METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Cardinals, 4-2, in 11-innings yesterday...The victory snapped a two-game skid...Since starting the season 0-5, the Mets have gone 14-8...The Mets continue a seven-game home stand (1-2) against the Cardinals (1-2) and Cubs (four games)...Following this series, the Mets hit the road for a six-game trip to Tampa Bay (three games) and St. Louis (three games).

HAPPY BIRTHDAY: Mets Hall of Fame broadcaster Gary Cohen celebrates his birthday today...Also born on this day was Ed Charles who played 61 games with the 1969 Miracle Mets.

MILB PITCHER OF THE WEEK: Congrats to RHP Dom Hamel who was named the International League Pitcher of the Week...Hamel made the start on April 24 vs. Columbus and allowed only one hit, walked two and struck out eight...He improved to 1-1 on year and sports a 4.42 ERA (9 ER/18.1 IP) with 12 walks and 27 strikeouts...Hamel sits at number 14 on MLB Pipeline's list of Mets prospects...The 25-year old was selected in the third round of the 2021 First-Year Player Draft out of Dallas Baptist University.

WALK IT OFF: The Mets earned their second walk-off win of the season yesterday...The Mets improved to an MLB-best 30-18 (.625) in extra-inning games since the ghost runner was introduced in the 2020 pandemic season (including double-headers scheduled for seven innings).

REEDING RAINBOW: Reed Garrett notched his fifth win of the year in his eighth appearance yesterday vs. St. Louis...He joins Jesse Orosco (August 1983) as the only relief pitcher in franchise history to win five games in a month...Is the first reliever with five wins in a month since Alex Reyes won five games in September, 2021...Reed Garrett is the first pitcher with five wins through his first eight outings of the season since Cecil Upshaw, who also recorded five wins with the 1971 Atlanta Braves...He is tied for third in major league history and is only one of 12 relievers with five wins in his first eight outings of the season...Only Hugh Bedient (six wins with 1912 Boston Red Sox) and Hall of Famer Rube Waddell (six wins with 1905 Philadelphia Athletics) had more.

IF FEEL THE NEED FOR REED: Garrett has allowed one earned run in 14.2 innings...He is tied for the major league relievers in wins and his 27 strikeouts are the most among all relievers...Garrett's 27 strikeouts are the most by a Mets reliever in his first eight outings of the season...He has struck out 27 of the 57 batters (47%) faced this year... His 27 strikeouts are the most by a Mets reliever in his first 8 appearances of a season.

THE BEAR NECESSITIES: Tomás Nido Has gone 7-22 with five runs, two home runs and three RBI in 11 career games against the Cubs...Harrison Bader has hit .288/.353/.479 with 24 extra-base hits with and 19 RBI in 72 career games against Chicago.

THE POLAR BEAR VS. THE CUBS: Pete Alonso has homered 15 times in 27 games against the Cubs...That's his third-highest total against an opponent (Miami - 26, Washington - 25) and his most against an opponent outside of the division...It is the best home-run rate in Mets history by any player against a single opponent (min. 75 AB)...Robin Ventura is second with a 9.00 ratio against the Pirates (9 HR/81 AB).

KING LUIS: Luis Severino is set to make his third career start against the Cubs...He has posted a 1.38 ERA (2 ER/13.0 IP) with two walks and 19 strikeouts in his previous two outings against the Northsiders...In five starts this year, Severino is 2-2 with a 2.67 ERA (8 ER/27.0 IP) with nine walks and 26 strikeouts...He is 2-1 with a 2.25 ERA (4 ER/16.0 IP) with seven walks and 14 punchouts in three starts at Citi Field in 2024.

STAND CLEAR OF THE CLOSING LINDOR: After going 1-31 in his first eight games, Francisco Lindor is batting .269/.337/.513 with 14 runs, four doubles, five home runs, 10 RBI, eight walks and three steals in 19 games since April 7...Over his last 13 games, Lindor is batting .314 (16-51) with nine home runs, three doubles, four homers, nien RBI, five walks with a .375 OBP, a .608 SLG and a .983 OPS...He is batting .286 (12-42) with six extra-base hits from the left-side in that time period.

ADAM'S SONG: After allowing two runs in his first two appearances, Adam Ottavino has made seven scoreless appearances...He has not allowed a hit and issued only one walk in those 7.2 innings, striking out 14 in that span and stranding one inherited runner...He is 1-0 with a 1.86 ERA (2 ER/9.2 IP) this season with one walk and 17 strikeouts...Opponents are batting .121 (4-33) against him.

CUBS-METS NOTES: The Mets have not won a season series against the Cubs since they went 5-2 against Chicago in 2016.

THE PEN IS MIGHTIER: The Mets bullpen has posted a 2.73 ERA (32 ER/105.2 IP) with 47 walks and 135 strikeouts...Their 2.73 ERA is the best in the Senior Circuit and tied for sixth in the majors...Their 135 strikeouts from the bullpen are the most in the major leagues...They also top the majors in batting average with a 1.89 mark, top the NL and are fifth in MLB with a 1.12 WHIP and lead the majors with a 11.50 K/9 IP ratio...The pen has allowed only six home runs this year, the second-fewest in The Show.

IN THE CITY: The Mets enter the day 7-8 at Citi Field this season...The team has won seven of their last 10 games at the ballpark...New York has posted a 2.70 ERA (42 ER/140.0 IP) at home this year, the lowest mark in the majors.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: In 20 games since April 6, the Mets are batting .268/.337/.423 with 107 runs, 35 doubles, one triple, 24 home runs, 66 walks with a .760 OPS...Their .268 average is the second-best in the majors, while their .337 OBP is fifth and their .760 OPS is sixth-best...That compares to a .167/.272/.264 slashline with 16 runs, four doubles, six home runs, 16 RBI with a .536 OSP in the previous seven games.

SEVERINO NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Luis Severino recorded a loss as the Mets fell 5-1 at San Francisco on April 23...He tied a season-high 6.0 innings pitched, allowing three runs on five hits, while issue no walks and fanning five batters.

METS DEBUT: In his Mets debut on March 30, Severino became the 25th pitcher to start a game for both the Yankees and Mets (last: Bartolo Colon, 2011 with the Yankees and 2014 with the Mets)...He threw 5.0 innings, allowing 12 hits with six runs (three earned) and six strikeouts.

NEW STARTER IN THE CITI: Severino made his Citi Field debut in his Mets debut, recording 5.0 IP with a 5.40 ERA (3 ER/5.0 IP)...During his eight seasons with the Yankees, he held a 30-16 record with a 3.62 ERA (144 ER/358.0 IP) and 1.13 WHIP with 399 strikeouts against 100 walks while pitching at home.

STRIKE THAT: Severino has recorded 814 career strikeouts...That ranks second among active Dominican pitchers...Only Luis Castillo (1,192) has recorded more.

2023 RECAP: Appeared in 19 games (18 starts) for the Yankees last season, posting a 6.65 ERA (66 ER/89.1 IP). From 2015-2022...Held a 3.39 ERA (240 ER/638.0 IP) and 1.12 WHIP, each the sixth-best mark in the American League (min. 600.0 IP).

CAREER HIGHLIGHTS: Over eight seasons with the Yankees, went 54-37 with a 3.79 ERA (306 ER/727.1 IP) with 788 strikeouts in 141 games. Is a two-time AL All-Star (2017-18)... In 2017, ranked in the top ten in the AL in strikeouts (fourth, 230), innings pitched (ninth, 193.1), and wins (ninth, 14)...In 2018, finished in the top-10 in AL Cy Young balloting as he ranked eighth in the AL with 220 strikeouts and was third in the league with 19 wins...He was also the fastest Yankee to record 500 career strikeouts, accomplishing the feat in the 85th game of his career.

STRONG START IN SPRING: In his first Spring Training with the Mets, Severino recorded a 1.29 ERA (2 ER/14.0) and allowed just one walk with 12 strikeouts over four starts.

HIGH VELOCITY: In 2023, his fastball velocity (96.4 mph) ranked in the 88th percentile in the majors.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: LHP SEAN MANAEA (1-1, 3.33)

LAST TIME OUT: Threw 4.2 scoreless innings in the Mets 8-2 win over the Giants on April 24...Allowed just four hits and four walks while striking out six batters...Manaea is 1-1 with a 3.33 ERA (9 ER/24.1 IP) with 14 walks and 27 strikeouts.

RETURN OF THE MANAEA: Spent the 2023 season with the San Francisco Giants... Has made 11 starts (23 games) at Oracle park, posting a 3-7 record with a 3.44 ERA (33 ER/86.1 IP) with 26 walks and 90 strikeouts.
