TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 24, 2015: Alex Rodriguez becomes the eighth player in Major League history to score 2,000 career runs, touching the plate in the third inning of a 3-2 win over the White Sox at Yankee Stadium.

Sept. 24, 1929: Yankees pitcher Tom Zachary improves to 12-0 with a 5-3 win over Boston. His mark remains the Major League record for most wins in a single season without a loss.

TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY

Sept. 25, 2014: Derek Jeter plays his final game at Yankee Stadium, going 2-for-5 with 3RBI, including a game-winning, "walk-off" single in the ninth in a 6-5 win over Baltimore.

Sept. 25, 1929: Former Yankees manager Miller Huggins passes away at the age of 51. He skipped the Yankees from 1918-29, winning three World Series titles.

Sept. 25, 1917: Yankees shortstop Phil Rizzuto is born in New York City.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their final homestand of the season today with the second game of a three-game set vs. Arizona (1-0 thus far)...are 2-2 on the homestand after losing two-of-three games vs. Toronto this week and winning their series opener vs. Arizona...after this homestand, will embark on their final road trip of the season, making stops in Toronto (Tues.-Thurs.) and Kansas City (9/29-10/1).

- Are 8-4 in their last 12 games (since 9/10).
- **Have posted a 16-8 (.667) record since 8/28, tied with Pittsburgh for the best record in the Majors over that span**...are 18-11 in their last 29 games (since 8/23).

WHERE WE LEFT OFF: The Yankees defeated the Diamondbacks, 7-1, in their series opener on Friday at Yankee Stadium...**RHP Luke Weaver** (5.1IP, 4H, 0R, 0BB, 3K) earned his first win as a Yankee after tossing 5.1 scoreless innings...**RF Aaron Judge** (4-for-4, 3R, 1 double, 3HR, 6RBI) recorded his second career three-HR game, hitting a go-ahead three-run HR in the third inning, a two-run HR in the fifth inning and a solo HR in the seventh inning...**CF Estevan Florial** (2-for-5, 1R, 2 doubles, 1RBI) hit an RBI double in the fifth inning...**SS Anthony Volpe** (1-for-3, 1 double, 1BB) and **3B Oswald Peraza** (2-for-4, 1 double, 2R) each reached base twice...**RHP Jhonny Brito** (3.2IP, 1H, 1ER, 3K, 1HR, 1HP) recorded his first career save.

HOME SWEET HOME: The Yankees are 41-38 at home this season...**their win on Friday clinched their 32nd straight winning season at home (since 1992)...according to Elias, their streak is the second-longest in Major League history, trailing only their own 47-year streak from 1918-64.**

CLOSING TIME: With **RHP Jhonny Brito** recording his first career save on Friday, the Yankees have had 10 different pitchers record a save this year: Clay Holmes-21, Michael King-6, Wandy Peralta-4, Ian Hamilton-2, Tommy Kahnle-2, Ron Marinaccio-2, Deivi García-1, Jhonny Brito-1, Nick Ramirez-1 and Ryan Weber-1...the Yankees' 10 players with at least one save are tied for the second-most in the Majors, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (11)...**marks the second time in franchise history (since saves became an official stat in 1969) that the Yankees had 10 different pitchers record a save** (also 12 in 2022).

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starters have posted a 2.90 ERA (167.1IP, 54ER) in their last 31 games (since 8/20)...have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 28 of those 31 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 23 of those starts.

- Have posted a 0.89 ERA (20.1IP, 2ER) and 25K in their last three games.

BOUNCING BACK: **LHP Carlos Rodón** will make his 13th start of the season today...has allowed 3ER-or-fewer in five of his last six starts (since 8/22) and 2ER-or-fewer in four of those starts.

WHERE'S WALDO: **INF/OF Oswaldo Cabrera** is batting .300 (12-for-40) with 5R, 2 doubles, 1HR, 3RBI, 5BB and 1SB in his last 11 games (since 9/10).

HIGH VOLTAGE: **INF Anthony Volpe** has had five of his last seven hits, 17 of his last 28 hits, 20 of his last 38 hits and 25 of his last 49 hits have gone for extra bases (12 doubles, 2 triples, 11HR).

GO WITH THE FLO: **OF Estevan Florial** hit an RBI double in the fifth inning on Friday...has hit safely in seven of his last nine games (since 9/12-G2)...has hit .308/.471/.462 (4-for-13) with 2 doubles, 6RBI, 3BB and 1HP with RISP this season.

JHONY B GOODE: **RHP Jhonny Brito** recorded his first career save on Friday after allowing just 1ER in 3.2 innings of relief...**in 10 relief outings with the Yankees this season, is 5-1 with one save and a 1.38 ERA (32.2IP, 5ER)**...has tossed at least 1.2 innings and allowed 1ER-or-fewer in each of his 10 relief outings.

BATTERS' EYE: **Since the All-Star break, the Yankees lead the Majors with a 9.42 PA/BB ratio and a 4.04 pitches per plate appearance ratio**...prior to the All-Star break, ranked 20th in the Majors in PA/BB (11.90) and P/PA (3.86).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge recorded his second career—and second of the season—three-HR game on Friday vs. Arizona (also 3HR on 8/23 vs. Washington)...hit a go-ahead three-run HR in the third inning, a two-run HR in the fifth inning and a solo HR in the seventh inning...**became the sixth player in franchise history to record multiple 3HR games**, joining Lou Gehrig (four), Joe DiMaggio (three), Alex Rodriguez (three), Tony Lazzeri (two) and Bobby Murcer (two)...**became the first player in franchise history to record multiple 3HR games in a single season.**

- Marked the 35th time in franchise history a Yankees player hit at least 3HR in game...is one of just 25 players to accomplish the feat as a Yankee.
- **Marked his sixth multi-HR game of the year and 33rd of his career**...his six multi-HR games are tied with Mookie Betts and Manny Machado for the second-most in the Majors this season, trailing only Matt Olson (eight).
- **His 33 multi-HR games are the fifth-most in franchise history**, trailing only Babe Ruth (68), Mickey Mantle (46), Lou Gehrig (43) and Joe DiMaggio (35)...his 33 multi-HR games since 2017 are the most in the Majors in that span (next: Manny Machado-30).
- Has recorded at least six multi-HR games in a single season for the fourth time in his career...also recorded 11 multi-HR games in 2022, seven in 2017 and six in 2021...**his four seasons with at least six multi-HR games are tied for the most in Major League history** (also Jimmie Foxx, Mark McGwire, David Ortiz and Babe Ruth) — credit: Sarah Langs.
- **His 255 career home runs are the most by any Major League player through his first 829 career games** (next: Ryan Howard-244HR)...**his 33 multi-HR games are also the most by any Major League player through his first 829 career games** (previous: Ralph Kiner – 32G).
- 17 of his 35HR this season have either tied the game (two) or given the Yankees the lead (15).
- The Yankees have gone 167-53 in his career when he homers...since 2020, the Yankees are 95-24 in those games...the Yankees are 23-4 this season when he homers.
- **His career-high four extra-base hits on Friday matched the most by a Yankee in franchise history**...was the 18th Yankee (27th time) to accomplish the feat...**is just the second Yankee in the last 18 years (since 2006), the fifth in the last 47 years (since 1977) and the eighth in the last 73 years (since 1951) to do so**, joining since 1951, only Brian Roberts (7/4/14 at Minnesota), Alex Rodriguez (4/18/05 vs. Tampa Bay), Hideki Matsui (6/5/03 at Cincinnati), Shane Spencer (8/7/98-G2 vs. Kansas City), Graig Nettles (9/29/76 at Boston), Jim Mason (7/8/74 at Texas) and Roger Maris (4/29/62-G2 at Washington-AL).
- **His 14 total bases on Friday matched the third-most by a Yankee in a single game in franchise history**, trailing only Lou Gehrig (16TB on 6/3/32 at Philadelphia-AL) and Tony Lazzeri (15TB on 5/24/36 at Philadelphia-AL).
- **Has hit 35HR in 100 games this season...is just the fourth player in Major League history to hit at least 35HR in a season while playing in 108 games-or-fewer** (the Yankees have eight games remaining this season)...joins Albert Belle (36HR in 106G in 1994 with Cleveland), Mark McGwire (39HR in 104G in 1995 with Oakland) and Rudy York (35HR in 104G in 1937 with Detroit).
- Despite missing 51 games on the injured list this year, **his 35HR are tied for the third-most in the AL and his 80BB rank sixth.**
- **Has hit at least 35HR for his third straight season and for the fourth time in his career** (52HR in 2017, 39HR in 2021 and 62HR in 2022)...**is the fifth Yankee in franchise history to record at least four such seasons.**...joins Babe Ruth (12), Lou Gehrig (seven), Mickey Mantle (six) and Alex Rodriguez (five)...**is the only Yankee to record at least four 35HR seasons within their first eight Major League seasons.**
- His 4H and 6RBI on Friday tied his career highs.
- Has reached base in 35-of-75 plate appearances over his last 17 games (since 9/5), posting a .467 OBP in that span (17H, 18BB).
- Has recorded multiple hits in each of his last two games and three of his last four games.
- Has reached base multiple times in 52 of his 100 games this year, including 40 of his last 71 games (since 5/12).
- Has hit .336/.441/.729 (36-for-107) with 24R, 3 doubles, 13HR, 26RBI, 20BB and 1SB in 29 Interleague games this season...has batted .313/.408/.655 (140-for-447) with 94R, 20 doubles, 2 triples, 43HR, 84RBI, 71BB and 9SB in 123 career Interleague games.

TODAY'S STARTING PITCHER: LHP CARLOS RODÓN (3-6, 5.90 ERA)

LHP Carlos Rodón will make his 13th start of the season today vs. Arizona...the 30-year-old will make the start on extended six days' rest due to Monday's team off day and Saturday's postponement...last pitched on 9/17 at Pittsburgh, taking the loss despite recording a season-high 6.2IP and 10K (6H, 3R, 0BB, 1HR)...**struck out Ke'Bryan Hayes in the fourth inning for his 1,000th career strikeout...became just the 17th active left-handed pitcher to reach the 1,000K plateau...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in five of his last six starts (since 8/22) after doing so just twice in his first six starts of the season from 7/7-8/6**...finished sixth in the NL Cy Young voting in 2022 after going 14-8 with one complete game and a 2.88 ERA (178.0IP, 131H, 59R/57ER, 52BB, 237K, 12HR) over 31 starts with the San Francisco Giants...the two-time All-Star (2021 with Chicago-AL and 2022 with San Francisco) has finished in the top-six of Cy Young voting twice (fifth in 2021 and sixth in 2022)...over the previous two seasons (2021-22), went 27-13 with two complete games and a 2.67 ERA (310.2IP, 222H, 98R/92ER, 88BB, 422K, 25HR) in 55 starts...over that span, led the Majors in K/9.0IP (12.23) and opponents' SLG (.307), ranked second in opponents' BA (.196) and opponents' OPS (.567), third in WAR among pitchers (11.1, FanGraphs), fourth in ERA (2.67), opponents' OBP (.259) and double-digit strikeout games (16), fifth in HR/9.0IP (0.72), tied for sixth in wins and seventh in strikeouts...was originally selected by the Milwaukee Brewers in the 16th round of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft but did not sign and went on to play three seasons at North Carolina State University (2012-14)...was selected by the Chicago White Sox in the first round (third overall) of the 2014 First-Year Player Draft...signed a six-year Major League contract with the Yankees extending through the 2028 season on 12/21/22.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his 12th start of the season on 9/17 at Pittsburgh, taking the loss despite recording a season-high 6.2IP and 10K (6H, 3R, 0BB, 1HR)...**struck out Ke'Bryan Hayes in the fourth inning for his 1,000th career strikeout...became just the 17th active left-handed pitcher to reach the 1,000K plateau**...his 10K marked a season high and his most in a game since his 10K on 9/29/22 vs. Colorado with San Francisco...his 103 pitches were also a season high and his most in a game since 9/4/22 vs. Philadelphia with San Francisco (106 pitches).

- ✦ Marked his eighth career start where he recorded double-digit strikeouts without issuing a walk (first since his 10K and 0BB on 9/29/22 vs. Colorado with San Francisco) and was the third Yankee this season (at the time) to accomplish the feat (also Gerrit Cole's 11K and 0BB on 8/25 at Tampa Bay and Domingo Germán's 11K and 0BB on 4/15 vs. Minnesota; Michael King later recorded 13K and 0BB on 9/20 vs. Toronto).

VS. ARIZONA: Has made four career starts vs. the Diamondbacks (all in 2022 with the Giants), going 0-2 with a 5.91 ERA (21.1IP, 14ER) and 35K...has recorded at least 7K in all four of his starts and at least 10K in two of those starts.

- ✦ Made one start at home vs. Arizona in 2022, allowing 1ER over 6.0IP and striking out 11 batters on 8/17/22 at Oracle Park (ND, 2H, 2BB, 0HR, 1HP).

2023: Is 3-6 with a 5.90 ERA (58.0IP, 54H, 38ER, 25BB, 60K, 14HR) in 12 starts this season...**has allowed 3R-or-fewer in five of his last six starts (since 8/22) after doing so just twice in his first six starts of the season from 7/7-8/6**.

- ✦ Has allowed 4H-or-fewer in nine of his 12 starts.
- ✦ Began the year on the 15-day injured list (retroactive to 3/27) with a left forearm strain and was transferred to the 60-day injured list on 6/1...missed 88 team games.
- ✦ Made his Yankees debut on 7/7 vs. Chicago-NL at Yankee Stadium, recording the loss despite allowing 2ER in 5.1IP (4H, 2BB, 2K, 1HR, 1WP)...was returned from rehab and reinstated from the 60-day injured list prior to the game.
- ✦ Earned his first win as a Yankee on 7/26 vs. the Mets after allowing just 1ER over 5.2IP (4H, 3BB, 4K, 0HR, 1HP).
- ✦ Tossed a season-high 6.0IP on 8/22 vs. Washington...was reinstated from the 15-day injured list prior to the game...missed 12 team games from 8/7-22 with a left hamstring strain.
- ✦ Recorded a season-high 6.2IP and 10K on Sunday at Pittsburgh (6H, 3R, 0BB, 1HR)...**struck out Ke'Bryan Hayes in the fourth inning for his 1,000th career strikeout**.

MILESTONE MAN: Struck out Ke'Bryan Hayes in the fourth inning on Sunday at Pittsburgh for his 1,000th career strikeout...became just the 17th active left-handed pitcher to reach the 1,000K plateau.

- ✦ Since his Major League debut in 2015, his 1,007K are the ninth-most among active left-handed pitchers.
- ✦ **His 10.01 K/9.0IP since 2015 ranks fifth among left-handed pitchers in the span**, trailing only Boston's Chris Sale (11.85), Seattle's Robbie Ray (11.15), San Diego's Blake Snell (11.09) and Los Angeles-NL's Clayton Kershaw (10.12).

HOME SWEET HOME: Will make his seventh home start this season...is 1-3 with a 6.59 ERA (27.1IP, 20ER) and 21K in six starts at Yankee Stadium this season.

- ✦ In 79 career games (77 starts) at home, has gone 30-23 with a 3.72 ERA (428.2IP, 377H, 188R/177ER, 162BB, 482K, 50HR).
- ✦ **Over his previous two seasons at home (2021-22), went 14-5 with a 2.07 ERA (147.2IP, 99H, 35R/34ER, 41BB, 206K, 9HR) in 26 starts...opposing batters hit .187 (99-for-530)...allowed 2R-or-fewer in 22 of those starts, 1R-or-fewer in 18 of those starts and seven of those starts were scoreless**.

STRIKEOUT MACHINE: Recorded a career-high 237K in 2022 with the Giants, the fourth-most by a Giants left-handed pitcher in a single season since 1883, trailing only Madison Bumgarner (251K in 2016), Cy Seymour (244K in 1898) and Rube Marquard (238K in 1911)...was the fourth Giant (second in the San Francisco-Era) to record at least 200K in his first season with the club, joining Sam Jones (209K in 1959), Amos Rusie (341K in 1890) and Tim Keefe (227K in 1885).

- ✦ His 11.98 K/9.0IP ratio last season was the highest by a Giants pitcher in franchise history among pitchers who have tossed at least 130.0 innings in a season.
- ✦ His Major League-leading 11 double-digit strikeout games in 2022 were the most in a single season in Giants history (previous high was nine games with at least 10K by Tim Lincecum in 2008 and Jason Schmidt in 2004)...recorded just two double-digit strikeout games over his first 13 starts (4/9-6/17/22) before recording nine such games over his final 18 starts (6/22-9/29/22)...recorded back-to-back double-digit strikeout games three times: 7/26-31/22, 8/17-23/22 and 9/4-9/22.
- ✦ His three games of at least 10K and 0BB in 2022 were tied for the most by a Giants pitcher in a single season since 1901, joining Kevin Gausman (three in 2021) and Madison Bumgarner (three in 2012 and 2016)...accomplished the feat on 7/31/22 vs. Chicago-NL (10K and 0BB), 8/23/22 at Detroit (10K and 0BB) and 9/29/22 vs. Colorado (10K and 0BB).
- ✦ **135 of his strikeouts last season ended with a fastball...according to Statcast, that was the third-highest total in the Majors, trailing only teammates Nestor Cortes (144K) and Gerrit Cole (141K)**.

KING OF THE HILL: Over the previous two seasons (2021-22), went 27-13 with two complete games and a 2.67 ERA (310.2IP, 222H, 98R/92ER, 88BB, 422K, 25HR) in 55 combined starts with the Chicago White Sox (2021) and San Francisco Giants (2022)...finished in the top-six of Cy Young voting both years (fifth in 2021 and sixth in 2022)...was named to his first two All-Star Games.

- ✦ In that span, led the Majors in K/9.0IP (12.23) and opponents' SLG (.307), ranked second in opponents' BA (.196) and opponents' OPS (.567), third in WAR among pitchers (11.1, FanGraphs), fourth in ERA (2.67), opponents' OBP (.259) and double-digit strikeout games (16), fifth in HR/9.0IP (0.72), tied for sixth in wins and seventh in strikeouts.
- ✦ From 2021-22, recorded at least 10K and 0BB in six games, the fourth-most such games in the Majors during that stretch...trailed only Jacob deGrom (nine), Gerrit Cole (eight) and Corbin Burnes (eight).
- ✦ Tossed his first career no-hitter and the 20th no-hitter in Chicago White Sox history on 4/14/21 vs. Cleveland, (9.0IP, 7K, 1HP)...retired his first 25BF before hitting Roberto Pérez in the ninth inning...was just the sixth pitcher to throw a no-hitter with the only baserunner reaching on a HBP...was the first no-hitter by a White Sox left-handed pitcher since
