**METSCELLANEOUS:** The Mets defeated the Giants, 9-0, last night...The Mets recorded their first shutout of the season...With a win today, the Mets would secure their second series victory of the season and their first on the road...The Mets finish their first trip of the year, a seven-game trip (3-3) against St. Louis (1-2) and San Francisco (2-1)...The team returns home on Tuesday for the start of a six-game homestand against Arizona (three games) and the A's (three games).

**HAPPY EASTER!:** The Mets are 17-23 all-time on Easter Sunday.

**SENGA GENESIS:** Kodai Senga is set to make his second start of the season today...He allowed two runs on four hits with three walks and nine strikeouts in 6.0 innings of work on March 31 at St. Louis...He has recorded 329 strikeouts through his first 53 career games...That is the fifth-most of any Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden (439), Noah Syndergaard (371), Matt Harvey (370) and Jacob deGrom (355).

**THAT'S OFFENSIVE:** Over the last two games, the Mets have scored 19 runs on 27 hits with four doubles, four home runs, 18 RBI, eight walks, two steals, a .402 OBP, and a .544 SLG...This compares to a total of 25 runs on 49 hits over their first seven games of the season.

**TAYLOR MADE:** Last night, Tyrone Taylor recorded his fifth-career pinch-hit home run...It was his second as a member of the Mets and first since April 11, 2024...The Mets recorded only one pinch-hit home run on 2025...Jared Young hit a solo home run on September 6 in Cincinnati...Overall, as a team the Mets are 2-7 when pinch-hitting in 2026.

**BO KNOWS BALL:** Over the last four games, Bo Bichette is batting 7-19 (.368) with three runs, two doubles, three RBI and an .842 OPS...This compares to a .091 (2-22) with one runs, three RBI and one walk over his first five games of the year.

**RISPY BUSINESS:** The Mets went 5-11 with RISP last night...Over the last two games, the team is 11-25 with RISP, recording one home run and 13 RBI...This compared to going 11-71 (.155) with one home run and 19 RBI over their first seven games.

**HERE'S THE PITCH:** The Mets are fourth in the Majors with a 2.58 ERA (24 ER/83.2 IP)...That is the second-best mark in the Senior Circuit...The Mets have struck out 84 batters this season, seventh in MLB and the fourth-most in the NL...The Mets bullpen has posted a 1.82 ERA (7 ER/34.2 IP), which is third in the Majors and second in the National League.

**ON THE MARK:** In five games this season, Mark Vientos is batting .471 (8-17) with four runs, two doubles, one homer, three RBI, two walks, a .526 OBP, a .765 SLG and a 1.291 OPS...He has safely hit in five of his six games.

**BROOKS AND DONE:** Since returning from "Tommy John" surgery last year, Brooks Raley has appeared in 34 games with the Mets, posting a 2.15 ERA (7 ER/29.1 IP) with six walks and 30 strikeouts...He is holding hitters to a .146 (15-103) mark...This includes a .086 (3-35) mark against left-handed hitters...He has not surrendered a home run since August 13, 2023 vs. Arizona.

**GIANTS-METS NOTES:** The Mets are 41-45 all-time at Oracle Park...Last night marked the fifth time the team has recorded a shutout at the ballpark...The previous time was August 26, 2025.

**WE REMEMBER:** The New York Mets announced that the club will wear a memorial "Davey" patch on the sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2026 season...Johnson passed away on September 5, 2025 at the age of 82...He finished his Mets career with the most managerial wins in franchise history (595) and the best winning percentage (.588)...In 1986, Johnson guided the team to a franchise-record 108 regular season victories and capped the year off with a dramatic World Championship...From 1984-1990, under his helm, the Mets averaged more than 95 wins.

**40 YEARS:** This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions New York Mets...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 World Champion Mets on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information regarding programming for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration will be available at a later date at Mets.com/1986.

**LAST TIME OUT:** Tossed 6.0 innings, allowing two earned runs on four hits with nine strikeouts against three walks in his first start of 2026 on March 31.

**SPRING TRAINING:** In three Spring outings (three starts), Senga recorded a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) with 11 strikeouts...Held Spring batters to a .176 (6-34) average...Last pitched on March 19 at Houston, tossing a spring-high 4.0 innings (2R, 6H, 1BB, 4K).

**VS. SAN FRANCISCO/NATIONAL LEAGUE:** Has recorded a 7.07 ERA (11 ER/14.0 IP) and a 7.07 SO/9.0 IP in three starts against the Giants...Made 18 appearances vs. the National League last season, posting a 2.99 ERA (31 ER/93.1 IP)...The Mets were 11-7 last year when Senga started against a National League team.

**2025 SEASON RECAP:** Senga finished last season going 7-6 with a 3.02 ERA (38 ER/60.2 IP), 55 walks and 109 strikeouts in 22 starts...Started the season going 7-3 through June 12, with a 1.47 ERA (12 ER/73.2 IP)...He had thrown at least 5.0 innings in all 13 starts and allowed three earned runs or fewer in all of those starts...Following his return from the IL, posted a 5.90 ERA (26 ER/39.0 IP) in nine starts...Allowed three or more earned runs in three consecutive games before being sent to Triple-A.

**KODAI THE FRIENDLY GHOST:** Senga picked up 71 of his 109 strikeouts on the ghost fork last season...Held batters to a .130 average with his ghost fork this season, which was the second-lowest opponents' batting average among any qualified pitcher throwing a split-finger pitch and the seventh-lowest opponent batting average among any qualified pitcher throwing any pitch...His 41.8% whiff rate was the fourth highest...In his rookie year (2023), Senga's "ghost fork" accounted for 110 of his 202 strikeouts...The pitch had a 59.5% whiff rate and a 28.2% put away rate...Opponents managed just 18 hits in 163 at-bats ending with the forkball, a .110 batting average.

**GOOD THINGS COME IN THREES:** Has allowed three or fewer runs in 44 of his first 52 career starts...His 44 such starts are tied with Dwight Gooden for the second most in franchise history through a starter's first 52 career games...He had allowed three earned runs or less in 31 consecutive starts from June 23, 2023 to July 11, 2025, which tied with deGrom (from 4/16/18-4/3/19) for the second-longest such streak in franchise history...At the time, it was the longest active such streak in the majors...He trailed only Jacob deGrom's 40 starts (from 9/9/19-9/18/22).

**SENGA GENESIS:** Through Senga's first 52 career starts he has posted 320 strikeouts...His 320 strikeouts through his first 52 Major League games are the fifth-most in Mets history behind Dwight Gooden (433), Matt Harvey (361), Noah Syndergaard (361) and Jacob deGrom (349)...His 320 strikeouts are also the fifth-most among Japanese-born pitchers through their first 52 starts, trailing only Yu Darvish (428), Hideo Nomo (409), Shohei Ohtani (367) and Masahiro Tanaka (326)...His career 3.00 ERA (95 ER/285.0 IP) is the 12th-best in franchise history through a player's first 52 starts with the club.

**CRUISING AT CITI:** In 29 career games at Citi Field, he has gone 12-5 with a 2.80 ERA (49 ER/157.1 IP), which is the 11th best in the history of the ballpark (min. 90.0 IP)...He has allowed just 15 home runs to 653 batters faced, recording a 0.86 HR/9.0IP ratio at home...His 11.27 K/9.0IP is the third-highest among pitchers at Citi Field behind Edwin Díaz's 15.10 K/9.0IP and Jacob deGrom's 11.52 K/9.0IP (min. 400 BF).

**2024 REWIND:** He missed nearly the first four months of the 2024 season with a right shoulder capsule strain...Returned and made one regular season start on July 26 vs. Atlanta, throwing 5.1 innings and allowing two runs on two hits with nine strikeouts and one walk before exiting with an injury...Missed the rest of the regular season with a strained left calf...He made it back for the Postseason and he made his first career Postseason start on October 5 in Game 1 of the NLDS against the Phillies...Threw 2.0 innings allowing one run, a home run in the first inning, and recorded one walk and three strikeouts...Finished the Postseason making three appearances and pitching 5.0 innings while striking out four.

**REMARKABLE ROOKIE:** During his rookie campaign in 2023, Kodai Senga recorded 202 strikeouts and became the 18th rookie pitcher in the Modern Era (Since 1900) to have 200 or more strikeouts in a season...Senga's 202 punch outs were the second-most by a Mets pitcher behind only Dwight Gooden's 276 strikeouts in 1984...He joined Hideo Nomo (236), Yu Darvish (221) and Daisuke Matsuzaka (201) as the only Japanese-born rookie hurlers to reach 200 strikeouts...Senga's 12 wins were tied with Ron Darling (1984) for the seventh-most wins in a single season by a Mets rookie and was the first Mets rookie to reach double-digit wins since Dillon Gee (13, 2011)...His 2.98 ERA (55 ER/166.1 IP) was the fifth-lowest in a single season by a Mets rookie behind only Jerry Koosman (2.08, 1968), Jon Matlack (2.32, 1972), Dwight Gooden (2.60, 1984) and Tom Seaver (2.76, 1967)...He finished seventh in NL Cy Young voting.

**HEY NOW YOU'RE AN ALL-STAR:** In 2023 Senga joined Pete Alonso (2019), Dwight Gooden (1984), Jerry Koosman (1968) and Tom Seaver (1967) as the only Mets rookies selected to an All-Star Game...He was the eighth Japanese-Born rookie ever to be selected to an All-Star Game joining Masahiro Tanaka (2014), Yu Darvish (2012), Kosuke Fukudome (2008), Hideki Okajima (2007), Hideki Matsui (2003), Ichiro Suzuki (2001) and Hideo Nomo (1995).

**METS-JAPAN CONNECTION:** Senga is the 14th Japanese-born player to appear in at least one game for the Mets, the most by any major league team...Prior to Senga, the last Japanese-born player to appear in a game for the Mets was OF Norichika Aoki in 2017.

- Threw a scoreless seventh inning on April 3 at San Francisco (1.0 IP, H, K)...Dating back to last season, each of his last six appearances have been scoreless.
- Recorded the final two outs of the sixth inning on April 1 at St. Louis (0.2 IP, H, K)...He stranded one of his two inherited runners, and this season he has stranded three of the four runners he's inherited.
- Has made three career appearances against San Francisco, and both were scoreless (3.2 IP).
- Tossed 1.2 scoreless innings in relief on March 29 vs. Pittsburgh (1.2 IP)...Since the start of last year, he has gotten five or more outs in a relief appearance 13 times, which is tied for the seventh-most such appearances in the majors over that span.
- Entered in the sixth inning on March 28 vs. Pittsburgh (0.2 IP, K) and he struck out one while stranding two runners.
- Made his third career Opening Day roster and his second consecutive with the Mets.
- Pitched in three games for the Dominican Republic in the World Baseball Classic...He tossed 4.0 scoreless innings and struck out seven of the 13 batters he faced.
- Appeared in three Grapefruit League games and he threw 3.0 scoreless innings...He struck out five of the 11 batters he faced during the spring.
- Last season, he made a career-high 52 appearances and finished with a 5-2 record, two saves, 12 holds, 57 strikeouts, and a 3.57 ERA (25 ER/63.0 IP).
- In 2025, he allowed just five earned runs over 25 combined appearances in March, April, and May (1.34 ERA)...His ERA through his first 25 games of the season is the 11th-best in franchise history.
