**TODAY'S GAME:** The St. Louis Cardinals continue their nine-game/10-day road trip to Cleveland (3-0), Pittsburgh (0-2) and Chicago-NL (July 4-6). Today's game is the final game of a three-game series against the Pirates in the Cardinals second and final trip to Pittsburgh. Following this afternoon's game, the Cardinals will fly to Chicago and have an open date on Thursday before opening a three-game series against the Cubs in their first visit to Wrigley Field of the 2025 season.

**THE CARDINAL GOOD-BYE:** This year marks the earliest the Cardinals have wrapped up their road trips to Pittsburgh in franchise history and since 1898 when they played their final game in Pittsburgh on July 6. -Elias Sports Bureau

**RECENT REDBIRDS:** The Cardinals were shutout for the second straight game last night, 1-0, as the Pirates plated a run in their final at-bat. It marked the first time the Cardinals were shutout in consecutive games by the Pirates since August 28-29, 2012 at PNC Park. Cardinals coaches Jon Jay and Daniel Descalso were both on that squad.

**FLIGHT PATTERN:** St. Louis entered today in 3rd place in the National League Central, 4.0 games behind first place Chicago and 1.5 games behind Milwaukee for 2nd place. Since May 4, the Cardinals have the best road record in the National League at 17-10 (.654).

**SERIES-LY SPEAKING:** With last night's loss, the Cardinals have lost their last three series in Pittsburgh. St. Louis last took a series (2-1) from the Pirates at PNC Park, July 2-4, 2024. This season, the Cardinals and Pirates are tied 4-4 with five games to play. After today's game, the Cardinals will host the Pirates for four games at Busch Stadium August 25-28. St. Louis swept Pittsburgh in three games (May 5-7) earlier this season.

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY OLI!:** Cardinals manager **Oliver Marmol** is celebrating his 39th birthday today. Marmol has been the youngest manager in Major League Baseball since he took the reigns of the Cardinals at the start of the 2022 season. He is 3-0 on his July 2nd birthday with wins at Philadelphia (7-6) in 2022, New York-AL (5-1) in 2023 and at Pittsburgh (7-4) in 2024.

**IT'S ALWAYS SONNY:** Starting pitcher **Sonny Gray** will be counted on as a stopper today against the Pirates. In his last 10 starts vs. Pittsburgh, Gray is 7-1 and his team is 9-1 with the lone loss (7-4) on Aug. 19, 2023 as a member of the Minnesota Twins. Gray earned his first win at PNC Park in his last start in Pittsburgh on April 8, 2025, when he threw 5.0 innings allowing one run en route to a 5-3 Cardinals win in 38 degree weather.

**VIC THE STICK:** **Victor Scott II** beat out an infield single in the 3rd inning last night. The single gave him a hit in his first seven games against the Pirates, matching **Albert Pujols** as the last Cardinals player in 2001. The last Cardinals player with a hit in his first eight games vs. Pittsburgh was **Tom Herr** from 1980-81. **Enos Slaughter** holds the franchise record hitting safely in his first 12 games with the Pirates as the opponent in 1938.

**FROM THE ELIAS SPORTS BUREAU:** In the Divisional Era (since 1969), the Cardinals offense's current streak of 40 consecutive innings without scoring a run vs. N.L. Central opponents dating back to June 24 vs. Chicago-NL is the longest such streak for any team vs. divisional opponents in the Divisional Era. The second longest such streak since 1969 was 39 innings by the Colorado Rockies vs. the N.L. West from Sept. 29, 2024-April 14, 2025. The second longest in-season streak since 1969 was 38 innings by the Cincinnati Reds vs. the N.L. Central from Sept. 21, 2024-Sept. 29, 2024. In the Divisional Era, the Cardinals' current streak of four consecutive games being shut out vs. a divisional opponent is the longest such streak by any team vs. its division (there have been no other such divisional streaks of 4+ by any team vs. its division in the Divisional Era).

**MAKING THEM COUNT:** **José Fermín** ran his career-long hitting streak to six games (dating back to 2024), tied with **Yohel Pozo** for the longest active among Cardinals. Fermín extended his streak with only one at-bat 3-of-the-last-4 games and was on a seven-game hit streak when he was recalled from Memphis (AAA) to give him 11 straight games with a hit dating back to Triple-A games.

#### PITTSBURGH CONNECTIONS

**Oliver Marmol** was originally selected by Pittsburgh in the 31st round of the 2004 MLB Draft, but did not sign.

**Victor Scott II** grew up a fan of **Andrew McCutchen** and **Starling Marte** as a child...Scott's father was Pirates fan from Pittsburgh, although Victor II grew up a Braves fan.

**Nolan Arenado** (2009) and **Paul Skenes** (2020) are graduates of El Toro High School in Lake Forest, Calif.

**Miles Mikolas** spent one month as a Pirate during the 2013 offseason...traded by San Diego with **Jaff Decker** to Pittsburgh for **Alex Dickerson** (Nov. 25, 2013), then traded by Pittsburgh to the Rangers for **Chris McGuiness** (Dec. 30, 2013).

Cardinals 2024 first round pick **JJ Wetherholt** graduated from Mars Area (Pa.) High School...coached by **Andy Bednar**, father of **David Bednar**.

**Brant Brown** played in 130 games for the Pirates in 1999 before traded to the Marlins for OF **Bruce Aven** (Dec. 13, 1999)...traded by the Cubs to Pittsburgh for RHP Jon Lieber (Dec. 14, 1998).

**Tommy Pham** was selected by the Cardinals in the 16th round of the 2006 MLB Draft...played parts of his first five seasons in St. Louis (2014-18).

**Willson Contreras** (June 17, 2016 at Wrigley Field), **Sonny Gray** (July 10, 2013 at PNC), **Andre Pallante** (April 10, 2022 at Busch), **Nolan Gorman** (May 20, 2022 at PNC), **Luken Baker** (June 4, 2023 at PNC), and **Matthew Liberatore** (May 21, 2022 at PNC) made MLB debuts vs. the Pirates.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Julián Javier** signed with Pittsburgh as an amateur free agent in 1956...played parts of five seasons in the Pirates minor league organization (1956-60).

TODAY'S GAME:

- The Cardinals Opening Day starter is set to make his 17th start of the season (324th career appearance/315th start).
- Leads the Cardinals staff in percentage of Swings That Miss (26.9%)
- Has 20 career double-digit strikeout games, including three since May 19. Since his career began in 2013, ranks 28th among his peers in 10+ K games.
- Is 5-1 with a 2.76 ERA (4 HR) in 10 home starts and 3-1 with a 4.37 ERA (6 HR) in six road starts.
- Issued one-or-fewer walks in seven of his last eight starts (May 7-present).
- Has six scoreless starts of 6.0 innings or more, 2nd-most in MLB behind Detroit's LHP **Tarik Skubal** (7)
- The Cardinals are 13-3 in his 16 starts this season, with two of his defeats coming in starts against the Mets.
- Sonny's 14 wins at home the past two seasons (2024-2025) are 2nd-most in the majors behind Detroit's **Tarik Skubal** (18). He is 5-1 and St. Louis is 9-1 in his Home starts this season.
- The Cardinals are 19-7 overall in Gray's 26 starts at Busch Stadium since 2024, including an 15-2 mark in his last 17 since Aug. 6, 2024.
- Is one of 11 pitchers in Busch Stadium III history with 200+ strikeouts (208 K). **Trevor Rosenthal** ranks 10th with 244 strikeouts.
- 10 of his 85 hits allowed in 2025 have been homers and **17 of his 37 runs (46%) allowed this season have come via HR's.**
- His 10 HR's allowed have surpassed his season total (8) for all of the 2023 season.
- Over past two seasons since joining St. Louis (2024-25), ranks 5th in strikeouts/ 9 IP (10.52) and 3rd in wins (21) among NL pitchers.
- St. Louis is 30-14 (.681) in his 44 starts with the club since joining in 2024; His record stands at 21-11 while wearing the Birds on the Bat.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Authored a one-hit complete-game shutout masterpiece last Friday at Progressive Park, striking out a season-high 11 Guardians on only 89 pitches in the 5-0 Cardinals win. His only blemish was a two-out Nolan Jones single in the bottom of the 5th inning.

- *Marked Gray's 5th career shutout and first since July 28, 2015 at Los Angeles Dodgers.*
- *It was the 11th time a Cardinal threw a one-hitter, one batter over the minimum since 1901, and first since **Jordan Montgomery** at Wrigley Field on Aug, 22, 2022.*
- *Since pitch counts were accurately kept in 1988, Gray joined **David Cone**'s perfect game (July 18, 1999) as the only two pitchers to throw shutouts of one hit or fewer with 10+ strikeouts in 89 pitches or fewer.*
- *Gray joined Houston's **Framber Valdez** as the only two pitchers this season with complete games of 89 pitches or fewer. The last Cardinal was **Adam Wainwright** at Pittsburgh with an 88-pitch complete game effort on Aug. 11, 2021*

2025:

- Ran off a 14.1 scoreless inning streak, 2nd-longest by a Cardinals pitcher this season (May 31-June 12).
- Went four consecutive starts (May 26-June 6) without allowing a HR, his 2nd-longest streak as a Cardinal (5 from May 26-June 17, 2024).
- Was overpowering in his 5/31 start at TEX, fanning 10, including career strikeout #1,800 of Jake Burger for his 10th & final K that day; Matched his season high with 7.0 scoreless IP for the 3rd time, as the Cardinals won, 2-0.

CAREER NOTES:

- Ranks in the Top 10 among active pitchers in wins (119, 7th), games started (314, 9th), innings pitched (1,831.0, 10th), strikeouts (1,825, 10th) and ERA (3.50, 7th).

GRAY vs. PITTSBURGH

- Making his 14th career start vs. the Pirates and 5th as a member of the Cardinals; It's his 3rd start of the season against the Buccos.
- Was brilliant in an efficient 7.0 scoreless innings (89 pitches) against the Pirates in a 5-0 win on May 7 at Busch Stadium. Allowed just 2 hits and had 4 innings of three up and three down. Was his 8th career start of 7.0+ scoreless IP and 2 or fewer hits allowed.
- Has a 7-4 record with a 3.66 ERA over the previous 13 starts (3-0, 2.19 ERA, 24.2 IP w/STL); **St. Louis has won each of his four games started against Pittsburgh a member of the Cardinals.**
- Improved to 2-0 in 2025 with a 5-3 win over the Pirates on 4/8 at PIT in a match-up vs. **Paul Skenes**; Game time temperature was 38 degrees and snow flurries. Passed 1,750 career innings pitched in that start and won at PNC Park for the 1st time in his career.
- Struck out nine and then eight batters in his two starts last season vs. the Pirates; Earned his lone win 6/12/24 at Busch Stadium tossing 7.0 innings allowing one run with a walk and nine punch outs in a 4-2 'Birds win.
- Has made three career starts (4 app.) at PNC Park and has yet to earn a win at the ballpark. Is 1-1 with a 1.47 ERA over 18.1 innings with 19 strikeouts. He had received just one total run of support over his 1st three appearances at PNC before claiming 5-3 win on 4/8/25.
