TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 6 game homestand with the second of 3 games against the Kansas City Royals (0-1)...Seattle will also host the Atlanta Braves (3 G, 5/4-6) on the homestand...the Mariners are coming off a 6 game road trip where they captured series wins at St. Louis (3-0) and at Minnesota (2-1)...tonight's game will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Dave Valle** on the call with **Angie Mentink** serving as field reporter...the game will also be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped last night's series opener against the Royals by a 7-6 score...despite the loss, Seattle is 6-2 over its last 8 games and 8-4 over its last 12 games...the Mariners are 5-2 over their last 7 series (4/10-c), including series sweeps against the Astros (4 G) and Cardinals (3 G) during that span.

- **Programming Note** - Sunday's series finale against the Royals will be broadcast on both **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** and **ESPN Radio**.
- **Good Cup of Joe** - **Connor Joe** last night hit his first home run of the season...after going 0-for-5 in his first 5 plate appearances following his selection from Triple-A Tacoma on April 8, he is batting .364 (4x11) with 2 runs, 1 double, 1 home run and 3 RBI over his last 4 games (4/19-c).
- **He's Raleigh Strong** - **Cal Raleigh** has hit 5 home runs over his last 10 games (4/20-c), T-2nd most in MLB since April 20.
- **Patient at the Plate** - **J.P. Crawford** ranks 5th in the Majors with an 18.9% walk rate this season...Seattle's 130 walks this season rank T-6th in MLB.

RANDY JOHNSON'S NUMBER 51 RETIRED...**Randy Johnson's #51** is being retired tonight during a pregame ceremony, where he will join fellow Hall of Famers **Ken Griffey Jr. (#24)**, **Edgar Martinez (#11)**, **Ichiro Suzuki (#51)** and **Jackie Robinson (#42)** as the only numbers retired by the Mariners...Johnson will be the 14th player in MLB history to have his number retired by multiple teams, and his and Ichiro's #51 will be the 8th number to be retired by the same team for multiple players (in addition to #42 which is retired across Major League Baseball)...Randy was inducted into the Mariners Hall of Fame in 2012 and the National Baseball Hall of Fame in 2015...the Arizona Diamondbacks retired his #51 in 2015.

J-ROD'S POWER SURGE...**Julio Rodríguez** last night went 2-for-4 with a pair of home runs and 4 RBI for his 8th career multi-homer game and first since Sept. 6, 2026 at Atlanta...over his last 19 games (4/11-c), Julio is batting .342 (26x76) with 11 runs, 6 doubles, 4 home runs, 14 RBI, 6 walks, 3 stolen bases and a .398 OBP, slugging .579 for a .977 OPS...during that span, his 26 hits rank T-4th in the Majors and his 9 multi-hit games rank T-3rd.

BIG 'EM...starter **Emerson Hancock** has been solid to begin his 2026 campaign, going 2-1 with a 2.86 ERA (11 ER, 34.2 IP) with 32 strikeouts, 6 walks and a 0.98 WHIP...he has posted a 5.33 strikeout-to-walk rate that ranks 5th among qualified starters in the Majors this season...his 4.5% walk rate also ranks 5th-lowest in MLB, trailing **Bryan Woo** and **Tarik Skubal-DET**, who lead the Majors with a 3.6% walk rate.

THE YOUNG FACTOR...over his last 14 games (4/16-c), **Cole Young** is batting .353 (18x51) with 8 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 10 RBI, 3 walks, 2 stolen bases and an .844 OPS...the 22-year-old ranks T-6th among all position players with 1.8 Wins Above Replacement (*Baseball-Reference*) this season, along with **Mike Trout-LAA**, **Aaron Judge-NYY** and **Andy Pages-LAD**...Young also leads second basemen and ranks 2nd in MLB with 9 defensive runs saved... last night, Young snapped a 6 game streak of RBIs (4/24-29), the longest streak by a Mariners player since **Eugenio Suarez's** franchise record streak in 2023 (10 G).

LATE-INNING RALLIES...the Mariners offense has been clutch late in the game this season, tallying an MLB-leading 15 go-ahead or game-tying hits in the 7th inning or later this season...**Julio Rodríguez** last night recorded his 3rd such hit of the season on his 2-run home run in the 7th inning, which ranks T-2nd in the Majors...**Cole Young** leads MLB hitters with 5 go-ahead or game-tying hits in the 7th inning or later this season...since his debut in 2022, Rodríguez has also amassed 6 career game-tying home runs in the 7th inning or later, tied for most in the Majors during that span.

SWING KINGS...since April 10, the Mariners offense has averaged 5.0 runs per game while batting .264 (176x667) with 33 doubles, 2 triples, 27 home runs, 98 RBI and 81 walks, getting on base at a .349 clip and slugging .441...during that span, the Mariners rank T-4th in MLB in batting average, 2nd in OBP, 4th in OPS (.790), T-5th in slugging percentage and 2nd in wRC+ (127).

JUST JOSHING AROUND...over his last 11 games (4/17-c), first baseman **Josh Naylor** is batting .390 (16x41) with 2 doubles, 2 home runs, 8 RBI, 5 walks and 4 stolen bases, slugging .585 with a 1.032 OPS...since Naylor made his Mariners debut on July 25, 2025, he is 23-for-25 in stolen base attempts, ranking T-7th in the Majors and 5th in AL in stolen bases over that span.

HOMESTAND HIGHLIGHTS...the Mariners continue their 6 game homestand against the Royals (3 G, 5/1-3) and Braves (3 G, 5/4-6)...headlining the homestand is **Randy Johnson Number Retirement Night** tonight...additionally, the Mariners will wrap up their **'80s Weekend (5/1-3)** celebrations with **'80s Pin Day** tomorrow...fans can also enjoy **Mariners Value Games** during each game of the Braves series (5/4-6)...visit Mariners.com/Tickets for more information.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Julio Rodríguez** last night hit his 3rd and 4th home runs of the season, a 2-run shot in the 1st inning and a game-tying, 2-run homer in the 7th inning...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...it marked Rodríguez's 8th career multi-homer game, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that Julio has hit 29 of his 116 career home runs in the 1st inning, which ranks 9th most in the Majors since his MLB debut in 2022?...Julio has hit more home runs in the 1st inning than any other inning during his career...additionally, since 2022, Seattle batters have hit 124 first inning homers, the 4th-most such home runs in MLB behind the Yankees (163 HR), Dodgers (149) and Braves (142).

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - MAY 2

- **1997** - **Randy Johnson** wins his 16th consecutive decision in an 8-1 win vs. Milwaukee, leaving him one shy of the AL record.
- **2002** - **Mike Cameron** makes history by belting four home runs in four consecutive at-bats in a 15-4 win at Chicago...he becomes the 11th player in MLB history and the first player in franchise history to accomplish the feat...additionally, **Bret Boone** and **Mike Cameron** become the first teammates ever to hit back-to-back home runs twice in the same inning.
- **2003** - **Edgar Martinez** collects his 2,000th career hit with a single to left in the 6th inning off Chicago's **Gary Glover** in the Mariners 9-2 win at U.S. Cellular Field.
- **2018** - **James Paxton** tallied a career-high 16 strikeouts, the most strikeouts by a Mariners pitcher since **Randy Johnson** tallied 19 strikeouts on Aug. 8, 1997 vs. Chicago-AL...became one of 3 pitchers in Mariners history with 16+ strikeouts while pitching at least 7.0 scoreless innings.
- **2023** - **Bryce Miller** makes MLB Debut at Oakland, setting the franchise record with 10 strikeouts in his first career appearance...also became the 3rd pitcher in MLB history to strike out 10+ without walking a batter in his debut.

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 7th start of the season and the 38th start of his career...this will be his 44th career appearance including the 6 relief appearances he made throughout the 2025 regular season...it will mark his 1st start against the Royals this season, 4th career appearance and 3rd career start against Kansas City.
- Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Scott Hunter on June 25, 2020.
- Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20...in 2020, was named Vince Dooley Athlete of the Year as the top male student-athlete at the University of Georgia.
- Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

LAST TIME OUT...in his 3rd road start of the season on April 26 at St. Louis, completed 6.0 innings of work allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 7 hits (2 HR) and 2 walks while striking out 4 batters...he threw 94 pitches and 53 strikes...is 1-of-9 pitchers in 2026 to have made a league-high 4 starts with 2-or-fewer runs and 2-or-fewer walks allowed over 6.0+ IP in their first 5 starts.

CAREER STRETCH...over his last 6 starts he has struck out 32 batters while walking 6 and allowing only 36 base runners, all career best marks over a 6-game span in a single season.

HOME TURF...Across his last 6 appearances at home (9/10/25-4/20/26) he is 3-0 with a 2.28 ERA (6 ER, 23.2 IP), 3 walks and 26 strikeouts for a .866 K/BB and a 0.732 WHIP...in 3 appearances in 2026, he is 2-0 with 3-or-fewer runs allowed over 5.0+ IP in all 3 appearances...ranks 6th in WHIP (.88), 5th in SO/BB (5.7) and 11th in opponent average (.204) in home games in the AL this season (min. 15 IP)...he has allowed 3-or-fewer runs in 18 of his 22 career starts at T-Mobile Park, tossing 5.0+ innings in 16 starts.

HOT OFF THE BAT...is the 8th Mariners pitcher to record 32+ strikeouts and 6-or-fewer walks through their first 6 games of the season (last: Logan Gilbert, 2025)...is 1-of-4 pitchers this season to have done so (also: Cam Schlichtler-NYY, Kevin Gausman-TOR, Tarik Skubal-DET)...through his first 6 starts owns a 8.3 K/9 and a 24.2 K%, both marks outpacing his 6.4 K/9 and 16.6 K% recorded in 2025, both career-highs.

QUALITY CONTROL...has recorded a quality start in 4 of his 6 starts this season...is 1-of-3 pitchers in 2026 to have 3 quality starts with 1-or-fewer walks and 5+ strikeouts (also: Bryan Woo-SEA, Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD)...the Mariners are 9-4 when Hancock logs a quality start since 2023 and are 7-2 since the start of 2025.

NO FREE PASSES...is 1-of-5 pitchers this season to have allowed 2-or-fewer walks over 5.0+ IP in each of their first 6 starts...his 4.5 BB% ranks 5th in the AL in 2026 (min. 30.0 IP)...has contributed 4 starts with 5.0+ IP and 1-or-fewer walks to a Mariners pitching staff that leads the league in such games (15) in 2026.

LENGTH ON THE MOUND...has tossed 6.0+ innings in 14 of his 37 career starts, including 6 times during the 2025 season and already 4 times in the 2026 season (last: 4/26 at STL)...the Mariners are 9-5 when he tosses 6.0+ innings compared to 14-11 when he tosses less than 6.0 innings...has also tossed 5.0+ innings in 28 of 37 career starts, doing so in all 6 of his starts this season.

LEFTIES IN CHECK...has allowed only 13 hits to left-handed batters this season, ranking T-5th in MLB (min 15.0 IP)...he has walked only 3 lefties while striking out 15 for a 5.00 K/BB, ranking 4th in MLB (min. 15.0 IP).

NO HITS HERE...in his first start of the 2026 season on March 29 vs Cleveland he threw a career high 9-strikeouts over 6.0 no-hit innings...he became the 2nd player in franchise history to toss 9+ SO without a hit allowed, joining Félix Hernández who threw 12 SO in his Perfect Game on Aug. 15, 2012 vs. Tampa Bay... is the first Mariners starter with 6.0+ IP and no hits allowed since James Paxton's threw a no-hitter (5/8/18 at TOR).

EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT...became the third pitcher in Mariners history and the second starter to record 7-or-more strikeouts with no walks in 4.0-or-less innings pitched on 9/25/25 against Colorado (also: Yusei Kikuchi as a starting pitcher, 6/5/21 at LAA, and Roy Thomas as a relief pitcher, 4/23/1983 at DET).

LIGHTS OUT...was one of 4 Mariners pitchers to toss 7.0+ shutout innings during the 2025 season after doing so in his July 15 start against the Guardians, joining Luis Castillo (done 2x, 5/19 at CWS and 7/5 vs. PIT), Bryan Woo (6/17 vs. BOS) and George Kirby (8/12 at BAL).
