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PITTSBURGH PIRATES (14-29) vs. NEW YORK METS (28-15)

May 14, 2025 - Citi Field - Queens, NY - 7:10 EDT - Game #44/Road #22

LHP Bailey Falter (2-3, 4.36 ERA) vs. RHP Clay Holmes (5-1, 2.74 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have lost each of the first two games on their six-game, seven-day road trip...Will have an off day tomorrow before wrapping up the trip with three games in Philadelphia (Friday-Sunday)...Promoted Don Kelly from bench coach to manager on May 8 after relieving Derek Shelton of his duties...Are in the 18th game of a stretch of 34 straight games against National League opponents (April 25-June 1)...Are also in the sixth game of a stretch of nine straight games against the National League East (are 6-7 against the division in 2025 and 26-21 against it dating back to the start of last season).

COMMONWEALTH CLASH: The Pirates will bus to Philadelphia following tonight's game to begin a three-game series at Citizens Bank Park on Friday, as part of MLB's inaugural Rivalry Weekend...Pittsburgh split its four-game series with the Phillies in The City of Brotherly Love from April 11-14 last season, while also taking two of three from its cross-state foe at PNC Park from July 19-21.

BAILEY ON THE BUMP: Bailey Falter will start in tonight's series finale...He's pitched 6.0-plus innings while allowing one run or fewer, two hits or fewer and two walks or fewer in each of his last two starts (Friday vs. Atlanta and May 3 vs. San Diego)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he's the second Pirates pitcher since at least 1893 to do that in consecutive games within a single season, along with Sam Leever (June 28-July 2, 1900)...Falter has a 3.86 ERA (23.1ip/10er) in six career outings (five starts) against the Mets.

SETTING THE TONE: Over their last eight games (since May 5 at St. Louis), Pirates starting pitchers have posted a 2.28 ERA (47.1ip/12er), the fifth-lowest mark in Major League Baseball (the Mets rank seventh with a 2.38 ERA)...Pittsburgh starters have pitched 5.2-plus innings in seven straight games, the longest-such streak since doing that in eight straight from April 3-11, 2024...The Pirates' 20 quality starts this season are tied with Philadelphia for second-most in all of MLB, behind only Kansas City (23).

LOCK IN, KE': Ke'Bryan Hayes went 2-for-4 with a triple and a stolen base on Tuesday against the Mets and has now hit safely in 19 of his last 22 games (since April 19 vs. Cleveland)...During that span, Hayes has gone 27-for-87 (.310) with two doubles, a triple, seven RBI, two stolen bases and eight multi-hit games...Hayes' .310 average in that stretch ranks fourth in the National League and 11th in all of Major League Baseball among hitters with at least 85 at-bats.

CLOSE CALLS: The Pirates have played in five consecutive one-run games for the first time this season and first time since June 15-21, 2019, according to the Elias Sports Bureau...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, the last time Pittsburgh played in six straight one-run games was June 3-8, 2007...The Pirates have played in 17 one-run games this season (7-10 record), third-most in MLB behind the Braves and Mets (18 apiece).

KEEPING UP WITH CATCH: Andrew McCutchen enters tonight's game three hits shy of 1700 as a member of the Pirates...He is also 12 hits away from tying Arky Vaughan (1709) for ninth place on Pittsburgh's all-time hits list...McCutchen is third among all active players with 2182 hits, behind Freddie Freeman (2308) and Jose Altuve (2273).

PIRATING: Pittsburgh stole three bases on Tuesday night and now has 49 steals this season, third-most in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Milwaukee (56) and Chicago-NL (50)...The Pirates have five players with four-plus steals (Oneil Cruz with 16, Isiah Kiner-Falefa with seven, Ke'Bryan Hayes with five, Adam Frazier and Jared Triolo with four)...Only Milwaukee, Philadelphia and Washington (six apiece) have more-such players...Pittsburgh's 84.2 stolen base percentage (155-for-184) since the beginning of last season ranks first in Major League Baseball.

PHAM-TASTIC: Tommy Pham has a .339 average (39-for-115) and .437 on-base percentage in 35 career games against the Mets...According to OptaStats, those are his best marks against any Major League team...His .539 slugging percentage against New York is his second-best against any opponent, behind only San Diego (.556)...Pham, who played 79 games with the Mets in 2023, has a .331 average (56-for-169) with nine doubles, 10 home runs and 27 RBI in 55 games played here at Citi Field...As a visitor in Queens, Pham is 23-for-61 (.377) with six extra-base hits and 10 RBI over 17 games.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

May 14, 2023: Mitch Keller tossed 7.0 scoreless innings while striking out 13 batters and not issuing a walk in Pittsburgh's 4-0 win at Baltimore on Mother's Day. He became the first Pirates pitcher with 13 strikeouts, no walks and no runs allowed in a game in the Live-Ball Era (since 1920). Pittsburgh pitchers set a club record in the win by striking out 17 batters without issuing a walk.

HOW ACQUIRED: From Philadelphia for INF Rodolfo Castro on August 1, 2023.

STARTING OFF: The 28-year-old lefty is in his third season with the Pirates after being acquired from the Phillies at the trade deadline on August 1, 2023, in exchange for infielder Rodolfo Castro...He's in his fifth Major League season after debuting in 2021... He was selected by Philadelphia in the fifth round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Falter allowed just two hits and two walks over 6.0 scoreless innings on Friday vs. Atlanta, winning a 3-2 decision (he also allowed one run on two hits and two walks in his prior start on May 3 vs. San Diego)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he joined Sam Leever (June 28-July 2, 1900) as the only Pirates pitchers since at least 1893 to pitch 6.0-plus innings while allowing one run or fewer, two hits or fewer and two walks or fewer in consecutive games within a single season (Babe Adams did this as a reliever in his final appearance of 1915 and as a starter in his first appearance of 1916).

AGAINST THE METS: Falter is 1-3 with a 3.86 ERA (23.1ip/10er) in six career appearances (five starts) against New York (NL)...He last faced the Mets last July 6 at PNC Park, allowing three runs on five hits and two walks (two strikeouts) in 2.0 innings while losing a 5-2 decision...Falter is 0-2 with a 3.38 ERA (13.1ip/5er) and 11 strikeouts in three career starts here at Citi Field...He is four strikeouts shy of 300 for his career.

BEAST VS. THE EAST: Falter, who pitched in parts of three seasons with Philadelphia from 2021-23, is 13-4 with a 3.51 ERA (130.2ip/51er) in 31 career appearances (24 starts) against the National League East...Since joining Pittsburgh in August 2023, Falter is 8-2 with a 3.24 ERA (75.0ip/27er) in 14 starts against the NL East...He is 3-0 with a 0.95 ERA (19.0ip/2er) against the division this season...Falter had a no-decision in the team's 5-4 loss on March 29 at Miami (6.0ip/2r), won a 6-1 decision on April 16 vs. Washington (7.0ip/0r) and won a 3-2 decision on Friday vs. Atlanta (6.0ip/0r).

PESKY LEFTIES: According to the Elias Sports Bureau, Falter (7.0ip/0r on April 16) and Andrew Heaney (7.1ip/0r on April 17) became the first pair of Pirates left-handed teammates to pitch 7.0-plus scoreless innings in consecutive team games since John Candelaria (9.0ip) and Larry McWilliams (7.0ip) did so on July 25 and July 27, 1982.

ALL GOOD THINGS COME TO AN END: In his start on April 5, Falter had his streak of plate appearances without hitting a batter snapped at 1124 (began on August 20, 2022) when he hit the Yankees' Jazz Chisholm Jr. leading off the second inning... According to the Elias Sports Bureau, the last pitcher with as long of a streak without hitting a batter was Yusmeiro Petit (1205pa) from April 21, 2017 to June 6, 2021.

2024 IN REVIEW: Falter spent his first full season in the big leagues while going 8-9 with a 4.43 ERA in 28 starts with the Pirates in 2024...He was on an Opening Day roster for the third straight season after also doing so with the Phillies in both 2022 and 2023.

STAYING IN THE PARK: Falter surrendered 11 home runs in 68.1 innings (1.45 per 9.0 innings) in his first 12 starts of the 2024 season...In his last 16 starts beginning on June 12, he surrendered six home runs in 74.0 innings, averaging just 0.73 per 9.0 innings.

JUST LIKE SANDY: Growing up in Chino Hills, California, Falter's father, Darwin, taught him to idolize fellow left-handed pitcher Sandy Koufax...Bailey would do reports on Koufax at school and even had a framed picture of the Dodgers southpaw hanging above his childhood bed...To this day, his delivery on the mound mimics that of Koufax...In 2024, he ranked in the 98th percentile in extension (per Baseball Savant).
