The Mariners and Athletics meet for their fourth and final series matchup of the season...Seattle swept the last series in West Sacramento (3-0) from May 25-27.

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TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue their final road trip of the regular season with the second of 3 games at the Athletics (0-1)...Seattle will also travel to face the Los Angeles Angels (3 G, 9/14-9/16) and Colorado Rockies (3 G, 9/18-9/20) on the trip...tonight's contest against the A's will be televised and streamed on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call and **Brad Adam** serving as field reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped last night's series opener to the Athletics by a 6-5 score in 10 innings...Seattle fell to 7-8 in 15 extra-inning games this season...Seattle is 29-44 (.397) on the road this season, as opposed to 40-35 (.533) at T-Mobile Park.

- **Close To You** - The Mariners are 23-23 in 46 one-run games this season...the 46 rank most in the American League and tied for 3rd-most in the Majors.
- **20/20 Mariner Duos** - The only Mariners teammates in franchise history to post 20+ home run and 20+ stolen base season together are Ken Griffey Jr. and Alex Rodriguez (2x, 1998-99), and **Randy Arozarena** and **Julio Rodríguez** (2x, 2025-26).
- **Woo Tang Forever** - Right-hander **Bryan Woo** holds a 2.25 ERA (9 ER, 36.0 IP) with 36 strikeouts, 7 walks, and a 4-1 record (4-2 team record) in 6 starts since the beginning of August.
- **Wake Me Up** - In September/October regular season games since 2021, the Mariners are 87-64 (.576), tied for the 5th-best record across the Majors.
- **Speedy Rodríguez** - **Julio Rodríguez** ranks 5th in Mariners history with 136 stolen bases, ranking behind Ichiro Suzuki (438 SB), Julio Cruz (290), Harold Reynolds (228) and Ken Griffey Jr. (167).

RALEIGH-ING THROUGH SEPTEMBER...**Cal Raleigh** has reached base safely in 13 consecutive contests (8/28-c), the 4th-longest on-base streak (via hit, walk or HBP) of his career...during that streak, Cal is batting .292 (14x48) with 11 runs, 5 doubles, 3 home runs, 8 RBI and 7 walks, getting on base at a .382 clip, slugging .583 with a .965 OPS...in 36 games since July 31, Raleigh has posted an .886 OPS, with 10 home runs and 23 RBI across 143 plate appearances...during that span, the 29-year-old catcher has raised his season OPS by nearly 100 points, going into play on July 31 with a .579 OPS and going into play tonight with a .666 OPS.

THE LAZ-ER SHOW...21-year-old **Lazaro Montes** hit a 2-run, game-tying, pinch-hit home run in the 6th inning last night, his third career home run in his young big league career...Montes' pinch-hit blast made him the second-youngest player in franchise history with a pinch-hit home run, trailing only a pair of pinch-hit homers off the bat of Ken Griffey Jr....the Hall of Famer recorded pinch-hit homers at age 19 on May 16, 1989, and at age 20 on Sept. 16, 1990.

KEYSTONE COLE...**Cole Young** leads American League second basemen with 16 defensive runs saved this season...DRS is an advanced baseball statistic that estimates how many runs a player saved or cost their team through their fielding compared to an average player at that position...in his sophomore season, Young has appeared in all but one game (147 G played) for the Mariners.

J.P. IN SEPTEMBER...in 10 September games, shortstop **J.P. Crawford**, who went 2-for-5 last night, is batting .344 (11x32) with a double, 3 RBI and 9 walks compared to just 4 strikeouts, getting on base at a .476 clip with an .851 OPS.

TRIPLE, DOUBLED...the Mariners offense recorded a pair of triples last night: **Cole Young** in the fourth inning and **Dominic Canzone** in the fifth inning...each of the last 3 times the Mariners have recorded multiple triples in a game have come at the Athletics: Sept. 21, 2021 and Aug. 20, 2022 at the Oakland Coliseum, and last night.

THAT'S "SER" TO YOU...right-handed reliever **Seranthony Domínguez** has impressed over his last 17 outings with the Mariners, after a rocky team debut on Aug. 4...in those 17 appearances since Aug. 7, the midseason acquisition holds a 2.12 ERA (4 ER, 17.0 IP) with 12 strikeouts and 6 walks, holding opponents to a .158 batting average (9x57)...including his 1.2 innings pitched last night, Domínguez has recorded 4+ outs in 3 of his last 8 outings since Aug. 24.

THREE IN THE TOP 15...the Mariners have 3 players on their current roster who rank in the top 15 on the franchise's all-time *Baseball-Reference* wins above replacement list: **Julio Rodríguez** (25.3 WAR, 9th), **J.P. Crawford** (21.6, 12th) and **Cal Raleigh** (19.4, 15th).

AN UNLIKELY SWIPER...since his first stolen base with the Mariners on July 26, 2025, **Josh Naylor's** 46 stolen bases are 6th-most in the Majors...Naylor is 46-for-53 in stolen base attempts in a Seattle uniform, with his 86.8 SB% ranking higher than any of the 5 players above him on that list.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Bryan Woo** is set to take the mound for the Mariners tonight...Woo was brilliant in his last outing on Sept. 6 against the A's at T-Mobile Park, tossing 8.0 scoreless innings with just one hit allowed and 9 strikeouts, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...in 11 career starts against the Athletics, Woo is 8-1 with a 1.95 ERA (14 ER, 64.2 IP)?...Woo's 1.95 ERA against the A's is the lowest ERA by a Mariners pitcher against any opponent (min. 10 GS) in franchise history...rounding out the top five on the list is **George Kirby's** 2.07 ERA in 13 starts against the Rangers, Félix Hernández's 2.19 ERA in 18 starts against the Rays, Félix's 2.26 ERA in 18 starts against the Twins, and James Paxton's 2.43 ERA in 12 starts against the Angels.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - SEPTEMBER 12

- **1987** - On his first day in the big leagues, Mario Diaz tripled in his first at bat off Chicago's Bob James.
- **2014** - **Fernando Rodney** recorded the save in the Mariners 4-2 win over the Oakland A's, his 45th of the season to tie Kazuhiro Sasaki for the Mariners single-season record. Seattle also pulled into a tie for the second wild card, only ½ game back of the A's for the first wild card.
- **2015** - **Nelson Cruz** hit home run #41 in the 7th, setting a career-high and tying for the ML lead in the Mariners 7-2 win over Colorado... Robinson Canó hit a home run in the 2nd inning, his 50th extra-base hit of the season becoming the 5th MLB player in history to open career with 11 straight seasons of 50+ XBH...John Hicks recorded his first MLB RBI on a squeeze bunt in the 4th inning.
- **2017** - **Kyle Seager** recorded his 150th career home run, becoming the 3rd player in club history to hit at least 150 home runs before turning 30 years of age (also Ken Griffey Jr. with 398 and Alex Rodriguez with 189). The Mariners defeated the Rangers, 10-3.
- **2018** - **Nelson Cruz** recorded his 1,000th career RBI with a solo home run in the 5th inning against the Padres, becoming the 11th active player to record at least 1,000 career RBI. Wade LeBlanc's scoreless inning streak came to an end at 19.0 consecutive innings.

ABOUT BRYAN WOO...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 28th start of the season and 98th career start...is also making his 2nd start against the Athletics this season and the 12th of his career.
- Selected by Seattle in the 6th round (174th overall) of the 2021 MLB First-Year Player Draft out of California Polytechnic State University...signed by Mariners scout Chris Hom.
- Spent 3 seasons at Cal Poly before being drafted, making 31 appearances (6 starts) for the Mustangs. Did not pitch in 2021 while recovering from right elbow surgery.
- Was selected to the 2025 American League All-Star team for the 1st time in his career.

LAST TIME OUT...W#11 on Sept. 6 vs ATH, tossing 8.0 shutout innings with 1 hit, 2 walks and 9 strikeouts...threw 102 pitches and 73 strikes...his 8.0 innings pitches represent a career-high, surpassing his previous high of 7.1 innings recorded on July 10, 2025 at NYY.

WOOOOOO!...his last outing on Sept. 6 marked the first time a Mariners pitcher has tossed 8.0+ innings and allowed 1-or-fewer hits since Mike Leake did so on July 19, 2019 vs. LAA...is also 1 of only 10 pitchers (12x) this season to record 1+ outings of 8.0+ IP with 1-or-fewer hits allowed (last: Noah Cameron-KC, 8/16 at LAA)...he is also just the 5th pitcher in franchise history to toss 8.0+ innings with 1-or-fewer hits allowed and 9+ strikeouts, joining Randy Johnson (5x), Félix Hernández (3x), Brandon Morrow and Taijuan Walker...first to do so since Taijuan Walker on July 31, 2015 at Minnesota.

150... struck out Henry Bolte in the 1st inning on Sept. 6 vs. ATH for his 150th strikeout of the season...joins **Logan Gilbert** as 1-of-2 Mariners pitchers with 150+ strikeouts...the Mariners are 1-of-2 rotations with multiple pitchers owning 150+ strikeouts this season...became the 7th pitcher in franchise history to reach 150 strikeouts in multiple seasons age 26-or-younger, joining Félix Hernández (7x, 2006-12), Freddy García (3x, 199-02), Mark Langston (3x, 1984-87), Mike Moore (2x, 1984-85) and teammates **George Kirby** (2x, 2023-24) and **Logan Gilbert** (2x, 2022-23).

ONE-HIT WONDERS...in his last start against the Athletics, threw 8.0 scoreless innings with 1 hit...marks his 3rd outing of the season with 1-or-fewer hits allowed over 6.0+ IP...is 1-of-5 pitchers this season with 3+ such outings...his 6 such outings since 2025 lead the MLB over that span while he is 1-of-2 players along with Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD to have recorded 2 starts of 1-hit allowed over 7.0+ IP since 2025...his 6 career 6-inning, 1-hit starts are tied for 2nd most in franchise history, tied with Félix Hernández and trailing Randy Johnson (8)...he is 1-of-10 MLB pitchers all-time to record 6+ such outings within his first 100 career starts.

SHUTTING IT DOWN...has thrown 7.0+ IP without an earned run allowed in 5 games this season, including his last start, tied for 2nd-most such games in MLB this season (also: 4 others)...has also recorded 6.0+ innings without an earned run in 6 starts this season, tied for 3rd-most in MLB (also: 3 others)...his 11 such games since 2025 are tied for 7th-most across that span (also: 3 others) while his 17 career such games are tied for the 11th most recorded through a players first 97 career games.

STEEE-RIKE THREEE!...has recorded 5+ strikeouts in each of his last 11 starts (6/30-c) for the 4th longest active streak in MLB...it is tied for the 13th longest streak recorded by a pitcher this season and marks the 2nd longest such streak of his career, trailing his 13-game streak from June 17 to Aug. 27 last season...recorded his 6th outing with 9+ strikeouts in his last start on Sept. 6, tying his 6 such starts recorded last season...is also tied for the 14th most starts in MLB this season (also: 3 others).

HEADING SOUTH...was born and raised in Oakland, CA...is facing his hometown team for the 12th time in his career with the Mariners going 8-1 in those prior starts while the Mariners are 10-1 in those starts...in each of his last 2 starts against the Athletics, has allowed 1-or-fewer runs and 4-or-fewer base runners with 7+ strikeouts over 7.0+ IP...among pitchers with 10+ starts against any opponent since 2023, Woo's 1.95 ERA against the Athletics is the best...in addition, Woo held a 0.57 ERA (2 ER, 31.1 IP) across his first 6 starts against the A's (2023-24).

SMOOTH SAILING...in each of his last 3 road starts as allowed 2-or-fewer runs over 5.0+ IP, including 2 quality starts...has allowed 1-or-fewer walks with 5+ strikeouts in each of the 3 starts with 3-or-fewer hits allowed in 2...over those 3 starts since the start of August, owns a 1.59 ERA (3 ER, 17.0 IP) with a 0.82 WHIP and 17 strikeouts to 3 walks while limiting opponents to a .180 batting average...since the start of August (min. 15.0 IP), Woo's ERA on the road ranks 6th best in MLB while his 0.82 road WHIP ranks 11th and his 5.67 K/BB on the road ranks 15th-highest.

NO FREE PASSES HERE... Woo's 61 career games of 6.0+ IP and 2-or-fewer walks, including his last start, rank 8th-most in MLB since 2023 while his 44 such starts since 2025 lead MLB across that span, ranking ahead of next closest Sandy Alcantara-MIA (40 G)...his 1.90 BB/9 this season ranks 4th-lowest among qualified pitchers in 2026.
