Jorge Polanco's 12-game hitting streak is the 2nd longest active streak in the Majors and the 3rd longest of his career (highest: 14 G, 5/27-6/13/2019).

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners begin their final road trip of the season with the first of 3 games against the Kansas City Royals...Seattle will also see the Houston Astros for a 3-game set on the trip (9/19-21)... the Mariners are coming off a perfect (7-0) homestand after completing sweeps against the Los Angeles Angels (4-0) and St. Louis Cardinals (3-0)...tonight's game against the Royals will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with Aaron Goldsmith and Ryan Rowland-Smith on the call and Brad Adam serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on Seattle Sports (710 AM) with Rick Rizzs and Gary Hill Jr. on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners beat the Angels by an 11-2 score on Sunday to complete the 4-game series sweep...Seattle is on a season-high 9-game winning streak, their longest streak since winning 14-consecutive games from July 2-17, 2022.
Historic Firsts - Bryan Woo (13 K, 1 BB on 9/13) and George Kirby (14 K, 0 BB on 9/14) are the first pair of teammates in Major League history to record back-to-back starts with 13+ strikeouts and 1-or-fewer walks.

- Winning Ways With Sunday's win, Seattle secured a franchise record 5th-consecutive winning season (2021-c).
- Home Sweet Homestand The Mariners completed a perfect 7-game homestand (7-0) for the first time in franchise history yesterday...Seattle's last 6-game perfect homestand was from April 15-21, 1991...the Mariners are 23-6 (.793) over their last 29 home games since the All Star Break, the best home record in the Majors during that span.
- You Can't Spell Victory Without 'Victor' Seattle has won 12 consecutive games in which Victor Robles has appeared in (8/24-8/27, 9/6-current).
- Down on the Farm RHP Logan Evans (right elbow inflammation) is scheduled to begin a rehab assignment with Triple-A Tacoma tonight...earlier today the Mariners also announced that INF **Colt Emerson**, the Mariners #1 overall prospect by *MLB Pipeline*, was promoted to Triple-A Tacoma.

POSTSEASON PICTURE...the Mariners are currently in Postseason position with 12 regular season games remaining (6 at T-Mobile Park and 6 on the road), holding sole possession of the AL West Division lead, a half game ahead the next closest Houston...it marks the latest in a season the Mariners have had a share or sole possession of 1st place in the division since 2001.

CAL RALEIGH, YOU ARE UNBELIEVABLE...Cal Raleigh on Sunday hit his MLB-leading 54th home run of the season, tying Mickey Mantle of the 1961 Yankees for the most home runs by a switch-hitter in a season in Major League history...it also marked Raleigh's 43rd home run hit while catching, passing Javy López (42 HR in 2003) for the most home runs hit *as a catcher* in a season in MLB history...here's a look at Cal's next 3 potential home run milestones:

- #55: Sets MLB record for most home runs by a switch-hitter in a season.
- #56: Ties Mariners record for most home runs in a season (Ken Griffey Jr., 2x, 1997-98).
- #57: Sets Mariners record for most home runs in a season.

K IS FOR KIRBY...George Kirby was incredible on Sunday, tossing 6.1 innings and allowing 3 hits, 2 runs (2 ER), no walks and striking out 14 batters...his 14 strikeouts tied a career high, which he set on June 8 of this season at the Angels also without a walk allowed...Kirby is the only pitcher in MLB this season to record multiple games of 14+ strikeouts without a walk and the first to do so since Jacob deGrom tallied 3 such games in 2021...the feat has also been accomplished only 5 times in franchise history by 3 different pitchers: Kirby (done 2x), Randy Johnson (done 2x) and Mark Langston (done 1x).

OOPS, ALL ACES...over the previous 4-game series against the Angels, the Mariners pitching staff tallied 62 strikeouts, an MLB record for the most strikeouts in a 3-or-4-game series in Major League history... during the series, 3 starters tied or set a career high: Bryce Miller (career-high 11 K on 9/11), Bryan Woo (career-high 13 K on 9/13) and George Kirby (career-high tying 14 K on 9/14)...Seattle also became the first team to have 3+ starters (Woo, Kirby and Logan Gilbert) each record at least one start with 13+ strikeouts in a single season since Houston and Cleveland each had 3 pitchers do so in 2018...only the 1969 Astros (Don Wilson, Denny Lemaster, Tom Griffin and Larry Dierker) had more pitchers accomplish the feat in MLB history (h/t Sarah Langs).

WHAT A RELIEF...during September, the Mariners bullpen has posted an MLB-leading 1.87 ERA (11 ER, 53.0 IP) with 58 strikeouts compared to just 9 walks...during the month, they also rank among the leaders in WHIP (1st, 0.98), opponent batting average (7th, .219), K/BB (1st, 6.44), BB/9 (2nd, 1.53), strikeout rate (5th, 27.9%), walk rate (2nd, 4.3%), strikeout-to-walk rate (3rd, 23.6%) and fWAR (2nd, 1.4)...from Sept. 6-12, the bullpen combined for 32.1 innings without allowing an earned run.

DESIGNATED DOUBLES...Jorge Polanco on Sunday recorded a franchise record-tying 3 doubles, extending his streak of games with a double to 7-consecutive games (9/8-c), which tied Jim Presley (1986) for the longest such streak in Mariners history...Polanco has also recorded an extra-base hit in his last 9-consecutive games (9/6-c), tied for the 2nd longest streak in franchise history, trailing Ken Griffey Jr.'s 10-game streak in 1993...'Polo' has an active 12-game hitting streak (9/2-c), during which he is batting .419 (18x43) with 8 runs, 11 doubles, 2 home runs, 10 RBI and 5 walks, reaching base at a .460 clip...he leads the Majors in slugging (.814) and ranks 2nd in OPS (1.274) during that span (min. 50 PA).

YOU'RE WATCHING THE J-ROD SHOW...Julio Rodríguez on Sunday recorded his 51st multi-hit game of the season, 1 game shy of Bo Bichette's MLB-leading 52 multi-hit games this season...over his last 57 games since July 11, Julio is batting .310 (72x232) with 44 runs, 15 doubles, 1 triple, 19 home runs, 47 RBI, 12 stolen bases and 13 walks, reaching base at a .355 clip and slugging .629 (.984 OPS)...during that span (min. 200 PA), Julio leads the Majors with 146 total bases and ranks 2nd in hits, T-3rd in home runs, T-4th in RBI, 3rd in slugging percentage, 6th in OPS and T-1st in fWAR (3.4)...overall this season, Rodríguez's 165 hits rank T-4th in the Majors with Luis Arraez-SD.

BIG DUMPER, BIGGER SEASON...Cal Raleigh continues to post MVP-caliber numbers this season, batting .244 (134x549) with 101 runs, 21 doubles, 54 home runs, 115 RBI, 92 walks and 14 stolen bases, getting on base at a .359 clip and slugging .577 with a .936 OPS...Raleigh leads the Majors in home runs and also ranks 3rd in RBI, 3rd in slugging, 5th in OPS, 6th in walks, 5th in extra-base hits (75), 4th in total bases (317) and 2nd in fWAR (8.1).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...infielder Jorge Polanco has been one of the best hitters in the Majors recently, batting .419 (18x43) over his last 12 games (9/2-c)....YOU MAY ALSO KNOW...Polanco has tallied 10 total doubles over his 7-game streak of doubles (9/8-c), but...DID YOU KNOW?...that Polanco is just the 11th player in MLB history to record 10+ doubles in a 7-game span?...he joins Honus Wagner-PIT (2x in 1994), Sam West-WSH (3x in 1931), Paul Waner-PIT (4x in 1932), Goose Goslin-WSH (1933), Joe Medwick-STL (1936), Carlos Delgado-TOR (2000), Joey Votto-CIN (3x in 2009), Odúbel Herrera-PHI (2x in 2017), José Ramírez-CLE (2017) and Jonathan India-CIN (2x in 2024)...Votto, Waner and West are the only players to tally more doubles (11) in a 7-game span.

ABOUT LOGAN GILBERT ...

- The 28-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 23rd start of the season and 2nd against Kansas City...he will also make the 144th start of his MLB career and 8th career start against the Royals.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (14th overall) of the 2018 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Rob Mummau on June 16, 2018.
- Spent 3 seasons at Stetson (FL) University, 2016-18...in 2017, was ASUN Pitcher of the Year and ASUN 1st-Team All-Conference.
- Named the 2022 and the 2024 Mariners Most Valuable Pitcher by the Seattle Chapter of the BBWAA.
 Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2024.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on Sept. 10 vs. St. Louis, tossing 4.2 innings and allowing 1 run on 5 hits (1 home run) with 8 strikeouts to 1 walk allowed...has tossed 7+ strikeouts in 10 of his 12 home starts this season.

LATEST STRETCH...owns a 2.38 ERA (6 ER, 22.2 IP) with 34 strikeouts across his last 4 starts (8/24-c), limiting teams to just 1 run in 3 of those 4 starts...his 34 strikeouts are 2ndmost in MLB across that span, trailing only Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD (36 SO).

PUNCHOUT WARRIOR...with his last start, he improved his strikeout rate to 34.0% this season, which leads MLB and is the 2nd-highest strikeout rate in a season in Mariners history (min. 100 IP), trailing Randy Johnson's 34.2% strikeout rate in 1997.

INSIDE THE STATS..owns a 12.52 strikeouts-per-nine innings ratio, 34.0% strikeout rate, 30.2% chase rate, 68.3% 1st-pitch strike rate, 33.7% whiff rate, each above his 2024 season averages...among pitchers with min. 100 IP this season, he leads in strikeouts-per-nine innings and in strikeout rate.

YOU SWING, AND YOU MISS...recorded a career-high 25 swing-and-misses on Aug. 24 vs. ATH, tied for the 7th-most in a game by a pitcher this season (also: Zack Wheeler-PHI on 4/2 vs. COL)...surpassd his previous mark of 22 swings-and-misses (done 2x, last: 4/1 vs. DET).

TRIO OF SORTS...tossed a career-high 13 strikeouts on 8/24 vs. ATH, and is 1 of 3 Mariners to toss 13+ strikeouts with 1-or-fewer walks in a single game this season, joining Bryan Woo (13 SO and 1 BB, 9/13 vs. LAA) and George Kirby (2x, last: 14 SO, 0 BB, 7/14 vs. LAA)...they are the first trio to ever do so in Mariners history and are also the first team in MLB to have 3 different players toss 13+ strikeouts with 1-or-fewer walks in a game since the 2018 Astros.

...across 16 starts against American League teams this season, AGAINST THE AL GAINST THE AL...across 16 starts against American League teams this season, he holds a 3.40 ERA (33 ER, 87.1 IP) with 124 strikeouts while limiting teams to a .189 batting average...is 30-27 with a 3.73 ERA (258, 622.1 IP) and 652 strikeouts across 110 career starts against AL teams...his 110 starts against AL teams since 2021 are the 3rd-most in MLB trailing Jose Berrios-MIN/TOR (121 GS) and Yusei Kikuchi-4Tms (114 GS) while his 652 strikeouts rank 4th-most in MLB since 2021, trailing Gerrit Cole-NYY (697 SO), Tarik Skubal-DET (660 SO), and Dylan Cease-CWS/SD (654 SO).

SEPTEMBER SPLITS...is 7-5 with a 3.07 ERA (52 ER, 152.2 IP) and 171 strikeouts across 26 career starts in the month of September...among pitchers with 20+ starts in Sept. since 2021, his 171 strikeouts are the most in MLB while his ERA is tied for 4th-best alongside Kevin Gausman-SF/TOR, trailing Max Fried-ATL/NYY (1.93), Corbin Burnes-3Tms (2.51), Dylan Cease-CWS/SD (2.75).

HOW HE COMPARES...his 159 strikeouts are the 4th-most through a pitcher's first 22 starts this season, trailing Zack Wheeler-PHI (182 SO), Tarik Skubal-DET (181 SO), and Garrett Crochet-BOS (175 SO)...also the 9th-most strikeouts in Mariners history through a pitcher's first 22 starts of a season.

LIGHTS OUT... has tossed 7+ strikeouts in 15 of his 22 starts this season, doing so in 5 consecutive starts to start the season (3/27-4/19)...owns 2 career-high streaks of 6 consecutive games with 7+ strikeouts (last: 9/29/24-4/19/25)...is 1 of 5 starters in Mariners history with 6-or-more consecutive games of 7+ strikeouts, joining Randy Johnson (done 10x), Félix Hernández (done 2x), Mark Langston (done 2x) and James Paxton.

PLENTY OF PUNCHIES...has tossed 10+ strikeouts in 4 games this season (last: 8/24 vs. ATH)...his 9 career games with 10+ strikeouts are tied with Mike Moore for the 5th-most such games in Mariners history, trailing James Paxton (11), Mark Langston (28), Félix Hernández (35), Randy Johnson (94).

AMONG THE GREATS...his 3.59 career ERA (327 ER, 818.2 IP) ranks 6th-best among starters in Mariners history (min. 500 IP), trailing Randy Johnson, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton who each hold a 3.42 career ERA, and Luis Castillo (3.53)...his 870 career strikeouts are 6th-most in Mariners history, behind Mike Moore (937 SO).

QUALITY STUFF...has tossed 69 quality starts in his career, including 7x this season and in 3 of his last 4 starts (8/24-c)...has allowed 3-or-fewer runs in 17 of his 22 starts this season and has allowed 3-or-fewer runs in 108 Major League starts, including a career-high tying 8-game streak of 3-or-fewer runs allowed from Sept. 29, 2024 to June 16, 2025.


