TIGERS CLINCH POSTSEASON SPOT WITH 4-1 WIN:

The Tigers cemented their spot in the postseason with last night's 4-1 win over the White Sox. Riley Greene had a pair of hits, including a double, and a RBI, while Matt Vierling went 1x3 with a double and a run driven in. Brennan Haniffee started for Detroit and threw 2.0 scoreless innings, allowing a hit. Brant Hurter improved his record to 6-1, giving up a run on two hits with one strikeout. Jason Foley got the final out of the game, inducing a fly out from Andrew Vaughn, for his 28th save.

BACK IN THE POSTSEASON: After a 10-year drought, the Tigers are back in the postseason for the 17th time in franchise history and the first time since 2014. The Tigers secured a Wild Card spot for the second time, joining the 2006 team. Detroit, which was eight games under .500 after the game on August 10 at San Francisco, is the second MLB team ever to make the playoffs in a non-shortened season after being eight-or-more games under .500 in August or later, joining the 1973 New York Mets.

GREENE MACHINE: Riley Greene had a pair of hits, including a double, and drove in a run last night, notching his 34th multi-hit game of the season, which ranks second on the team. In 23 games this month, Greene is slashing .300/.360/.533 with four doubles, one triple, five homers and 18 RBI. Among American League hitters this month, he ranks seventh in RBI, tied for eighth in homers and extra-base hits (10) and tied for 10th in slugging percentage.

HOLTON DOWN THE OPPOSITION: Tyler Holton pitched a scoreless inning in relief last night, walking one and striking out one. Since June 29, Holton has posted a 4-1 record with seven saves, a 0.68 ERA (52.2IP/4ER) and 44 strikeouts in 37 games. Holton leads all Major League pitchers (min. 80.0 innings) with a 0.78 WHIP, a .173 opponent batting average, a .222 opponent on-base percentage and a .500 opponent OPS, while ranking second with a .279 opponent slugging percentage and third with a 2.19 ERA (94.1IP/23ER).

FOLEY SLAMS THE DOOR: Jason Foley closed out last night's win, retiring the only batter he faced. Foley notched his 28th save of the season, which ranks tied for fifth in the American League and tied for ninth in the Majors. Foley has successfully converted 13 of his last 14 save opportunities. Since August 3, he has posted a

1.59 ERA (22.1P/4ER) with only 11 hits allowed and 20 strikeouts. Foley has a 0.75 WHIP and .143 opponent batting average in that span.

SECOND HALF SURGE: With last night's win, the Tigers improved to 31-11 (.738) since August 11, which is the best record in the Majors over that span and the team's best record in a 42-game span since also going 31-11 from August 15-September 28, 2011. Since August 11, the Tigers lead the Majors with a 2.56 ERA (383.0IP/109ER) and a +70 run differential.

TIGERS AND WHITE SOX: The Tigers and White Sox continue their final series of the season tonight. Detroit has gone 10-1 against Chicago (AL) this season, including taking three-of-four games at Comerica Park. The Tigers have clinched the season series vs. the White Sox for the second straight year.

AGAINST THE AL CENTRAL: The Tigers continue their final series against an American League Central opponent today. Detroit is 28-22 against divisional foes this season, going 10-1 vs. Chicago (AL), 6-7 vs. Cleveland, 6-7 vs. Minnesota and 6-7 vs. Kansas City. The Tigers have clinched a winning record against the AL Central for the second straight season.

AT COMERICA PARK: The Tigers are 4-0 on their current six-game homestand, which includes three games vs. Tampa Bay (3-0) and three games vs. Chicago (AL) (1-0). The Tigers are 42-36 at Comerica Park this season, including a 16-5 record in their last 21 games in Detroit.

- Last pitched in Thursday's series finale vs. Tampa Bay, pitching 2.0 perfect innings and earning his fourth win of the season...has allowed just one earned run in 11 September appearances, compiling a 2-1 record with one save, a 0.60 ERA (15.0IP/1ER) and 14 strikeouts.
- Has faced the White Sox five times in his career, including two starts, and has a 1-0 record with a 3.18 ERA (11.1IP/4ER) and four strikeouts...in 42 career appearances, including 13 starts, at Comerica Park, Brieske is 4-5 with a 3.47 ERA (85.2IP/33ER) and 67 strikeouts.
- Will be making the 28th start of his career today...in 27 previous starting assignments, he is 3-8 with a 4.21 ERA (98.1IP/46ER) and 73 strikeouts.
- Started consecutive games on September 13-14 vs. Baltimore, combining to throw 2.1 hitless innings with two walks and three strikeouts...became the first Tigers pitcher to start back-to-back team games, which were on consecutive days, since George Uhle on August 4-5, 1929.

- Crushed two home runs on September 15 vs. Baltimore...marked his third career multi-homer game (last, June 15, 2024 at Houston)...was the first Tigers lefthanded hitter to have two homers in a game against a southpaw since Eric Munson on May 31, 2004 vs. Kansas City.
- Recorded a pair of hits on September 11 vs. Colorado, including his 21st homer of the season...marked the first time in his career logging 10+ hits and eight-or-more runs driven in over any five-game span.
- Recorded the second four-hit game of his career (other, June 15, 2024 at Houston) on September 6 at Oakland, going 4x6 with a double and two RBI.
- Hit his 20th homer of the season on September 1 vs. Boston, becoming the ninth player in franchise history to hit 20+ homers in their age-23 season-or-younger (last, Spencer Torkelson in 2023).
- Played in his first career All-Star Game, entering as a defensive replacement in the fifth inning and going 0x2...was the Tigers youngest All-Star outfielder since Willie Horton in 1965...his 178 total bases before the All-Star break were the most by a Tiger since Nick Castellanos in 2018 (195).
