**RAYS REPORT**—The Rays continue a 12-game, 14-day road trip against the Angels (2-1), Mariners (3G), Athletics (3G) and Giants (3G) tonight in Seattle...are coming off their first series win since July 18-20 vs. BAL (0-4-0 in prev. 4) and first road series win since June 24-26 at KC (0-6-0 in prev. 6)...have won back-to-back games for the first time since July 18-19...are 3-2 in their last five games, but have lost six of nine, 10 of 14, 16 of 23 and 24 of their last 35 games...are 4-9 so far on a stretch of 19 road games in a 22-game span (July 25-Aug. 17)...started the season 21-26, went an MLB-best 25-9 from May 20-June 26 and are an MLB-worst 11-24 since June 27...are fourth in the AL East for the 28th consecutive day, a season-high-tying 11.0 GB the division-leading Blue Jays and 4.5 GB the Yankees for the ALs third and final Wild Card spot...including off days and the All-Star break, they have spent two days in first, 37 in second, 32 in third, 58 in fourth and four in fifth.

- ✦ The Rays scored in each of the first three innings and homered four times in Wednesday's 5-4, rubber-game win at Angel Stadium, matching their total home runs from their previous six games combined (4HR, July 31-Aug. 5).
- ✦ Between **Christopher Morel** and **Nick Fortes**, it marked the second time this season the Rays eight- and nine-hole hitters both homered, joining June 7 vs. MIA (Jansen/Walls), and the first time on the road since Sept. 17, 2023 at BAL (Gray/Bethancourt).
- ✦ Rays pitchers struck out 16, their second most this season behind July 2 vs. ATH (17SO) and most away from home since Aug. 27, 2024 at SEA (17SO)...the staff has 166 SO in their last 17 games since July 20, leading the majors in strikeouts per 9.0 IP (10.09) and strikeout rate (26.3%) in that span.
- ✦ Tampa Bay has plated five runs or more in consecutive games for the first time since July 5-6...the club's last longer streak was June 13-16 (season-high 4G streak).
- ✦ The Rays lead the majors with 149 SB and are on pace for a franchise-record 208 SB, which would surpass the 2009 team (194SB)...they have stolen a base in five straight, nine of 10 and 16 of their last 19 games since the All-Star break.
- ✦ Under **Kevin Cash** (2015-pres.), the Rays are 167-111 (.601) in August, second in the majors behind the Dodgers (188-94/.667).
- ✦ Puyallup, Wash. native **Drew Rasmussen** will make his fourth career appearance/first start in his home state tonight, going 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA (8.2IP, 1ER) across his previous outings at T-Mobile Park.

**RECENT TRANSACTIONS**—Today, the Rays placed **OF Jonny DeLuca** (left hamstring strain) on the 10-day IL (retro Aug. 7) and selected **OF Tristan Peters** from Triple-A Durham...to make room on the 40-man roster. **RHP Connor Seabold** was designated for assignment...Peters will wear No. 25, and his first appearance will mark his major league debut.

**HAPPY BIRTHDAY!**—**Yandy Diaz** is celebrating his 34th birthday today, and FanDuel Sports Network play-by-play man **Dewayne Staats** is celebrating his 73rd...bench coach **Rodney Linares** turned 48 on yesterday's off day.

**30 FOR 13—Junior Caminero** recorded his third career multi-homer game Wednesday at Angel Stadium, all of which have come this season (also: May 25 at HOU, July 18 vs. BAL)...Caminero, 22, who is in his age-21 season based on his age as of June 30, surpassed **Evan Longoria** (age 23, 2009, 33HR) as the youngest player in Tampa Bay history with a 30-homer season...Caminero is the 20th player since 1901 to hit 30 HR in an age-21-or-younger season...the ninth AL hitter (see table to the right) and the third primary third baseman (min. 50% of games at 3B) joining **ATL Bob Horner** (33HR) in 1979 and the Milwaukee **Braves Eddie Mathews** (47HR) in 1953...he also became the first player in franchise history to record 20 doubles and 30 homers through his first 110 games of a season, regardless of age...he joins **NY Yankees Aaron Judge** (24 2B, 37HR) and **SEA Eugenio Suarez** (20 2B, 37HR) as the only players in the majors with 20 doubles and 30 homers this season.

- ✦ He is the third Dominican-born player to hit 30 HR in an age-21-or-younger season, joining **WSH Juan Soto** (34HR) in 2019 and **STL Albert Pujols** (37HR) in 2001.
- ✦ He reached 100 career RBI in 160 games, third fastest by any player in Rays history behind Longoria (135G) and **Brandon Lowe** (151G)...Caminero (30 2B, 37HR, 101RBI) is the 15th player since 1901 with 30 2B, 35 HR and 100 RBI through his first 160 career games and the second Ray, joining Longoria (47 2B, 38HR, 131RBI).
- ✦ Caminero is on pace for 41 HR, which would mark the second-highest total in Rays history behind **Carlos Peña** (46HR) in 2007...he needs 10 HR in the Rays final 46 games to join **ATL Ronald Acuña Jr.** (41HR, 2019), **Mathews** (47HR, 1953) and **NY Yankees Mel Ott** (42HR, 1929) as the only players in major league history to record 40 HR in an age 21-or-younger season.

**RELIEF RENAISSANCE**—The Rays bullpen has thrown 10.2 straight scoreless innings and has an MLB-leading 1.47 ERA (43.0IP, 7ER) in the last 11 games since July 27...this, after posting a 6.04 ERA (85.0IP, 57ER) over the previous month (June 27-July 26), third worst in the majors...last series in Anaheim, Angels hitters went 2-for-34 (.059) with 16 strikeouts and two walks against Rays relievers.

- ✦ **Pete Fairbanks** (19SV) is one save shy of joining **Roberto Hernandez** (1998-2000) as the only pitchers in Rays history with three 20-save seasons...he is 4-for-4 on save opportunities over his last seven outings, and his 82 career saves are fourth most in franchise history, three shy of third-ranked **Fernando Rodney** (85SV).
- ✦ **Edwin Uceta** has allowed 0 ER over his last nine appearances (13.2IP, striking out nearly half of his batters faced (24 of 49/.49.0%)...**Mason Englert** has a 1.23 ERA (14.2IP, 2ER) over his last 10 outings...**Garrett Cleavinger** has a 7.2 scoreless inning streak.
- ✦ **Alan Seymour** (1.20 ERA/15.0IP, 2ER; 16SO) 1.20 ERA (15.0IP, 2ER) is the first pitcher in Rays history with 15 strikeouts or more and a 1.20-or-better ERA through his first nine career appearances.

**EMERALD CITY SHOWDOWN**—The Rays and Mariners meet for the first of two sets in 2025 this weekend in Seattle before reconvening Sept. 1-3 at Steinbrenner Field...the Rays are 3-1-1 in the last five season series since 2019 (clubs did not meet in 2020) after losing five straight from 2014-18...the clubs split, 3-3, last season, and the home team has won the last four series (2023-pres.)...Tampa Bay limited Seattle to a .189 (35-for-185) average while striking out 12.1 batters per 9.0 IP, its highest mark against any opponent in 2024, but 18 of the 24 runs scored by the Mariners came on 10 HR...the Rays are 6-3 in the last nine matchups and 12-7 in the last 19...they have dropped four of their last five games at T-Mobile Park and are 8-18 (.348) here since 2016, their second-worst record at any AL venue in that span behind Texas' Globe Life Field (4-12/.250)...they have lost six of eight series in Seattle over that timeframe, with the wins coming from May 5-8, 2022 (3-1) and Aug. 9-11, 2019 (3-0).

- ✦ The Rays have homered in 10 straight games at T-Mobile Park (May 5, 2022-pres.), tied with May 22, 2002-Aug. 24, 2004 for their longest streak in the ballpark's history.
- ✦ **Josh Lowe** is 9-for-24 (.375) with 1 2B, 3 HR and 4 RBI in six career games at T-Mobile Park...**Yandy Diaz** has multiple hits in six of his last seven games vs. the Mariners, going 11-for-28 (.393) with 1 2B, 3 HR and 8 RBI in that span.
- ✦ Mariners pitching coach **Pete Woodworth** is a St. Pete, Fla. native...pitching strategist/asst. pitching coach **Danny Farquhar** a Pembroke Pines, Fla. product, made 72 relief appearances with the Rays from 2016-17.
- ✦ **Randy Arozarena** (2019-24), **Miles Mastrobuoni** (2022) and **Luke Raley** (2022-23) are all former Rays...Arozarena became the fourth Ray to be named AL Rookie of the Year in 2021 and was an AL All-Star with the club in 2023 at T-Mobile Park.
- ✦ Rays coordinator, baseball information and communications **Chase Remme** spent the 2024 season with the Mariners baseball communications department.

**WILD WEST**—The Rays current 12-game road trip is their longest since a pair of 12-game treks in 2005: May 30-June 12 (12G, 3G each in OAK, SEA, CIN, PIT) and Aug. 2-14 (12G, 3G each in TEX, LAA, BAL, CLE)...it also marks their first four-city trip since June 2-13, 2011 (SEA, LAA, BAL, DET), which culminated with a one-game make-up in Detroit...they also had a 10-game trip from July 19-29, 2013 in which they traveled through Toronto, Boston and New York (Yankees) before returning to Boston for a make-up game to close the trip.

- ✦ The Rays will travel over 6,200 miles on this trip, venturing from Tampa through Anaheim, Seattle, West Sacramento and San Francisco before returning home.

**YESTERDAY IN RAYS HISTORY**—Yesterday marked the 26th anniversary of **Wade Boggs'** 3,000th hit, a homer off **CLE Chris Haney** which made him the first player in major league history to join the 3,000-hit club via the long ball...the graduate of Tampa's L.B. Plant High School remains the only member of the club to have played for Tampa Bay...exactly 17 years after Boggs reached the milestone, **Ichiro Suzuki** tallied his 3,000th hit with a triple on Aug. 7, 2016 at COL during his three-year stint with the Marlins.

**TONIGHT’S START**—Drew Rasmussen will toe the rubber for his 23rd start of the campaign and ninth on the road...marks the 73rd start (122G) of his career and 38th as a visitor (61G)...marks his fourth career start/ fifth appearance opposite the Mariners...min. 100.0 IP, ranks among AL leaders in opp. SLG (4th, .325), opp. OPS (6th, .598), WHIP (7th, 1.02), ERA (8th, 2.81) , opp. OBP (8th, .273) and opp. average (11th, .218)...the Rays are 11-3 in his last 14 starts...is six strikeouts shy of 400 for his career...signed a two-year contract extension through 2026 with a club option for 2027 on Jan. 7, 2025.

**LAST TIME OUT**—Rasmussen earned his ninth win after tossing 5.1 shutout innings against the Dodgers on Aug. 2 at Steinbrenner Field (W, 5.1IP, 4H, 6SO)...struck out four of his first eight batters faced...allowed just four batters to reach base on singles in the 2nd, 4th, 5th and 6th innings.

- ✦ It marked his longest outing since he worked 5.1 innings of two-run ball on June 19 vs. BAL.
- ✦ Was his eighth scoreless outing of 5.0 innings or more this season (last: June 25 at KC - 5.0IP), tied with PIT Paul Skenes and LAD Yoshinobu Yamamotu for second most in the majors behind DET Tarik Skubal (9GS), the Rays are 7-1 in those starts.
- ✦ Since May 17, Rasmussen is 8-1 with a 2.47 ERA (65.2IP, 18ER) and a 1.01 WHIP...the eight wins are tied for third most in the AL and tied for fifth most in the majors over that span...min. 65.0 IP, his 2.47 ERA over that stretch is fourth best in the AL.
- ✦ Rasmussen has allowed three runs or fewer in 19 of 22 starts this season and one or zero runs in 12 of 22.

**THREADING THE SPACE NEEDLE**—Rasmussen will be making his fourth career start (5G) against Seattle, most recently allowing one unearned run over a 2.0-inning start on Aug. 28, 2024 at T-Mobile Park (2.0IP, 2H, R, 2SO)...he is 2-0 with a 0.61 ERA (14.2IP, 1ER), 20 SO, a 0.82 WHIP and a .180 (9-for-50) opp. AVG over his four appearances against the Mariners, with both wins coming in starts vs. the club (2-0, 0.69 ERA/13.0IP, 1ER).

- ✦ He is 8-3 with a 2.89 ERA (74.2IP, 24ER), 77 SO, a 0.94 WHIP and a .200 (55-for-275) opp. AVG in 18 career outings (14GS) against AL West clubs...this season, he is 1-0 with a 3.46 ERA (13.0IP, 5ER), a 0.85 WHIP and a .196 (9-for-46) opp. AVG in three starts against the division.

**CATCHING FLIGHTS**—The Rays are 5-2 when Rasmussen starts on the road this season, having won five straight from April 24–July 6...over that five-start span, he was 3-0 with a 3.52 ERA (23.0IP, 9ER) and 20 strikeouts to four walks...across his eight road starts this season, opposing hitters are slashing .238/.288/.369 (31-for-130) with five doubles and four home runs...he has allowed one or zero runs in five of the eight contests and spun one quality start on May 17 at MIA...in 37 career road starts, he is 15-5 with a 2.95 ERA (165.0IP, 54ER), a .238 (147-for-617) opp. average and 135 strikeouts.

- ✦ He is 2-0 with a 2.57 ERA (14.0IP, 4ER) over his last four starts on the road dating back to June 25 at KC...the Rays are 3-1 in that span and 6-2 overall in 2025 when he starts on the road.

**SLUG STOPPER**—Rasmussen has allowed only two extra-base hits (2 2B) across his last four starts, holding opponents to a .262 slugging pct. ...his last outing on Aug. 2 vs. LAD marked Rasmussen's MLB-leading 10th start of 5.0 IP or more with no extra-base hits allowed, surpassing David Price in his 2012 Cy Young-winning campaign for the most such starts in a season in franchise history...marks the most such starts by an AL pitcher over an entire season since HOU Justin Verlander (12GS) in 2022...Rasmussen has not allowed an extra-base hit in his last two starts spanning 10.1 IP...min. 100.0 IP, his .325 opp. slugging pct. on the season ranks fourth in the AL and eighth in the majors.

**FROZE HIM**—Rasmussen is tied with four others for fifth in the AL with 37 called strikeouts behind NYY Will Warren (45), CLE Tanner Bibee (44), ATH Luis Severino (40) and HOU Hunter Brown (39)...19 of the 37 (51.4%) called strikeouts have come on his sinker...in his last 14 starts, 22 of his 58 strikeouts have been looking.

**HEAT CHECK**—Rasmussen throws fastballs (cutter, sinker, four-seamer) 89.5 pct. of the time, the highest rate among major league starters (min. 500 pitches thrown in starts)...among all hurlers with 500 pitches thrown or more this season, only NYY Tim Hill (95.3%) and LAA Kenley Jansen (91.3%) have a higher usage rate on heaters than Rasmussen.

- ✦ Opponents are hitting .219 (78-for-356) against his fastballs in 2025, including a .175 (21-for-120) clip against his cutter...min. 100 AB ending with cutters, it signals the second-lowest mark in the majors behind Jansen (172).

**GOING STREAKING**—Rasmussen's 23.0 scoreless inning streak from May 17–June 3 was tied for the fifth-longest single-season run in club history, trailing runs by J.P. Howell (27.1IP, 2012), Alex Cobb (24.2IP, 2014), Kevin Kelly (24.1, 2024) and Taj Bradley (24.0IP, 2024)...only Cobb's and Bradley's streaks came as starting pitchers...Rasmussen tallied five scoreless innings or more in a franchise-record four consecutive starts during the streak.

**BEST OF THE BEST**—Min. 350.0 IP, Rasmussen's 2.74 ERA (384.0IP, 117ER) since debuting with the Rays on June 19, 2021 ranks second in the majors, just behind NYY Max Fried (2.74)...under the same parameter, he also leads the majors in opp. OPS (.588), is third in opp. slugging pct. (.321) and fourth in WHIP (1.03) and opp. on-base pct. (.266).

- ✦ Rasmussen (2.93) is one of 12 active major league pitchers with 400.0 IP or more and an ERA of 3.00 or lower in his career...he is one of four to accomplish the feat while starting in at least half of his appearances, joining LAD Clayton Kershaw (2.52), TEX Jacob DeGrom (2.55), and LAD Shohei Ohtani (2.98).
- ✦ Rasmussen did not yield an extra-base hit in 21.2 IP from March 31–April 24...per Stats Perform, his streak with 0 XBH was the longest by a starting pitcher to begin a season in Rays history, and tied for second longest by any Rays pitcher with Kyle Farnsworth (21.2IP) in 2012, trailing only J.P. Feyerisen (24.1IP) in 2016...it marks the fourth-longest streak by a Rays starter at any point in a season.

TOMORROW’S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP JOE BOYLE (1-1, 2.30)
