RAY REPORT—The Rays begin a six-game road trip against the Royals (three to play) and Astros (three to play) tonight at Kauffman Stadium...they have gone 7-3 in the midst of a 23-game stretch over a 24-day span (June 19–pres)...have won five straight games (June 24–pres)...their fifth winning streak of five games or more, most in the majors, ahead of the Cardinals, Dodgers, Yankees, and White Sox (each 3x)...are 15 games above .500 for the first time since June 11 (40-25) and 1.5 games ahead in the division for the first time since June 5 (37-23)...have spent 44 days in first place in the AL East, 39 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...Saturday, they overtook the Yankees for the division lead, their first time atop the AL East since June 12 and the latest they have led the division in a season since July 18, 2023...have held a share of first or second in the division for 81 straight days (April 8–pres).

- ★ The Rays completed their MLB-best eighth sweep of the season over the Diamondbacks with a 5-1 win on Sunday...surpassed 2023, 2021, and 2008 (all 7) for the most sweeps in club history before the calendar flips to July.
- ★ They secured their seventh home series sweep, extending their MLB lead (2nd: CWS, 5)...it marks their most sweeps at Tropicana Field before the end of June, surpassing 2023 and 2008 (both 6).
- ★ **Junior Caminero** homered for his fourth game in a row (June 25–pres.) – see more in "La Máxima" note below.
- ★ **Drew Rasmussen** spun his fifth straight quality start (June 5–pres.), lowering his ERA in the month of June to an AL-best 0.82 ERA (33.0IP, 3ER)...he also paces the AL this month in strikeouts (39) and WHIP (0.61), while ranking second in opp. average (.142)...his 0.83 ERA is the third lowest in a month in team history (min. 30.0IP), behind **Rich Hill** (0.78, May 2021) and **Chris Archer** (0.73, July 2013).
- ★ **Yandy Diaz** extended his home on-base streak to 26 games (May 5–pres.), the majors' longest single-season streak since **LAD Shohei Ohtani** (30G) from July 19–Sept. 21, 2025...the last Ray with a longer stretch was **Randy Arozarena** (33G) from April 12–June 24, 2023...it ties **Randy Winn** (May 8–July 13, 2002) for the sixth-longest single-season streak in Rays history, two shy of **Ben Griever's** fifth-ranked streak (28G, April 18–June 14, 2001), and is tied for 10th longest overall (incl. multi-season streaks).
- ★ The Rays are a major league-best 18-7 (.667) against left-handed starters this season...they have won each of their last three games against a southpaw starter and six of the last nine.
- ★ They can extend their winning streak to six games this evening, which would mark their longest since May 1-7 (7G).

LA MÁXIMA—Yesterday, **Junior Caminero** was named AL Player of the Week (June 22-28) after slashing .423/.500/.1231 (11-for-26) with 7 HR, 15 RBI, 4 BB, 8 R, and a 1.731 OPS across seven games...he paced all major league hitters in home runs and tied **CHC Dansby Swanson** for the most RBI...his 1.731 OPS ranked second in the majors to NL Player of the Week **WSH Luis Garcia Jr.** (2.170)...marks the second time in his career he has been recognized as AL Player of the Week, joining May 26–June 1, 2025 and the first Ray to win it since **Yandy Diaz** (Sept. 15-21, 2025).

- ★ He has homered seven times in his last six games (June 23–pres.), joining **Carlos Peña** (June 6-12, 2010 - 7HR) as the only Rays in team history to have seven homers or more in a six-game span...he...the last Ray to homer in five straight games was **Mike Zunino** (5G, Aug. 11-17, 2021), and no player in team history has hit eight home runs in a seven-game span; **PHI Kyle Schwarber** (May 8-15, 2026 - 8HR), is the only player to have eight homers in any seven-game stretch since 2022.
- ★ His home run on Sunday vs. AZ traveled 463 feet, the farthest home run by a Ray in 2026 and tied for the fourth-farthest home run in the majors this season...it marked the seventh-farthest long ball in the Statcast era (since 2015) by a Ray and the seventh-farthest at Tropicana Field in that same span.
- ★ Phase 2 of All-Star balloting began yesterday at 12 p.m. ET and continues until Thursday, July 2 at 12 p.m. ET...Caminero is attempting to become the first player in franchise history to start back-to-back All-Star Games and the eighth (9x) to be elected as a starter via fan balloting, including the first since **Yandy Diaz** and **Randy Arozarena** in 2023...the voting for starting third baseman is between him and **TOR Kazuma Okamoto**, who he leads in WAR (3.3 to 1.9), hits (89 to 71), doubles (12 to 11), home runs (22 to 19), AVG (.292 to .236), OBP (.384 to .318), SLG (.548 to .462), OPS (.932 to .779), and OPS+ (155 to 110).
- ★ Caminero has been announced as the first of the eight participants in the 2026 Home Run Derby...he finished runner-up to **SEA Cal Raleigh** in last year's iteration at Truist Park in Atlanta and had 44 home runs in the three rounds.
- ★ His 74 career home runs are the 24th most by a player before his 23rd birthday, which is this Sunday, July 5...with one home run before Sunday, he will tie **NYY Joe DiMaggio** and **TEX Juan Gonzalez** for 22nd most...his 22 home runs are tied for the third most before the calendar flips to July in franchise history (see table on the right).

96 DAYS LATER—The Rays are halfway through their 2026 campaign and are tied for the third-best start to a season in team history (see table on the right)...per FanGraphs, their odds to make the postseason have risen from 28.9 pct. entering Opening Day (March 25) to 93.4 pct. entering play today...their 64.5 pct. difference is the largest increase in the majors over that timeframe.

- ★ They are off to a 31-12 (.721) start at home, the second-best start at home in team history behind 2023 (33-10)...they have taken the series opener in 11 of 14 home series and gone on to take 10 of the 14 sets with seven of the 10 ending in sweeps.
- ★ Through 81 games, **Yandy Diaz** has reached base 142 times, most in franchise history to this point in the season (see table on the right)...he is on pace to reach base 284 times this season, which would surpass **Aubrey Huff's** franchise record (259TOB, 2003).
- ★ **Junior Caminero** and **Diaz** have each posted a .932 OPS through the team's first 81 games, tied for the sixth-best OPS by a qualified Rays hitter through this point in a season...their marks are the highest since **Corey Dickerson** had a .948 OPS in 2017.
- ★ The Rays bullpen has combined for 32 saves, the second most in team history at this juncture...**Bryan Baker** has accounted for 21 of the 32 saves and sits seventh in team history for most saves before the All-Star break...he already has the most since **Alex Colomé** (25) in 2017.

POWER SURGE—Rays batters have registered 11 home runs in their last four games (June 25-28) of their recent season-long 10-game homestand, on the heels of hitting 11 in their 17 previous contests (June 6-24)...they have launched multiple home runs in each of the four games (June 25–pres)...their longest streak since April 11-14, 2025 (4G) and tied for the 11th-longest streak in team history (17x)...the last time they homered multiple times in five straight games was a six-game stretch between April 3-9, 2023 during a franchise record 13-game winning streak to open the season...five different Rays have left the yard in the club's last four contests (**Junior Caminero**, 6; **Cedric Mullins**, 2; **Jonathan Aranda**, 1; **Victor Mesa Jr.**, 1; **Ben Williamson**, 1).

- ★ Mullins has launched five of his eight home runs this year in the month of June...this month, the outfielder has hit safely in 15 of 19 games he has started and reached base in all 19 starts...Mullins has plated an RBI in three straight games (June 26–pres.) and four of his last five games (June 23–pres.).

KEEP IT 100—Yesterday, MLB Pipeline updated the Top 100 Prospects rankings, with notable Rays farmhands moving up on the list...**OF Theo Gillen** [MLB No. 10 | TB No. 1] jumped from No. 39 to No. 10, rising more spots than any other player...he is the No. 2 outfield prospect behind **LAD Josue De Paula** who is the No. 4 overall prospect...**C Nathan Flewelling** [MLB No. 77 | TB No. 2] moved up to No. 77, jumping up from No. 84...additionally, **C Caden Bodine** [MLB No. 99 | TB No. 3] joined the Top 100 after pacing all full-season minor league hitters in average (.360) thus far in 2026...Flewelling and Bodine are ranked as the No. 7 and No. 8 catching prospects, respectively, with the Rays standing as the only organization with multiple catchers ranked among MLB's 10 best prospects at the position.

REAL ROYALTY—The Rays and Royals will complete a seven-game season series over the course of 11 days from June 22–July 2...the clubs split their four-game set at Tropicana Field between June 22-25 and have split each of their last two season sets (3-3 in 2024-25)...the Rays have not lost a season series to Kansas City since 2017 (4-3), going undefeated in the previous seven (5-0-2; clubs did not meet in 2020).

- ★ The Rays closed their last series with the Royals by holding the club hitless through 8.1 innings before **Craig Kimbrel** yielded a two-run homer to **KC Carter Jensen**...it was the third time in club history the Rays opened a game with 8.1 hitless frames, joining April 23, 2022 vs. BOS, when six pitchers combined to hold the Red Sox without a hit through 9.0 innings before yielding a pair of hits in the 10th, and **Matt Garza's** no-hitter on July 26, 2010 vs. DET, which remains the only no-no in club history.

BOOKNOVS—To go with his addition to the MLB Top 100 Prospects, **C Caden Bodine** has been promoted to Double-A Montgomery after just 32 games with Class-A Bowling Green...the backstop slashed .341/.411/.477 (45-for-132) with 6 2B, 4 HR, 30 RBI, and an .888 OPS...he tied the Hot Rods franchise record with an 18-game hitting streak between June 4-25 (also: **Brandon Lowe**, June 25–July 16, 2016).

AWARD SHOW—**RHP Ty Johnson** was named International League Pitcher of the Week (June 22-28) yesterday...in game one of Sunday's doubleheader for Triple-A Durham, Johnson threw 5.0 hitless innings with one baserunner reaching on a walk and a season-high-tying nine strikeouts in the winning effort...he became the fifth Bull since at least 2005 to throw 5.0 hitless innings in a start with one or zero baserunners allowed (last: **Taj Bradley**, April 28, 2024 vs. SWB - 1BB).

TONIGHT'S START—Griffin Jax will toe the rubber tonight for his 12th start and 23rd appearance of the year, including his sixth start and 14th outing at Tropicana Field...marks his 12th straight start after pitching out of the bullpen in each of his first 11 appearances...is the 28th start of his major league career...acquired from the Twins for RHP Taj Bradley on July 31, 2025.

- ✦ Jax has not allowed an extra-base hit in six of his starts this year, tied with rotation-mate Shane McClellan, TOR Dylan Cease, and LAA José Soriano for the most such starts in the AL...in all of MLB, MIL Jacob Misiorowski (9), SD Michael King (7), and MIA Max Meyer (7) have more.
- ✦ Has fashioned a 0.90 ERA (20.0IP, 2ER) across his last four starts since June 7, the third-lowest mark in the majors (min. 15.0IP) and second lowest in the AL during that span behind NYY Cam Schittler (0.76ERA).
- ✦ Jax has struck out four batters or more in five straight outings (June 1-pres.), the longest streak of his career.
- ✦ Five of his seven earned runs allowed in June came off of homers.
- ✦ Boasts a 2.40 ERA (45.0IP, 12ER) with 43 strikeouts in 11 starts compared to an 8.00 ERA (9.0IP, 8ER) with 10 strikeouts in 11 relief appearances this year.

LAST TIME OUT—Spun a season-high-tying 5.0 innings on June 24 vs. KC with five hits, two unearned runs, and a season-high seven strikeouts while earning his second straight win (June 19-pres.)...he has given up two runs or fewer in seven of the eight starts in which he worked 4.0 IP or more.

- ✦ Generated 13 whiffs, his second most this season (14, June 1vs. DET)...his eight whiffs on the changeup were a career high.
- ✦ Jax has walked five batters across his last six starts since May 26, tied for the fourth fewest during that span among AL starters (min. 25.0IP) behind SEA Bryce Miller (3BB), DET Keider Montero (3BB), and SEA Bryan Woo (4BB).
- ✦ Tossed a season-high 88 pitches, his most since Sept. 5, 2021 at TB (w/ MIN) when he threw 89 pitches.

FOUNTAIN OF LEARNING—Jax has appeared in 27 games opposite the Royals in his career, making four starts...he holds a 3-2 record with a 2.72 ERA (43.0IP, 13ER), .218 (34-for-156) opp. average, and 36 strikeouts in those outings...his team has gone 19-8 and provided 5.44 runs of support per 9.0 innings in those appearances.

- ✦ Jax has a 13-13 record with a 3.48 ERA (155.1IP, 60ER) across 110 career outings (12 starts) against AL Central foes...his club has gone 67-43 in his appearances, giving him 5.97 runs of support per 9.0 innings...is 1-1 with a 3.86 ERA (14.0IP, 6ER) with 15 strikeouts across five appearances (three starts) against AL Central clubs this season.
- ✦ Will mark his second straight start against the Royals (June 24)...prior to that start, it was his first against the club since Oct. 2, 2021 at KC, when he earned the win after 5.0 innings of one-run ball in a 4-0 victory.
- ✦ KC Salvador Perez's 20 career AB against Jax are the most among active AL hitters...Perez is batting .100 (2-for-20) lifetime with 1 2B, 1 RBI, 1 BB, 5 SO, and 1 HBP, the second-lowest average among active AL hitters against Jax (min. 10PA).

ROAD WARRIOR—In 14 appearances (five starts) on the road this season, Jax is 1-4 with a 2.96 ERA (27.1IP, 9ER) with 20 strikeouts to 12 walks and a .287 (29-for-101) opp. average...of AL righties (min. 25.0IP) that have made at least five starts on the road this season, his 2.96 ERA ranks ninth...the Rays have lost each of his last four starts on the road, but Jax has gone 0-2 with a 0.53 ERA (17.0IP, 1ER) with 13 SO in those outings...has worked to a 2.54 ERA (63.2IP, 18ER) over 52 career appearances (four starts) against AL Central opponents on the road.

GET JAX UP AND MOVING—This marks the first time Jax has been a regular starter since his 2021 rookie season with the Twins, when he made his final 14 appearances as a member of the Twins rotation after his first four came in relief...he started two games for the Rays last season, working as an opener for Ian Seymour on Sept. 5 vs. CLE before starting a bullpen game on Sept. 10, 2025 at CWS...both starts lasted 1.0 scoreless frame...for his career, he is 5-8 with a 4.56 ERA (116.1IP, 59ER) in 27 starts compared to 21-28 with a 3.70 ERA (294.1IP, 121ER) in 294 relief appearances.

- ✦ Jax spent his first five professional seasons (2016-19, 2021) as a starter...he first transitioned to a full-time relief role in 2022...from 2016-21, 50 of his 55 minor league appearances were starts.

HOW SWEEP IT IS—Jax throws his sweeper 25.3% of the time, the 10th highest mark among major league pitchers (min. 800 pitches)...despite this, his usage rate has dropped 18.7 pct. on the pitch from 2025 (44.0 pct.)...in 2026, he has limited opponents to a .154 (6-for-39) opp. average, fourth lowest in the AL and 10th lowest in the majors (min. 200 sweepers)...under the same parameters, his 40.7 pct. whiff rate on the pitch ranks fourth in the AL and seventh in the majors.

CAPTAIN JAX—Jax is currently a Captain in the U.S. Air Force Reserve, earning the promotion in June 2021, and remains the only Air Force Academy graduate to play in the majors...after his graduation from the Academy in 2017, he made five starts with Class-A Cedar Rapids and Rookie-level Elizabethton during his 60-day leave ahead of his first active duty assignment, departing on July 22 to begin his role as an acquisitions officer working with civilian contractors such as SpaceX and Boeing...the following year, he was accepted into the Air Force World Class Athlete Program, which allows soldiers to train for the upcoming Olympic Games as their active duty job responsibility for a two-year period, allowing him to continue his baseball career while completing his active duty requirement...became eligible for the program when baseball was readmitted for the scheduled 2020 Tokyo Olympics.

- ✦ He completed his active duty requirement and was admitted to the Air Force Reserve in November 2019...was notified of his promotion to Captain on June 5, 2021, the same day he was selected to the Twins major league roster ahead of his MLB debut three days later.

2025 RECAP—Last season, made a career-high 73 appearances (2 starts), tied for sixth most in the AL, between the Twins (50G) and Rays (23G), going a combined 1-7 with a 4.23 ERA (66.0IP, 31ER)...also set career bests in strikeouts (99) and holds (28)...acquired at the July 31 trade deadline for RHP Taj Bradley...of his 99 strikeouts, 97 came as a reliever, fourth most in the AL behind HOU Bryan Abreu (105), CLE Cade Smith (104), and teammate Edwin Uceta (103)...min. 250 BF, ranked second in the majors in chase rate (38.1%) behind CIN Graham Ashcraft (38.3%) and was fifth in whiff rate (37.3%)...joined Abreu as the only pitchers in the majors to make 70 appearances or more each season from 2023-25...his 216 appearances in that timeframe ranked third to SF/NYM Tyler Rogers (226G) and Abreu (220G).
