## MILWAUKEE BREWERS (14-7) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (12-11) APRIL 23, 2024 at PNC Park, Pittsburgh, PA - 6:40 EDT - GAME \#24/HOME \#10 RHP TOBIAS MYERS (MLB DEBUT) vs. LHP BAILEY FALTER ( $1-1,4.05$ ERA)

THE PIRATES:...ended their season-high six-game losing streak with Monday's 4-2 win...Were swept by the Red Sox in the first three games of this current homestand this past weekend...Began the season 5-0 for the first time since 1983...Swept a season-opening four-game series on the road for the first time since doing so in 1903 in Cincinnati.

ABOUT TONIGHT'S STARTER: Bailey Falter gets the start tonight in game two of this four-game series against the Brewers...
Falter allowed five first-inning runs in his first start on March 31...Beginning with the second inning in his March 31 start, Falter has allowed four runs in his last 19.0 innings of work.

WINNING STARTS HERE: Pittsburgh's starting rotation has recorded a 3.77 ERA (129.0ip/54er) this season...That's the thirdlowest ERA among all National League teams and 10th-best in MLB...The only two starting rotations in the National League to have a lower ERA are the Phillies (2.20) and Padres (3.74).

THE DRIVE FOR FIVE: Pirates starters have lasted at least 5.0 innings in 19 games this season...According to StatsPerform, the only National League teams with more are Arizona and Philadelphia with 20 apiece.

KEEPING UP WITH THE JONES': Jared Jones, who leads all rookies in MLB with 39 strikeouts, has seven or more punchouts in each of his five career games...He has matched the Major League record for most such games to start a career and is the second Pirate to do so along with Jose DeLeon, who also did so in five straight from July 23, 1983 to August 10, 1983...The only pitchers in Major League history to accomplish this were Masahiro Tanaka (five straight) from April 4-27, 2014, and Stephen Strasburg (five straight) from June 8-28, 2010....Special thanks to the Elias Sports Bureau.

LEADING THINGS OFF: Andrew MCCutchen hit the 23rd leadoff home run of his career last night and his first since June 14, 2023, at Wrigley Field off Drew Smyly...It was also his third leadoff homer against the Brewers and first since May 4, 2021 off Eric Lauer...The Pirates hit four leadoff home runs in 2023 and now have 191 in 138 seasons as a member of the National League.

CASHING IN AT PNC: Andrew McCutchen has hit 99 of his 301 career home runs at PNC Park....McCutchen's 99 home runs at PNC Park are the most by any player...The 37-year-old McCutchen's second-most home runs (33) have been hit at American Family Field.

FOUR YOUR INFORMATION: The Pirates are the only team this season that has not lost when scoring four-plus runs...Two teams have only one loss: San Diego (11-1) and Philadelphia (14-1)...Courtesy Elias Sports.

ALIKA LIKE THAT: Alika Williams is 6 -for- 16 during his current six-game hitting streak, which is the second-longest by a Pirate this season (Michael A. Taylor hit safely in seven straight from March 28 to April 4)...Williams has now hit safely in eight of his first nine games of this season.

CRUZING FOR A BREWZING: Oneil Cruz went 3 -for-4 with a pair of RBI
Monday night....Cruz has now hit safely in eight of his last nine games against the Brewers, going 13-for-34 (.382) with three doubles, four home runs and 14 RBI.

WALK ON: The Pirates walked four times Monday night and come into today third in MLB in free passes, trailing only the Yankees (102) and Dodgers (101)...Bryan Reynolds ranks second among all National League players with 17 walks, trailing only Mookie Betts of the Dodgers (20).

THE RENEGADE: David Bednar earned his third save of the season while working a scoreless ninth inning Monday night... Since being acquired by the Pirates prior to 2021, Bednar has recorded the seventh-lowest ERA (2.59) among all relief pitchers in MLB with at least 150.0 innings pitched...Emmanuel Clase has the lowest ERA (1.91) in MLB among relievers with at least 150.0 innings since 2021.

Began the season with Triple-A Indianapolis, where he went 1-1 with a 3.95 ERA (13.2ip/6er), 20 strikeouts and .226 batting average against in three starts...Entered this season rated by Baseball America as Pittsburgh's No. 8 prospect...Was tabbed among Baseball America's top 100 prospects in both 2022 (No. 88) and 2021 (No. 58)...Was drafted out of Cary-Grove (IL) High School with the 18th overall selection in the 2019 First-Year Player Draft...Made his big league debut last year on $7 / 17$ against Cleveland and suffered the loss before winning each of his next two starts. vs. MILWAUKEE: $0-0$ in one career start... He had a no-decision $(4.0 \mathrm{ip}+/ 3 \mathrm{r})$ in an $8-4$ win at American Family field on 8/4/23.
