RHP Paul Skenes (9-10, 3.96 ERA) vs. RHP Eury Pérez (5-9, 3.61 ERA)

THE PIRATES: are playing their ninth of 11 road games in a 14-game stretch (the stretch began on July 30 at Cincinnati) with tonight's series opener at loanDepot park (the only three home games during that stretch came from Friday-Sunday vs. New York-NL, when they dropped two of three games)...Finished a stretch of 17 consecutive days with a game on Sunday vs. the Mets (the stretch began on July 24 vs. Chicago-NL)...Will begin a six-game homestand vs. Boston (August 14-16) and Detroit (August 17-19) after this trip (will mark their first home interleague games since June 23-25 vs. Seattle)...Have hit 145 homers (they hit 117 homers in 2025)...Have the most hits (1064) in Major League Baseball...Have scored the third-most runs (602) in Major League Baseball, behind Washington (643) & Chicago-NL (614), after scoring 583 runs in 2025...Have struck out the third-most batters (1113) in Major League Baseball, behind Philadelphia (1178) & Milwaukee (1164).

BEACH BOUND: Pittsburgh had the day off on Monday and is now starting a brief, three-game road trip to Miami (Tuesday-Thursday)...It marks the Pirates' first three-game series at loanDepot park since taking two of three games here from September 17-19, 2021...They split a four-game series from July 11-14, 2022, lost three of four games from June 22-25, 2023, swept a four-game series from March 28-31, 2024 and lost three of four games from March 27-30, 2025 in Miami...It is the Pirates' second and final three-game road trip of the season (they won two of three games from April 10-12 at Chicago-NL) and their first against a non-National League Central team since they won two of three games to end the season from Sept. 27-29, 2024 at New York (AL).

IRON CITY BRYAN: Bryan Reynolds, who doubled on Sunday vs. New York (NL), has played in each of Pittsburgh's 120 games this season and 129 straight team games (he missed his last game last season on September 17 vs. Chicago-NL)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, that is the fifth-longest streak by a Pirate since 1989, trailing Jason Bay (307 games, 2004-06), Bobby Bonilla (189 games, 1989-90), Kevin Young (142 games, 1998) and Andrew McCutchen (132 games, 2011)...He is also on pace to become the seventh Pirate (10th instance) in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to play in all of the team's games in a season, joining Dick Groat (161 games in 1962), Bill Mazeroski (162 games in 1964, 162 games in 1966 and 163 games in 1967), Matty Alou (162 games in 1969), Omar Moreno (162 games in 1980 and 103 games in 1981), Johnny Ray (162 games in 1982) and Bay (162 games in 2005).

SWITCHING IT UP: The first three hitters in the Pirates' batting order on Sunday vs. New York (NL) were switch hitters (Jake Mangum, Ronny Simon and Bryan Reynolds)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, it marked the first time Pittsburgh had at least each of its first three hitters in the starting lineup be switch hitters since August 4, 1991 at St. Louis, when each of its first four hitters were switch hitters (Cecil Espy, Curtis Wilkerson, Orlando Merced and Bobby Bonilla)...Mangum went 2-for-4 with a solo home run (it marked his fourth home run of the season), while Reynolds posted a ground-rule double during the first inning.

WELCOME BACH: Lake Bachar, who was acquired by Pittsburgh from Miami in a four-player trade on August 3, is returning to loanDepot park for the first time as an opposing pitcher...The 31-year-old Bachar, who struck out the side in his Major League debut on September 8, 2024 vs. Philadelphia right here at loanDepot park, posted a 2.54 ERA (28.1ip/8er), 29 strikeouts, a .180 batting average against (18-for-100) and a 0.95 WHIP across his 18 appearances (two starts) with the Marlins at home this year.

SIMON SAYS: Ronny Simon, who was claimed off waivers by Pittsburgh from Miami on June 2, 2025, is returning to loanDepot park for the first time as a visiting player...The 26-year-old Simon collected an RBI single (off Nick Lodolo) in his Major League debut with the Marlins on April 21, 2025 vs. Cincinnati...He has gone 5-for-18 (.278) with a double, two RBI, a walk, a stolen base and three runs in his first five games with the Pirates this season.

ROAD WARRIORS: Luke Weaver (0.40 ERA, 22.2ip/1er) and Evan Sisk (0.89 ERA, 20.1ip/2er) have posted the best and sixth-best road ERA, respectively, among Major League pitchers (minimum 20.0 innings pitched)...The only pitchers (other than Weaver) with a better road ERA than Sisk are San Diego's Mason Miller (0.42), the Athletics' Luis Medina (0.42), Los Angeles (NL)' Tanner Scott (0.81) and Tampa Bay's Tyler Wells (0.88)...The Pirates' 546 road strikeouts this season are the most throughout Major League Baseball.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY	
August 11, 1979: The Pirates entered the fifth inning trailing, 8-0, but went on to score the game's next 14 runs in their 14-11 win over the Phillies at Philadelphia's Veterans Stadium. Pittsburgh plated five runs in the fifth inning, four runs in the seventh inning, four runs in the eighth inning and one run in the ninth inning. Thirteen of the Pirates' 14 runs and 17 of their 23 hits in the win came with two outs.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the first round (No. 1) of the 2023 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Skenes lost a 4-2 decision after allowing three runs on two hits and a season-high-tying four walks (also July 31 at Cincinnati) over 5.0 innings of work on August 5 at Milwaukee...He has allowed four walks in back-to-back starts for the second time in his career (also May 1, 2025 vs. Chicago-NL & May 6, 2025 at St. Louis).

AGAINST THE MARLINS: Skenes has gone 1-1 with a 2.60 ERA (17.1ip/5er) in three career starts against Miami...He won a 3-2 decision after allowing one run and striking out nine batters over 6.0 innings on September 9, 2024 at PNC Park...Skenes made his first career Opening Day start on March 27, 2025 here at loanDepot park, when he had a no-decision after allowing two runs and striking out seven batters over 5.1 innings of work in Pittsburgh's 5-4, walkoff loss...He also lost a 4-2 decision after allowing two runs and striking out 10 batters in 6.0 innings of work this year on June 14 at PNC Park.

K COLLECTOR: Skenes enters tonight's start against Miami at loanDepot Park with 548 career strikeouts, tied with Al McBean for the 35th-most in franchise history (since 1887)...Kris Benson and Denny Neagle are tied for 31st place with 553 strikeouts, Kent Tekulve is in 33rd place with 552 strikeouts & Ron Kline ranks 34th with 551 strikeouts.

AND THE WHIFF: Skenes struck out a career-high-tying 11 batters (also May 17, 2024 at Chicago-NL and July 11, 2024 at Milwaukee) in 5.1 innings on July 25 vs. Chicago (NL)...His three career outings with at least 10 strikeouts and fewer than 6.0 innings are the most by a Pirate in the Modern Era (since 1901)...He also did it on July 6, 2025 at Seattle (5.0 innings, 10 K) and this season on May 28 vs. Chicago-NL (5.1 innings, 10 K).

PAUL-STAR GAME: Skenes was named to his third straight National League All-Star team on July 4...Per Sarah Langs, he was one of eight Major Leaguers to make the All-Star Game in at least each of his first three career seasons, joining Rod Carew (18 straight, 1967-84), Ichiro Suzuki (10 straight, 2001-10), Joe DiMaggio (seven straight, 1936-42), Tom Seaver (seven straight, 1967-73), Dwight Gooden (three straight, 1984-86), Evan Longoria (three straight, 2008-10) and Yu Darvish (three straight, 2012-14)... He became only the third Pittsburgh pitcher to be named to three consecutive All-Star teams, joining Rip Sewell (1943-44, 1946) and Elroy Face (1959-61) on that short list.

THE 500 CLUB: Skenes' fourth-inning strikeout of Elly De La Cruz during his start on June 26 vs. Cincinnati was the 500th of his Major League career (it came in his 72nd start)...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, he became the fastest Pirates pitcher (by starts) since at least 1893 to reach the mark, surpassing Bob Veale (77 starts, 1962-65).

DON'T WALK HERE: Skenes pitched 39.0 consecutive innings without issuing a walk (the streak began in the fourth inning on April 13 vs. Washington) before allowing a walk to Adolis García in the fifth inning on May 17 vs. Philadelphia...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, that was the second-longest streak without a walk by a Pirates pitcher during the Expansion Era (since 1961), behind only Bob Friend (46.1ip, May 28-June 22, 1963).

CRAZY EIGHTS: Skenes pitched 8.0 scoreless innings while allowing two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts on May 6 at Arizona and May 12 vs. Colorado...He joined Bob Veale (Sept. 16-22, 1963) and Steve Blass (Sept. 15-20, 1968) as the only Pirates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings and allow two or fewer hits in back-to-back starts...He also became just the fourth Major League pitcher since 1901 to pitch 8.0 scoreless innings while giving up two or fewer hits and issuing zero walks in back-to-back starts, along with Boston (AL)'s Cy Young (1905), Chicago (AL)'s Billy Pierce (1958) and San Diego's Mat Latos (2010).

Pittsburgh has not named a starter for Wednesday night's game against Miami at loanDepot park.
