RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals continue a nine-game homestand over 10 days with the second of a three-game series against the Boston Red Sox. St. Louis won the opening game of the series/homestand by blasting a season-high four home runs in a 10-6 win. The Baltimore Orioles come to town May 20-22 followed by an open date and a three-game series against their National League Central rival, the Chicago Cubs, May 24-26.

FLIGHT PATTERN: The Cardinals moved into 4th place with a win last night-coupled with a loss by the Cincinnati Reds. They currently reside 7.0 games behind first place Milwaukee (26-18) and one game behind 3rd place Pittsburgh (21-25). St. Louis has won four of their last five games and are tied with Colorado and Miami for the best mark in the National League (4-1) since May 12.

ALL EYES ON US: The Cardinals will be televised nationally three times on this homestand. Sunday, May 19, the Roku Channel will air the Cardinals-Red Sox game with a first pitch time of 12:05 p.m. Central Time. Two games during the Cubs series will air on FOX Saturday Baseball (May 25) and ESPN Sunday Night Baseball (May 26).

A BEAST VS. THE (A.L.) EAST: The Cardinals posted the best winning percentage against American League East Division opponents since the start of 2023 with an 12-4 mark (.750). They are 4-0 against the Boston Red Sox dating back to May 12 of last season and 2-1 against the Blue Jays, Orioles, Rays and Yankees. The Cardinals are 19-13 (.594) against A.L. East opponents under third-year manager **Oliver Marmol**, his best record against any division with the N.L. Central (70-65, .519) ranking second.

HOMER HAPPY: The Cardinals tied their season-high homering in a 5th straight game last night. They also hit a season-high four home runs last night, their most since Sept. 6, 2023 at Atlanta and their most at Busch Stadium since four vs. Minnesota (8/2/23). Dating back to their last homestand, the Cardinals have hit three home runs in consecutive games. The Cardinals have hit three or more home runs in three consecutive home games twice in their history (Aug. 31-Sept. 2, 2004 & June 30-July 2, 2002), both instances at Busch Stadium II.

MORE SCORES: Nolan Gorman scored a run in his 6th consecutive game against the Red Sox last night. With a run scored in his next game against the Red Sox, he will tie **Javy Lopez** (ATL, 2000-01) for the most consecutive games with a run scored by a National League player against the Red Sox since 1997, when Interleague play began.

JUST THE GOOD O'L BOYS: Alec Burleson is 7-for-14 over his last three games with three multi-hit efforts, two home runs and four RBI. The seven hits over three games is the most in his career and the first time he's tallied three straight multi-hit games. **Brendan Donovan** also has tallied multiple hits in three straight games, matching his career best. **Julio Rodríguez** (SEA) ran off five straight games with multiple hits this season for the MLB high. **Tommy Edman** is the last Cardinals player with multiple hits in four straight games (Aug. 10-14, 2023).

MILES AND MILES: Today marks the 150th career start by **Miles Mikolas** with the St. Louis Cardinals. He becomes only the 32nd pitcher in Cardinals history (since 1892) to make 150 or more starts and is tied with **Danny Cox** (1983-88) for 31st place all-time (**Bob Gibson**, 1st, 482). Mikolas is one of six Cardinals pitchers to achieve 150 or more starts since 2000, joining **Adam Wainwright** (411), **Chris Carpenter** (197), **Lance Lynn** (169), newly inducted Cardinals Hall of Famer **Matt Morris** (156) and **Michael Wacha** (151).

BOMB AWAY: Lars Nootbaar socked his 4th home run of the season last night to put the Cardinals in the lead. His home run traveled an estimated 430 feet, just a foot shy of his average home run distance this season at 429 feet. Nootbaar's 429-foot average ranks 6th in MLB and 2nd on the Cardinals behind **Willson Contreras** (430). See Chart Left

WATCH ME (WHIP): Among qualified Major League pitchers in Interleague play this season, **Kyle Leahy** sports the 5th-lowest (0.32) WHIP and **Ryan Helsley** has the 6th-lowest (0.33). **Danny Coulombe** (BAL) ranks first with an 0.00 WHIP in 5.1 Interleague innings.

Willie McGee played in 67 games for the Red Sox in 1995, and appeared in the ALDS vs. Cleveland.

Lars Nootbaar and **Masataka Yoshida** were teammates on 2023 Gold medal winning Japan in the 2023 World Baseball Classic.

Nolan Arenado's older brother, Fernando Jr., goes by his middle name, Cousy (named in honor Boston Celtics guard **Bob Cousy**).

Ryan Fernandez was selected from Red Sox in Rule 5 Draft in Dec., 2023...he was 23rd round draft selection by Boston in 2018.

Nick Robertson was acquired in trade from Boston 12/8/23 in deal for OF Tyler O'Neill. Appeared in 9 games for the Red Sox in 2023.

Tommy Edman's father, **John Edman**, was a four-year starting shortstop at Williams College in Williamstown, Mass., where he was a team captain his final two years...earned a Bachelor of Arts in economics with a concentration in mathematics.

Chaim Bloom, Cardinals Advisor to President of Baseball Operations, was the Red Sox Chief Baseball Officer from Oct. 28, 2019 to Sept. 14, 2023.

Julio Rangel spent two seasons (2021-22) as the Red Sox Minor League Pitching Coord.

Tyler O'Neill played parts of six seasons with the Cardinals (2018-23) and co-lead the team with 34 HR's in 2021. He won Rawlings Gold Glove Awards in 2020 and 2021 as a Cardinal.

Tanner Houck was born in St. Louis...graduated from Collinsville (Ill.) High School...pitched three seasons at the University of Missouri (2015-17).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **John Tudor** pitched his first five MLB seasons in Boston (1979-83)...was selected by the Red Sox in the 3rd round of the 1976 MLB January Draft-Secondary Phase.

Red Sox principal owner **John Henry** was born in Quincy, Ill...spent most of his childhood on the family farm in Forrest City, Ark. where he was a Cardinals fan who grew up listening to Harry Caray, Jack Buck, and Joe Garagiola on the radio...was age nine when he saw his first MLB game at Sportsman's Park in St. Louis.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Chris Carpenter** was born in Exeter, NH...graduated from Trinity High School in Manchester, NH.

Carlos Villoria worked for the Cardinals as a Spanish Interpreter for two seasons (2018-19).

Kyle Hudson, Red Sox third base coach, played baseball (outfield) & football (wide receiver) at Univ. of Illinois...is from Mattoon, IL.

Bally Sports Midwest reporter **Jim Hayes** attended Emerson College in Boston for one year.

St. Louis Post-Dispatch reporter **Lynn Worthy** is from nearby Tyngsborough, Mass...Attended Emerson College & Boston College in Boston.

St. Louis defeated Boston in seven games in the **1946** World Series, highlighted by **Enos Slaughter's** 8th inning "mad dash" in Game 7 at Sportsman's Park.

The Cardinals defeated the Red Sox in seven games in the **1967** World Series...**Bob Gibson** (3-0, 1.00 ERA, 26 K) was MVP..

St. Louis lost the **2004** WS to Boston in four games.

The Cardinals lost to the Red Sox in six games in the **2013** World Series...marked the first World Series since 1999 to feature both #1 seeds from the AL and NL and first since 1958 to feature two teams with identical regular season records.

- The Cardinals' Opening Day starter for 2024 makes his team-leading 10th start of the season and his 160th career (188th appearance).
- This marks his 150th career start with the Cardinals, only the 32nd pitcher in Cardinals history (since 1892) to make 150 or more starts and is tied with **Danny Cox** (1983-88) for 31st place all-time (**Bob Gibson**, 1st, 482).
- Is one of six Cardinals pitchers to achieve 150 or more starts since 2000, joining **Adam Wainwright** (411), **Chris Carpenter** (197), **Lance Lynn** (169), **Matt Morris** (156) and **Michael Wacha** (151).
- Has the highest qualifying ERA (6.19) in Major League Baseball and 2nd-highest opponent BA (.311) in the NL behind **Patrick Corbin** (.335).
- Leads the team with eight decisions (3-5), but is still seeking his 1st home win of 2024.
- Has enjoyed career success in the month of May, posting an 12-8 mark with a 3.18 ERA, his lowest monthly ERA. Went 3-0 with a 1.89 ERA in six starts last May.
- In his 149 starts as a member of the Cardinals, St. Louis is 60-30 when Miles throws 6.0 or more innings, while the Cardinals are 22-37 when he works 5.2 innings or less.
- Is 23-25 in his 73 starts at Busch Stadium as a Cardinal, with 42 Quality Starts. The Cardinals are 40-33 in those games.
- Mikolas is an amazing 45-5 (.900 win pct) as a Cardinal when receiving 3 or more runs in support (Cardinals 59-14 in those 73 games). He's just 8-47 (.145) when receiving 2 runs or fewer (Cardinals 23-54).
- His loss vs. MIL (4/20/24) was his 1st ever as a Cardinal when receiving 4+ runs of support in 70 such starts dating to 2018.
- Has entered his 7th season (was injured in 2020) with the Cardinals in 2024. Is currently ranked 2nd among active Cardinals pitchers in career innings pitched (881.1), wins (53), strikeouts (646) and games started (149) for St. Louis; trailing only **Lance Lynn** in all categories.
- Led Major League Baseball with 35 starts in 2023, becoming the first pitcher to record 35 starts in a season since **Jhoulys Chacin** (35) in 2018 with Milwaukee. Was the first Cardinals pitcher since **Chris Carpenter** had 35 in 2009 to do so.
- Hasn't committed an error since August 2, 2018 vs. COL. Is one of two pitchers (**Erick Fedde**) with 100+ total chances and zero errors since Aug 3, 2018. Ranks 8th among MLB pitchers in fielding pct. (.989) since 2018 (min. 100 TC).

LAST TIME OUT

- Earned the win at Milwaukee allowing three runs in the 1st inning and following it with five zeros as the Cardinals rallied to a 4-3 win at American Family Field.
- Walked a season-high three batters, but recorded his 4th quality start of the season.

- Did not walk a batter for tfour consecutive starts 4/20-5/7, a new career-high. Tied with **Zack Littell** for most consecutive starts without a walk in the 2024 season. The previous Cardinals pitcher to pitch five starts without a walk was **Mike Leake** in 2016.
- Surrendered a season-high six runs in a loss vs. NYM (5/7). Did not walk a batter for the 4th straight start.
- Earned his first career win against the Mets (4/26) at Citi Field, his 17th different active Major League stadium with 5.2 innings allowing two runs. His second straight start without a walk issued, first time in consecutive starts since July 8-17, 2023.
- Notched his 1st win of the season, besting the Padres and **Yu Darvish** by a 5-2 score on April 2 at PETCO Park. It was his 1st win in San Diego since May 10, 2018, and marked the 6th quality start among seven career starts against his former team.
- His loss vs. MIL (4/20) was his 1st ever as a Cardinal when receiving 4+ runs of support in 70 such starts dating to 2018.
