RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a five-game, six-day, rain-shortened road trip against the Yankees (1-1) and Orioles (0-1, two to play) tonight in Baltimore...are tied with the Braves (36-18, 667) for the best winning pct. in the majors...have led the majors for each of the last eight days, their first time owning MLB's best winning pct. since June 30, 2023 (57-28)...have won five of seven, nine of 13, 16 of 21, 22 of 28, and 29 of their last 39 games...have the easiest remaining schedule in MLB (.473 opp. winning pct.), and, including this series, each of their next six opponents are currently below .500...have led the AL East for 16 consecutive days (May 9-pres.), their longest reign since a club-record 113-day streak in 2023 (Opening Day-July 19)...have spent 23 days leading the AL East, 25 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...are 13-5 on a stretch of 20 games (May 4-27) that includes 17 meetings with divisional opponents...following this stretch, only two of their final 13 series before the All-Star break will come vs. AL East teams, both at Tropicana Field: June 8-10 vs. BOS and July 6-9 vs. NYY.

- ★ The Rays blew leads of 1-0, 4-2, 5-4, and 7-5 in yesterday's 9-7, 13-inning loss, snapping a nine-game winning streak in series openers...they committed a season-high four errors, their most since July 20, 2021 vs. BAL (4) and most on the road since May 19, 2019 at NYY (4)...it marked their first defeat this season when out-homering their opponent (14-0 entering).
- ★ Paired with **Aaron Judge's** two-run homer on Sunday at NYY, the Rays have been walked off in consecutive games for the first time since July 4-5, 2025 at MIN...they have never dropped three straight games in walk-off fashion.
- ★ Their four walk-off losses are tied with seven other teams for third most in the majors behind the Tigers (6) and Yankees (5)...three of those set backs have come on walk-off homers, tied for the most in MLB with the Tigers and Rockies...all three walk-off blasts have come within the Rays last 10 games (also: May 13 at TOR - **Daulton Varsho** grand slam)...six of their last 11 games have been decided in the final at-bat (May 12-pres.), and each of their last four losses have come in the last at-bat...however, their nine last at-bat wins are tied for the most in MLB, matching the Braves and Cardinals.
- ★ The Rays have lost back-to-back games for the first time since a three-game skid from April 19-21...yesterday's defeat snapped a five-game winning streak in games following a loss.
- ★ Undefeated (8-0-1) over their last nine sets, tied for the sixth-longest streak of unbeaten series in franchise history, the Rays need to win the next two games to avoid their first series loss since April 20-22 vs. CIN and first on the road since April 17-19 vs. PIT.
- ★ **Griffin Jax** has turned in a 1.42 ERA (19.0IP, 3ER) in five starts since joining the Rays rotation on April 26, seventh among AL starters (min. 15.0IP)...he has yielded 1 XBH in that span (HR), becoming the second AL starting pitcher to allow 1 or 0 XBH through his first five starts of a season (min. 15.0IP) in the Wild Card era (since 1995), joining **KC Brad Keller** (1XBH, 28.0IP) in 2020.

RECENT TRANSACTIONS—Today, the Rays signed free agent **RHP Craig Kimbrel** and placed **RHP Jesse Scholtens** (right wrist strain) on the 15-day IL...Kimbrel, 37, was designated for assignment by the Mets on May 22 and became a free agent yesterday...the right-hander is a nine-time All-Star, 2018 World Series champion, 2017 AL Reliever of the Year, 2014 NL Reliever of the Year, and 2011 unanimous NL Rookie of the Year...the nine career All-Star nods are tied with **Rich Gossage** for second most in MLB history by a reliever behind **Mariano Rivera** (13)...he has gone 56-50 with a 2.65 ERA (836.2IP, 246ER), 1,297 strikeouts, 352 walks, 440 saves, 30 holds, and a 1.03 WHIP over 865 career appearances spanning 17 seasons with the Mets (2026), Astros (2025), Braves (2025, 2010-14), Orioles (2024), Phillies (2023), Dodgers (2022), White Sox (2021), Cubs (2019-21), Red Sox (2016-18), and Padres (2015).

- ★ Kimbrel's 440 career saves are second most among active pitchers behind **DET Kenley Jansen** (483) and fifth most by any pitcher since saves became an official statistic in 1969, also trailing Hall of Famers **Rivera** (652), **Trevor Hoffman** (601), and **Lee Smith** (478).
- ★ His 1,297 career strikeouts are tied with **Jansen** for second most among active relievers behind **BOS Aroldis Chapman** (1,354) and are tied fourth most by a relief pitcher in the modern era (since 1900), also behind Hall of Famers **Hoyt Wilhelm** (1,363) and **Gossage** (1,340).

FIRST IMPRESSIONS—With his two-run homer in the 11th inning yesterday, **Victor Mesa Jr.** became the first player in the majors to hit a go-ahead home run in extra innings in his debut with a franchise since **CHC Javier Baez** on Aug. 5, 2014 at COL...in the Wild Card era (since 1995), only five players have accomplished the feat, according to Stats Perform: Mesa Jr., Baez, BAL **Taylor Teagarden** (July 14, 2012 vs. DET), FLA **Miguel Cabrera** (June 20, 2003 vs. TB), and TEX **Craig Worthington** (Aug. 17, 1995 at CWS)...Mesa Jr. became the 30th player to homer in his Rays debut, a list that also includes manager **Kevin Cash** (June 15, 2005 vs. MIL) and first base coach **Corey Dickerson** (April 3, 2016 vs. TOR)...he was the 15th to turn the trick on the road and first since **Nelson Cruz** on July 23, 2021 at CLE...over the last four seasons (2023-26), only Mesa Jr., **Carson Williams** (Aug. 22, 2025 vs. STL), and **Christopher Morel** (July 30, 2024 vs. MIA) have gone deep in their Rays debuts.

FREE BASEBALL—The Rays AL-leading nine extra-inning games are tied with the Cardinals, Nationals, and Pirates for second most in the majors behind the Mets (10)...they have gone to extra frames in four of their last 11 games and in five of 21 games during May, tied with the Mets for the most in MLB this month...the nine extra-inning affairs are the most in franchise history before the end of May, surpassing the previous mark of seven shared by the 2024 and 2022 Rays...they are on pace for 28 extra-inning games, which would break the club record of 22 games established in 2022 and mark MLB's highest total since the 1957 Tigers (28).

- ★ Between yesterday and April 18 at PIT (13), the Rays have played two 13-inning games, their most since participating in three during the 2019 season...the 13-inning contests match the club's longest game since MLB introduced the extra-inning ghost runner in 2020...from 2020-25, they had only two 13-inning games: April 16, 2024 vs. LAA (W, 7-6) and May 20, 2021 at BAL (L, 8-6).
- ★ The Rays have lost their last three extra-inning games after winning their previous five (April 5-May 12)...only the Mets (7) and Cardinals (6) have more extra-inning wins than the Rays (5).
- ★ **Yandy Diaz** has reached safely in six of his 7 PA during extras (2H, 4BB)...**Chandler Simpson** is 3-for-6 (.500) from the 10th frame on...**Jonathan Aranda's** 5 RBI in extra innings are tied with three other players for second most in the majors behind **NYM Carson Benge** (6).

ROTATIONAL DOMINATION—Rays starters have thrown 13.1 straight scoreless innings and have permitted one run in their last 19.1 IP and two runs in their last 26.1 IP...they have yielded one or zero runs in a season-high five straight outings, pitching to a 0.99 ERA (27.1IP, 3ER) in that span despite receiving only three runs of support (0.99 RSA)...it marks the rotation's longest streak since another five-start stretch from June 21-26, 2025, and it has not recorded a longer streak since going 10 straight starts to close the 2021 season (Sept. 22-Oct. 3)...their 26 such starts on the year are the most in the majors, ahead of the Braves (24)...Rays starting pitchers have yielded three runs or fewer in 27 of their last 28 outings (April 22-pres.) and 43 of 51 starts this season...they lead MLB in opp. on-base pct. (.278) while ranking highly in WHIP (2nd, 1.10), opp. slugging pct. (3rd, .341), opp. OPS (3rd, .619), opp. average (4th, .217), walk rate (4th, 7.2%), home runs per 9.0 IP (5th, 0.87), and FIP (3.62).

The rotation owns an MLB-best 2.82 ERA (258.2IP, 81ER)...the Rays have completed a season leading the majors in starting pitcher ERA once previously, when the 2012 rotation, anchored by Cy Young-winner **David Price**, turned in a franchise-record 3.34 ERA.

FEELING HOT HOT HOT—AL batting average leader **Yandy Diaz** has a 10-game on-base streak, batting .350 (14-for-40) with 5 2B, 3 HR, 10 RBI, and a 1.122 OPS in that span...**Junior Caminero** is 11-for-31 (.355) with 2 2B, 2 HR, and 8 RBI during an eight-game hitting streak, tied with TOR **Ernie Clement** and BOS **Willson Contreras** for the longest active streak in the AL and tied for the second longest of his career (also: July 13-25, 2025), trailing a 10-game run earlier this season (April 15-25)...**Cedric Mullins** has gone 11-for-28 (.393) with 2 XBH, 2 RBI, 6 BB, and 4 SO in his last eight games.

- ★ **Ryan Vilade** has reached base safely in 10 of his last 16 PA (.625 OBP - 3 1B, 3B, HR, 5BB)...two of the six outs he has made in that span were sacrifice flies...he is batting .351/.418/.544 (20-for-57) with 6 XBH, 14 RBI, 8 BB, and 8 SO over his last 24 games (April 7-pres.), pacing the majors in average over that span while ranking eighth with a .962 OPS (min. 50PA).
- ★ **Jonathan Aranda** is batting .338/.422/.486 (25-for-74) with 5 2B, 2 HR, and 15 RBI over 22 games in May...he ranks second among AL batters in average this month behind **Greene** (.350) and is tied with **Greene** for third in on-base pct., trailing ATH **Nick Kurtz** (.471) and NYY **Cody Bellinger** (.424).

CHARM CITY CLASH—The Rays and Orioles continue a stretch of six meetings over a 10-day span (May 18-27) tonight, with the Rays taking three of four matchups thus far...they won the first three meetings, tying 2022 for their second-longest season-opening streak vs. Baltimore, trailing a six-game run to open 2021...the Rays have lost 10 of their last 15 games at Oriole Park (Sept. 16, 2023-pres.) and are 10-18 in their last 28 (May 22, 2022-pres.) on the heels of a 14-2 run (Sept. 17, 2020-May 21, 2022)...they are 1-1-7 in series play over the 10-18 stretch, with the lone win coming from Sept. 6-8, 2024...the Rays have lost the last three season series (2023-25) with the Orioles on the heels of six straight wins (2017-22).

- ★ In his last 16 games vs. the Orioles (Sept. 7, 2024-pres.), **Yandy Diaz** is batting .475/.551/.780 (28-for-59) with 6 2B, 4 HR, and 16 RBI...min. 60 PA, it marks the highest average and on-base pct. by any player in the majors vs. a single team in that span.
- ★ **Junior Caminero** has reached base safely in 11 straight games against the Orioles, batting .370/.431/.609 (17-for-46) with 2 2B, 3 HR, and 10 RBI in those contests.

TONIGHT'S START—Griffin Jax will toe the rubber tonight for his sixth start and 17th appearance of the year, including his third start and 11th outing away from Tropicana Field...marks his sixth straight start after pitching out of the bullpen in each of his first 11 appearances...is the 21st start of his major league career...acquired from the Twins for **RHP Taj Bradley** on July 31, 2025.

✦ Jax has allowed two earned runs or fewer in each of his last eight starts dating back to Oct. 2, 2021 with MIN, the second-longest active streak among Rays arms behind **Nick Martinez** (10GS, March 3–pres.).

LAST TIME OUT—Tossed a season-high-tying 5.0 innings on May 19 vs. BAL (5.0IP, 3H, R, BB, 6SO, HR)...his six strikeouts in the outing were tied for the second most in his career (4x, last: Sept. 21, 2021 at CHC) behind only a 10-strikeout performance on Aug. 10, 2021 vs. CWS...the lone run he allowed came against the first batter he faced with a **Taylor Ward** home run, the first leadoff homer he has allowed in his career...after the long ball, he retired six of seven, nine of 11, and 14 of his next 17 batters faced...he threw his changeup a season-high 16 times, with hitters going 1-for-7 (.143) against it.

✦ His three hits allowed were his fewest in a start of 5.0 innings or more since Oct. 2, 2021 at KC (5.0IP, 1H).

OLD BAY & TAMPA BAY—Jax is 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA (15.0IP, 3ER) and 18 strikeouts over 11 career appearances (1GS) against Baltimore...against the AL East this season, he has a 1.76 ERA (15.1IP, 3ER) with 13 strikeouts, a .212 (11-for-52) opp. average, and a 1.17 WHIP in five outings (three starts).

✦ Jax is 3-6 with a 4.34 ERA (87.0IP, 42ER) in 64 career appearances (six starts) against AL East opponents...however, he has turned in a 1.69 ERA (21.1IP, 4ER), 1.03 WHIP, and .194 (14-for-72) opp. average across 11 outings (three starts) vs. the division since joining the Rays.

ROAD TRIP—Jax has a 3.66 ERA (189.1IP, 77ER) in 159 career outings (11GS) away from his home stadiums...as a starter in away games, he has turned in a 5.21 ERA (46.2IP, 27ER) despite allowing three runs or fewer in each of his last five road starts (Sept. 21, 2021 at CHC).

✦ Since joining the Rays, he has a 3.58 ERA (27.2IP, 11ER) away from Steinbrenner Field and Tropicana Field in 24 appearances...his last road start came on May 13 at TOR (5.0IP, 4H, 0R, 4BB, SO).

GET JAX UP AND MOVING—This marks the first time Jax has been a regular starter since his 2021 rookie season with the Twins, when he made his final 14 appearances as a member of the Twins rotation after his first four came in relief...he started two games for the Rays last season, working as an opener for **Ian Seymour** on Sept. 5 vs. CLE before starting a bullpen game on Sept. 10, 2025 at CWS...both starts lasted 1.0 scoreless frame...for his career, he is 3-5 with a 4.98 ERA (90.1IP, 50ER) in 21 starts compared to 21-28 with a 3.70 ERA (294.1IP, 121ER) in 294 relief appearances.

✦ Jax spent his first five professional seasons (2016-19, 2021) as a starter...he first transitioned to a full-time relief role in 2022...from 2016-21, 50 of his 55 minor league appearances were starts.

CAPTAIN JAX—Jax is currently a Captain in the U.S. Air Force Reserve, earning the promotion in June 2021, and remains the only Air Force Academy graduate to play in the majors...after his graduation from the Academy in 2017, he made five starts with Class-A Cedar Rapids and Rookie-level Elizabethton during his 60-day leave ahead of his first active duty assignment, departing on July 22 to begin his role as an acquisitions officer working with civilian contractors such as SpaceX and Boeing...the following year, he was accepted into the Air Force World Class Athlete Program, which allows soldiers to train for the upcoming Olympic Games as their active duty job responsibility for a two-year period, allowing him to continue his baseball career while completing his active duty requirement...became eligible for the program when baseball was readmitted for the scheduled 2020 Tokyo Olympics.

✦ He completed his active duty requirement and was admitted to the Air Force Reserve in November 2019...was notified of his promotion to Captain on June 5, 2021, the same day he was selected to the Twins major league roster ahead of his MLB debut three days later.

MLB CAREER RECAP—Last season, made a career-high 73 appearances (2 starts), tied for sixth most in the AL, between the Twins (50G) and Rays (23G), going a combined 1-7 with a 4.23 ERA (66.0IP, 31ER)...also set career bests in strikeouts (99) and holds (28)...acquired at the July 31 trade deadline for **RHP Taj Bradley**...of his 99 strikeouts, 97 came as a reliever, fourth most in the AL behind **HOU Bryan Abreu** (105), **CLE Cade Smith** (104), and teammate **Edwin Uceta** (103)...min. 250 BF, ranked second in the majors in chase rate (38.1%) behind **CIN Graham Ashcraft** (38.3%) and was fifth in whiff rate (37.3%)...joined Abreu as the only pitchers in the majors to make 70 appearances or more each season from 2023-25...his 216 appearances in that timeframe ranked third to **SF/NYM Tyler Rogers** (226G) and **Abreu** (220G).

✦ In 2024, received the Joseph W. Haynes Award as Twins Pitcher of the Year, as voted on by the Twin Cities chapter of the BBWAA...became the first Minnesota pitcher to record 10 saves and 20 holds in a season.

✦ In 2023, made the Twins Opening Day roster for the first time and spent the year in the club's bullpen...tied for ninth in the AL with a team-leading 23 holds...led the majors with a 3.3 pct. barrel rate (min. 250BF).

✦ In 2022, transitioned to a relief role for the first time after spending his first six professional seasons (2016-21) as a starter...led the Twins bullpen in innings (72.1), tied for the team lead in holds (18), and ranked second in appearances (65)...began the season with Triple-A St. Paul after spending spring training with the Twins...made one appearance before being recalled April 12 when **Jorge Alcala** was placed on the injured list, remaining with the big-league club through season's end.
