METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Brewers, 7-2, last night...Tonight, the Mets continue a seven-game homestand (1-1) against the Brewers (1-1) and Giants (three games).

ANSWER HE CALL: The N.Y. Police and Fire Widows' & Children's Benefit Fund, also known as Answer the Call, is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization that provides financial assistance and a network of support to the families of FDNY Firefighters, FDNY EMTs, NYPD Police Officers, and PAPD Police Officers killed in the line of duty...The organization was founded in 1985 by Mets Hall of Famer Rusty Staub...Since its inception, the organization has helped over 1,000 families and has distributed more than \$170 million... Tonight is the 38th annual event of families enjoying a Mets game and a picnic...This year, Brianne and Colin Moon (children of fallen FDNY William Moon), Angelina Liu (daughter of fallen NYPD Wenjian Liu), and Robert Wallace III (grandson of fallen FDNY Robert Wallace Sr.) will throw out ceremonial first pitches.

SEAVER'S FIRST METS GAME: The Amazin' Mets Foundation is proud to sponsor their second future service dog through their partnership with America's Vet Dogs...America's Vet Dogs is a New York-based nonprofit that provides specially trained service dogs to veterans and first responders with disabilities. Seaver attended his first Mets game on June 28, welcomed players as they arrived at the ballpark, and watched batting practice for the first time...Seaver will undergo basic training and socialization with Front Office staff and Mets players and fans for the next 16 to 18 months.

IN JUNE: New York is now 7-16 (.304) in June...The team has posted 4.49 ERA and has slashed .225/.398/.396.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga has recorded 93 strikeouts through his first 14 career major league games, that is the fourth-most by a Mets pitcher in franchise history...Only Dwight Gooden (107), Nolan Ryan (103) and Matt Harvey (102) recorded more in their first 14 career starts...His 93 strikeouts are tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese born pitcher through 14 career games...He trails only Hideo Nomo (129), Masahiro Tanaka (113) and Yu Darvish (96)...Daisuke Matsuzaka also struck out 93 through his first 14 career games.

CITI SENGA: Kodai Senga has posted a 2.52 ERA (11 ER/39.1 IP) in seven home starts, going 3-2...He has struck out 49 and issued 20 walks in those games.

THIS IS 200!: Francisco Lindor launched his 200th career home run in the fourth inning last night...He is now the 11th shortstop in major league history to reach the 200-career home run mark (Min. 60% career games at SS)...He became the 14th player to hit his 200th career home run in a Met uniform (last: Todd Frazier, June 20, 2019 at Chicago-NL)...He was the seventh Met to accomplish the feat at home (Last: David Wright, August 24, 2012 vs. Houston).

PICK SIX: Lindor is on a six-game hitting streak, batting .400 (8-20) in that span with four runs, one double, two home runs, four RBI, four walks, two steals with a .462 OBP, a .750 SLG and a 1.212 OPS.

GIRL DAD POWER: Over the last 10 games, Lindor is batting .355 (11-31) with eight runs, two doubles, four home runs, 10 RBI, six walks, three steals with a .450 OBP and an .806 SLG...Over the last 20 games, Lindor has posted a .998 OPS, batting .277 (18-65) with 13 runs, four doubles, six home runs, 14 RBI, 12 walks, five steals with a .383 OBP and a .615 SLG...He has posted a 2.4 fWAR this year, which ranks 14th in the National League...His 35 extra-base hits are tied for the ninth most in the National League.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo recorded his fourth career multi-homer game last night...He has recorded four home runs over his last 10 games... Nimmo is batting .330 (32-97) with 10 extra-base hits against left-handed pitchers this year...His .330 average is the fourth-highest mark by a southpaw against fellow southpaws this season...It is second in the National League behind Miamis Luis Arraez (.371).

PHAM-TASTIC: Tommy Pham has safely hit in 15 of his last 18 games...Over the last 18 games, Pham is batting .286 (20-70) with 10 runs, seven doubles, two home runs, 14 RBI, five walks, three steals with an .800 OPS...Since May 17, Pham is batting .302 (29-96) with 14 runs, nine doubles, one triple, four home runs, 21 RBI, nine walks, six steals with a .900 OPS in 29 games.

BREWERS-METS NOTES: Last night's win snapped a five-game losing streak to the Brewers, which dated back to September 21, 2022.

MILWAUKEE: Brandon Nimmo has hit .323 (32-99) with 18 runs, six doubles, five triples, four homers, five RBI, 10 walks with a .396 OBP and a .606 SLG in 29 career games against Milwaukee...Starling Marte has appeared in 120 games against the Crew and is a .290/.330/.473 hitter with 25 doubles, five triples, 16 home runs and 58 RBI...Daniel Vogelbach, who played for the Crew, is a .293/.398/.507 hitter with eight XBH and 14 RBI in 22 games vs. the Brewers.

BACK IN THE CITI: The Mets are 18-16 at home this year and have posted a 4.01 ERA...The Mets went 28-15 at home before the All-Star break last season.

STEAL THIS BASE: The Mets have stolen a franchise-record 33 consecutive bases without being caught...The last time a Mets player was thrown out attempting a stolen base was on May 10 (Francisco Lindor at second)...The Mets are first in the major leagues with a 90.8% stolen base success rate this season...Starling Marte has swiped 21 bags this year, tied for sixth in the majors and tied for third in the National League...His 335 career stolen bases rank second among active players...Elvis Andrus is the active leader with 341 steals.

NIFTY FIFTY: Pete Alonso has recorded 55 RBI, while and Francisco Lindor has recorded 54 RBI this year...Alonso ranks tied for second in the NL, while Lindor is tied for fourth...The Mets are one of four teams in the majors with two players who have each recorded at least 50 RBI...They join the Braves (Ozzie Albies - 55 and Matt Olson - 60) as the only other team in the National League.

KEEP THE CAR RUNNING: The Mets are 6-10 when both teams score six or more runs this year...They are 3-6 when both score seven or more runs and 2-3 when they both score 8 or more runs.

IF YOU START ME OFF: New York is 22-3 when their starter goes at least 6.0 innings...The Mets are 8-1 when the starter goes at least 7.0 innings.

FIRST IS THE BEST: The Mets are 23-9 (.719) when scoring first this season... The Mets are 13-34 (.277) when their opponent scores first.

FIRST IS THE WORST: The Mets have been outscored 56-23 in the first inning this year...New York has posted a 5.92 ERA (52 ER/79.0 IP) in the first inning this season...That is the fifth-highest first inning ERA in the majors...Last year, the Mets posted a 4.39 ERA (79 ER/162.0 IP) in the first frame.

DR. ROBERTSON: David Robertson has posted a 2-1 record with 11 saves, and a 1.59 ERA (6 ER/34.0 IP) in 30 appearances this season...He has walked eight, while striking out 41...He ranks fourth in the NL and 10th in the majors in ERA among relievers...He is tied for 17th in the NL with 41 punchouts...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .169 (11-65) average this year.

ABSENCE OF PROOF: The New York Mets are teaming up with the national non-alcoholic pop-up Absence of Proof to bring a fun non-alcoholic experience to Citi Field...Fans ages 21 and up can enjoy a ballgame at Citi Field while sipping on refreshing craft mocktails and other non-alcoholic beverages during this special experience...The event, presented by Cadillac and Dunkin', will run in the Piazza Club on the Excelsior level for four home games: Thursday, June 29 vs. the Milwaukee Brewers and June 30-July 2 vs. the San Francisco Giants.

THE FUTURE IS BRIGHT: RHP Mike Vasil was named to the National League 2023 SiriusXM Futures Game roster...The 23-year-old has made 12 starts between Double-A Binghamton and Triple-A Syracuse where he has combined to go 1-3 with a 4.37 ERA (28 ER/57.2 IP) with 13 walks and 66 strikeouts...He was selected by the Mets in the eighth round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of Virginia.

SENGA NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered his fifth loss of the year on June 23 against the Phillies at Citizens Bank Park...Tossed 5.1 innings and allowed four runs on five hits, twthree walks and six strikeouts.

STRIKE 'EM OUT: Has 93 strikeouts this season to lead all NL rookies...Are the fourth-most by a Met through their first 14 career game behind Dwight Gooden (107), Nolan Ryan (103), and Matt Harvey (102)...Are the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher through their first 14 games trailing only Hideo Nomo (129), Masahiro Tanaka (113) and Yu Darvish (96).

PUTTING THE K IN FORK: Senga's "ghost fork" has accounted for 52 of his 93 strikeouts through 14 starts...The pitch has a 58.4 percent whiff rate and a 28.1 percent putaway rate...Opponents have managed just eight hits in 76 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .118 batting average.

SHUT 'EM OUT: On May 30 against the Phillies, Senga became the 10th rookie in franchise history to throw 7.0 or more innings, while one hit or less and was the first Met since Steven Matz did so on August 14, 2016...Joins Jonathon Niese, who tossed a complete game shutout on June 10, 2010, as the only Mets rookie to accomplish the feat without allowing a walk.

ALL I DO IS WIN: Senga became the only Japanese-born pitchers to start their career 3-0 and is the fourth player in franchise history to earn the win in their first two career major league starts, joining Steven Matz, Mike Pelfrey and Gary Gentry...Additionally, he joins Kazuhisa Ishii, Hideki Irabu and Koji Uehara as the only Japanese-born pitchers to win each of their first two career major league starts...Senga fell just shy of becoming the second Mets starting pitcher ever to begin his career 4-0, a record held by Steven Matz.

MLB DEBUT NOTES: Senga became the 64th pitcher whose major league debut came in a start for the Mets...New York has had one pitcher make his MLB debut as a starter in each of the previous three seasons: José Butto in 2022, Tylor Megill in 2021 and David Peterson in 2020 (the Mets won each of those three games)...Senga allowed one run over 5.1 innings on three hits, three walks and eight strikeouts in his major league debut...His eight strikeouts were tied for the fourth-most by a Japanese-born pitcher in their major league debut and tied for the third-most by a Mets pitcher in their major league debut.

METS-JAPAN CONNECTION: Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Prior to joining the Mets, Senga spent 11 seasons in Japan's NPB with the Fukuoka Softbank Hawks...During his NPB career he posted a 87-44 record with a 2.59 ERA (313 ER/1,089.0 IP) and 1,252 strikeouts (10.3 K/9.0)...He was also a three-time NPB All-Star (2013, 2017 and 2019), a two-time Pacific League Best Nine Award winner (2019 and 2020) and a two-time Mitsui Golden Glove Award winner (2019 and 2020).

2022: Last season, Senga went 11-6 with a 1.94 ERA (31 ER/144.0 IP), 156 strikeouts, a 1.06 WHIP and a 0.4 HR/9 rate over 22 appearances.

INTERNATIONAL COMPETITION: Senga appeared in four games in the 2017 World Baseball Classic for Team Japan...He posted a 0.82 ERA, throwing 11.0 innings and allowing one run on seven hits with 16 strikeouts and one walk...He also pitched in two games during the Tokyo Summer Olympics, throwing a total of 3.0 scoreless innings as Japan won the gold medal on its home turf.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER (7-2, 3.95)

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 6.0 innings in the Mets 4-2 win against Philadelphia on June 24...Allowed just two runs on seven hits, while recording just one walk and eight strikeouts.

EIGHT IS GREAT: Scherzer pitched 8.0 innings for the first time this season in his outing on June 19 at Houston...The last time Scherzer pitched 8.0 innings or more was September 12, 2021 with the Los Angeles Dodgers...This was Scherzer's first time accomplishing this feat as a Met...Scherzer holds a career record of 47-3 and has a 1.25 ERA (66 ER/475.2 IP) in games where he pitches 8.0 innings or more.
