RAY REPORT-The Rays continue a seven-game, two-team homestand against the Giants (2-1) and Angels (0-1, 3 to play) tonight at Tropicana Field...they are 2-2 so far in a stretch of 13 consecutive games without an off day that concludes on April 24 vs. Detroit Last night's defeat marked Tampa Bay's first loss when leading after seven frames since Sept. 2, 2023 at Cleveland and their first at home since June 22, 2023 vs.
Kansas City. Kansas City.
Tonight, the Rays look to avoid their first series defeat against the Angels since May 9-11, 2022 and the first at Tropicana Field since May 22-24, 2017.
With a win this evening, Tampa Bay can secure its 10th victory before suffering its 10th defeat for the sixth consecutive season...the 2018 Rays began the season 3-10, but went on to win 90 games.
STRONG START FOR CIV-RHP Aaron Civale has worked 5.0+ innings and allowed 2 ER in each of his first three starts, posting a 2.12 ERA (17.0IP, 4ER)...only four pitchers ( 5 instances) in franchise history have tossed 5.0+ innings and allowed 2 ER or fewer in four starts to open a season: Shane McClanahan (8GS in 2023), Tyler Glasnow (2x: 7GS in 2019 \& 4GS in 2021) and Matt Moore (5GS in 2013).
PITCHING PROBLEMS-Tampa Bay relievers have posted an MLB-worst 6.92 ERA (67.2IP, 52ER), ahead of only Miami (5.76/70.1IP, 45ER).

Rays relievers have surrendered an MLB-high 14 home runs and 46 walks.
They have allowed at least one earned run in 16 of 17 games to open the season and have allowed at least one home run in three consecutive games for the first time since the final three games of the 2023 season at Toronto from Sept. 29-Oct. 1. Overall, Rays pitching has posted a 5.17 ERA (151.1IP, 87ER), marking the club's highest ERA through 17 games to start a season since the 2005 team (5.88).

HOMER (UN)HAPPY-Tampa Bay has allowed 26 home runs, second most in the majors behind Toronto (27HR)...the 26 HR are tied with the 2000,2001 and 2003 clubs for the most HR allowed through 17 games in franchise history...the 2003 Devil Rays hold the club record with 27 HR allowed through 18 games.
FISHINGFOR TROUT-Angels OF Mike Trout has hit safely in all four games against the Rays this season, going 8 -for-17 (.471) with 12B, 13B, 3 HR and 6 RBI with zero strikeouts His career 1.119 OPS against the Rays is the highest of any player, outpacing Frank Thomas (1.028) and Manny Ramirez (1.018).
Trout has a 1.109 OPS at Tropicana Field, the highest among any player (min 100PA), ahead of Travis Hafner (1.076) and Brian Daubach (1.054).

ALL ABOUT AMED-Amed Rosario has hit safely in each of his last seven games since April 5, batting . 400 (12-for-30) with 2 2B, 1 HR and 5 RBI during the run...it marks his longest hitting streak since an 11-game stretch from July 11-24, 2022.

The seven-game run is tied with Jose Caballero for the second-longest streak by a Ray this season, trailing a nine-game stretch by Isaac Paredes from March 30April 9.
Rosario has a 16.0 pct. whiff rate this season, down from 23.1 pct. in 2023, while his 12.2 pct. strikeout rate ( $6 \mathrm{SO} / 49 \mathrm{PA}$ ) ranks in the top 93 rd percentile of all major league hitters...he had an 18.2 pct strikeout rate (99SO/545PA) in 2023.

HITTIN'HAROLD-Following a 1-for-17 (.059) start through four games, Harold Ramírez has hit safely in nine of his last 11 games dating back to April 5...during that stretch, he is batting .333 (15-for-45) with 12B, 1 HR, 7 RBI and 9 R.
n his last 14 games against the Angels since May 11, 2022, Ramírez is batting .314 16 -for-51) with $32 \mathrm{~B}, 1 \mathrm{HR}$ and 17 RBI .
Ramírez has an 11.3 pct. strikeout rate (7SO/62PA) through 15 games, ranking in the top 93rd percentile of all MLB hitters.

IN A FUNK-In his last 12 games since April 1, Randy Arozarena is batting . 130 (6-for46) with 1 2B, 2 RBI and 4 BB against 12 SO...his .130 AVG during that that stretch is the lowest in the majors (min. 45AB)...the next closest hitters are SD Xander Bogaerts (.149) and STL Paul Goldschmidt (.152)

He has not homered in 12 straight games since going deep in back-to-back games from March 30-31 vs. Toronto...the 12-game homerless drought is his longest since a 12-game stretch from Aug. 30-Sept. 12, 2023
Arozarena has produced a 7.7 pct. walk rate (5BB/65PA) in 2024 after recording a career-best 12.2 pct. walk rate (80BB/654PA) last season
tied for third most in the majors behind both Houston and Toronto (7G)
The Rays suffered 23 such defeats all of last season, tied with Seattle for the third fewest in the majors behind Atlanta (17G) and Philadelphia (22G).

BAG BANDITS-The Rays have stolen 17 bases in 21 attempts ( $81.0 \%$ ), the second-most thefts in the AL behind the Royals (20SB) and fifth most in the majors behind the Reds (32SB), Nationals ( 28 SB ) and Brewers (23SB) ...with Jose Siri (6SB) and José Caballero (5SB), the Rays join the Nationals and Reds as the only teams in the majors with multiple players having $5+$ stolen bases.

The Rays stole at least one base in franchise-record-tying nine straight games to open the year, becoming the first team in the majors to turn the trick since the 1999 Devil Rays (also 9G)...the Rays are just 3-for-5 (60.0\%) on stolen base attempts in their last eight games since the streak ended.

THE ROAD AHEAD-The Rays are in the midst of a stretch from April 5-May 30 in which 14 of their 16 series are against clubs that missed the postseason in 2023, having gone 6-4 thus far... 12 of those sets are against clubs that were under the .500 mark last season. With 748 career wins, Rays manager Kevin Cash is seven victories shy of surpassing his predecessor, Joe Maddon, as the Rays all-time managerial wins leader.

COAST TO COAST-The Rays and Angels continue a seven-game season series tonight at Tropicana Field, with all seven matchups between the clubs coming over an 11-day period...the Rays took two of three games from the Angels in Los Angeles from April 8-10 Tampa Bay earned a 4-2 season series victory over Los Angeles in 2023...after dropping the season series in 2014 (2-5) and tying in 2015 (3-3), the Rays have won each of the last seven season series (did not play in 2020), going 35-17 (.673) during each of the

Last season, a three-game set between the Rays and Angels in Anaheim was impacted by series concluding with a day-night doubleheader on Saturday, Aug 19
After serving as Tampa Bay's manager from 2006-14, Joe Maddon was at the helm for Los Angeles (2020-22) following five seasons managing Chicago-NL
$(2015-19)$ (2015-19).
Guy Gallagher, the Angels Director, Equipment and Clubhouse Operations, joined Los Angeles after spending the previous 23 seasons as the Rays Visiting Clubhouse Manager. He originally joined the Tampa Bay organization in 1996 as a minor league equipment and clubhouse manager.
LHP Reid Detmers threw the 12th no-hitter in Angels history on May 10, 2022 vs. Tampa Bay.
Angels LHP Matt Moore made 96 appearances (94GS) for the Rays between 2011-2016, going $39-28$ with a 3.88 ERA ( 540.01 P , 233ER) and 494 strikeouts....he was selected as anAl-Star in 2013 with
Tampa Bay Tampa Bay.

TONIGHT'S START-Civale will make his fourth start of the season, including his third at Tropicana Field....has allowed 2 ER or fewer in each of his first three starts...the Rays are 4-4 in his last eight outings compared to 4-1 in his first five after being acquired from the Guardians on July 31, 2023...in 13 starts since the trade, has turned in a 4.48 ERA (62.1IP, 31ER)... enters tonight's outing at 492.1 IP, 7.2 shy of reaching 500.0 career IP.
LAST TIME OUT-Civale picked up his second win of the season with a 5.0-inning effort against the Angels on April 9 in Anaheim (5.OIP, 4H, 3R, 2ER, BB, 4SO)...allowed a Mickey Moniak single followed by a Mike Trout two-run homer in the opening frame....was charged with an unearned run due to a José Caballero fielding error in the 4th, but worked a 1-2-3 frame in the 5th to conclude his outing....held the Angels to 0 -for- 4 with RISP; opponents are 0 -for-6 with RISP against him overall this season.

AARON AND THE ANGELS-Civale will make his second consecutive start against the Halos... has three total starts against the Angels in hi career, going 2-1 with a 6.00 ERA (15.0IP, 10ER), 19 SO and two walks...in his lone home start opposite Los Angeles on Sept. 20, 2023 in St. Pete, he allowed a season-high six runs in an 8-3 Rays loss (3.0IP, 7H, 6ER, 7SO, HR).

He is $6-6$ with a 4.00 ERA (92.1IP, 41 ER ) and 1.00 WHIP in 16 career
starts against AL West opponents, seven of which were quality.
this includes a 2.45 ERA (11.0IP, 3ER) in two starts this season (April
3 vs. TEX; April 9 at LAA).
TROP TALK-Since the beginning of last season, Civale is $4-3$ with a 4.00 ERA (74.1IP, 33ER) in 13 home starts and 5-3 with a 2.49 ERA (65.OIP, 18ER) in 13 road outings...this includes $1-2$ with a 5.09 ERA (35.1IP, 20ER) in seven starts at Tropicana Field...in each of his first two home starts this season, he has worked exactly 6.0 frames and allowed one run on four hits, with both runs coming via solo homers...Civale is the 10th Rays pitcher to record 6.0+ IP and yield one run or fewer in each of his first two home starts in a season (last: Rasmussen/Springs, 2023).

Only two Rays pitchers have turned the trick in three straight home
starts to begin a season: Tyler Glasnow (2021) and Jake Faria (2017)
BIT BY THE LONG BALL-Through three starts, 3 of the 4 ER Civale has allowed have come via solo homers by TOR George Springer, TEX Corey Seager and LAA Mike Trout....he has yielded at least one home run in seven consecutive starts dating back to Sept. 9, 2023 vs. Boston, the longes streak of his career and second-longest active streak in the majors behind DET Jack Flaherty (9GS)...since permitting just 1 HR in a span of 10 start from June 25-Aug. 16, 2023 ( $0.15 \mathrm{HR} / 9.0 \mathrm{IP}$ ), he has been tagged for 10 HR in his last 10 starts dating back to Aug. 23, 2023 (1.91 HR/9.0IP)... 12 of the 27 (44.4\%) runs he has allowed in that span have come via the long ball.
3 IS THE MAGIC NUMBER-For his career, Civale is $31-1$ with a 3.09 ERA (302.2IP, 104ER) in games when he receives three or more runs of support. he has a $2-26$ record with a 5.08 ERA (189.2IP, 107ER) in games receiving two or fewer runs of support...since joining the Rays, Civale is $4-0$ with a 3.61 ERA (42.1IP, 17ER) with $3+$ runs of support and $0-4$ with a 6.30 ERA (20.0IP, 14ER) when receiving two or fewer runs.

MIX IT UP-Against right-handed hitters, Civale relies primarily on his sinker/sweeper, throwing one of those two pitches 59.3 pct. of the time and holding opponents to a combined 3 -for-27 (.111) with 8 SO...when facing left-handed batters, he predominately turns to his cutter/curveball recording a combined 65.7 pct. usage rate, .231 (3-for-13) opp. average and 4 SO on those offerings.

To this point, his sinker/sweeper combo against righties has paid dividends, as his 162 (6-for-37) opp. average vs. RHB ranks sixth among qualified AL hurlers.
After throwing his cutter a career-high 37.2 pct. of the time last season, he has utilized the pitch 27.5 pct of the time in 2024...he has thrown 23.9 pct. sinkers, his highest usage rate on the offering since his rookie year in 2019 (35.1\%).

ODDS AND ENDS-Civale has received a decision in five straight starts, the longest streak of his career....has held the opposition to a 3-for-21 (.143) clip with runners on base and has faced only seven batters with RISP (0-for 6, BB)...has permitted four hits or fewer in four straight starts, his longest streak since a career-high eight-start run from July 13-Sept. 30, 2022.

## TOMDRROW'S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP ZACK LITTELL [1-0, 1.17]
