The Mariners and Astros meet for the 9th of 13 matchups this season...Seattle has won 5 of its last 6 series against Houston since the start of 2023, going 14-7 vs. HOU during that span...the clubs are scheduled to play 6 games in Houston and 7 games at T-Mobile Park in 2024. Year Home Road Totals

TONIGHT'S TILT...the Mariners continue a 6-game homestand with the 2nd of 3 games against the Houston Astros (0-1)...Seattle will also welcome the Los Angeles Angels (3 G, 7/22-7/24) to T-Mobile Park on the homestand...tonight's game will be televised live on ROOT SPORTS with Aaron Goldsmith and Ryan Rowland-Smith on the call...the game will also be broadcast live on Seattle Sports (710 AM) with Dave Sims and Gary Hill Jr. on the call.
ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners dropped last night's game by a 3-0 score to the Astros, their 4th consecutive loss...the Mariners are 38-6 (.864) when out-hitting their opponent and 41-28 (.594) when they homer this season...Seattle is 34-28 in night games and 18-19 in day games.

- Joy Division - Seattle is 18-9 (.667) against AL West Division opponents this season.
- At the Break - The Mariners finished the first half of the season with a 52-46 record (.531), their 4th consecutive season above . 500 at the All-Star Break (48-43 in 2021, 51-42 in 2022, 45-44 in 2023).
- Cooperstown - Former Mariners third baseman Adrián Beltré will be inducted into the National Baseball Hall of Fame Class of 2024 on Sunday, July 21...Mariners Hall of Famers Ichiro Suzuki and Félix Hernández are both set to appear on the Hall of Fame ballot for the first time this winter.
- Among Greats - Mariners legend Ichiro Suzuki was ranked No. 37 on ESPN's ranking of the top 100 professional athletes of the century...lchiro was the 5th-highest baseball player listed, behind only Albert Pujols (No. 24), Mike Trout (30), Clayton Kershaw (31) and Miguel Cabrera (33).
HISTORIC HOME PITCHING...Seattle pitchers are $30-19$ with 15 saves and a 2.70 ERA (134 ER, 447.0 IP) with 98 walks and 457 strikeouts in 49 games at T-Mobile Park this season...among teams pitching at home, the Mariners lead MLB in ERA (2.70), opponent batting average (.202), WHIP (0.95), hits-per-9 innings (6.60), walks-per-9 innings (1.97), strikeout-to-walk ratio (4.66), FIP (2.97) and opponent OPS (.569)...the 4.66 strikeout-to-walk ratio is on pace to be 3rd-best at home in MLB history, trailing 2017 Cleveland (4.81) and 2019 Dodgers (4.75)...the 0.95 WHIP is on pace to be 3rd-best at home in MLB history, trailing the 1910 White Sox (0.92) and 1908 White Sox (0.93).
WHAT'S THE VECTOR, VICTOR...Victor Robles was 2 -for-3 in last night's game and is now batting .467 ( $7 \times 15$ ) with 3 runs, 2 doubles, 1 home run, 2 RBI, 2 walks and 3 stolen bases, getting on base at a .556 clip and slugging . 800 (1.356 OPS) in 8 July games...since joining the Mariners on June 4, Victor is batting . 382 (13x34) with 4 runs, 4 doubles, 1 home run, 3 RBI, 4 SB and a 1.050 OPS in 23 games, reaching safely in 10 of his 12 starts...Robles' 1.050 OPS since June 4 is the 3rd-best mark in the American League (min. 30 PA), trailing only Aaron Judge-NYY (1.176) and Heston Kjerstad-BAL (1.141).
CAL'S FIRST HALF...Cal Raleigh is batting .269 ( $14 \times 52$ ) with 10 runs, 1 double, 6 home runs and 11 RBI, getting on base at a .333 clip, slugging . 635 (.968 OPS) in 13 July games...Cal has 20 home runs, 61 RBI, 5 stolen bases and a 109 OPS+ this season, ranking tied for the American League lead among catchers with 2.6 WAR (FanGraphs)...Cal leads MLB catchers in both home runs and catcher caught stealing (18), while he is tied for the lead in stolen bases...Cal could become the first player to lead catchers in HR, CCS and SB since they began tracking catcher caught stealing in 1974...Cal could also become the first player to lead catchers in both HR and SB in a season since JT Realmuto-PHI in 2020 and the first to lead catchers in a full 162-game season since Carlton Fisk-CWS in 1985.
JULIO EN JULIO...Julio Rodríguez is batting . 415 ( $17 \times 41$ ) with 7 runs, 3 doubles, 3 home runs and 6 RBI with a 1.186 OPS in 13 July games, which includes 3 games with $3+$ hits...in 57 career games during the month of July, J-Rod is batting . 306 ( $68 \times 222$ ) with 35 runs, 14 doubles, 1 triple, 12 home runs, 39 RBI, 9 stolen bases and 14 walks, getting on base at a .371 clip, slugging .541 with a .912 OPS.
MUÑ-MAN...right-handed reliever Andrés Muñoz, who was named a 2024 American League All-Star for the first time in his career, has recorded 15 saves, 6 holds and a 1.41 ERA ( $6 \mathrm{ER}, 38.1 \mathrm{IP}$ ) with 18 walks and 46 strikeouts in 38 appearances this season...Muñoz sports a 1.04 WHIP and 10.80 strikeouts-per-9 innings...Muñoz leads MLB with 6 saves of 4+ outs and is 1 of only 3 MLB pitchers with 10+ saves and 5+ holds, joined by José Alvarado-PHI and Jason Foley-DET...Muñoz is 1 of 3 AL relievers with a sub-2.00 ERA and 10+ saves, along with Emmanuel Clase-CLE and Kirby Yates-TEX.
WALTER THE ALL-STAR...right-handed starter Logan Gilbert leads the Majors in WHIP (0.87) and innings pitched (132.1) this season and is tied for the MLB lead with 16 quality starts, ranking 5th in Opp. AVG (.191) and 10th in ERA (2.79)...Gilbert is the only pitcher in the Majors with 3 outings of $8.0+$ scoreless innings.
MASTERS OF THE MOUND...the Mariners pitching staff is $52-47$ with 26 saves and a 3.47 ERA (336 ER, 875.0 IP) with 236 walks and 827 strikeouts this season...Seattle leads the American League in ERA (3.46), ranking 2nd in MLB...Mariners pitchers lead the Majors in opponent batting average (.218), WHIP (1.07), walks-per-9 innings (2.43), hits-per-9 innings (7.24) and rank 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.50) behind Minnesota (3.58).
2025 SCHEDULE ANNOUNCED...the 2025 Major League Baseball schedule was announced Thursday... the Mariners are set to open next season with a 6-game homestand that begins with Opening Day on March 27 against the Athletics...Seattle will finish the regular season with a National League opponent (3game home series vs. the Dodgers) for the first time in franchise history.
2024 MLB DRAFT RECAP...the Mariners selected 20 players in the 2024 MLB First-Year Player Draft from July 14-16...Seattle selected 14 pitchers, 5 position players and 1 two-way player...the class is headlined by 1st round pick (15th overall), switch-pitcher Jurrangelo Cijntje (jurr-angelo SAIN-jah) from Mississippi State University and 2nd round pick, right-handed pitcher Ryan Sloan from York High School in Elmhurst, Illinois.
THE CURRENT HOMESTAND...the Mariners are home for a 6-game homestand July 19-24...remaining promotions on the homestand include International Trading Card Day on Tuesday, July 23 and the Salmon Run Day Ticket Special on Wednesday, July 24.

## ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY

- 26-year-old right-hander is making his 21st start of the season, his 3rd against Houston...he is also making his 77th career start and 6th against the Astros.
- Is in his third season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB FirstYear Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub
- Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
- Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record with 7 earned runs, 3 walks, 34 strikeouts and .263 opponent batting average in 5 games started.
- Named Colonial Athletic Pitcher of the Year in 2019 for Elon University after posting a 2.75 ERA and 19-8 record in 88.1 innings pitched across 14 games started.
LAST TIME OUT...L\#7 on $7 / 13$ at Los Angeles-AL...he pitched 6.0 innings and allowed 2 runs ( 1 earned) on 3 hits with 2 walks and 7 strikeouts...he has gone $5.0+$ innings in each of his last 17 outings, and 18 of 20 this season.
MID-SEASON FORM...over his last 9 starts $(5 / 29-c)$ he is $3-2$ with a 2.11 ERA (13 ER, 55.1 IP ) and 59 strikeouts to 7 walks...over that span, he has a 9.60 SO/9 with a 0.96 WHIP, 8.43 SO/BB and 8 quality starts.
FLASHBACK...his 11 strikeouts against the Astros this season are tied for the 2nd most against a team he's faced in 2024 (also: Toronto)... he trails his highest against the Arizona Diamindbacks with 12 strikeouts.
NO FREE RIDES...is the only pitcher since 1900 (min. 50 GS) to have more games started than walks allowed ( 76 starts, 54 walks).
EMPTY BASES...the right-hander ranks 5th in the AL in opponent on-base percentage (.257) and 5th in the AL in WHIP this season (0.99)...both are career-bests for him...in 2023, he had a 1.04 WHIP and a .270 OBP against.
TOP RANKS...in 2024, ranks 1st in SO/BB (8.92) and 2nd in BB/9 (0.99) in the Majors...since his debut in 2022, he ranks 1st in MLB with 1.11 BB/9 (min. 400.0 IP)...Miles Mikolas-STL ranks 2nd during that span with a 1.67 BB/9 mark.
NO JUNE GLOOM...in his 5 starts in June, he held a 3-0 record with a 1.74 ERA (6 ER, 31.0 IP) and 31 strikeouts to 3 walks...the 1.74 ERA in June is his lowest in a month during his career...his ERA was the 2nd lowest on the Mariners last month (min. 20 IP), trailing Logan Gilbert with a 1.51 ERA.
A LOT OF Os...did not allow a run in 17.0-consecutive innings from his start on $4 / 15 \mathrm{vs}$. Cincinnati to allowing 1 run in the 4 th inning against the Astros on $5 / 3$.
NL EXPERIENCE...he has made 5 starts against National League opposition this season with a 2-1 record and a 2.61 ERA (9 ER, 31.0 IP) in those outings...NL hitters are slashing .202/.222/.404 against Kirby with 33 strikeouts and 3 walks.
WALK THE WALK...among pitchers with at least 80.0 innings pitched this season, Kirby has the 2nd-fewest walks in the Majors with 13....his BB\% is 2.8\%, 2nd-best in MLB behind Zach Eflin-TB (2.2\%) and ranks in the 99th percentile of all Major League pitchers.
UNDER CONTROL...has not allowed more than 3 walks in any of his first 76 career starts, the 4th-longest streak in MLB history to start a career by a starting pitcher (also: Tanner Roark-WSH)...has a 51-start streak with 2-or-less walks, tied for the longest active streak in the Majors by a starting pitcher (also: Zach Eflin-PHI/TB, 51).
QUALITY MATERIAL...recorded his 13th quality start of the season in his last start at Los Angeles-AL...in 2023 , had 20 starts of at least 6.0 innings while allowing 3 earned runs or fewer, which ranked T-5th in the Majors and T-3rd among AL pitchers.
LEADING BY EXAMPLE...since his MLB debut on $5 / 8 / 22$, he ranks among the top pitchers in the American League in various categories (min. 350 IP), including SO/BB (1st, 7.80), WHIP (3rd, 1.08), ERA (3rd, 3.35), wins (T-4th, 28), innings pitched (4th, 438.1) and strikeouts (6th, 421).
END THE INNING...this season, opposing hitters are batting . 211 ( $30 \times 142$ ) with 4 doubles, 2 triples and 5 home runs and 34 strikeouts with 2 outs in an inning...with 2 outs and runners in scoring position, hitters are batting .222 (10x45) with 10 strikeouts.
GET A WHIFF OF THIS...earned a personal single-game career-high against Arizona on 4/27 with 12 strikeouts...tallied 23 swings-and-missed during that start which also marked a career-high... 19 of his whiffs were fastballs.
MISSION CRITICAL...the Mariners own a $31-18$ record in games that Kirby tosses at least 6.0 innings in his career...in games Kirby goes 5.2 innings or less, the Mariners are 11-16.

[^0]:    AS YOU MAY KNOW...George Kirby is 3-2 with a 2.11 ERA (13 ER, 55.1 IP), 7 walks, 59 strikeouts and a 0.96 WHIP in 9 starts since May 29, and... YOU MAY ALSO KNOW...that during that span, Kirby ranks among the MLB leaders (min. 40.0 IP) in ERA (4th), WHIP (0.96), BB/9 (3rd, 1.14), SO/BB (2nd, 8.43) and fWAR (T-1st, 2.2), but...DID YOU KNOW?...that Kirby is on pace to become just the 2nd player in MLB history with multiple seasons with a SO/BB ratio of at least 8.50 ?...he could join Jim Whitney (1883-84), while becoming the first player in the Modern Era (1900-c) to accomplish the feat...he is also on pace to have his 3rd season of $100.0+$ IP with a SO/BB ratio of at least 6.00 , and could become the 14th pitcher in the Modern Era with at least 3 such seasons and the first to do so in his first 3 MLB seasons.
