ARIZONA DIAMONDBACKS (51-53) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (42-62)

July 26, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - Game #105/Home #55

RHP Merrill Kelly (9-5, 3.32 ERA) vs. LHP Andrew Heaney (4-9, 5.03 ERA)

THE PIRATES: dropped the first game of this three-game series vs. Arizona on Friday in the final series of this homestand (were swept by Chicago-AL in three games from July 18-20 before sweeping Detroit in three games from July 21-23)...Have gone 29-25 at home this season...Are one of four teams in all of Major League Baseball that has yet to lose when leading after eight innings this season (35-0)...Are in the second game of a stretch of 12 straight games against the NL West.

HOW MAY I ASSIST YOU: Oneil Cruz recorded his fifth assist of the season in Friday night's game against Arizona, tied with Philadelphia's Brandon Marsh, San Diego's Jackson Merrill and Miami's Dane Myers for the fourth-most among all Major League center fielders...Only New York (NL)'s Tyrone Taylor (seven), San Francisco's Jung Hoo Lee (six) and Boston's Cedanne Rafaela (six) have more assists...The five assists are also the most by a Pirates center fielder in a season since Starling Marte had eight in 2019.

CRUZ CONTROL: Oneil Cruz enters today leading Major League Baseball with 34 stolen bases...The 34 stolen bases are the most by a Pirate in a season since Starling Marte had 47 steals in 2016...He's stolen at least one base in three straight games (since Tuesday vs. Detroit) for the third time in his career (also this season from March 27-29 and last season from August 20-22)...The last Pirate to steal at least one base in four straight games was Marte from July 8-15, 2016.

PHAMTASTIC: Tommy Pham recorded Pittsburgh's lone hit on Friday vs. Arizona, a second-inning triple off Diamondbacks starter Ryne Nelson...It was Pham's first triple since last season on September 15 here at PNC Park off Pirates starter Jared Jones, while he was with Kansas City...Over his last 22 games (since June 22 vs. Texas), Pham is batting .387 (29-for-75) with six doubles, a triple, four home runs, 18 RBI, six walks and nine runs scored...His .387 average in that span is the best in all of Major League Baseball among those with at least 80 plate appearances, while his 1.080 OPS in that span ranks seventh in all of Major League Baseball...Pham's .387 average since June 22 is the best by any Pirate in any 22-game, single-season span (minimum 80 plate appearances) since Josh Bell batted .411 (37-for-90) with eight doubles, nine home runs and 24 RBI from May 10-31, 2019.

BE LIKE MIKE: Mike Burrows allowed just three hits and one walk while striking out five batters and not allowing a run over a career-high 6.0 innings on Friday night against the Diamondbacks (he had a no-hit bid through 4.1 innings for the second consecutive start, along with July 19 vs. Chicago-AL)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the sixth Pittsburgh pitcher since 2000 to have a no-hit bid of at least 4.0 innings in back-to-back starts, joining Mitch Keller (September 19-25, 2020), Joe Musgrove (July 29-August 6, 2018), Edinson Volquez (August 29-September 3, 2014), Dave Williams (May 23-28, 2005) and Kris Benson (June 11-17, 2004).

INNINGS EATERS: Pittsburgh has four pitchers (Bailey Falter, Andrew Heaney, Mitch Keller and Paul Skenes) with at least 100.0 innings pitched, tied with Los Angeles (AL) and Tampa Bay for the second-most-such pitchers in Major League Baseball (St. Louis, five)...Per OptaStats, the last time the Pirates had at least four pitchers reach 100.0 innings pitched before August in a season was in 2015 (A.J. Burnett, Gerrit Cole, Francisco Liriano and Jeff Locke all did it).

DE-'PEN-DABLE: Isaac Mattson, Dennis Santana, David Bednar and Braxton Ashcraft combined to allow just two hits and one unearned run over 5.0 innings of work on Friday vs. Arizona...It was the Pirates' eighth game this season where the bullpen combined to throw at least 5.0 innings without allowing an earned run (last on July 20 vs. Chicago-AL)...Only Los Angeles-NL (11) has more-such games this season...Pittsburgh's bullpen has had six games in 2025 with at least 5.0 innings, no earned runs and two hits or fewer allowed, its most-such games in a season since doing that six times in 1993.

HOW ACQUIRED: Signed as a free agent on February 22, 2025.

STARTING OFF: The 34-year-old southpaw is in his 12th Major League season...He signed a one-year contract with Pittsburgh on February 22 after spending each of the previous two years with Texas...He was Los Angeles (AL)’s nominee in both 2018 and 2019 for the distinguished Roberto Clemente Award for his community involvement.

LAST TIME OUT: Heaney allowed a season-high-tying seven runs on a season-high nine hits in 4.0 innings on July 20 vs. Chicago (AL), losing a 7-2 decision...Four of the seven runs he allowed came in the first inning, by way of back-to-back home runs from the White Sox’ Miguel Vargas (three-run) and Mike Tauchman (solo)...It marked the first time this season that Heaney allowed more than one run in the first inning.

AGAINST THE DIAMONDBACKS: Heaney is 1-1 with an 8.25 ERA (12.0ip/11er) in three regular-season appearances (two starts) against Arizona...He lost a 5-0 decision to Ryne Nelson on May 26 at Chase Field, allowing five runs on eight hits and three walks over 5.0 innings...Heaney faced the Diamondbacks twice during the 2023 World Series, while he was with Texas...He tossed 0.2 innings of relief in Game Two (October 28) at Globe Life Field, a game Arizona won, 9-1...Heaney also started Game Four (October 31) at Chase Field, allowing one run over 5.0 innings (won an 11-7 decision).

SOUTHPAW SIGHTING: Heaney’s 19 starts this season are tied with New York’s David Peterson for the ninth-most among all left-handed pitchers in the National League (teammate Bailey Falter is tied for the top spot among NL lefthanders with 21 starts).

AS A RELIEVER: Heaney pitched 2.0 innings in relief on July 12 at Minnesota, allowing three runs on three solo homers (Matt Wallner, Byron Buxton, Willi Castro)...It was his first outing out of the bullpen since May 28, 2024 vs. Arizona, while he was with Texas.

HERE’S THE PITCH: Heaney is averaging 16.4 pitches per inning this season...It’s his best rate since averaging 16.3 pitches per inning in 2020, as a member of the Angels.

CLOSE CALLS: The Pirates have played in six one-run games over Heaney’s first 19 starts of the season...Heaney has pitched to a 1.93 ERA (37.1ip/8er) in those six starts.

HIGHS AND LOWS: Over his first 14 starts (March 30-June 12), Heaney posted a 3.33 ERA (78.1ip/29er) and 59 strikeouts...In his last six appearances (five starts), dating back to June 19 [G1] at Detroit, Heaney has a 10.65 ERA (23.2ip/28er) and 15 strikeouts.

THANKS FOR YOUR SUPPORT: Heaney received a season-high seven runs of support in his start on June 30 vs. St. Louis (most since receiving 11 runs of support on June 30, 2024 at Baltimore, while he was with Texas)...He received a combined four runs of support while in the game in his prior four outings (since June 7 vs. Philadelphia).

AND THE WHIFF: Heaney struck out each of the first six batters he faced in his start on April 23 in Anaheim against the Angels, becoming the first Pirates lefthander to strike out at least six straight batters since Francisco Liriano on June 1, 2013 vs. Cincinnati (seven straight)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, Heaney and Paul Skenes (May 17, 2024 at Wrigley Field vs. the Cubs) are the only Pittsburgh pitchers in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to strike out six or more straight batters to begin a game...In that outing, according to Elias, he also became the first Pirates southpaw ever to throw at least 6.0 scoreless innings and nine strikeouts while allowing one hit or fewer and zero walks.
