METSCELLANEOUS: New York defeated the Pirates, 4-3, in walk-off fashion last night...New York is in a stretch where they play 18 of 21 games in the state of New York (3-1)...The Mets continue a six-game homestand (3-1) against the Cubs (2-1) and Pirates (1-0)...Following this homestand, the Mets head to The Bronx for three games before shipping up to Boston for a three-game set.

CH-CH-CHANGES: Major League Baseball announced two scoring changes from yesterday's game...In the top of the ninth inning, Ke'Bryan Hayes reached first on what was originally scored a single...This has been changed to a failed fielder's choice...In the bottom of the ninth Francisco Lindor reached first on what was originally ruled an error...This has been changed to a base hit...As a result, the run in the inning is now earned.

50/50 BENEFICIARY FOR MARC: The Amazin' Mets Foundation's 50/50 Raffle program gives fans the opportunity to support the important work of the Foundation, while offering fans a chance to win cash prizes...In memory of longtime Mets photographer Marc Levine, proceeds from Tuesday's raffle will benefit the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children...Marc served on the board of the Metro New York chapter of the organization.

WALK IT OFF: The Mets earned their fourth walk-off win of the season last night, tied for the third-most in the majors, one behind Miami and San Francisco...Pete Alonso recorded his eighth career walk-off RBI, which ties him with Kevin McReynolds for the third-most walk-off plate appearances in franchise history...He trails only Wilmer Flores (10) and David Wright (9)...Alonso has recorded 146 go-ahead RBI in his career, passing Howard Johnson (144) for the sixth-most in franchise history.

ODD & ENDS: The team's 27 wins are tied for the most in the majors...The Mets are now 12 games above .500, which matches their season-high (also, 4/29 - 21-9). ...This team is one of seven in franchise history to record 27 wins through its first 42 games...The team moved to 22-1 in games when leading after the seventh inning...The Mets improved to 8-3 against NL Central teams and 20-10 against the NL overall.

SERIES-LY SPEAKING: New York has won the opening game in each of their seven home series this season...The Mets are seeking their ninth series win of the season and their sixth at home...New York has dropped only one series at Citi Field in 2025.

IN THE CITI: The Mets improved to 16-4 overall at home this season, tied for the best start to a season in Queens in franchise history (also: 1972 and 2015)...Their .800 winning percentage at home is the second-best in the majors this season, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (.833)...Mets pitchers have recorded a 2.44 ERA at home this season which is the third-lowest in the majors.

SENGA GENESIS: Kodai Senga is set to take the bump tonight...He has allowed five earned runs over seven starts this year (38.2 IP), giving him a 1.16 ERA...Senga allowed a home run to the second batters he faced this year...Entering today, he has not allowed a home run to the last 150 batters he faced...He has not allowed a home run in six straight games, which is the longest streak of his career...Overall, Mets starters have allowed only 14 homers this year, the fewest in the majors.

20/20 VISION: In 20 home games this season, Francisco Lindor has posted a .407/.444/.741 (33-81) with 20 runs, three doubles, eight home runs, 15 RBI, seven walks, two stolen bases and three sacrifice flies...His 33 hits through a player's first 20 home games of a season are the most in franchise history.

23 AND ME: The Mets have won the last 23 games in which Francisco Lindor has homered...The streak that goes back to July 9, 2024 is the longest streak in team history...Prior to Lindor's streak, the longest was 21 straight wins when George Foster homered between July 3, 1985, and June 29, 1986...The next-longest active streak by any major leaguer is Boston's Ceddanne Rafaela at 17 straight wins...Courtesy of Stats Perform.

LINSANITY: Francisco Lindor has safely reached base in 15 of his last 16 games...In his last 25 games dating back to April 16, has a .346/.419/.606 slashline with 19 runs, three doubles, eight home runs, 20 RBI, and eight walks...Lindor is batting .400 (17-41) in the first inning this year...As the first batter of the game, his 17 hits are the most in the majors, while his eight extra-base hits are the second-most...Lindor has hit six lead-off homers as a member of the Mets...That is tied with Mookie Wilson for the seventh-most in team history...Michael Conforto is next with seven leadoff homers.

PIRATES-METS NOTES: The Mets have won 15 of their last 20 games against the Pirates...The Mets have won five straight and 10 of their last 11 against the Pirates at Citi Field.

OUCH: The Mets have been plunked 25 times this year, which is the most in the major leagues...New York was hit 107 times last season, the second-most in the majors and the most in the Senior Circuit...Pete Alonso owns the franchise record, having been hit by 90 pitches in his career...Brandon Nimmo is second with 81, followed by Jeff McNeil at 77 HBP.

ACUÑA MATATA: After batting .118 (2-17) through his first nine games, Luisangel Acuña is batting .310 (27-87) with 14 runs, five doubles, six RBI, six walks, nine steals, a .358 OBP and a .368 SLG...Acuña has stolen a total of 10 bases this season...The rookie record is 24 steals, held by Mookie Wilson in 1981.

LAST TIME OUT: Senga recorded 6.0 scoreless innings, earning his fourth win of the season in the Mets 7-1 win against the Diamondbacks on May 7...Allowed a season-high five walks against four strikeouts in the outing.

STREAKING: Senga has not allowed more than two earned runs in each of his last 15 starts dating back to August 19, 2023...It is tied for the longest such streak in franchise history by a starting pitcher (15, Dwight Gooden, 8/20/85 - 5/6/86) and it is the longest active streak in the majors...It is also the longest such streak in the majors since Chris Sale allowed two or fewer earned runs in 18 straight starts from June 7 - September 19, 2024.

GHOSTING THE BATS: In 2023 Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts...The pitch had a 59.5% whiff rate and a 28.2% put away rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average...In Senga's seven starts of the 2025 season, he has picked up 23 of his 35 strikeouts on the "ghost fork" and generated a 43.2% whiff rate.

SO FAR SO GOOD: In seven starts this season, Senga has gone 4-2 with a 1.16 ERA (5 ER/38.2 IP), 17 walks and 35 strikeouts...He is one of 11 pitchers to allow one or zero home runs when facing at least 100 batters...His ERA is the fourth-best in franchise history through a pitcher's first seven starts of a season, trailing Johan Santana's 0.78 ERA in 2009, Jacob deGrom's 0.80 ERA in 2021) and Frank Viola's 0.87 ERA in 1990...He is one of four Japanese-born pitchers to have as low of an ERA through their first seven starts of a season, joining Yoshinobu Yamamoto (0.90 ERA in 2025), Shota Imanaga (1.08 ERA in 2024) and Hideki Irabu (1.13 ERA in 1998).

SENGA GENESIS: Through Senga's first 37 career starts he has posted 246 strikeouts which is the 15th-most through a pitchers first 37 starts in major league history...It is the fourth most by a Met, trailing Dwight Gooden (first, 319), Matt Harvey (seventh, 270) and Noah Syndergaard (11th, 261)...It is also the third-most among Japanese-born pitchers in that span, trailing only Yu Darvish (301) and Hideo Nomo (297).

CRUISING AT CITI: In 19 career games at Citi Field, he has gone 9-3 with a 2.23 ERA (27 ER/109.0 IP), which is the fifth best in the history of the ballpark (min. 90.0 IP)...He has allowed just nine home runs to 440 batters faced, recording a 0.74 HR/9.0IP ratio at home...His 11.64K/9.0IP is the second-highest among pitchers at Citi Field behind Edwin DÍaz's 15.29K/9.0IP clip (min. 400 BF).

VS. PIRATES: Senga has one previous start against the Pirates, working 7.0 innings and allowing on unearned run on two hits with four walks and six strikeouts in the Mets 5-1 win on June 10, 2023.

SPRING TRAINING: Senga made three starts in Grapefruit League action and he finished with a 2.00 ERA (2 ER/9.0 IP) and nine strikeouts...His last spring outing was March 20 against the Nationals, and he struck out six batters over 3.2 innings of work.

2024 REWIND: He missed nearly the first four months of the 2024 season with a right shoulder capsule strain...Returned and made one regular season start on July 26 vs. Atlanta, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with nine strikeouts and one walk before exiting with an injury...Missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...He made it back for the Postseason and he made his first career Postseason start on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...Threw 2.0 innings allowing one run, a home run in the first inning, and recorded one walk and three strikeouts...Finished the Postseason making three appearances and pitching 5.0 innings while striking out four.

REMARKABLE ROOKIE: During his rookie campaign in 2023, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsusaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967).

KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST: In 2023, Senga finished second in the NL and fifth in the majors among qualifiers in ERA...His 202 strikeouts were the tied for the eighth-most in the NL and tied for the 14th-most in the majors...Senga held opposing batters to a .208 average, the third-lowest mark among qualifiers in the NL and the fourth-lowest mark in the majors...His 10.93 K/9 rate was the fifth-best mark among qualified major league pitchers in 2023...He finished seventh in NL Cy Young voting.

HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR: In 2023 Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-

- Didn't allow an earned run and earned his second win of the season on May 12 against the Pirates (W, 1.0 IP, 2 H, R)...His 1.08 ERA (3 ER/25.0 IP) is the second lowest among all Major League pitchers (min. 25.0 IP), trailing only Max Fried (1.05 ERA).
- Retired all five batters he faced in relief and stranded an inherited runner in the fifth inning on May 10 against the Cubs (1.2 IP, K).
- Entered in the seventh inning on May 7 at Arizona and stranded a runner while picking up the final two outs (0.2 IP, K)...It was his sixth hold of the season and he now has 13 scoreless relief appearances this season.
- Threw 2.0 scoreless innings on May 5 at Arizona and earned his fifth hold of the season...He now has made five relief appearance of at least 2.0 innings and all five of those outings have been scoreless (one of four relievers to record as many appearances).
- Was used as an opener for the second time this season on April 30 against Arizona (also: 4/16 @ MIN)...As an opener, has fired 3.0 hitless innings and has recorded four strikeouts...His three strikeouts matched his season high (also: 4/18 vs. STL).
- Hasn't allowed an earned run in six appearances (5.1 IP) against the Pirates...Is holding Pirates batters to a .250 (5-20) average with six strikeouts against them.
- He has a 1.50 ERA (2 ER/12.0 IP) over nine appearances at home this season...He has held batters to a .195 batting average (8-41) at Citi Field this season.
- Has gone 2-0 with one save, six holds and a 1.08 ERA (3 ER/25.0 IP) through 19 appearances this season, holding batters to a .169 average (14-83)...With runners on base, has held batters to a .103 average (4-39).
- Has produced a run value of four with his sinker this season, tied for the seventh-best among qualified Major League pitchers.
- Got the final two outs and picked up the save in the Mets 6-5 win on April 2 at Miami...It was his first career save after not recording one in his first 118 career appearances.
- Made his second career Opening Day roster and his first with the Mets (also 2023 with Miami).
- Began last season with Miami before he was acquired by the Mets on July 30 in exchange for INF Wilfredo Lara...Finished last season with a 5.14 ERA (12 ER/21.0 IP) and 51 strikeouts over 39 games between the Marlins and Mets.

- Tossed a scoreless seventh inning on May 12 against the Pirates (1.0 IP, BB, K)...Was his sixth scoreless outing in eight home appearances this season.
- Gave up one run in the ninth inning on May 9 against the Cubs (1.0 IP, 2 H, ER, 3 K, HR)...Surrendered a solo home run to Michael Busch and it was just the second home run he has allowed this season.
- Threw 2.0 innings without allowing an earned run on May 6 against Arizona (3 H, R, BB)...It was the 11th time since the start of 2024 season that he pitched at least 2.0 innings without allowing an earned run in relief.
- In six games at home this season he has a 1.64 ERA (2 ER/11.0 IP) and 15 strikeouts...He has held opposing batters to a .205 batting average (8-39).
- Has completed 1.1 or more innings in 10 of his 15 appearances this season, which is tied for the most such outings among major league relievers...His eight wins since the start of the 2024 season are tied for the 13th-most among major league relievers (tied for sixth-most in the NL).
- Has allowed one or zero runs in 33 of his last 37 appearances, including scoreless outings in 25 of those contests, dating back to July 6, 2024...In that span, has gone 7-0 with three saves, five holds and a 2.53 ERA (16 ER/57.0 IP)...Has held batters to a .204 average (40-196) in that span...Over that range, the Mets are 29-8 in games he has pitched in.
- Made his first career Opening Day roster this season.
- In 2024 he completed 36.0 innings in 23 relief outings and allowed eight runs (2.00 ERA), going 6-0 with three saves and 41 strikeouts...Was 1-3 with a 3.08 ERA (13 ER/38.0 IP) in seven starts.

- Entered in the seventh inning and recorded the final two outs of the inning on May 10 against the Cubs (0.2 IP).
- Pitched 2.0 scoreless innings on May 4 (G1) against St. Louis (2.0 IP, 2 H)...It was the first time he had pitched 2.0 or more innings scoreless innings since July 25, 2023, at Los Angeles-NL.
- Appeared in his first game this season on May 1 vs. Arizona...Came on to start the fifth inning and he gave up a walk and a double (0.1 IP, H, ER, BB).
- Had his contract selected from Triple-A Syracuse prior to the game on May 1.
- Has appeared in seven games for Triple-A Syracuse this season and he has a 7.88 ERA (7 ER/8.0 IP) with 12 strikeouts.
- Last season he pitched for Toronto, and he ranked fourth among AL left-handed relief pitchers with 69 appearances...He posted a 3-3 record with 3.59 ERA (25 ER/62.2 IP) 50 strikeouts, and two saves...Over his last 44 appearances of the season, posted a 2.50 ERA (11 ER/39.2 IP) with 35 strikeouts.
- Was acquired by Toronto on July 21, 2023...Pitched to a 2.66 ERA (7 ER/23.0 IP) and 0.97 WHIP over 29 games with the Blue Jays in 2023.
- In parts of seven major league seasons between St. Louis (2019-2023), Toronto (2023-2024) and the Mets (2025), he has gone 17-14 with five saves and a career 3.88 ERA (120 ER/278.2 IP), with 268 strikeouts over 275 games (two starts).
- Made five straight opening day rosters from 2020-2024.
- Made his MLB debut on May 29, 2019, in a start at Philadelphia, becoming the 2,000th player to appear in a game for the Cardinals in their 128-year history as a member of the National League dating to 1892.

- Tossed a perfect ninth inning on May 11 against the Cubs (1.0 IP)...He hasn't surrendered an earned run in six straight appearances (6.1 IP) dating back to April 23 vs. Philadelphia.
- Pitched a perfect ninth inning on May 10 against the Cubs (1.0 IP, K)...This marked his 285th relief appearance with the Mets and it tied him with Turk Wendell for the ninth-most in franchise history.
- Earned his eighth save of the season after tossing a scoreless ninth inning on May 5 at Arizona (1.0 IP, K)...Marked his 124th save with the Mets, tying Jeury's Familia (124) for the third-most saves in franchise history (also: John Franco - 276 and Armando Benitez - 160)...His eight saves are tied for the 10th-most in the majors this season and are the fifth-most in the NL.
- Pitched a scoreless eighth inning against St. Louis on May 4 (G2) (1.0 IP, 2 H, K).
