HERE'S THE RUB: The Detroit Tigers and Chicago White Sox this afternoon play the rubber match of their three-game set after splitting the first two games of this weekend series at Comerica Park ... overall this season, the Tigers have gone 11-6 in their 17 rubber matches into today, including wins in 10 of their last 14 such games ... after today's finale, the Tigers embark on a two-city, six-game road trip to play the New York Yankees (September 9-11) and Miami Marlins (September 12-14).

- The Tigers have reached 46 home wins this year for the first time since going 51-30 here in 2013 ...with 43 home wins a season ago, the Tigers have now guaranteed back-to-back winning home campaigns for the first time since a six-year run from 2009-2014.
- Detroit boasts an 8.5-game lead in the A.L. Central over Kansas City (73-69), the largest lead of any club in any division and a leisurely stroll from where it was at the All-Star Break when the club was 11.5-games up on the Twins and 12.0-games up on the Guardians/Royals.
- The Tigers are 29-16 (.644) vs. the A.L. Central this season, the best intradivision mark in the A.L. and trailing only the Dodgers (26-13 vs. the N.L. West) for the best in the majors.
- The Tigers (82-61) enter the day half-a-game behind Toronto (82-60) for the best record in the American League but are otherwise 2.5 games up on New York (79-63), 4.0 games up on Boston (78-65) and 4.0 games up on Houston (78-65), the leader of the A.L. West.

RISPY BUSINESS: The Tigers are batting .272 (145-for-534) with 223 runs scored and an .828 OPS with runners in scoring position and two outs this season, all three of which are the best totals by any team in baseball this year ... only twice in the last 52 seasons since 1974 have the Tigers had a better team OPS in such situations, behind the 2007 Tigers (.856) and 1984 Tigers (.842).

- Including a three-run homer last night, Gleyber Torres leads the majors with a .392 batting average (20-for-51) and .745 slugging with RISP and two outs while ranking second with a 1.160 OPS in such spots ... Javier Báez ranks eighth in the A.L. with a .985 OPS with RISP and two outs while Dillon Dingler ranks 16th with a .918 OPS (min. 50 plate apps. for all rankings).
- Torres and Riley Greene have 28 RBI with runners in scoring position and two outs, tied for sixth most in the A.L. ... Spencer Torkelson is right behind with 25 RBI in such spots while Báez has 24 RBI and Dingler has 23 RBI ... the Tigers have five players with at least 23 RBI with RISP and two outs for the first time since 2012 (Cabrera, Peralta, Fielder, Boesch, D. Young) ... last year Kerry Carpenter led the club with 20 RBI with RISP and two outs for the entire season.

SPENCER'S GIFTS: Spencer Torkelson enters today's game with 28 homers, reaching the mark for the second time in the last three years (he had a career-best 31 homers in 2023) ... Torkelson is the first Tiger to record a pair of 28-homer seasons in a three-year span since Justin Upton reached the mark in 2016 (31 homers) and 2017 (28 homers).

- Torkelson has now hit 69 homers since the start of the 2023 season, the best three-year total by any Tiger player since J.D. Martinez (76 homers) and Miguel Cabrera (72 homers) exceeded that total from 2015-17.

THIS IS STRIKING: Tigers starting pitchers rank second in the A.L. with 747 strikeouts this season, trailing only Houston starters and their 778 strikeouts ... Detroit is looking for its first Top 2 finish in strikeouts by starting pitchers since 2013, when Tigers starters led the majors with 981 strikeouts, 102 (!) more than their next-closest competitors (Cleveland and Texas).

ZACH OWNS HIS OWN HOME: Zach McKinstry is tied for second in the majors (with Jacob Wilson) with a .335 batting average (71-for-212) at home this season, behind only Jeremy Peña and his .341 home mark ... McKinstry has a .412 OBP and a .608 slugging percentage at home, good for a 1.020 OPS, third best in the majors behind only Aaron Judge (1.063) and Kyle Schwarber (1.025).

IT'S NOT EASY BEING GREENE: Riley Greene is the 15th different player in franchise history to post a 30 homer, 100 RBI season and is the first Tiger to reach this milestone since Miguel Cabrera in 2016 ... Greene is the first Tigers left-handed hitter to do so since Prince Fielder in 2012.

- Greene is only the fourth player in the 125-season history of the franchise to turn in a 30-100 campaign at age 24-years-old or younger, joining Jason Thompson (1977), Rudy York (1937) and Hank Greenberg (1935) ... programming note: it's only September 7.
- Greene joins Mets first baseman Pete Alonso as the only two players in all of baseball to reach 29 doubles, 32 homers and 103 RBI this season ... Greene has those totals through 143 team games, on pace for 33 doubles, 36 homers and 117 RBI in a 162-game season.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE?: The Tigers have the second-best record in the A.L. on the strength of a +89 overall run differential, trailing the Yankees (+139) and Red Sox (+92) for the best mark in the A.L. ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +86 edge on the second-place Royals (+3), are +138 on the third-place Guardians (-49) and are +176 on the fourth-place Twins (-87).

AND FINALLY: The Tigers last night tallied their 16th shutout of the season, by far the most in the American League (three more than Texas, 13) and one shy of Pittsburgh (17) for most in the majors ... this marks Detroit's most shutouts in a season since they also had 16 in 2006.
