ROAD-TRIPPING REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals and division-rival Pittsburgh Pirates play the second game of a three-game series tonight at PNC Park ... After sweeping the Minnesota to open the season, the Cardinals have gone 1-6 over their last 7 games, going 0-4 (0-3 at BOS, 0-1 at PIT) on the road trip ... St. Louis enters today in 3rd place in the National League Central Division, 2.5 games behind Chicago.

BACKSTOP BRILLIANCE: Last night, catcher **Yohel Pozo** hit his 2nd career home run and first since going yard off Oakland's **Sergio Romo** on Aug. 13, 2021 with Texas, a span of 3 years, 7 months, & 25 days The last Major Leaguer to go as long or longer than Pozo between home runs is Toronto catcher and former 2021 Cardinals minor league backstop **Tyler Heineman** (5 years, 6 months, & 4 days), between Sept. 26, 2019-March 30, 2025. - *Elias*

• Pozo is the 7th catcher all-time to homer in his Cardinals debut and first since **Steven Hill** went deep in his MLB debut on Aug. 15, 2010 off Chicago Cubs reliever **Marcos Mateo** at Busch Stadium (Hill's only MLB game that season).

• St. Louis catchers **Iván Herrera**, **Pedro Pagés**, and **Yohel Pozo** combine to lead all MLB team catching combos in home runs (6), extra-base hits (11), total bases (38), slugging pct. (.884), and OPS (1.275), while co-leading in hits (15) and RBI (18) and ranking 2nd in batting average (.349).

LET THE KIDS PLAY: Four of the top 11-youngest National Leaguers are active for tonight's Cardinals-Pirates game: RHP **Paul Skenes** (22 years & 314 days, 7th), OF **Jordan Walker** (22-321, 8th), INF **Thomas Saggese** (22-363, 9th), and SS **Masyn Winn** (23-018, 11th) ... MLB's youngest player is Brewers OF **Jackson Chourio** (21-028).

DEEP THOUGHTS: 11 different Cardinals have gone yard this season, 2nd-most in franchise history over the first 10 games of a season behind the 2000 Cardinals (12 different) ... Cardinals this season without homers include **Willson Contreras**, **Alec Burleson**, **Luken Baker**, and **Michael Siani**. - *Orf* **HISTORY WAS MADE LAST NIGHT:** With the home run by **Yohel Pozo** last night, the Cardinals became the **1st team in MLB history** to have three different catchers homer in their team's first 10 games to begin a season - *Elias*.

BIG BOOTY BOUNTY: St. Louis leads visiting teams with 208 home runs (201 games) in PNC Park history (2001-present), including 34 by **Albert Pujols** (35 career HR are most by a visiting player). **#JimmyTGone** **AHOY MATEY:** St. Louis leads visiting teams with 115 wins all-time at PNC Park (2001-present), while their .572 win pct. ranks as their 5th-best at any road ballpark and 3rd among annual Steel City visitors behind the Padres (.608) and Dodgers (.600) ... St. Louis has won the season series over Pittsburgh 21 times in the last 25 years since 2000 (2008, 2012, 2013, 2023).

FOUR SCORE: St. Louis has scored 4+ runs in all 10 games to begin their season, the only MLB team this season to do so and two games shy of its season-opening franchise record streak of 12 games by the **1954** Cardinals ... The **1978** Boston Red Sox hold the MLB record with 18 games of 4+ runs scored to begin their season ... St. Louis finished last night's game one hit shy of tying the 1999 Cleveland Indians for the MLB record of double-digit hit totals in 10 games to begin a season.

• Dating back to Sept. 24, 2024, the Cardinals have scored 4+ runs in 16 consecutive games overall, T-2nd longest streak in franchise history over any span of games behind the **1921** Cardinals (21 games from May 27-June 14).

• With 4+ runs and 9+ hits tonight, St. Louis would set the MLB record with 11 such games to open a season, surpassing the shared record by the 1936 Cincinnati Reds and 1999 Cleveland Indians.

PITTSBURGH CONNECTIONS

Oliver Marmol was originally selected by Pittsburgh in the 31st round of the 2004 MLB Draft, but did not sign.

Victor Scott II grew up a fan of **Andrew McCutchen** and **Starling Marte** as a child...Scott's father was Pirates fan from Pittsburgh, although Victor II grew up a Braves fan.

Miles Mikolas spent one month as a Pirate during the 2013 offseason...traded by San Diego with **Jaff Decker** to Pittsburgh for **Alex Dickerson** (Nov. 25, 2013), then traded by Pittsburgh to the Rangers for **Chris McGuiness** (Dec. 30, 2013).

Michael Siani's younger brother, **Sammy Siani**, was selected by Pittsburgh with the 37th overall pick in the 2019 MLB Draft...is an outfielder for Altoona (AA) in the Pirates organization.

Brant Brown played in 130 games for the Pirates in 1999 before traded to the Marlins for OF **Bruce Aven** (Dec. 13, 1999)...traded by the Cubs to Pittsburgh for RHP Jon Lieber (Dec. 14, 1998).

Willson Contreras (June 17, 2016 at Wrigley Field), **Sonny Gray** (July 10, 2013 at PNC), **Andre Pallante** (April 10, 2022 at Busch), **Nolan Gorman** (May 20, 2022 at PNC), **Luken Baker** (June 4, 2023 at PNC), and **Matthew Liberatore** (May 21, 2022 at PNC) made MLB debuts vs. the Pirates.

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Julián Javier** signed with Pittsburgh as an amateur free agent in 1956... played parts of five seasons in the Pirates minor league organization (1956-60).

Riley O'Brien's great uncle, **Eddie O'Brien** played for Pittsburgh as an infielder and also made five pitching appearances (1953, 1955-58)...his grandfather **Johnny O'Brien**, played part of four seasons with the Pirates (1953, 1955-57).

Tommy Pham was selected by the Cardinals in the 16th round of the 2006 MLB Draft...played parts of his first five seasons in St. Louis (2014-18).

Nolan Arenado (2009) and **Paul Skenes** (2020) are graduates of El Toro High School in Lake Forest, Calif.

Pirates Asst. Pitching Coach **Brent Strom** spent six seasons (2008-13) with the Cardinals organization as minor league pitching instructor (2008-11) and pitching coordinator (2012-13).

Cardinals Hall of Famer **Matt Morris** pitched two seasons in Pittsburgh (2007-08).

Cardinals 2024 first round pick **JJ Wetherholt** graduated from Mars Area (Pa.) High School... coached by **Andy Bednar**, father of **David Bednar**.

Derek Shelton was born in Carbondale, Ill...caught four seasons (1989-92) at Southern Illinois Univ.

Nick Yorke made his MLB debut on Sept. 16, 2024 at St. Louis.

Pirates Head Athletic Trainer **Rafael Freitas** was an athletic trainer at Memphis (AAA) in 2016.

Pirates Senior Director, Communications & Content **Terry Rodgers** previously worked as a PR Specialist in the Cardinals Communications department (2010-11).

Tonight's Game:

- Leads the starting rotation's 3rd turn thru as he is set to make his 3rd start of the young season tonight.
- Coldest temperature he has pitched in over his 300 career starts (309 app) was 35 degrees at Great American Ballpark vs. Pittsburgh (March 31, 2019). Tossed 2.2 innings allowing three runs (2 ER) on five hits in a 5-0 loss.
- Struck out his career-high 13 batters nearly two years ago to the day (April 7, 2023) vs. Houston w/MIN. Temperature at game time was 47 degrees.
- Made his 300th career start vs. LAA (4/2). Threw 6.0 innings for a no decision, exiting after a grand slam by Logan O'Hoppe, before the Cardinals retaliated with nine unanswered runs for a 12-5 win.
- Needs five outs to hit 1,750 innings pitched, the 10th active Major Leaguer to hit that mark (**Justin Verlander, Max Scherzer, Clayton Kershaw, Charlie Morton, Jose Quintana, Chris Sale, Gerrit Cole, Patrick Corbin** and **Kyle Gibson**).
- Cardinals have won both of his starts this season. St. Louis is 19-11 in his 30 starts with the club since joining in 2024; His record stands at 14-9 while wearing the Birds on the Bat.
- Drew the Cardinals Opening Day start on 3/27 vs. MIN, the 4th Opening Day start of his career and his 1st for St. Louis.
- Was credited with the win on Opening Day with a 5-3 decision over the Twins when he worked 5.0 IP, allowing 2 runs (two-run Bader HR in 5th).
- With the Opening Day win, improved to 3-0 with a 1.07 ERA (25.1 IP/3 ER) in his four career Opening Day starts.
- Opened his 2024 season with 17.0 scoreless innings (April 9-21), longest by a Cardinals starting pitcher in 2024 and longest by any Cardinals starting pitcher to open a season since Woody Williams (24.2 IP) in 2003.
- Is 18-12 with a 3.10 ERA in 42 career starts in April and had a 3-1 mark with a 1.16 ERA last April in four starts for St. Louis.

Gray vs. Pittsburgh

- Making his 12th career start vs. the Pirates and 3rd as a member of the Cardinals. Has a 5-4 record with a 4.20 ERA over the previous 11 starts (1-0, 3.55 ERA, 12.2 IP w/STL).
- Struck out nine and then eight batters in his two starts last season vs. PIT. Earned his lone win 6/12/24 at Busch Stadium tossing 7.0 innings allowing one run with a walk and nine punch outs in a 4-2 'Birds win.
- Last faced the Pirates at PNC Park as a member of the Reds on May 12, 2021. Hurled 4.2 innings, scattering seven hits with one run in a no decision the Reds won 5-1 in 10 innings.
- Has made two career starts (3 app.) at PNC Park and has yet to earn a win at the ballpark. Is 0-1 with a 1.35 ERA over 13.1 innings with 15 strikeouts. Received one total run of support over those three appearances.
- Has wins in 24 different Major League Ballparks (including in actives) over his career. Has yet to record a win at PNC Park, Chase Field (ARI), Coors Field (COL), Fenway Park (BOS), Globe Life Field (TEX), Daikin Park (HOU) and the defunct Turner Field (ATL).

2024/Career Notes:

2024 NL Ranks: Wins (13, T-7th), Home Wins (9, 3rd), Decisions (22, T-7th), Strikeouts (203, 4th), Opponent BA (.228, 9th), Hits/9IP (7.68, 8th), Baserunners/9 IP (9.96, 5th), SO/9 IP (10.98, 2nd), Strikeout % (30.3, 2nd), WHIP (1.09, 6th), SO/BB (5.21, 3rd), FIP (3.20, 5th).

- Struck out 203 batters in his first season in St. Louis, 19th-most in Cardinals single-season history. Became the 9th pitcher in Cardinals single-season history (20th instance) to reach 200 strikeouts and first since **Jack Flaherty** (231 in 2019).
- His 203 strikeouts were 2nd-most by a pitcher in their first season with St. Louis behind only **José DeLeón's** 208 strikeouts in 1988.
- Established new single-season Cardinals records in strikeouts/9 IP (10.98) and strikeout percentage (30.3%) in 2024, surpassing **Jack Flaherty** (10.59, 29.9%) in 2019.
- Finished two strikeouts shy of tying his single-season career high of 205 with the Reds in 2019. Recorded a 57.1 strikeout pct. on his Sweeper (fanning 112 in 196 plate appearances), MLB's best strikeout pct. of any pitch (minimum 150 plate appearances).
- Yielded a career high 21 home runs, but only five at Busch Stadium.
- His team-leading 13 wins were his most since a career-high 14 victories in back-to-back seasons with Oakland (2014-15)
- Signed a three-year (2024-26) free agent contract with St. Louis following the 2023 Thanksgiving holiday, with a fourth year club option for the 2027 season.
- The Cardinals are his fifth Major League team, after the Athletics (2013-17), Yankees (2017-18), Reds (2019-21), and Twins (2022-23).
- Finished 2nd in the 2023 American League Cy Young Award voting behind Yankees **Gerrit Cole**, who received 30 unanimous 1st place votes. Gray received 20 2nd place votes and six 3rd place. Also ranked 18th in AL MVP voting.
- Three-time Major League Baseball All-Star, earning selections in 2015 (American), 2019 (National) and 2023 (American).
- Graduated from Smyrna (Tenn.) High School. A two-sport athlete, lettered all four years in baseball and three years in football. Played quarterback and led Smyrna to back-to-back Tennessee High School state championships. Was also Homecoming King.
- Originally selected by the Chicago Cubs in the 27th round of the 2008 MLB Draft out of Smyrna High School, but did not sign. Drafted by the Oakland Athletics in the 1st round (18th overall) of the 2011 Major League Draft out of Vanderbilt University.
