**FLIGHT PATTERN:** The St. Louis Cardinals continue their first road trip (at BOS-3, at PIT-3) of the season this weekend, taking on the Boston Red Sox in the second game of a three-game weekend series at Fenway Park ... St. Louis enters today in second place in the National League Central Division, 1/2-game behind the Chicago Cubs.

**IT FEELS LIKE FALL:** The Cardinals have faced the Red Sox in four World Series (1946, 1967, 2004, 2013), winning in seven games in both 1946 and 1967 before losing all four in 2004 and in six games in 2013. The Cardinals 12 World Series games at Fenway Park are their 2nd-most at any road stadium (15 at Original Yankee Stadium) and most by any opponent in Fenway Park history. **BOSTON BRAVES:** The Cardinals also played 11 games against the Boston Braves at Fenway Park during the 1914-15 seasons to accommodate larger crowds before Braves Field was constructed.

**FANTASTIC FINISHES:** The Cardinals have posted six wins in the final at-bat during their regular season series with the Red Sox, four of them occurring at Fenway Park.

• **June 10, 2003 at Boston (Game 1 in Series):** Tied 7-7 in the 9th - **Jim Edmonds** and **Scott Rolen** hit one-out doubles before **Eduardo Perez** singled in Rolen with an insurance run for a 9-7 as **Cal Eldred** closed out the game.

• **June 12, 2003 at Boston (Game 3 in Series):** Tied 5-5 in the 13th inning - The Red Sox intentionally walked **Albert Pujols** with two outs and **Kerry Robinson** on 3rd base. **Jim Edmonds** hit a three-run home run for an 8-5 lead. **Esteban Yan** held the Red Sox to two runs in the bottom half for an 8-7 win.

• **August 5, 2014 at St. Louis (Game 10 in Series):** Tied 2-2 in the 8th inning - **A.J. Pierzynski**, **Oscar Taveras** and **Jon Jay** hit three consecutive two out singles to give St. Louis a 3-2 lead. **Trevor Rosenthal** closed out the 9th inning for his 35th save.

• **May 12, 2023 at Boston (Game 20 in Series):** Trailing 6-5 in the 9th, **Lars Nootbaar** singled in **Paul DeJong**, then **Nolan Gorman** blasted a go-ahead two-run homer for an 8-6 victory as **Ryan Helsley** got the win in an appearance where 19-of-28 pitches registered 100+ MPH.

• **May 13, 2023 at Boston (Game 21 in Series):** Trailing 3-1 in the 9th, after back-to-back walks to lead off the inning, **Nolan Gorman** smacked a pinch-hit RBI double. **Alec Burleson's** pinch-hit fielder's choice resulted in an erratic throw allowing the go-ahead run to score.

• **May 18, 2024 at St. Louis (Game 24 in Series):** Tied 2-2 in the bottom of the 8th - the Cardinals opened their half of 8th with four consecutive singles from **Nolan Arenado**, **Alec Burleson**, **Ivan Herrera** and **Nolan Gorman** to put up a 5-run inning in their final at-bat for 7-2 win.

**DOUBLE-DIGIT HITS:** The Cardinals have recorded 10+ hits in each of their first seven games to start the season, tying their franchise record from 1901 and 1956 ... The 1999 Cleveland Indians hold the MLB record with 10 consecutive double-digit hit totals to begin a season ... St. Louis leads Major League Baseball this season in batting average (.302) and on-base pct. (.377) while ranking 2nd in slugging pct. (.502) and OPS (.879). - *chart left*

**IVÁN THE TERRIBLE:** With four homers over his last two games, **Iván Herrera** is the 8th Cardinal (15th instance) since 1901 to record 4+ HR in a two-game span, first since **Matt Carpenter** (4 HR July 20-21-G1, 2018), and the only one to do so prior to turning age 25 ... Herrera is the 10th Cardinal since 1901 with 4+ homers in their first six games of a season, the first since **Nolan Arenado** (4 in 2022), and the only one to do so age 24 or younger ... Herrera is the first Cardinal to record 9+ RBI over a two-game span since **Matt Holliday** (9 from Aug. 30-G2-31, 2014) ... Is the 6th Cardinal (10th instance) since 1901 age 24 or younger to do so, and first since **Fernando Tatís** in 1999 ... The only other catcher in team history (since 1901) to do so was **Ken O'Dea** (1942) ... Herrera ranks 2nd in MLB this season in slugging (1.100), 3rd in OPS (1.555), and T-4th in homers (4).

**NOOOOOOOOOOT:** **Lars Nootbaar** has reached base safely in 18 of his 35 plate appearances this season, most in the team's first seven games since **Jim Edmonds** (20 times in 2000) and **Mark McGwire** (21 in 1998) ... Nootbaar ranks 6th in MLB in both on-base pct. (.514) and batting average (.414) ... Nootbaar's streak of reaching base safely in all seven games is the longest season-opening stretch by a Cardinals leadoff hitter since 2B **Tommy Edman** (first 14 games of 2021).

#### BOSTON CONNECTIONS

**Lars Nootbaar** and **Masataka Yoshida** were teammates on 2023 Gold medal winning Japan in the 2023 World Baseball Classic.

**Nolan Arenado's** older brother, Fernando Jr., goes by his middle name, Cousy (named in honor Boston Celtics guard **Bob Cousy**).

**Ryan Fernandez** was selected from Red Sox in Rule 5 Draft in Dec., 2023...he was 23rd round draft selection by Boston in 2018.

**Chaim Bloom**, Cardinals Advisor to President of Baseball Operations, was the Red Sox Chief Baseball Officer from Oct. 28, 2019-Sept. 14, 2023.

**Julio Rangel** spent two seasons (2021-22) as the Red Sox Minor League Pitching Coordinator.

**Tanner Houck** was born in St. Louis...graduated from Collinsville (Ill.) High School...pitched three seasons at the University of Missouri (2015-17).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Willie McGee** played in 67 games for the Red Sox in 1995, and appeared in the ALDS vs. Cleveland.

**Carlos Villoria** worked for the Cardinals as a Spanish Interpreter for two seasons (2018-19).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **John Tudor** pitched his first five MLB seasons in Boston (1979-83)...was selected by the Red Sox in the 3rd round of the 1976 MLB January Draft-Secondary Phase.

Red Sox principal owner **John Henry** was born in Quincy, Ill...spent most of his childhood on the family farm in Forrest City, Ark. where he was a Cardinals fan who grew up listening to Harry Caray, Jack Buck, and Joe Garagiola on the radio...was age nine when he saw his first MLB game at Sportsman's Park in St. Louis.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Chris Carpenter** was born in Exeter, NH...graduated from Trinity High School in Manchester, NH.

Red Sox Assistant Hitting Coach **Dillon Lawson** Served as an assistant coach with Lindenwood University (2007-09) and Southeast Missouri State University (2012-15), and as the hitting coach with the University of Missouri (2017).

Red Sox Catching Instructor/Bullpen Catcher **Parker Guinn** previously coached at Southern Illinois Edwardsville University (2015-16).

Red Sox third base coach **Kyle Hudson** played baseball (outfield) & football (wide receiver) at University of Illinois...is from Mattoon, IL.

FanDuel Sports Midwest reporter **Jim Hayes** attended Emerson College in Boston for one year.

St. Louis Post-Dispatch reporter **Lynn Worthy** is from nearby Tyngsborough, Mass...Attended Emerson College & Boston College in Boston.

St. Louis defeated Boston in seven games in the 1946 World Series, highlighted by **Enos Slaughter's** 8th inning "mad dash" in Game 7 at Sportsman's Park.

The Cardinals defeated the Red Sox in seven games in the 1967 World Series...**Bob Gibson** (3-0, 1.00 ERA, 26 K) was WS MVP..

St. Louis lost the 2004 World Series to Boston in four games.

The Cardinals lost to the Red Sox in six games in the 2013 World Series...marked the first World Series since 1999 to feature both #1 seeds from the AL and NL and first since 1958 to feature two teams with identical regular season records.

TODAY'S GAME:

- Making his second start of the season as he makes his 32nd career start in his 140th career game.
- Began the 2024 season on the Opening Day roster as part of the bullpen. Was optioned to Memphis (AAA) on April 21 and was inserted into the starting rotation upon his return on May 26.
- Made 108 relief appearances out of 118. to begin his career.
- Is 10-7 with a 3.86 ERA over 13 starts and 53 career appearances in Day Games.
- Returned to the starting rotation on May 26, 2024 and has led the Cardinals in wins (9), quaifying ERA (3.56) and opponent BA (.231) in 21 starts since.
- As a starting pitcher in 2024 was 8-7 with a 3.56 ERA over 20 starts after going 0-1 with a 6.30 ERA in nine relief appearances in April.
- Ranked 3rd on the Cardinals with eight wins while his 3.78 ERA was the lowest among the club's pitchers with 100 or more innings.
- Established single-season highs in wins (8), games started (20), innings pitched (121.1), strikeouts (94) and quality starts (7).

PALLANTE vs. RED SOX:

- Making his 2nd career start (4th app.) vs. the Red Sox. All appearances have been at Fenway Park.
- Is a career 1-1 with a 2.16 ERA over 8.1 innings pitched.
- Started in his first appearance on June 19, 2022. Suffered the loss (6-4) despite allowing just two runs on four hits over 5.2 innings.
- Appeared in relief twice in 2023, tossing a scoreless appearance both times, recording a Hold with 1.2 scoreless innings (5/12) in relief of Adam Wainwright in an 8-6 win.

2024/CAREER NOTES:

- Made the Cardinals Opening Day Roster for the 4th time (2022-2025).
- Utilized as a hybrid pitcher during his 2022 rookie season with 47 appearances and 10 starts. Led the Cardinals with 62 relief appearances in 2023. Began the 2024 season in the bullpen, was optioned on April 21, and returned to the rotation on May 26 finishing the season with 20 starts as one of the Cardinals most effective starters.
- Established single-season highs in wins (8), games started (20), innings pitched (121.1), strikeouts (94) and quality starts (7) in 2024.
- Since he started his career in 2022, has the 2nd-best ground ball percentage (66.4%) in MLB trailing only **Clay Holmes** (68.6%). min. 130 appearances.
- His first start came in his 18th career appearance, on June 4, 2022 at Chicago Cubs in the second game of a doubleheader. Threw 4.0 innings allowing one run in a no-decision the Cardinals rallied to win in extra innings (7-4).
- Started vs. San Francisco (June 20, 2024) at Rickwood Field in Birmingham, Ala., tossing 5.1 innings in the 6-5 Cardinals win. Was the first Cardinals starting pitcher to earn a win at a neutral site since **Alan Benes** vs. San Diego on April 19, 1997 at Aloha Stadium in Honolulu, Hawaii.
- Pitched for Team Italy in the 2023 World Baseball Classic.

2025 SPRING TRAINING:

- Made five Spring Training starts, including Exhibition Game vs. Memphis (AAA) on Monday, March 24 at AutoZone Park.
- Worked 4.0 IP vs. Memphis on March 24 and threw a spring high 83 pitches; allowed 2 runs in 1st inn., then followed with 3.0 scoreless IP.
- Had four Grapefruit League starts, the last on March 15 vs. TOR when he worked a spring-high 5.0 IP and threw 69 pitches
- Was 2-0, 6.92 ERA in his four Grapefruit League starts, allowing 2 HR's in 13.0 IP with 9 strikeouts.
