## SAN DIEGO PADRES (61-52) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (56-55)

AUGUST 6, 2024 AT PNC PARK, PITTSBURGH, PA - 6:40 EDT - GAME #112/HOME #56

RHP DYLAN CEASE (11-8, 3.42 ERA) vs. LHP BAILEY FALTER (5-7, 3.95 ERA)

**THE PIRATES:** had the day off yesterday...Took a 4-0 lead into the sixth inning Sunday against Arizona before losing 6-5...Were three games over .500 at 55-52 following their win on July 30 at Houston (the first time to be three games over .500 since having an 11-8 record following the action on April 17)...Have won 14 games in their last at-bat (their most since having 16 last at-bat wins in 2021)...Have played in 39 one-run games; tied for the most in all of MLB along with the Cubs...Have won seven straight and 10 of their last 11 games when going deep multiple times in a game...Have the third-best stolen base percentage (83.3 percent) in MLB behind the Blue Jays (83.6 percent) and Brewers (83.4 percent)...Have gone 20-16 in the opening game of series, including 11-7 at PNC Park.

**SETTING UP THE SERIES:** Pittsburgh is 274-234 (.539) all-time against the Padres, the Pirates' best record against any current MLB team...The Pirates' last home series against San Diego was a three-game sweep in June 2023, the only non-divisional team the Pirates have swept in the past five seasons...Courtesy of StatsPerform.

**SERIESLY SPEAKING:** The Pirates are 5-2 in their last seven series dating back to July 9...The Pirates won four straight series from July 9-24 against Milwaukee, the Chicago White Sox, Phillies and Cardinals...The Bucs then lost two of three games against the Diamondbacks at Chase Field from July 26-28 before taking two of three games against the Astros at Minute Maid Park from July 29-31...Pittsburgh's other series loss during this stretch also came against the Diamondbacks this past weekend at PNC Park.

**PLAY RENEGADE:** Since being acquired from San Diego prior to the 2021 season, David Bednar has recorded a 2.74 ERA (217.0ip/66er) and 81 saves in 212 games as a member of the Pirates...Since the beginning of the 2021 campaign, Bednar's 81 saves are tied for the ninth-most in all of MLB while his 2.74 ERA ranks 10th among relief pitchers (minimum 175.0ip).

**HEY 19:** David Bednar has converted each of his last 19 save opportunities, which is the fourth-longest active streak in MLB...The only three pitchers with a longer active saves streak are Josh Hader (22 straight), Emmanuel Clase (20 straight) and Kirby Yates (20 straight)...The last Pirate to have a season saves streak of 19 games or longer was Felipe Vazquez in 2018 (24 straight).

**THE MEN BEHIND THE MASK:** Yasmani Grandal went 3-for-4 with a double and RBI in his start behind the plate Sunday afternoon...Pittsburgh's catchers have driven in a total of 56 runs this year, which are tied for the 10th-most in all of MLB...Last year Pittsburgh's catchers had 45 RBI for the entire season, which was tied for the fewest in MLB along with the White Sox.

**MAKE THAT A DOUBLE:** The Pirates have hit at least one double in 12 straight games...The only team with a longer active streak of games with a double is the Padres (14 games)...The Pirates' next-longest streak this season was 10 games in May.

**REYNOLDS ROLLING:** Bryan Reynolds has a .571 on-base percentage thus far in August, which is tied for third in the National League among the 122 players with at least 10 plate appearances along with Arizona's Joc Pederson...Washington's Luis Garcia Jr. is first in that category with a .625 OBP while San Diego's Manny Machado ranks second (.583).

**WHAT TO WATCH FOR:** Bailey Falter gets the start tonight in the opener of this three-game series against the Padres...Falter has held the first three hitters in the lineup to a .221/.282/.338 slash line compared to .259/.306/.440 against the rest of the lineup...The Padres' 1-3 hitters have a combined .280 batting average this season, third-best in the majors...Courtesy of StatsPerform.

**KEEPING UP WITH CUTCH'S MILESTONES:** Andrew McCutchen comes into today one RBI shy of 800 in his career as a member of the Pirates...He will become one of just seven Pirates in team history to record at least 800 RBI since 1920 when RBI became an official stat...McCutchen is tied for the fifth-most RBI (1076) among all active players along with Giancarlo Stanton.

### ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

August 6, 2013: Josh Harrison hit the second pinch hit walkoff home run in PNC Park history after taking Miami's Mike Dunn deep in the ninth inning. Neil Walker added three hits while Andrew McCutchen recorded his fourth straight multi-hit game while also collecting two RBI. The win put the Pirates 2.0 games ahead of the second-place Cardinals while raising the team's record to 68-44.

 HOW ACQUIRED: From the Phillies in exchange for INF Rodolfo Castro on 8/1/23

**STARTING OFF:** The 27-year-old lefthander is in his second season with the Pirates after being acquired from the Phillies at the trade deadline last season (August 1) in exchange for INF Rodolfo Castro...Falter is in his fourth Major League season...He made 50 appearances (24 starts) for the Phillies from 2021-23...He has also made 28 appearances (25 starts) with the Pirates from 2023-24 after being selected in the fifth round of the 2015 draft by Philadelphia.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Falter started on July 30 at Houston, earning the win after allowing two runs (one earned) with three strikeouts and no walks in 5.1 innings...It was his first start with the Pirates since July 6 vs. New York-NL after being placed on the 15-day IL on July 7 (left triceps tendinitis).

- Falter made one rehab appearance for Triple-A Indianapolis on July 24 at Iowa (CHC), allowing two runs on five hits with three strikeouts in 3.0 innings of work.

**AGAINST THE PADRES:** Falter will be making his first career regular season start and third career regular season appearance against the Padres tonight...Has not factored into the decision in either of his relief outings, posting a 16.20 ERA (3 ER in 1.2 IP) with three strikeouts and no walks.

- Each of his regular season appearances against San Diego came during the 2021 season: July 3 at Citizens Bank Park (0 ER in 1.0 IP) as a member of the Phillies and August 22 at Petco Park (3 ER in 0.2 IP).
- Started Game 4 of the 2022 NLCS against the Padres at Citizens Bank Park on October 22, 2022, allowing four runs on three hits with one walk in 0.2 IP.

**IF YOU TAKE AWAY ONE INNING...:** Since allowing five runs in his first inning of the season on March 31 at Miami, Falter has pitched to a 3.52 ERA (37 ER in 94.2 IP).

- Has posted a 6.00 ERA (12 ER in 18.0 IP) in the first inning this year, compared to 3.48 ERA (30 ER in 77.2 IP) through the rest of the game.

**HOME COOKIN':** Tonight will be Falter's ninth start of the season at PNC Park, where he has gone 2-3 with a 3.83 ERA (19 ER in 44.2 IP)...He has allowed three or fewer runs in seven of those outings, including two or fewer four times.

- Over his last 10 appearances (nine starts) at PNC Park since Sept. 6, 2023, Falter has gone 3-3 with a 3.31 ERA (20 ER in 54.1 IP).

**GETTING IT DONE:** Falter has twice posted outings of 6.0-plus innings pitched and two or fewer hits allowed - April 6 vs. Baltimore (6.0ip/1h) and May 31 at Toronto (6.0ip/2 h)...He is one of nine NL lefties to have multiple such outings this season, joining ATL Chris Sale (3), SF Blake Snell (3), PHI Ranger Suarez (2), NYM Jose Quintana (2), NYM Sean Manaea (2), LAD James Paxton (2), CHC Shota Imanaga (2) and ATL Max Fried (2).

**THAT'S QUALITY:** Falter turned in four consecutive quality starts from May 12-31, which matched the longest such streak of his career (also: July 29-August 31, 2022)...It was the longest quality start streak by a Pirates lefty since Jonathan Niese also had a four-game streak from May 9-27, 2016.

**WHAT THE METRICS SAY:** Per Baseball Savant, Falter has an average 7.4 foot extension when releasing the pitch, which ranks in the 99th percentile in Major League Baseball this season...He also ranked in the 99th percentile in 2023 and was in the 100th percentile from 2021-22.

**JUST LIKE SANDY:** Growing up in Chino Hills, California, Falter's father, Darwin, taught him to idolize fellow left-handed pitcher Sandy Koufax...Bailey would do reports on Koufax at school and even had a framed picture of the Dodgers southpaw hanging above his childhood bed...To this day, his delivery on the mound mimics that of Koufax.

**ON DECK:** The 32-year-old lefthander will make his seventh start of the season tomorrow night...Allowed four runs in 2.1 innings in a no-decision in his last start on 7/27 at Arizona...Missed a total of 78 games while being on the injured list with a left forearm muscle strain before being reinstated on 7/12...Was acquired by the Pirates from Atlanta on 12/5 after being traded from Seattle to Atlanta two days earlier...Earned his first win as a member of the Pirates on 7/12 against the White Sox.
