A NEW SEASON STARTS: The Orioles completed the 2024 regular season with a 91-71 record, finishing in second place in the AL East, 3.0 games behind the first-place Yankees...The O's finished with a third consecutive winning season for the first time since 2012-14.

WHAT'S TRENDING: Baltimore has made the Postseason for the second straight season after winning the AL East with a 101-61 record in 2023...The club was swept in the ALDS against Texas sat year, dropping the first two games at Camden Yards...The Birds have not won a playoff game since Game 3 of the 2014 ALDS at Detroit and have lost their last eight Postseason games since the ALCS in 2014...This marks the fourth time in team history that the club has made the playoffs in at least two straight seasons, joining 1996-97, 1973-74, and 1969-71 (3)...The Orioles finished the season by winning five of six on the final road trip from September 24-29 at New York-AL (2-1) and Minnesota (3-0); before that stretch, the 0's had lost seven of 10 and 10 of 14...The team was 38-40 (.487) since July 1, 33-33 (.500) since the All-Star break, and 26-27 (.491) since August 1 to end the year.

HOMER HAPPY: The Orioles finished the regular season with 235 home runs, second in MLB behind the Yankees (237)...The 235 homers are the third most in a single season in Orioles history behind 1996 (257) and 2016 (253)...The club paced MLB with 139 long balls through June, 16 more than any other team, but hit 96 the rest of the season, ranked 10th in MLB from July on.

② Baltimore had nine players with at least 10 home runs, tied with the Dodgers and Red Sox for the second most in MLB behind the Braves (11): Anthony Santander (44), Gunnar Henderson (37), Colton Cowser (24), Adley Rutschman (19), Cedric Mullins and Jordan Westburg (18), Ryan O'Hearn (15), Ryan Mountcastle (13), and Ramón Urías (11); the team record is 10 players, done in 2019, 2000, and 1998.

③ Henderson and Santander were one of two duos with at least 35 home runs, along with New York-AL's Aaron Judge (58) and Juan Soto (41); the 0's did not have a player reach 35 homers last season, and this year marked the first time since 2016 that the team has had multiple players with 35+ home runs (Trumbo, 47; Davis, 38; Machado, 37).

⑤ The Birds hit 13 leadoff homers, the most by the club in a single season and second in MLB this year behind the Phillies (15); Henderson hit 10 of those, second most in one season by an Oriole behind Brady Anderson, who hit all 12 for the club in 1996; Cowser (2) and Westburg (1) have the other three for the 0's in 2024.

TOP GUNN: Gunnar Henderson set the 0's record for most home runs by a shortstop with 37, passing Cal Ripken, Jr. (1991) and Miguel Tejada (2004), who held the 0's record with 34 entering

He was voted the 2024 Most Valuable Oriole by members of the local media; he's the eighth player to earn MVO in back-to-back seasons and the first since **Adam Jones** in 2011-12.

Pa Henderson earned AL Player of the Week on September 9, the second such award of

His 118 runs scored ranked fourth in the AL and sixth in MLB, and were the most by an Oriole since **Roberto Alomar** set the club record with 132 in 1996; he's the sixth player in 0's history (since 1954) to score 100 runs in back-to-back seasons after scoring exactly 100 times last year, joining **Manny Machado**(2, 2015-16), Jones(2, 2012-13), **Brian Roberts** (3, 2007-09), Anderson (2, 1995-96), and Ripken, Jr. (3, 1983-85). Henderson ranked fourth in the AL and fifth in MLB with 8.0 fWAR; that is the best mark by an Oriole since Ripken, Jr. set the club record with 10.6 in 1991; he's the fifth player (seventh occurrence) in 0's history to finish a season with an 8.0 fWAR, joining Ripken, Jr. (3x; 10.6, 1991; 9.8, 1984, & 8.5, 1983), **Brooks Robinson** (8.1, 1964), **Frank Robinson** (8.2, 1966), and **Jim Gentile** (8.0, 1961). His 31 home runs out of the leadoff spot are the second most in Orioles history, behind **Brady Anderson** (35) in 1996.

MASHED TATERS: Anthony Santander ranked third in MLB with 44 home runs, trailing New York-AL's Aaron Judge (58) and Los Angeles-NL's Shohei Ohtani (54)...He's the eighth Oriole (ninth occurrence) to hit 40 home runs in a season and the first since Mark Trumbo in 2016 (see chart at right)...He's the eighth switch-hitter (12th occurrence) in MLB history to hit at least 40 homers in a season and one of four (five occurrences) with at least 44 (see chart at right).

6)s He drove in 102 runs, the first Oriole to reach the century mark since Jonathan Schoop (105) in 2017; he's the fourth Oriole switch-hitter to do so, joining Eddie Murray (5x, 1980, 82-85), Ken Singleton (2x, 1979-80), and Bobby Bonilla (1996).

6)s Santander hit 35 home runs since the start of June, behind Ohtani (40) and Judge (38) for the most in MLB; no other player hit more than 28 during that time.

6)s His 105 home runs since the start of 2022 rank sixth in MLB during that time and are second in the AL, behind only Judge (157).

6)s He's the ninth player in O's history with multiple 30-homer seasons, joining Manny Machado (3, 2015-17), Chris Davis (4, 2012-13, 15-16), Adam Jones (2, 2012-13), Rafael Palmeiro (4, 1995-98), Eddie Murray (5, 1980, 82-83, 85, 87), Boog Powell (4, 1964, 66, 69-70), Frank Robinson (3, 1966-67, 69), and Jim Gentile (2, 1961-62).

HOLY COWSER: Colton Cowser tied for the MLB rookie lead with 24 home runs with San Diego's Jackson Merrill...He's the 10th rookie in team history (since 1954) to hit at least 20 homers and the first since Gunnar Henderson (28) last year...He also the ninth rookie in 0's history to record 20 doubles and 20 home runs in a season and the first since Henderson (29-2B, 28 HR) in 2023... Among rookies, Cowser led the AL and ranked third in MLB with 4.1 fWAR, behind San Diego's Merrill (5.3) and Pittsburgh's Paul Skenes (4.3)...He finished among AL rookies in in runs scored (1st, 77), total bases (1st, 223), extra-base hits (1st, 51), slugging percentage (2nd, 447), walks (2nd, 52), doubles (3rd, 24), RBI (3rd, 69), OPS (3rd, 768), and hits (5th, 121).

① The O's have the reigning AL Rookie of the Year in Gunnar Henderson; four American League and nine National League teams have had a player win Rookie of the Year in back-to-back seasons, with the Dodgers being the last to do so in 2016 (Bellinger) and 2017 (Seager); the last AL team was the Athletics in 2004 (Crosby) and 2005 (Street).

② His 11 Outs Above Average were more than all other O's defenders combined, per Statcast; eight of those have come in left field, two behind Toronto's Daulton Varsho for the most among MLB left fielders.

THE ROYAL FAMILY: The Orioles and Royals meet for the first time since late April in this AL Wild Card Series...Baltimore won the season series, 4-2, after winning two of three at Oriole Park from April 1-3 and at Kauffman Stadium from April 19-21...The Birds tallied a pair of walk-off wins at Camden Yards, with Jordan Westburg launching a two-run home run in the ninth inning on April 1 with the score tied, and James McCann delivering a two-out, two-run single in the ninth inning with the O's down a run on April 3...In Kansas City, the Orioles used a seven-run second inning off Cole Ragans on April 20 in a 9-7 win, while Cotton Cowser and Westburg hit back-to-back home runs off Seth Lugo in a 5-0 victory on April 21.

O: The clubs have met one time in Posteason play; Kansas City swept the ALCS in 2014, winning the four games by a combined six runs, with every game being within at least a run entering in the ninth inning.

THE ROSTER IS SET: The AL Wild Card Series roster against the Kansas City Royals features 12 pitchers (7 RHP and 5 LHP) and 14 position players (2 C, 7 INF, 5 OF)...Five players will be making their Postseason debuts with their first appearances - Keegan Akin, Colton Cowser, Jackson Holliday, Heston Kjerstad, and Cade Povich...Kjerstad was on the 2023 ALDS roster against Texas, but did not appear in a game.

QUICK HITS: Slated to make his ninth career Postseason appearance (3 GS) in Game 1 of the American League Wild Card Series vs. Kansas City this afternoon...Went 15-9 with a 2.92 ERA (63 ER/194.1IP) in 32 starts (22 quality starts) for the 0's in 2024; became the second qualified 0's pitcher with a sub-3.00 ERA since Mike Mussina posted a 2.54 ERA (68 ER/241.0 IP) in 1992, joining Kyle Bradish (2.83) in 2023... Finished ranked among qualified MLB leaders in innings pitched (6th) and ERA (7th), and among qualified AL leaders in innings pitched (3'd), ERA (4th), wins (T-5th), games started (T-5th), winning percentage (.625, 7th), WHIP (1.10, 8th), and opponent batting average (.226, 9th)...Was named AL Pitcher of the Month for September...The 0's went 21-11 in his starts this year...Started for the AL in the 2024 All-Star Game in Arlington, becoming the fifth 0's pitcher to start a Midsummer Classic...Placed on the Paternity List on June 28 for the birth of his twin daughters, Charlotte and Harper...A four-time All-Star and 2021 NL Cy Young Award winner, Burnes was acquired by the Orioles from the Brewers in exchange for LHP DL Hall, INF Joey Ortiz, and a 2024 Competitive Balance Round A pick on February 1, 2024...He was originally selected by the Brewers in the fourth round of the 2016 First-Year Player Draft out of Saint Mary's College (CA).

POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE: Burnes has made eight career Postseason appearances (2 GS) while posting a 2.84 ERA (6 ER/19.0 IP) with 11 hits, six walks, and 22 strikeouts... Made the start for the Brewers in Game 1 of the 2023 NL Wild Card Series, allowing four runs on five hits (3 HR) and two walks with five strikeouts in 4.0 innings...Retired seven of his first eight batters faced before allowing three runs on back-to-back homers to Corbin Carroll (2 R) and Ketel Marte...Threw 92 pitches, 59 strikes.

LAST TIME OUT: Was dealt the loss on September 26 at New York-AL after tossing 5.0 innings of one-run ball on two hits (1 HR) and one walk with nine strikeouts... Surrendered a solo home run to Giancarlo Stanton in the second inning, followed by a single to Jazz Chisholm Jr., before keeping the Yankees hitless through the next 3.2 innings...The 0's were shutout by the Yanks until an Emmanuel Rivera sac fly in the ninth inning...Had 8+ punchouts in back-to-back starts for the first time this season...Threw 69 pitches, 46 strikes.

AGAINST THE ROYALS: Has gone 3-0 with a 2.15 ERA(7 ER/29.1 IP) in five career starts against Kansas City...Burnes faced the Royals twice this season, going 1-0 with a 3.97 ERA(5 ER/11.1 IP); earned the win on April 20 at Kauffman Stadium after allowing three runs on four hits (1 HR) and one walk with four strikeouts in 5.2 innings...Did not factor in the decision in his first start of the year against the club on April 3 at Oriole Park, allowing two runs on nine hits with three strikeouts in 5.2 innings.

FEELING HOT, HOT: Burnes was named the American League Pitcher of the Month for September after pitching to a 1.20 ERA(4 ER/5.0 IP) with three wins and 31 strikeouts across five starts...His 1.20 ERA last month was his lowest mark in a single month (min. 2 GS) in his career...Burnes tossed back-to-back scoreless outings of 7.0 innings apiece on September 14 and 20, his first time doing so in his career...In his last six starts of the season since August 28, Burnes pitched to a 3-1 record with a 1.29 ERA (5 ER/35.0 IP), holding opponents to two earned runs or fewer in each of those starts.

PLAYOFF READY: This year, Burnes made 12 starts against teams that qualified for the 2024 Postseason, going 5-5 with a 3.34 ERA (26 ER/70.0 IP) and a 1.09 WHIP.

STEAL MY SUNSHINE: Burnes allowed a career-high 41 stolen bases this season, the most in MLB and the most by an Oriole in team history...Was the most since New York-NL's Noah Syndergaard (42) in 2019; Syndergaard also surrendered 48 in 2016...Did not allow a stolen base through his last three starts this season.

HIGH QUALITY: Burnes threw a career-high 22 quality starts this year, which tied for the second most in MLB with three others, trailing Zack Wheeler (26)...He was the first Oriole with 22 quality outings since Mike Mussina (25) and Scott Erickson (22) in 1997...Burnes tossed a career-high 10 consecutive quality starts from April 26 to June 16, the longest such streak by an Oriole since 2007 (Jeremy Guthrie, 5/8-6/26).

HEY NOW, YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: Selected to his fourth consecutive All-Star Game and made his first start...Became the fifth Orioles pitcher to start the Midsummer Classic, joining Steve Stone (1980), Jim Palmer (1978, 1977, 1972, 1970), Milt Pappas (1965), and Jerry Walker (1959)...Pitched a scoreless first inning, allowing a walk to Los Angeles-NL's Shohei Ohtani and a double to Philadelphia's Bryce Harper; left both runners stranded in scoring position...Caught by Adley Rutschman, the first all-Oriole starting battery in an All-Star Game.
