PITTSBURGH PIRATES (44-45) vs. WASHINGTON NATIONALS (46-43)

July 4, 2026 - Nationals Park - Washington, D.C. - 11:05 EDT - Game #90/Road #45

RHP Braxton Ashcraft (8-3, 3.33 ERA) vs. LHP Carson Palmquist (0-0, 2.08 ERA)

THE PIRATES: have won two of the first five games on this seven-game road trip (their final road trip before the All-Star break) to Philadelphia (2-2, Monday-Thursday) and Washington (0-1, Friday-Sunday), including a 9-5 loss on Friday night here at Nationals Park...Will host Atlanta (July 7-9) and Milwaukee (July 10-12) for six games during their final homestand prior to the All-Star break...Have the most hits (807) in Major League Baseball...Have scored the third-most runs (457) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Washington (479) and Los Angeles-NL (478)...Have struck out the third-most batters (814) in all of Major League Baseball, behind only Milwaukee (850) and Philadelphia (849)...Have won or split eight of their first 14 road series this season (they won or split only seven of their 26 road series during the 2025 campaign)...Are in the 12th game of a stretch of 35 straight games played in the Eastern Time Zone, a stretch that began on June 23 vs. Seattle and will end on August 2 at Cincinnati (their next game not played in the Eastern Time Zone will be on August 3 at Milwaukee).

NATIONAL MATTER: The Pirates have gone 19-14 (.576) vs. Washington since the start of the 2022 season, winning each of the four season series in that stretch...The Pirates and Nationals split a four-game series from April 13-16 at PNC Park...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, today's scheduled start time of 11:05 AM EDT will be the Pirates' earliest local scheduled start time for a game since September 15 (G1), 1996 at San Francisco's 3Com Park at Candlestick Point, when they had a local scheduled start time of 11:05 AM PDT...Pittsburgh's July 4 game in 1987 vs. Los Angeles at Three Rivers Stadium had a local start time of 10:35 AM EDT.

MAKE IT A DOUBLE: Jared Triolo, Brandon Lowe, Bryan Reynolds, Esmerlyn Valdez and Nick Gonzales all recorded doubles in the ninth inning on Friday at Washington...According to the Elias Sports Bureau, it was only Pittsburgh's second inning with at least five doubles during the Expansion Era (since 1961), along with the eighth inning on April 27, 1986, when Mike Brown, Tony Pena, Bob Walk, R.J. Reynolds and Bill Almon did that during a 13-5 win vs. Philadelphia at Three Rivers Stadium...Friday's ninth inning was also the Pirates' first inning with at least five extra-base hits since the fifth inning on May 15, 2011 at Milwaukee, when Neil Walker (home run), Chris Snyder (double), Ronny Cedeno (double), Steve Pearce (double) and Andrew McCutchen (triple) did it.

STAR-STUDDER SEASONS: Paul Skenes (119) and Braxton Ashcraft (115) are only the second pair of Pirates to have at least 115 strikeouts prior to the All-Star break in the same season (the first All-Star Game was held in 1933), joining Francisco Liriano (125)/Gerrit Cole (116) in 2015...Brandon Lowe (58) and Bryan Reynolds (55) are only the ninth pair of Pirates to have at least 55 RBI prior to the All-Star break in the same season, joining Willie Stargell (63)/Roberto Clemente (56) in 1966, Stargell (68)/Al Oliver (60) in 1972, Stargell (75)/Oliver (61) in 1973, Andy Van Slyke (61)/Bobby Bonilla (59) in 1988, Barry Bonds (62)/Bonilla (61) in 1990, Brian Giles (72)/Kevin Young (56) in 2000, Aramis Ramirez (59)/Giles (55) in 2001 and Nate McLouth (65)/Xavier Nady (56) in 2008...Oneil Cruz (21), Konnor Griffin (17) and Jake Mangum (16) are only the second trio of Pirates to have at least 16 stolen bases prior to the All-Star Break in the same season, joining Frank Taveras (33)/Omar Moreno (27)/Rennie Stennett (23) in 1977.

ANCHOR DOWN: Bryan Reynolds connected for the 150th home run of his Major League career with his solo blast (off Foster Griffin) in the third inning on Friday at Washington...He became only the ninth player in Pirates history (since 1887) with at least 150 home runs, joining Willie Stargell (475), Ralph Kiner (301), Andrew McCutchen (248), Roberto Clemente (240), Barry Bonds (176), Dave Parker (166), Brian Giles (165) and Frank Thomas (163)...Reynolds enters today with 397 career extra-base hits (216 doubles, 31 triples and 150 home runs)...He would become the 17th player in team history with at least 400 extra-base hits and only the second switch hitter, along with Max Carey (had 590 XBH).

THE MAGICIAN: Esmerlyn Valdez went 3-for-5 with a double, an RBI and a run scored on Friday at Washington...He has hit safely in 10 of his last 11 games (since June 19 at Colorado), including eight straight games (since June 26 vs. Cincinnati)...Valdez has gone 19-for-38 (.500) with five doubles, a triple, four home runs, 11 RBI, four walks, a 1.535 OPS and 11 runs scored during the 11-game stretch (he has raised his average from .083 to .339 in that time)...Valdez is tied for fourth in Major League Baseball in extra-base hits (10) and tied for sixth in both hits and total bases (38) during that time.

July 4, 2015: Jeff Locke allowed just two hits and a hit-by-pitch while striking out six batters over 8.0 scoreless innings of work in Pittsburgh's 1-0 win over Cleveland at PNC Park. The Pirates' lone run came on a sixth-inning single from Neil Walker that scored Josh Harrison, who had two doubles in the victory. Mark Melancon earned his 26th save of the season after tossing a scoreless ninth inning.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2018 Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Ashcraft won an 11-7 decision after allowing five runs on five hits (including a career-high three home runs) and one walk while striking out eight batters in 6.0 innings on June 29 at Philadelphia...He has won three straight decisions (since June 17 at the A's) for the second time in his career (also four straight, May 9-31).

AGAINST THE NATIONALS: Ashcraft had a no-decision after allowing five runs (two earned) and striking out seven batters over his 5.2 innings of work in his only career game/start against Washington, which came on April 16 at PNC Park (Pirates lost, 8-7).

TWICE AS NICE: Ashcraft has made multiple starts where he recorded at least 10 strikeouts and did not issue a walk...He struck out 11 batters on May 31 vs. Minnesota and 10 batters on June 24 vs. Seattle...Ashcraft became the only Pittsburgh pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) to post multiple such starts during a single season.

RISPY BUSINESS: Ashcraft has limited opposing hitters to a .127 batting average against (9-for-71) with runners in scoring position this season...He has also allowed just three hits in 33 at-bats (.091 average) with runners in scoring position & two outs.

MR. CONSISTENT: Ashcraft pitched at least 6.0 innings, struck out at least five batters and walked two or fewer batters in six consecutive starts from May 3-May 31...He became one of five Pirates (six instances) during the Modern Era (since 1901) to do that, joining Rick Reuschel (six starts, September 4-October 1, 1985), Jon Lieber (six starts, June 15-July 13, 1998), Gerrit Cole (six starts, April 14-May 11, 2017 and six starts, July 30-August 26, 2017) and Paul Skenes (seven starts, June 11-July 23, 2024).

FIRST THINGS FIRST: Ashcraft did not allow a first-inning run in any of his first 20 Major League starts (from last year on June 23 at Milwaukee to May 31 vs. Minnesota)...The streak was snapped on June 6 at Atlanta (allowed two runs in the first inning)...Per the Elias Sports Bureau, he was one of three Major League pitchers in the Expansion Era (since 1961) to allow zero first-inning runs in at least each of his first 20 career starts, along with Rollie Sheldon (20, 1961) & Dennis Rasmussen (22, 1983-84).

PITCH EFFICIENCY: Ashcraft had a career-high 11 strikeouts (issued zero walks) while throwing just 80 pitches over 6.0 innings on May 31 vs. Minnesota...He became the 12th Pirate (13th instance) in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero walks in an outing, the first since Mitch Keller (13k) on May 14, 2023 at Baltimore...Ashcraft also became the 11th Major Leaguer (since pitch tracking began in 1988) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero walks in an outing of 80 or fewer pitches, the first since Tampa Bay's Ryan Pepiot (12k, 76 pitches) on Sept. 18, 2024 vs. Boston.

ELITE ARM: Ashcraft had a 2.77 ERA (74.2ip/23er) and 81 strikeouts (he issued just 17 walks) over his first 12 starts...He was one of only three Pirates (since earned runs became an official stat in the National League in 1912) to have a sub-3.00 ERA, at least 80 strikeouts and 20 or fewer walks issued through their first 12 starts of a season... Ashcraft joined Gerrit Cole (2015, 1.73 ERA/86 K) & Paul Skenes (2024, 1.93 ERA/97 K).

HISTORIC STRETCH: Ashcraft had at least eight strikeouts while issuing one/zero walks and allowing one/zero runs in back-to-back starts on April 5 vs. Baltimore and April 11 at Chicago (NL)...He joined Bob Friend (Aug. 20-24, 1959), Rick Rhoden (June 21-27, 1986), Joe Musgrove (Sept. 20-26, 2020), Mitch Keller (May 8-14, 2023) and Paul Skenes (Sept. 4-10, 2025) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have consecutive starts with at least eight strikeouts, one/zero hits and one/zero walks.
