THE MOTHER OF ALL HOLIDAYS: The Detroit Tigers and Kansas City Royals tonight conclude their three-game series at Kauffman Stadium ... the Tigers have dropped their last five games, matching their season-high losing skid, and tonight hope to avoid the same fate they dished out on the Royals during their three-game sweep of them from April 14-16 in Detroit ... the Tigers have lost 10 of their last 14 games after winning 10 of their previous 13 games into this stretch.

- The entire A.L. Central woke up on Mother's Day separated by 3.5 games from top to bottom ... since this division came into existence back in 1994, only one other time has it been this close from first place to fifth place on the second Sunday in May, as there was also only 3.5 games of separation on Mother's Day in 2008 ... the last time any division was this close on Mother's Day was in 2021 when the NL East was separated by 2.5 games from top to bottom.
- Detroit is 6-16 on the road thus far, a .273 winning percentage, the lowest road mark in the majors and the club's roughest 22-game road start since a 6-16 opening salvo in 2022 ... the Tigers have been 6-16 or worse through 22 road games just four times in the last 25 years.
- After tonight's series finale, the Tigers will take tomorrow off before concluding this two-city, six-game trek with a three-game set at the New York Mets starting Tuesday.

WHOA WE'RE ONE-QUARTER OF THE WAY THERE: The Tigers tonight surpass the quarter pole with their 41st game of the season ... a year ago, the Tigers reached the quarter pole with a 26-15 record, best in the A.L. by 2.5 games and tied with the New York Mets for the third-best record in all of baseball ... Detroit began today among 11 teams within 4.0 games of the final two wild card spots.

- The Tigers last year reached the quarter pole with a +72 run differential through 41 games, the second-best mark in all of baseball ... this year, the Tigers have a +1 run differential into their 41st game, just barely one of only four A.L. teams that started Sunday in positive territory.

LIFE OF RILEY: Riley Greene is now batting .375 (33-for-88) with eight doubles, four homers, 14 RBI, a .471 on-base percentage, a .602 slugging percentage and a 1.073 OPS in his last 26 games over the past month starting April 11 ... he leads the majors in batting average and on-base percentage and is fourth in the majors in OPS during in this span.

THERE'S BEEN A BIT OF CHAOS: The Tigers this year have seen their starting pitcher toss less than four innings nine times so far through their first 40 games, one season after setting a club record by seeing its starting pitcher complete at least four innings in each of the team's first 35 games (surpassing the previous mark of their first 32 games in 1905 and 1907) ... in 2024, chaos reigned when Tigers starting pitchers had 43 starts of less than four innings, many by design.

NIGHT DANGER: The Tigers are eight games (2-6) into a stretch of 11-straight night games through next Wednesday in New York ... it is Detroit's longest stretch of consecutive night games in nearly 27 years since an 11-game run from August 16-28, 1999 ... the Tigers are 11-3 during day games this year, good for a .786 winning percentage, the best mark in the majors ... the Tigers are 7-19 at night, which is a .269 winning percentage, last in all of baseball.

GREENE STREAK: Riley Greene has reached base safely in 20-straight games, matching his career best from August 20-September 14, 2022 ... it is the longest streak by a Tiger this season, longest by any Tiger since Gleyber Torres last season (25 games) and the third-longest active streak in the A.L.

- This run marks Greene's second streak of reaching base safely in 16 or more games already this season, as he started off by reaching base safely in his first 16 games of the campaign ... he is the only player in all of baseball with multiple streaks of 16 or more games this year.
- Greene aims to become the first Tigers left-handed hitter to surpass 20 games since Kerry Carpenter had a 24-game run in 2023.

EXTRA, EXTRA! Detroit has an extra-base hit in 38-straight games dating to March 28, the longest active streak in all of baseball ... Baltimore is next at 32-straight games ... this is Detroit's longest extra-base hit streak since a 44-game run from August 4-September 23, 2025.

NOT LEFT OUT AT ALL: The Tigers began the season by facing 16 consecutive right-handed starting pitchers ... tonight they will face their 13th southpaw starter in their last 25 games ... Detroit has seen more left-handed starting pitchers than any other team in baseball since this 25-game stretch began on April 14 ... the Yankees are next closest having seen 10 southpaw starters since then.

IT'S GOOD FOR SOMETHING: Kevin McGonigle has a 2.2 bWAR through his first 38 major league games, the fourth-best mark in the American League and trailing only Bobby Witt Jr (2.6 bWAR), Cody Bellinger (2.3 bWAR) and Aaron Judge (2.3 bWAR) ... Kevin is 21-years-old.

AND FINALLY: Ty Madden has tallied 11.0 innings covering two relief appearances to start his 2026 big league campaign ... he is the first Tigers pitcher to total at least 11.0 innings in his first two relief outings of a season in 40 years when Eric King tossed 11.1 relief innings on May 15 and 21, 1986.

- Covered 4.2 innings over three starts in MLB, all coming in 2024...Detroit went 2-1 in those three games.
- Recalled from Triple-A Toledo on Sunday, April 26...made his first appearance of the year for Detroit that day.
- Went 3-3 with a 3.00 ERA in 54 relief appearances with Detroit in 2025...began the 2026 season with Triple-A Toledo, where he went 1-1 with a 4.91 ERA in 10 relief appearances.
- Earned a spot on his first career Opening Day roster in 2025, didn't allow a single earned run over 10.2 innings (nine games) of relief in Spring Training...surrendered seven hits and three walks while striking out nine.

- Earned his first win of the season and second of his major league career on April 30 against Atlanta, tossing 2.0 scoreless frames...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two, keeping Detroit within a run before they took the lead late.
- Earned his first career major league save with 3.1 scoreless innings, allowing two walks while striking out two in a victory over the Marlins on April 11.
- Signed with Detroit on a one-year major league contract with a club option for the 2027 season on Dec. 16, 2025.
- Spent each of the previous two seasons with the SSG Langers of the KBO League...went 12-7 with a 2.25 ERA (43 ER/171.2 IP) in 30 starts for SSG last season, recording 245 strikeouts in his 171.2 innings pitched, an average of 12.8 strikeouts per nine innings.
- In his two seasons with SSG, went 23-10 with a 2.91 ERA (93 ER/287.1 IP) in 54 appearances (53 starts)...released by Detroit after nine appearances with Triple-A Toledo in 2024 prior to signing with the Langers.
- Has spent parts of five seasons with the Philadelphia Phillies (2017-19), Chicago White Sox (2020) and Texas Rangers (2021) prior to joining the Tigers this year...also pitched with Hiroshima in the NPB for the 2022-23 campaigns.

- Optioned to Triple-A Toledo on April 22...recalled on April 29 after making one relief appearance with the Mud Hens...allowed one hit and one walk while striking out two over 2.0 innings in the outing.
- Earned the first Major League win of his career with a scoreless inning (one hit, two strikeouts) in his first appearance of the year on March 27 against San Diego.
- Posted a 2-0 record in the World Baseball Classic, helping Team Venezuela to a gold medal...struck out 11 batters with a 1.23 ERA (1 ER/7.1 IP) in the tournament.
- Had his contract selected by the Tigers on March 10, 2026, in the midst of the World Baseball Classic.
- Appeared and started in 30 games for the Kiwoom Heroes last season in the KBO with a 13-11 record and 3.68 ERA (72ER/171.1 IP), recording 171 strikeouts.

- Since being acquired at last year's trade deadline, has gone 4-0 with seven holds, five saves and a 1.04 ERA (4 ER/34.2 IP) in 32 relief appearances ... Finnegan boasts the second-lowest relief ERA in the A.L. and the fourth-lowest ERA among all relief pitchers in baseball (min. 30 relief innings) starting last August 1, trailing only Atlanta's Raisel Iglesias (0.27 ERA), Boston's Aroldis Chapman (0.87 ERA) and San Diego's Mason Miller (0.91 ERA).
- Earned his first save of the season on April 30 against Atlanta, allowing one hit while striking out one in a scoreless ninth inning...marked his first save with the Tigers since Aug. 16, 2025, at Minnesota.
- Did not allow a run over his first 11 games (11.0 innings) this year, allowing five hits and eight walks while striking out five over that span...his first earned run came on April 24 against Cincinnati in a game in which he struck out four batters over 1.2 frames.
- Re-signed with Detroit on a two-year deal as a free agent on Dec. 20, 2025...appeared in 16 games with the Tigers last season, posting a 3-0 record with a 1.50 ERA (3ER/18IP) with 23 strikeouts.
- Made his first postseason appearance with the Tigers in 2025, playing six games and striking out three in 7.1 innings of work.
- Landed on the injured list on Sept. 5 with a right adductor strain...activated Sept. 19 and allowed one run in three of the first four games since returning from the IL.
- Became the first MLB reliever to change teams at the deadline and immediately throw 14+ scoreless innings since Erik Goedel in 2018...the first Tigers reliever to do so since Doug Blair in 1983.
- Recorded a four-out save on Aug. 2 at Philadelphia in his Tigers debut...started his Tigers career going 3-0 with a hold and four saves, allowing just three hits and three walks while striking out 19 over his first 14.1 innings (12 games).
- Earned 20 saves with the Nationals in 2025 prior to being traded to Detroit on July 31, sixth-most in the N.L. at the time...went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA (19 ER/39.0 IP) in 40 relief outings, including 34 games finished for Washington.
