Did You Hiura 'Bout This?

Jackson Chourio enters the day on an 11-game hitting streak during which he is batting .417 (15-for-36) with 2 HR and 9 RBI while posting a .462 OBP/.667 SLG/1.128 OPS....his streak marks the longest by a Brewers rookie since Keston Hiura (15g in 2019).

Star Power

William Contreras (catcher) and Christian Yelich (outfield) will be in the National League starting lineup at the 2024 All-Star Game....this is the eighth time in franchise history and first time since 2014 that the team has had multiple All-Star starters.... Carlos Gómez (LF), Jonathan Lucroy (C) and Aramis Ramírez (3B) started in the 2014 Midsummer Classic.

Star Catcher

William Contreras will become just the third catcher in franchise history to start an All-Star Game....Contreras will join Ted Simmons (1984) and Jonathan Lucroy (2014).

Born Again Christian

Christian Yelich has made his third career All-Star Game (also 2018-19) and will be starting for the second time....Yelich is the last Brewer to start an All-Star Game (2019).

THIS AFTERNOON'S GAME: Is the sixth game (2-3) of a 7-game road trip to Colorado (2-2) and Los Angeles-NL (0-1)....following this trip and an off day on Monday, the team returns to American Family Field for a 6-game homestand against Pittsburgh (3g) and Washington (3g) leading into the All-Star break.

AT HOME: The Brewers are 27-13 at home, going 10-2-1 in series play....the team has gone 22-6 in its last 28 home games after a 5-7 start....the Brewers had a season-high 6-game home winning streak from 5/29-6/10....the team has won its last nine home series....their last home series loss came from 4/26-4/28 against the Yankees (1-2).

ON THE ROAD: The Brewers are 25-24 on the road, going 7-6-2 in series play....the team has gone 12-20 in its last 32 road games after a 13-4 start....the team had a season-high 4-game road winning streak from 4/9-4/13.

MANAGER: Pat Murphy was named the 20th manager in franchise history on 11/15/23, replacing Craig Counsell....he is signed to a 3-year contract through 2026....Murphy spent the previous eight seasons (2016-23) as bench coach....his only Major League managerial experience previously came in 2015 as interim manager of the Padres, replacing Bud Black in June (42-54)....he enjoyed a 25-year college head coaching career primarily at the University of Notre Dame (1988-94) and Arizona State University (1995-2009)....Murphy went 1,000-457-4 as a college coach and was on pace to be the winningest coach in NCAA history before he transitioned into the professional ranks.

COACHES: First base coach Quintin Berry (4th season), field coordinator Néstor Corredor (2nd season/1st in current role), hitting coach Connor Dawson (3rd season), assistant pitching coach Jim Henderson (3rd season/1st in current role), pitching coach Chris Hook (6th season), third base coach Jason Lane (9th season/4th in current role), run prevention coordinator Walker McKinven (5th season/1st in current role) and hitting coach Ozzie Timmons (3rd season) all returned from the 2023 staff.... Rickie Weeks (associate manager), Daniel de Mondesert (assistant coach) and Charlie Greene (bullpen coach) are in their first seasons on the coaching staff, all Major League coaches for the first time.

LET'S GO TO THE VIDEO TAPE: The Brewers have made 21 replay challenges this season, going 13-8....their last challenge (won) came on 7/3 at Colorado as a safe call at first base involving Michael Toggia was overturned (pickoff).

TODAY'S STARTER: #51 - RHP FREDDY PERALTA (17gs, 6-4, 3.83)

PERALTA AT A GLANCE: Freddy Peralta, 28, makes his 18th start....he last started last Sunday vs. Chicago-NL in a 7-1 win (7ip, 2h, 1r, 1er, 2bb, 8k, 1hr, 103 pitches)....the team is 12-5 in his starts....he has 7 quality starts....opponents are batting .212 (73-for-344, 12hr)....he is 2-0 with a 1.50 ERA in his last 3 starts (18ip, 9h, 3r, 3er, 6bb, 22k, 1hr)....Peralta was acquired from Seattle, along with RHP Carlos Herrera and RHP Daniel Missaki, in exchange for 1B Adam Lind on 12/9/15....on 2/28/20, he signed a 5-year contract through the 2024 season with club options for 2025 and 2026.

LAST SEASON: Peralta went 12-10 with a 3.86 ERA in a career-high 30 starts last season....the team went 17-13 in his starts....he made 16 quality starts....opponents batted .212 (131-for-617, 26hr)....Peralta ranked among the 2023 National League leaders in K/9IP (3rd, 11.41), WHIP (5th, 1.12), H/9IP (5th, 7.12), strikeouts (T5th, 210) and K/BB (7th, 3.89)....he became the eighth pitcher (14x) in franchise history to produce 200+ strikeouts in a season.

CAREER: Is 48-31 with a 3.83 ERA and 1 save in 163 games/114 starts (674.2ip, 287er)....is in his seventh Major League season, all with the Brewers (2018-24)....has gone 40-29 with a 3.82 ERA as a starter (590.2ip, 251er) and 8-2 with a 3.86 ERA in relief (84ip, 36er)....was an All-Star in 2021.

CAREER AT AMERICAN FAMILY FIELD: Is 28-15 with a 3.47 ERA in 86 games/58 starts (357.2ip, 138er)....is 3-1 with a 4.20 ERA in 8 starts this season (45ip, 21er).

CAREER ON THE ROAD: Is 20-16 with a 4.23 ERA in 77 games/56 starts (317ip, 149er)....is 3-3 with a 3.49 ERA in 9 starts this season (49ip, 19er).

CAREER vs. DODGERS: Is 2-1 with a 1.80 ERA in 4 starts against Los Angeles (20ip, 9h, 4r, 4er, 11bb, 21k, 2hr)....his only start at Dodger Stadium came on 7/30/18 as he received no decision in a Brewers' 5-2 win (4ip, 3h, 1r, 1er, 4bb, 6k, 1hbp)....he earned a 9-3 win in his only start last season on 5/8 in Milwaukee (6ip, 3h, 1r, 1er, 2bb, 5k).

BREWERS ON THE MOUND

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP DALLAS KEUCHEL (2gs, 0-0, 6.75)

LHP Dallas Keuchel will be making his third start of the season.....Keuchel last started on Tuesday at Colorado and received no decision in the Brewers' 4-3 win (5.1ip, 4h, 2r, 2er, 2bb, 5k, 1hr, 78 pitches)....he made his Brewers debut on 6/26 vs. Texas and received no decision in the Brewers' 6-5, 10-inning win (4ip, 8h, 5r, 5er, 1bb, 4k, 2hr, 71 pitches)....he was acquired by Milwaukee from Seattle on June 25 in exchange for cash....signed to a Minor League contract with the Mariners on April 5, he went 7-4 with a 3.93 ERA in 13 starts at Triple-A Tacoma before he was dealt to Milwaukee.....Keuchel has never pitched against the Dodgers in the regular season, one of two teams he has never faced (also Atlanta).... he did, however, make 2 starts against Los Angeles with the Astros in the 2017 World Series, starting Game 1 (L) and Game 5 (ND).
