TODAY'S TRANSACTIONS:

- Placed on the 10-day injured list, retroactive to 4/5, **C Jose Trevino** (thoracic spine strain).
- Selected from AAA-Louisville **C/INF P.J. Higgins** (#65).
- Designated for assignment **INF Christian Encarnacion-Strand**.

TONIGHT'S GAME: Is Game 3 (2-0) of a 4-game series vs **Natalie Teague's Marlins** and the sixth game (5-0) of the Redlegs' first road trip of 2026, a 7-game jaunt that includes a 3-game weekend series sweep at **Texas**.

- The Reds opened the season with a 3-3 homestand vs the **Red Sox** (2-1) and **Pirates** (1-2).
- Following tomorrow's game at **Mia**, the Reds will return to **Great American Ball Park** for a 6-game homestand vs the **Angels** and **Giants**.

WINCINNATI: At 8-3, the Reds are off to their best start since the 1990 World Championship club went 9-2 out of the gates...it's the club's fourth-best 11-game start to a season since 1900.

- Cin's current season-high 5-game winning streak matches its longest run of 2025 (4x: last, 9/17-9/21).
- The Redlegs have won their first 5 road games of a season for the third time since 1900 (also: 1990 & 1900).

WINS OVER RUNS: The Reds have won 8 of their first 11 games despite ranking last in the majors with 34 runs scored...this is the first Cin team in any 11 game span to score 34 or fewer runs and win 8 times since the 1972 club did it from 5/14-5/23 (11 games, 8 wins, 34 runs).

- The last Major League team to win 8 times in any 11-game span while scoring 34 runs or fewer was the 2025 **Rangers** (8w/33r, 3/27-4/7).
- 7 of Cin's 8 wins this season have come in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, the most such wins in the majors this year.
- The 2025 Reds went 35-38 (.479) in games decided by 2 runs or fewer, the ninth-worst record in the majors.

EXTRA! EXTRA! The Reds improved to 2-0 in extra-inning games following last night's 6-3 win in 10 innings at **Mia** (also: 3/28 vs **Bos**, won 6-5 in 11).

- The Reds have combined to score 5 times in extras this season...the 2025 Reds plated just 9 runs after the 9th inning in 15 such games...last year's club went 3-12 (.200) in extra-inning affairs.

IT AIN'T OVER TILL IT'S OVER: The Reds last night rallied for their first win when trailing by 2 or more runs in the 9th inning or later since 3/31/24 vs **Wsh** (down 5-3 in the 9th, won 6-5)...it was the first time the Reds did such a thing on the road since 8/26/23 at **AZ** (down 4-2 in the 9th, won 8-7 in 11 innings).

- Last night's win was also the Reds' first victory in which they were held scoreless *and* trailed by multiple runs through 8 innings since 7/12/22 at **NYN** (down 3-0 in 9th, won 4-3).

CLEAN LIVIN' (SCORING CHANGE): The Reds have yet to commit an error this season (11g), their longest streak of errorless games to begin a season since 1900 and T2nd-longest streak by any Major League team to begin a season since 1900 (2022 **Padres** 16g & 2022 **Royals** 11g).

- In last night's 6th inning **Mia's Heriberto Hernández** advanced from first to second on what was originally scored an obstruction error on **2B Matt McLain**...that ruling has since been changed to a stolen base by **Hernández** and no error for **McLain**.
- The Redlegs had 7 errors after 11 games in 2025, and 9 after 11g in '24.

EL CABALLO DE HIERRO: **SS Elly De La Cruz** has appeared in each of Cin's last 229 games, beginning 7/30/24...it's the fifth-longest consecutive games played streak by a Red since 1970 (see box below).

SERIES NOTES: The Reds are 139-106 all-time vs the **Marlins**, including 24-23 here at **loanDepot park** and 44-29 at **Great American Ball Park**.

- The **Marlins** (4-3) won the 2025 season series vs **Cin**...it marked **Mia's** first season series victory over the **Reds** since 2018 (5-2).
- The 2 teams split the 4-game set at **GABP** from 7/7-7/10, 2025.
- Cin went 1-2 at **Mia** from 4/21-4/23, 2025 when the roof was open for all 3 games at **loanDepot park**...it marked the Reds' first series loss to the **Marlins** since 8/7-8/9, 2023 at **GABP** (1-2).
- The Reds have gone 28-15 over the last 8 seasons (6-1 in 2019, 0-0 in 2020, 5-2 in 2021, 4-3 in 2022, 3-3 in 2023, 5-2 in 2024, 3-4 in 2025, 2-0 in 2026) following 4 straight season series losses to the **Marlins**.

SWITCH BLADE: **SS Elly De La Cruz** homered in each of the Reds' previous 6 regular-season series dating back to 9/19/25 vs **Chc**...he's the first switch hitter in Reds history to homer in at least 6 consecutive regular-season series.

- The last Red prior to **Elly** to homer in 6 straight series was **INF Christian Encarnacion-Strand** (9/15/23-3/31/24).
- De La Cruz** has homered twice in 17 at-bats vs **LHP** this season...in 2025, he hit 5 HR in 199 at-bats vs **lefties**.

OFF THE BENCH: Reds substitutes have combined to bat .333 with a .887 OPS over the season's first 11 games (7-for-21, 1hr, 4rbi, 5k).

- In 2025, Reds in-game replacements batted .180 (28th in the majors), with a .266 OBP (28th), a .212 SLG (29th), and a .478 OPS (29th)...Cin was the only team in the majors last year not to produce a HR off the bench.

PLAYER OF THE WEEK: **1b Sal Stewart** on 3/30 was named National League Player of the Week for 3/25-3/29 to become the 10th Reds rookie to win NL Player of the Week honors since the award's inception in 1973 (last: **Rece Hinds**, 7/8-7/14, 2024).

- Stewart** became the fifth Red to win the award in the season's first week (others: **Kal Daniels** 1988, **Eddie Milner** 1984, **Johnny Bench** 1983, **Dave Collins** 1980).
- In the 3 games vs **Bos**, he went 7-for-10 with a home run, 3 doubles, 3 walks, and 5 hard-hit balls (exit velo of +95mph).

NAPOLI AT FIRST: Assistant Bench Coach **Mike Napoli** will fill in as Cin's first base coach while **Collin Cowgill** recovers from knee surgery.

LAST TIME OUT: Did not factor in the decision in Fri's 5-3 win at Tex (5.0ip, 6h, 2r/2er, 1bb, 5k, 0hr, 87TP).

- After allowing a pair of 2-out runs and 4 hits in the 2nd inning, proceeded to scatter 2 hits over his final 3.1 innings.
- Was struck in the right leg on a 107mph Corey Seager grounder in the 5th inning but recovered to make an outstanding sliding play to throw out Seager at first... remained in the game.

3/28 vs BOS: Did not factor in the decision in the 11-inning 6-5 win vs Bos on 3/28 (4.0ip, 5h, 3r/3er, 2bb, 5k, 1hr, 74 TP).

- Left the game after 4 innings with the Reds leading 4-3.
- Was originally slated to start the season's third game but was moved up in the rotation when Nick Lodolo was placed on the injured list.

2026 SPRING TRAINING: Went 1-1 with a 5.40 ERA in 5 spring starts (16.2ip, 11r/10er, 8bb, 12k, 292 TP).

- In his final Spring Training start on 3/23 vs the Brewers in Milwaukee, allowed 6 runs (5er) on 6 hits over 4.0 innings (1bb, 3k, 1hr, 78TP).
- Exited his second-to-last spring appearance after 51 pitches due to a blister on his right finger (3/18 vs Col).

2025 RECAP: In his first season with the Reds, led the staff with 32 starts, 14 wins, 169.2 innings pitched, and 15 quality starts...produced a quality start in a career-high 6 straight outings from 8/12 to 9/12.

- His 14 wins were a career high and tied for the fourth-most in the National League...were the most wins by a Reds pitcher since Luis Castillo won 15 games in 2019.
- Over his final 12 starts (7/27-9/28), pitched to a 7-4 record with a 2.81 ERA.
- Received votes for the Rawlings Gold Glove Award for the second consecutive season.

ACQUIRED: From the Royals on 11/22/24 in exchange for INF Jonathan India and OF Joey Wiemer.

LAST TIME OUT: Earned the 2-0 win on Sat at Tex (6.0ip, 3h, 0r/0er, 2bb, 4k, 82TP).

- Was his first win since 9/21/24 vs Pit and his second career quality start (9/5/24 vs Hou).
- Of his 8 career starts, was his fifth in which he pitched at least 5.0 scoreless innings...ties him with Fernando Valenzuela (1981) for the most such outings through his first 8 career starts by any Major League pitcher since 1900.
- His 1.30 ERA after 8 career starts became the fifth-lowest by any Major Leaguer (min. 4ip/start) in that span, and the lowest since Valenzuela's 0.50 in 1981.
- Became the fourth Reds pitcher since the mound moved to its current distance in 1893 to allow 6 hits or fewer in each of his first 8 career starts, joining Tony Cingrani (2013-2014), Scott Williamson (2000), and Rob Bell (2000).

MARCH 29 vs BOS: Didn't factor in the decision in the 3-2 win vs Bos on 3/29 (5.0ip, 3h, 2r/2er, 2bb, 5k, 1hr, 86 TP)...was his first Major League appearance since 9/28/24, a span of 547 days.

- Missed the entire 2025 regular season due to injuries (R forearm strain & L oblique strain).
- Had his career-opening 33.2-inning homerless streak snapped after allowing a 2-run HR to Wilyer Abreu in the 4th inning...marked the longest streak by a Reds pitcher to begin his career since Tom Browning (55.1ip, 1984-85).
- Became the seventh Reds pitcher since 1893 to allow 6 hits or fewer in each of his first 7 career starts, the first since Tony Cingrani did so in each of his first 24 Major League starts from 2013-14.

STILL A ROOKIE: Still meets rookie qualifications despite entering the season with over a year of service time (1.031).

TOP PROSPECT: Enters the season rated as one of the Reds' top prospects per *Baseball America* (#3) and MLB Pipeline (#5)...is considered by *Baseball America* as having the best slider and best control in the Cincinnati system.

1.30 ERA: Has pitched to a 1.30 ERA (41.2ip, 6r/6er) through his first 8 career Major League starts, lowest by a Cin starter in that span since earned runs became an official stat in both leagues in 1913.

A STAR AT WAKE: After his 2023 junior season at Wake Forest, was named ACC Male Athlete of the Year, ACC Pitcher of the Year for the second straight season, ACC Scholar-Athlete of the Year, *Baseball America* All-America first team, and Collegiate Baseball All-America first team...was a finalist for the National Pitcher of the Year and Dick Howser Trophy awards and a semifinalist for the Golden Spikes Award.

- He and teammate Chase Burns (2024) are the only pitchers from Wake Forest to win the ACC Pitcher of the Year Award.
