Ichiro Suzuki is set to become the third player inducted to the National Baseball Hall of Fame with the Seattle Mariners in **42 days** on July 27 in Cooperstown... he is also set to have his **#51** retired by the Mariners on Aug. 9 at T-Mobile Park.

The Mariners and Guardians wrap up the first of 2 series matchups this season... the Mariners will travel to Cleveland for a 3-game series from Aug. 29-31, Seattle's second-to-last trip.

TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners conclude a 3-game series today against the Cleveland Guardians (2-0)... Seattle will also welcome the Boston Red Sox (3 G, 6/16-6/18) to T-Mobile Park on the homestand... today's game will be televised live on **ROOT SPORTS** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryan Rowland-Smith** on the call, with **Jen Mueller** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizos** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners secured the series win against the Guardians last night with a walk-off 4-3 victory...it marked Seattle's 5th walk-off this season (last: 6/1 vs. Minnesota)...the Mariners improved to a 14-10 (.583) record in 1-run games.

- **Sweep Dreams** - The Mariners look to secure their 4th series sweep this season.
- **Series Business** - Seattle now holds a 13-9-1 series record this season and a 6-5-1 record at T-Mobile Park after capturing a series win over Cleveland last night.
- **Great Day for Baseball** - The Mariners own an MLB-best 16-9 (.640) record in day games this season.
- **For the Dads** - Seattle is 29-17 (.630) on Father's Day.
- **Strive For Five** - The Mariners are 23-6 (.793) when scoring 5+ runs this season.
- **Giving The Team Length** - Seattle is 22-8 (.733) when its starting pitcher goes 6.0+ innings this year.

CAL RALEIGH: A SLAM DUNK ALL-STAR...**Cal Raleigh** leads MLB catchers in home runs (26) by a wide margin over next-closest Logan O'Hoppe-LAA (14 HR)...Raleigh also leads catchers in runs scored (45), RBI (54), walks (42), stolen bases (7), total bases (156) and extra-base hits (38)...among qualified catchers, he also leads in slugging percentage (.622) and OPS (.998)...the 28-year-old backstop is primed to join his current manager **Dan Wilson** (1996) as the only catchers in Mariners history to make the All-Star Game... Raleigh is vying to become the first catcher to ever start the All-Star Game for Seattle.

HISTORICAL PACE...**Cal Raleigh** went 1-for-3 with 1 double, 1 RBI and 1 walk in last night's win...in 68 games this year, he's batting .263 (66x251) with 45 runs, 12 doubles, 26 homers, 54 RBI, 7 steals and 42 walks, getting on base at a .376 clip, slugging .622 with a .998 OPS...Cal's 26 HR are tied for most in the Majors with Aaron Judge-NYY...Raleigh became the first catcher in MLB history to reach 20+ home runs before the end of May...Cal's 26 HR are already tied for 2nd-most by a catcher before the All-Star Break with Hall of Famer Ivan Rodriguez-TEX (26 HR) in 2000, trailing only Hall of Famer Johnny Bench-CIN (28 HR) in 1970.

ONE HOMER AWAY FROM TOP-10...**Cal Raleigh** has 119 career home runs, tied with Mitch Haniger for 10th-most in Mariners history...with his 120th homer, Cal will move into sole possession for 10th-most homers in a Seattle uniform...despite hitting just 2 HR in his rookie 2021 season, Cal's 119 HR are 2nd-most by a Mariner through a player's first 5 career seasons, trailing only Hall of Famer Ken Griffey Jr. and his 132 HR in his first 5 seasons from 1989-93.

HE J.P. (HE JUST PRODUCES)...shortstop **J.P. Crawford** reached base safely in a career-high 5 plate appearances last night, going 3-for-3 with 1 run, 2 walks (1 intentional) and 1 stolen base...over his last 14 games (5/30-c), Crawford is batting .444 (24x54) with 4 runs, 5 doubles, 1 home run, 5 RBI and 11 walks compared to just 5 strikeouts...Crawford has a .538 on-base percentage, .593 slugging percentage and 1.131 OPS in that span...overall this season, Crawford's 45 walks rank T-6th in MLB (also: Aaron Judge-NYY) and his .410 OBP ranks 4th in the Majors and 2nd in the American League, trailing only Aaron Judge-NYY (.479 OBP)...J.P. is on track to become the first Mariner (min. 500 PA) to post a season OBP over .400 since Ichiro Suzuki in 2004 (.414 OBP).

WALK OFF WONDER...**Jorge Polanco** recorded 2 RBI in last night's game, including a 2-out walk-off single...it marked Polanco's 5th career walk-off hit (1st with Seattle) and 8th career walk-off plate appearance...Seattle's 5 walk-off plate appearances this season are tied for 2nd most in the American League (also: Minnesota and Tampa Bay)...the Mariners now have an MLB best 29 game-tying or go-ahead hits in the 7th inning or later, ranking ahead of San Diego and Toronto (24 G).

BRASH & MUÑOZ: WHAT A COMBO...**Matt Brash's** 14-game scoreless streak (5/3-c) and **Andrés Muñoz's** 16-game scoreless streak (3/27-5/3) to begin the season mark the first time that teammates have registered 14+ game scoreless streaks to start their season since Cleveland's Tyler Olson (30 G, 7/21-10/1/2017) and Andrew Miller (15 G, 4/3-5/14/2017) did it during the 2017 season...since Andrew Miller's scoreless streak only got to 15 games to begin his '17 campaign, if Brash can go his next 2 outings without giving up a run, he and Muñoz would become the first teammates to register **16+** game scoreless streaks to start their season since Oakland's Brad Ziegler (29 G, 5/31-8/12/2008) and Santiago Casilla (18 G, 3/26-5/6/2008) to begin their 2008 season.

JULIO: ANOTHER COMPELLING ALL-STAR CASE...center fielder **Julio Rodríguez** went 1-for-5 with a run and a stolen base in last night's victory...among American League outfielders, Julio ranks 2nd in bWAR (3.3) to Aaron Judge-NYY (5.6), T-2nd in runs scored (43), T-4th in hits (73), T-7th in RBI (34), T-4th in stolen bases (12), 6th in total bases (119), 1st in defensive WAR (1.4) and T-1st in defensive runs saved (10).

A HISTORIC STRETCH FOR #68...last night, Mariners starter **George Kirby** snapped a 68 game streak of consecutive starts (4/3/2023-6/14/2025) without allowing more than 2 walks...it was the longest active streak in the Majors, and the 3rd longest streak in MLB history, trailing only Carlos Silva (99 G, 8/2/2023-5/20/2007) and Hall of Famer Cy Young (85 G, 5/17/1904-7/2/1906)...right-hander **Bryan Woo** now holds the longest active streak of starts with 2-or-fewer walks allowed in the Major Leagues with 35 games (5/10/2024-c)...Brent Suter holds the next longest active streak with 28 games (4/10/2018-c).

A MOVE WITH SOME 'POP'...on Friday, the Mariners selected right-handed pitcher **Zach Pop** (#35) from Triple-A Tacoma and optioned right-hander **Logan Evans** to Tacoma...Pop has made 158 Major League appearances across 4 seasons with Miami (2021-22) and Toronto (2022-24), going 8-5 with one save and a 4.45 ERA (77 ER, 155.2 IP) with 123 strikeouts and 53 walks...Pop was signed by Seattle to a minor league contract on April 16 and made a combined 11 relief appearances between Tacoma (9 G) and the ACL Mariners (2 G), going 2-1 with one save and a 2.79 ERA (3 ER, 9.2 IP) with 9 strikeouts...Pop was born and raised in Canada, before attending the University of Kentucky, just like former Seattle hurler James Paxton.

AS YOU MAY KNOW...**Jorge Polanco** hit a walk-off RBI single in last night's game to secure the series win against Cleveland, the Mariners 4th walk-off plate appearance this season...**YOU MAY ALSO KNOW**...**Jackson Kowar** secured his first win of the season and as a Mariner last night, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...both Polanco and Kowar had their last walk-off hit and win, respectively, come against Cleveland?...Polanco's last walk-off hit was on August 18, 2021 vs. Cleveland while with Minnesota... Kowar's last win was on Sept. 18, 2023 vs. Cleveland while with Kansas City.

ABOUT EMERSON HANCOCK...

- The 25-year-old right-handed pitcher is scheduled to make his 12th start of the season tonight and his 1st against Cleveland...he is also scheduled to make the 27th start of his career and 2nd career start against the Guardians.
Selected by Seattle in the 1st round (6th overall) of the 2020 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Scott Hunter on June 25, 2020.
Spent 3 seasons at the University of Georgia, 2018-20... in 2020, was named Vince Dooley Athlete of the Year as the top male student-athlete at the University of Georgia.
Was named to CoSIDA Academic All-America First Team in 2020.

LAST TIME OUT...ND on June 9 at Arizona, he threw 5.0 innings, giving up 2 runs on 6 hits (1 HR) with 3 walks and 3 strikeouts...it was his 3rd straight start throwing 5.0+ innings and allowing 2-or-less runs, and has allowed 3-or-less runs in 9 of 11 starts this season.

IN HIS OWN WORDS

"We don't quit. We kept fighting. That last inning was unreal...We got a bunch of fighters in there and we fought until the very last out. It's baseball. Tomorrow is a new day and we're going to give them everything we got and keep competing."

LENGTH ON THE MOUND...after his May 23 start vs. Houston, I marked his 4th start this season where he has tossed 6.0+ innings...he has tossed 6.0+ innings in 8 of his 26 career starts, and 5.0+ innings in 19 starts...in those 19 starts of 5.0+ innings pitched, the Mariners hold a 13-6 record.

HOME WARRIOR...has thrown 5.0+ innings in each of his last 4 home starts, and has allowed 3-or-fewer runs in 12 of his 14 career starts at T-Mobile Park, tossing 5.0+ innings in 11 of those 14 starts.

AMERICAN LEAGUE TOTALS...has made 16 career starts against American League teams, posting a 4-3 record with a 5.85 ERA (48 ER, 78.0 IP) with 47 strikeouts and 24 walks...in his last 11 starts against AL teams, the Mariners hold a 7-4 record... has thrown 5.0+ innings in 9 of his starts against AL teams, including 4 quality starts.

BRINGIN' THE HEAT...has increased his average fastball velocity by 1.9 mph (94.6 mph) this season, up from an average fastball velocity of 92.7 mph in 2024...in his May 17 start against the San Diego Padres, threw a career-high 97.6 mph fastball to strikeout Jake Cronenworth in the 2nd inning...in that outing, 42 of his pitches touched 95+ mph, nearly double his previous career-high of 22 pitches over 95 mph on April 17 against Cincinnati...the fastest pitch he had thrown prior to 2025 was a 96 mph sinker on 7/07/24 against Toronto.

SWINGS AND MISSES...recorded a career-high 15 swings and misses in his May 12th outing against the Yankees...has already recorded a career-high 31 swinging strikeouts across his 11 starts this season, passing a previous career-high of 26 swinging strikeouts across 12 starts in the 2024 season.

JUNE FEELS GOOD...in 3 career starts in June, Hancock holds a 2.55 ERA (5 ER, 17.2 IP) with 7 walks, 10 strikeouts and a 1.19 WHIP, while limiting opponents to a .219 batting average.

LATEST STRETCH...in his last 5 starts (5/17-c), Hancock is 1-0 with a 3.04 ERA (9 ER, 26.2 IP), collecting 1 quality start on May 23, and has allowed 25 hits 9 walks and 19 strikeouts across 26.2 innings of work, allowing 2-or-fewer runs in 4 of the 5 starts.

LOCKING IT IN...his 3 starts on April 23, April 30, and May 6, marked just the 2nd time in his career with 6.0+ innings pitched in 3 consecutive starts (also: 2024 season, 4/13 at CHC, 4/21 at COL and 4/26 at ARI)...has recorded more strikeouts (41) and fewer runs allowed (31) in his first 11 starts this season compared to his first 11 starts of the 2024 season (36 SO, 34 RA).

GET AHEAD, STAY AHEAD...when pitching ahead in the count this season, over 21.1 innings pitched, has allowed 18 hits and holds a .228 batting average against with a 0.84 WHIP with no walks and 23 strikeouts.

QUICK TRIP TO TACOMA...after his 1st major league start of the season (3/30 vs. DET), Hancock was optioned to Triple-A Tacoma...between his two starts with the Rainiers, he allowed 4 runs on 9 hits (1 HR), 2 walks, 2 hit by pitches, and struck out 12 in 9.2 innings of work...between the 2024 and 2025 seasons, Hancock holds a 3.46 ERA (40 ER, 104.0 IP) and is 7-4 with Tacoma across 19 game starts.

THE VERY FIRST ONE...recorded his 1st career win on 4/1/24 vs. Cleveland at T-Mobile Park...tossed 5.1 innings, gave up 4 hits (1 home run) and 3 earned runs with 1 strikeout.

THE DEBUT...made MLB debut on 8/9/23 against the San Diego Padres, allowing just 1 run on 2 hits and 3 walks with 3 strikeouts... became just the 6th starting pitcher in franchise history to pitch 5.0+ innings and allow 2-or-fewer hits in a Major League debut, joining Pat Rice, Ken Cloude, Taijuan Walker, Roenis Elias and Bryce Miller.
