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**BOSTON RED SOX (65-57) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (60-64)**  
**August 15, 2026 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 7:15 EDT - Game #125/Home #62**  
**RHP Sonny Gray (14-3, 2.79 ERA) vs. RHP Jared Jones (2-4, 5.03 ERA)**

**THE PIRATES:** began this six-game homestand vs. Boston (1-0, Friday-Sunday) and Detroit (Monday-Wednesday) with an 8-4 win on Friday vs. the Red Sox at PNC Park... Won one of three games during their recent road trip (Tuesday-Thursday) at Miami (their 13-1 win on Thursday at loanDepot park was their largest win since a 14-2 victory on July 5, 2024 vs. New York-NL and their largest road win since a 16-1 victory on April 29 [G2], 2023 at Washington)...Have hit 151 home runs (they hit 117 home runs last season)...Have the most hits (1099) in Major League Baseball...Have scored the third-most runs (625) in Major League Baseball, behind only Washington (663) and Chicago-NL (637), after scoring 583 runs all of last year...Have struck out the third-most batters (1147) in Major League Baseball, behind Philadelphia (1208) and Milwaukee (1196).

**AMERICAN SPIRIT:** Pittsburgh can pick up its eighth consecutive home series win against an American League opponent for the first time with a win tonight vs. Boston (interleague play began in 1997)...The Pirates swept a three-game series from July 21-23, 2025 vs. Detroit, won two of three games last year from August 18-20 vs. Toronto, won two of three games last year from September 19-21 vs. the Athletics, swept a three-game series from April 3-5 vs. Baltimore, won two of three games from April 17-19 vs. Tampa Bay, swept a three-game series from May 29-31 vs. Minnesota and won two of three games from June 23-25 vs. Seattle...The only previous instance where the Bucs did that in seven straight series came from June 18, 2010-June 24, 2012.

**GO WITH THE FLO:** Rafael Flores Jr. hit a solo home run (second inning) and delivered an RBI single (fourth inning) on Friday vs. Boston (he also collected an infield single in the eighth inning of the 8-4 win)...He recorded an RBI in four straight plate appearances (he also hit three-run home runs in the eighth and ninth innings on Thursday at Miami)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Flores Jr. became the first Pirate to do that since Starling Marte (July 23-24, 2018)...He would be the third Pirate (fourth time) to homer in at least three straight games this year, joining Brandon Lowe (three, April 12-14) and Esmerlyn Valdez (four, June 26-29 and three, July 9-11 [G2])...The last Pirate with multiple hits and multiple RBI in three straight contests was Ke'Bryan Hayes (Aug. 8-10, 2023).

**SIMON SAYS:** Ronny Simon singled and scored in the fourth inning on Friday vs. Boston...He is 9-for-22 (.409) with a double, two RBI, a walk, a stolen base & four runs on his six-game hitting streak (since August 7 vs. New York-NL).

**LOWE OR NEVER:** Brandon Lowe connected for his 26th home run on Friday vs. Boston...The last Pirate with more than 26 home runs in a season was Bryan Reynolds (27) in 2022...The last Buc to hit more than 26 home runs in a season while hitting left-handed was switch hitter Josh Bell, who hit 28 of his 37 home runs from the left side in 2019...Lowe's 21 career homers against the Red Sox are tied with Toronto for his most versus any Major League team.

**SHIPPING UP TO BRYAN:** Bryan Reynolds went 2-for-4 with a double, three runs and a stolen base on Friday vs. Boston...He is 19-for-44 (.432) with three doubles, six home runs, 13 RBI, eight walks, a 1.419 OPS and 15 runs in 13 career games against the Red Sox...He has the best OPS against Boston (minimum 40 at-bats) in Major League Baseball since August 16, 2022 (his first game against the Sox)...Chicago (NL)'s Alex Bregman (1.350) is second.

**MONTGOMERY INN:** Mason Montgomery secured his fourth save by striking out the only batter he faced (Adley Rutschman) on Friday vs. Boston...He has a 1.15 ERA (15.2ip/2er), 32 strikeouts and a .077 batting average against (4-for-52) in his last 17 outings (one start), dating back to June 29 at Philadelphia...His 68 strikeouts in relief are tied for the fifth-most among all Major League southpaws (teammate Gregory Soto, 61 strikeouts, is eighth).

**ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY**

August 15, 1970: Jose Pagan went 4-for-4 with two home runs, five RBI and three runs scored in the Pirates' 9-3 win over the Padres at Three Rivers Stadium. It marked the third of four career multi-homer games for Pagan, who went deep only 52 times in nearly 3700 Major League at-bats. Bob Veale earned his eighth win of the season after striking out 12 San Diego hitters during his complete game.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Jones lost an 11-1 decision after allowing a career-high eight runs on six hits and three walks over his 3.0 innings of work on August 9 vs. New York (NL).

**SKY-HIGH JULY:** Jones’ 2.00 ERA (27.0ip/6er) during the month of July was tied with Atlanta’s Chris Sale and San Francisco’s Robbie Ray (he was traded to San Diego on August 3) for the seventh-lowest mark in the National League (minimum 27.0 innings pitched), behind Chicago’s Shota Imanaga (1.53), Chicago’s Matthew Boyd (1.67), Miami’s Eury Pérez (1.69), New York’s Nolan McLean (1.78), Arizona’s Brandon Pfaadt (1.88) and Arizona’s Merrill Kelly (1.95)...His .120 batting average against (11-for-92) during the month of July was first among Major League pitchers (minimum 90 at-bats).

**DYNAMIC DUO:** Jones had a no-decision after allowing one run on two hits and one walk in 6.0 innings in Pittsburgh’s 3-2, 10-inning loss on July 24 vs. Chicago (NL)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Bubba Chandler (July 22 [G2] at New York-AL) and him were the first pair of Pirates starters since at least 1893 to pitch at least 6.0 innings while allowing two or fewer hits, one or zero runs & one or zero walks in back-to-back games.

**HISTORIC STRETCH:** Jones became the only Pirates pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) with three or fewer hits allowed, one or zero runs allowed and at least six strikeouts in three consecutive outings when he accomplished that from July 2-18 (G1).

**30 ROCK:** Jones retired his final four batters on July 2 at Philadelphia, retired each of his 18 batters on July 8 vs. Atlanta and retired his first eight batters on July 18 (G1) at Cleveland (Steven Kwan snapped the streak with a two-out single in the third inning)... Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Jones became one of only three Pirates pitchers in the last 70 years (since 1957) to retire at least 30 consecutive batters, joining Harvey Haddix (38 straight batters, May 21-26, 1959) & Jim Bibby (32 straight batters, May 19-24, 1981).

**YOU’RE PERFECT:** Jones had a no-decision after striking out eight batters over 6.0 perfect innings in Pittsburgh’s 3-0 loss on July 8 vs. Atlanta...He was the first Pirates pitcher in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have an outing of at least 6.0 perfect innings.

**2026 DEBUT:** Jones had a no-decision after allowing five runs and striking out six batters over 4.1 innings of work in Pittsburgh’s 6-5, walkoff win on May 29 vs. Minnesota (Bryan Reynolds hit a game-ending, two-run blast in the ninth inning)...It marked his first Major League appearance since pitching 4.1 innings on September 27, 2024 at Yankee Stadium (he was reinstated from the 60-day injured list the same day).

**MAKING A COMEBACK:** Jones missed all of last year with a right elbow UCL sprain... He underwent right UCL surgery on May 21, 2025 (was performed by Dr. Keith Meister).

**ON THE MEND:** Jones had a 2.89 ERA (18.2ip/6er) and 24 strikeouts over five rehab starts split between Low-A Bradenton (one start, April 29 vs. Lakleand), Triple-A Indianapolis (two starts, May 6 [G1] vs. Omaha and May 23 at Toledo) and Double-A Altoona (two starts, May 12/17 vs. Harrisburg)...He had a 1.02 WHIP on the assignment.

**2024 IN REVIEW:** Jones went 6-8 with a 4.14 ERA (121.2ip/56er) and 132 strikeouts in 22 starts during his rookie season (2024)...His 132 strikeouts ranked sixth among all Major League rookies (his teammate, Paul Skenes, ranked fourth with 170 strikeouts).
