TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue the current 6-game homestand with the first of a 3-game set against the Chicago White Sox...Seattle also hosted the San Diego Padres on the homestand (0-3)...The Mariners previously wrapped up a winning road trip (4-3) against the Chicago White Sox (1-2) and Houston Astros (3-1)...tonight's tilt will be televised live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Angie Mentink** on the call and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** serving as field analyst...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners lost yesterday's series finale against the Padres by an 8-3 final...the Mariners are 12-11 over their last 23 games since April 22.

- **On a Stroll** - The Mariners are one of 4 teams in the Majors this season to rank in the top 10 in both most walks by an offense and fewest walks allowed by a pitching staff, along with the Cubs, Yankees and Dodgers.
- **Young and Spry** - Second baseman **Cole Young**'s 11 defensive runs saved lead MLB infielders and rank T-2nd in the big leagues among all positions.
- **Juliooooo** - **Julio Rodríguez** is batting .286 (30x105) with 15 runs, 6 doubles, 6 home runs, 13 RBI, 6 walks and 4 stolen bases over his last 25 contests (4/20-c).
- **Series Highlights** - During the current series against the White Sox, fans can enjoy **Josh Naylor Bobblehead 2-Day Giveaway** (tonight and tomorrow) as well as **Mariners Value Games** (5/18-20) with tickets starting under \$12.

COLT EMERSON MAKES MLB DEBUT...infield prospect **Colt Emerson** made his Major League debut yesterday after being recalled from Triple-A Tacoma prior to the series final against the Padres...in a corresponding move, INF/OF **Brendan Donovan** was placed on the 10-day Injured List (retroactive to May 16, left groin muscle strain)...Emerson is ranked as the Mariners #1 prospect, and the #6 overall prospect in MLB, according to *MLB Pipeline*...he is also ranked as the #3 overall prospect by *Baseball America*...in 38 games with Triple-A Tacoma this season, he hit .255 (37x145) with 26 runs, 8 doubles, 1 triple, 7 home runs, 26 RBI and 17 walks, reaching base at a .347 clip and slugging .446 for an .837 OPS.

THE WAY YOU WOO...in 9 starts to begin the season, RHP **Bryan Woo** is 3-2 with a 3.91 ERA (23 ER, 53.0 IP) with just 10 walks, 47 strikeouts and a 1.00 WHIP...among qualified starters in the Majors this season, he ranks 8th in walks-per-9 innings (1.70), T-5th in lowest walk rate (4.7%) and T-5th in fewest walks allowed (10) along with rotation mate **Emerson Hancock** (also: 2 others).

ANSWERING THE CALL...the Mariners bullpen ranks 3rd in MLB with a 3.08 ERA (52 ER, 152.0 IP) this season, narrowly trailing the Rangers (3.03 ERA) and Braves (3.04 ERA)...they have allowed just 11 home runs and 57 walks over 152.0 innings, both ranking 3rd lowest among Major League bullpens this season...Seattle has gotten outstanding contributions from LHP **José A. Ferrer** (1.71 ERA, 22 G) and RHP **Eduard Bazarzo** (2.21 ERA, 22 G) who both rank T-7th in the Majors with 22 appearances...RHP **Cooper Criswell** holds a 2.79 ERA (6 ER, 19.1 IP) and RHP **Nick Davila** has not allowed an earned run in 6 appearances (6.1 IP) since being selected from Triple-A Tacoma on May 2.

NAYLING IT...over his last 25 games since April 17, **Josh Naylor** is batting .347 (35x101) with 10 runs, 5 doubles, 3 home runs, 14 RBI, 11 walks, 10 stolen bases and a .407 OBP while slugging .485 for a .892 OPS...during that span, he ranks T-5th in the Majors in average and 3rd in stolen bases...Naylor is 29-for-31 (93.5%) in stolen base attempts since joining Seattle, ranking 1st in franchise history in stolen base percentage (min. 25 attempts), ranking ahead of James Jones (93.3%) and teammate **Victor Robles** (92.5%).

THIS IS RANDY'S WORLD...over his last 11 games (5/6-c), **Randy Arozarena** is batting .415 (17x41) with 8 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 6 RBI, 3 walks, 4 stolen bases and 3 hit-by-pitches, getting on base at a .479 clip, slugging .537 with a 1.016 OPS in 48 plate appearances...overall this season, the Mariners left fielder's .301 batting average ranks T-5th among qualified American Leaguers and his 12 stolen bases rank T-8th in MLB and T-5th in the AL.

A RALEY STRONG FORCE...**Luke Raley** is batting .269 (32x119) with 19 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 10 homers, 27 RBI and 8 walks, getting on base at a .336 clip, slugging .571 with a .907 OPS...over his last 11 games (5/4-c), Raley is hitting .333 (10x30) with 8 runs, 5 homers, 14 RBI and 3 walks with 1.262 OPS...on May 8 at the White Sox, Raley became one of 16 players in franchise history to record 7+ RBI...his 7 RBI are also the most by a player in the Majors this season.

SOLID ON THE MOUND...the Mariners pitching staff has been solid this season, posting a combined 3.75 ERA (178 ER, 427.1 IP) with an MLB-fewest 122 walks and 407 strikeouts...among Major League pitching staffs they rank 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.34), 1st in fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.57), 7th in ERA and T-8th in WHIP (1.23)...Mariners starting pitching leads MLB with 275.1 innings pitched and ranks 5th in strikeouts with 258.

BIG TEX IS BACK...RHP **Bryce Miller** made his season debut on Wednesday night in Houston, tossing 5.1 innings and allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 8 hits (1 HR) and 1 walk with 3 strikeouts...he was activated off the Injured List prior to the game after missing the start of the season with a left oblique strain...he made 4 rehab starts between High-A Everett and Triple-A Tacoma before being reinstated, where he posted a 1.98 ERA (3 ER, 13.2 IP) with 14 strikeouts.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Bryan Woo** has been stellar since making his Major League debut in 2023, going 31-17 with a 3.29 ERA (164 ER, 448.2 IP), 90 walks and 439 strikeouts over 79 career starts, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...that since 2023, Woo ranks among the Major League leaders in numerous statistical categories?...he ranks 2nd in WHIP (0.98) behind only Tarik Skubal-DET (0.91), T-4th in fewest walks allowed, T-6th in walks-per-9 innings (1.81), 8th in strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.88) and 9th in ERA among starters (min. 400 IP) during that span.

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - MAY 18

- **1985** - Ivan Calderon's 8th-inning, pinch-hit home run off Baltimore's Tippy Martinez gave the Mariners an 8-7 win at the Kingdome.
- **1991** - Pat Rice wins his Major League debut 4-1 in Yankee Stadium...Rice, who arrived in New York just in time to pitch went 5.2 innings and did not allow a run.
- **1999** - Edgar Martinez connects for 3 home runs, bringing his 2-day home run total to 5, tying ML record (22nd time, 10th AL) vs. Minnesota.
- **2008** - Ichiro records career stolen base #291 vs. San Diego, setting the club SB record, passing Julio Cruz (290 SB).
- **2012** - Kevin Millwood throws a 2-hit complete-game shutout at Colorado in the Mariners 4-0 win. Millwood threw his 6th career shutout, but first since Aug. 1, 2003. Kyle Seager goes 2-for-3 with 2 RBI and Mike Carp hits his 3rd home run.
- **2021** - Mariners are no-hit by Spencer Turnbull in a 5-0 Detroit win...second time in club history they have been no-hit twice in the same season.

ABOUT BRYAN WOO...

- The 26-year-old right-handed pitcher is set to make his 10th start of the season and his 80th career start...is also making his first start against the White Sox this season and the 5th of his career.

LAST TIME OUT...W#3 on May 12 at Houston, tossing 6.0 innings and allowing 2 runs (2 ER) on 4 hits with 2 walks and 9 strikeouts...he threw a career-high 104 pitches (74 strikes) in his 9th start of the year, surpassing his previous career-high 103 pitches thrown on July 10, 2025 at New York-AL...marked his 3rd consecutive start of 6.0+ innings.

PLENTY OF PUNCHIES...has thrown 6.0 innings with 9 strikeouts in each of his last 2 starts (5/6-c) and in 3 total starts this season (also: 3/28 vs. CLE)...his 9 starts of 6.0+ IP and 9+ strikeouts since 2025 are tied for the 3rd-most in MLB across that span.

EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT...currently averages 14.5 pitches per inning this season, the 5th fewest among qualified starting pitchers...is currently averaging 14.8 pitches per inning across his career, tied for the fewest P/IP among starters since 2023 (min. 400 IP), alongside Tarik Skubal-DET and Cristopher Sanchez-PHI.

AGAINST THE WHITE SOX...owns a 1.74 ERA (4 ER, 20.2 IP) with 2 walks and 24 strikeouts across 4 career starts against the White Sox...has not allowed more than 2 runs or more than 1 walk in each of his 4 starts against CWS with the Mariners going 4-0 with Woo on the mound...in his last start vs. the White Sox (8/5/25 at T-Mobile Park), he tossed 7.0 innings, allowing 1 run (1 ER) on 2 hits (1 HR), no walks and 9 strikeouts.

GOOD TO BE HOME...among pitchers with 200+ IP at home since 2023, he leads MLB in WHIP (0.844), ranks 2nd in SO/BB (6.46), 4th in ERA (2.73), and 4th in BB/9 (1.52)...his 14 quality starts at home since 2025 are tied for 2nd-most in MLB across that span.

LEONARDO DA WOOSKI...has thrown 6.0+ IP with 1-or-fewer hits in 2 starts this season (4/3 at LAA and 5/6 vs. ATL)...is 1-of-4 pitchers with multiple games of 6.0+ IP and 1-or-fewer hits allowed this season, joining Michael McGreevy-STL, Chris Sale-ATL, and Paul Skenes-PIT...his 5 games of 6.0+ IP and 1-or-fewer hits allowed since last year are most in MLB across that span, ahead of Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD (4 G).

WOOOOO...has tossed 7.0+ innings in 3 starts this season (last: 4/19 vs. TEX)...threw 7.0 shutout innings, allowing just 1 hit on April 3 at LAA, his 3rd career start tossing 7.0+ IP with 1-or-fewer hits...his 3 such starts are tied for the most such games in MLB since the start of last season (also: Yoshinobu Yamamoto-LAD).

MAY FLOWERS...May is historically a high performing month as he holds a 2.46 ERA (23 ER, 84.0 IP) with an 8.88 strikeout-to-walk ratio (71 SO, 8 BB) and a 0.810 WHIP while limiting batters to a .196 average (60x306) across 14 career starts in the month of May...among pitchers with 10+ GS in May since 2023, he leads MLB in fewest walks-per-nine (0.68) and ranks 2nd in both WHIP (0.810) and SO/BB ratio (8.88), trailing Tarik Skubal-DET in both categories (0.729 WHIP, 14.0 SO/BB)...has tossed 6.0+ IP in 12 of those 14 starts in May, including 10 quality starts.

QUALITY STUFF...has tossed a quality start in 6 of his 9 starts this season and in each of his last 2 starts (5/6-c)...threw a quality start in 21 of his 30 starts last season, tied for 4th-most in the Majors that season...his 27 quality starts since 2025 are the most in MLB, ranking ahead of Max Fried-NYY, Framber Valdez-2Tms, and Tarik Skubal-DET who each have 26 quality starts since 2025.

FEW FREE PASSES...has issued just 10 walks across 53.0 innings and 9 starts this season...his 1.70 walks-per-nine innings this season ranks 7th-best in MLB and trails teammate Emerson Hancock (6th, 1.68 BB/9)...his 4.7 walk percentage this season is tied for 4th-best in the Majors, alongside Davis Martin-CWS...among qualifying pitchers since 2025, he also ranks 2nd in both walks-per-nine (1.73) and walk percentage (4.9%) and 4th in strikeouts-to-walk ratio (5.33)...in addition, he has tossed 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer walks in 7 of his 9 starts this season and in 34 starts since 2025 which leads MLB across that span.

WATCH ME WHIP...his 1.00 WHIP this season ranks 6th-best among American League pitchers while teammate Emerson Hancock's 1.01 WHIP ranks T-7th alongside Max Fried-NYY...Woo's 0.983 career WHIP is also the lowest in franchise history (min. 400 IP) and is the 3rd-best mark in MLB among qualified pitchers since 2023, trailing Tarik Skubal-DET (0.91) and Paul Skenes-PIT (0.91).

WOO HOLDS THE TRIDENT...his 3.29 career ERA (164 ER, 448.2 IP) is a franchise best mark among Mariners starters (min. 75 GS), ranking ahead of Randy Johnson, Félix Hernández, Hisashi Iwakuma, and James Paxton who each hold a 3.42 career ERA.

FIRST HALF WARRIOR...is 15-8 with a 3.07 ERA (84 ER, 246.1 IP), 228 strikeouts and a 0.958 WHIP across 43 career starts pre All-Star Break...his 0.958 WHIP in the first half ranks 3rd-best in MLB since 2023 (min. 200 IP), trailing Tarik Skubal-DET (0.857) and Paul Skenes (0.864).

LAST SEASON...he threw 6.0+ innings in all 18 starts before last year's All-Star break, while posting a 2.75 ERA (35 ER, 114.2 IP) with 109 strikeouts and 21 walks...his 2.75 ERA last year was the 6th-best by a starting pitcher in the first half (min. 15 GS) in franchise history, while his 0.93 WHIP ranked 3rd-best (1st: Logan Gilbert, 0.87 in 2024).
