RAY REPORT—The Rays complete a seven-game homestand against the Orioles (0-4) and Cubs (1-1, 1 to play) tonight at Tropicana Field...are 7-8 in their last 15 games on the heels of a season-high six-game losing streak from May 19-25...are 7-14 in their last 21 contests after posting an 11-4 mark in their previous 15 from May 3-18...the Rays are 1-5 so far during a stretch of 19 games in 20 days from June 7-26.

Last night, Tampa Bay allowed a season-high six stolen bases...it marked the fourth time in franchise history the Rays allowed 6+ SB, including the first since a franchise-high-tying 7 SB on June 22, 2023 vs. KC...they became the fourth team (5th instance) to allow 6+ SB in a game this season, joining the Mets (7SB, May 5 at TB & 6SB May 2 vs. CHC), White Sox (6SB, April 14 vs. CIN) and Athletics (6SB, March 30 vs. CLE).

The Rays have homered in three straight games for the first time since May 16-19 (4G). The Rays 11-5 (.688) mark in Interleague play is second best in the majors behind the Phillies (10-3/.769).

Tonight marks the Rays ninth rubber game, including their first since May 30 vs.

THE CHAMP IS HERE—Yandy Díaz has reached base safely in a season-high 15 straight games, batting .271/.353/.339 (16-for-59) with 2 2B, 1 3B, 8 BB and 8 SO during the run...it marks the sixth-longest active streak in the AL and the eighth longest in the majors...the his last 15-game on-base streak came during a career-high-tying 22 game stretch from April 27–May 28, 2023...he is the second Ray to produce a 15+ game on-base streak this season, joining Isaac Paredes (18G, April 28–May 19).

SOUTHPAW STATUS—Since the start of 2023, the Rays are 35-17 (.673) in games against LH starters, the second-best record in MLB behind the Orioles (50-22/.694).

In 23 games against left-handed pitching since April 17, Yandy Díaz is batting .364 (16-for-44) with 3 2B, 1 HR, 4 RBI, 2 BB and 4 SO...he opened the season 4-for-24 (.167) with 1 2B, 3 RBI, 2 BB and 3 SO against southpaws.

Of Isaac Paredes' team-leading 10 HR, only one has come off a left-hander (May 30 vs. OAK - Hogan Harris).

Brandon Lowe went 5-for-8 with 1 2B, 1 HR and 6 RBI vs. left-handed pitching over a three-game stretch from June 2-5, but is 0-for-4 since.

HOMER (UN)HAPPY—The Rays have allowed an MLB-high 91 HR, ahead of the White Sox (89HR) and Blue Jays (88HR)...the 91 HR are tied with the 2006 club for the second-most long balls allowed through 68 games in franchise history, ahead of only the 2000 Devil Rays (100HR)...the 2000 teams also holds the record through 69 games with 100 HR...last season, Tampa Bay's 177 HR allowed were tied for second fewest in the AL and tied for fourth fewest in MLB.

Tampa Bay relievers have allowed 37 HR, second most among MLB bullpens, ahead of Toronto (42HR)...Rays starters have allowed 54 HR, fifth most in the majors. Tampa Bay has hit the fewest home runs (53) in the AL, tied with Washington for second fewest in MLB, ahead of only Miami (51HR)...the Rays 53 HR are their fewest through 68 games since 2014 (49HR).

CARDIAC KIDS—The Rays 18 comeback wins are sixth most in MLB behind the Yankees (20) and the Brewers/Nationals/Orioles/Phillies (all 19)...Tampa Bay has come from behind in seven of its last eight wins.

Tampa Bay's five walk-off victories are tied for the MLB lead with Baltimore, Miami, New York-NL, San Francisco and Seattle.

The Rays rank among MLB leaders in wins when trailing after sixth (T1st, 8), seventh (1st, 7) and eighth (T1st, 4) frames.

Each of Tampa Bay's six wins from May 18–June 4 came in come-from-behind fashion, their longest streak since May 8-18, 2013 (8G), per Elias.

TWO-OUT TROUBLES—Tampa Bay pitching has posted a .257 opp. average with two outs, the third-highest mark in the majors, ahead of only Colorado (.278) and Chicago-AL (.264)... Rays starters have allowed opponents to hit .269 with two outs, third highest among MLB rotations, ahead of Colorado (.280) and Los Angeles-AL (.271)... Tampa Bay relievers have posted a .241 opp. average with two outs, the sixth-highest clip in the majors.

Of the 19 hits the Rays have allowed this series, 14 have come with two outs... the Cubs are batting .438 (14-for-32) with two outs and .122 (5-for-41) with one or zero outs.

IN PENCIL, NOT 'PEN—The Rays bullpen has posted a 4.41 ERA (265.1IP, 130ER), the fifth-highest mark in the AL and seventh highest in the majors...the 4.41 ERA would signal the highest clip by a Tampa Bay bullpen since a franchise-worst 6.16 ERA in 2007.

The Rays relief corps has posted a sub-4.00 ERA in each of the last seven seasons, with the 2016 Rays being the last club to post a higher mark (4.09).

BASEPATH BATTLES—Tampa Bay pitching has allowed 63 SB, the fourth-highest figure in the majors, ahead of New York-NL (71SB), San Francisco (70SB) and Chicago-AL (69SB)...the Rays have caught nine base stealers, the third fewest in the majors, ahead of the Cardinals and Cubs (both 8CS).

Rays relievers have conceded an MLB-most 45 SB, with the next closest clubs being the Mets (38SB) and the Cubs (37SB)...in comparison, Tampa Bay starters have allowed 18 SB, third fewest among all MLB rotations, behind only Kansas City (13SB) and Arizona (16SB)...Jason Adam's 12 SB against lead all MLB relievers, while Garrett Cleavinger (7SB) and Chris Devenski (6SB) are fourth and tied for fifth, respectively, among AL relievers.

The Rays have swiped 65 bags of their own, tied with Kansas City for the AL lead and tied for fifth most in the majors behind Washington (100SB), Cincinnati (98SB), Milwaukee (95SB) and Philadelphia (73SB).

DOWN TO THE WIRE—The Rays are 22-10 (.688) in games decided by two runs or fewer, the best winning pct. in such games in MLB, ahead of Seattle (22-12/647) and Philadelphia (18-10/643)....Tampa Bay's 12-5 (.706) winning pct. in one-run games ranks second behind Seattle (16-6/.727).

NORTH SIDERS IN ST. PETE—Tampa Bay and Chicago complete a three-game set tonight at Tropicana Field...the Cubs took two of three from the Rays last season at Wrigley Field from May 29-31...each game was decided by one run...RHP Marcus Stroman tossed a complete game, one-hit shutout in the series opener...the Cubs took the first two games and the Rays needed a two-run rally in the 8th inning of the series finale to avoid the sweep.

Tonight's contest marks only the 22nd game between the two franchises, with Tampa Bay holding a 12-9 edge in the all-time series...the Cubs have played just two series at Tropicana Field: a two-game set from Sept. 19-20, 2017 and a three-game series from June 17-19, 2008.

TONIGHT'S START—The right-hander will make his seventh start of the IONIGHTS START—I he right-hander will make his seventh start of the season tonight, including his fifth at home...opened the season on the 15-day IL (right pectoral strain) before making his 2024 debut on May 10 vs. NYY...is searching for his first home win since June 21, 2023 vs. BAL... excluding his career-high 9 ER from June 1 at BAL, he has pitched to a 3.00 ERA (27.0IP, 9ER) in his other five starts.

LAST TIME OUT—Took the loss despite allowing only 1 ER in a 5-0 defeat on June 8 vs. Baltimore (L, 5.0IP, 3H, ER, BB, 7SO, HR)...allowed one hit the first time through the order, collecting 4 SO...held the Orioles scoreless until **Ryan O'Hearn's** lead-off homer in the 4th inning...retired each of his final 6 BF following the home run...recorded 18 swings-and-misses, the second most of his career (22 on May 20, 2024 vs. BOS)...he has been the starting pitcher for three of the Rays four shutout losses.

ROUND 2.—Bradley is set for his second career start against the Cubs this evening...he started against them last Memorial Day at Wrigley Field and was dealt a tough-luck loss after allowing an unearned run over 5.2 innings of work (L, 5.2IP, 1R, 0ER, BB, 8SO)...the lone run was scored on a sacrifice fly two batters after a **Taylor Walls** throwing error...his counterpart, **RHP Marcus Stroman**, tossed a one-hit shutout...he became the ninth pitcher (10th instance) in franchise history to take a loss despite allowing 0 ER over 5.2+ IP, including the first since **Corey Kluber** on June 14, 2022 at NYY.

Bradley is 1-3 with a 4.68 ERA (25.0IP, 13ER) in five career starts vs. NL opponents...his last Interleague outing came on July 8, 2023 vs. ATL.

BOUNCED BACK—On June 1 at Oriole Park, Bradley yielded a career-high 9 ER, including 4 HR, over 3.1 innings of work...it marked the most earned runs charged to a Rays pitcher since Luis Patiño (9) on Sept. 11, 2022 at NYY...in his next outing on June 8 at Tropicana Field, he limited Baltimore to one run across 5.0 frames...according to Elias. he became the third pitcher in Rays history to allow 9+ ER in a start and 1 ER or fewer in his next start, both against the same team...the previous instances involved Chris Archer (Sept. 26–Oct. 3, 2015 vs. TOR) and Casey Fossum (April 28–May 4, 2007 vs. OAK)...the last pitcher in the majors to accomplish the feat was MIA Pablo López (May 10-18, 2019 vs. NYM)...Bradley marked the 21st occurrence since earned runs became an official statistic in 1913.

Of his 18 ER, 14 came in two of his starts: May 20 vs. BOS (5) and June 1 at BAL (9)...he has allowed 2 ER or fewer in each of his other four outings, pitching to a combined 1.71 ERA (21.0IP, 4ER) in those games.

NO HELP AT HOME—Despite an 0-3 record, Bradley has turned in a 2.74 ERA (23.0IP, 7ER), 0.87 WHIP, .169 (14-for-83) opp. average, 30 SO and 6 BB across four starts at Tropicana Field...the Rays are 1-3 in those games, providing him with zero runs of support.

LONG BALL WOES—Bradley's 30 HR allowed as a starter are the second most through a pitcher's first 27 career starts in franchise history, behind Doug Waechter (33, 2003-05)...he has allowed a homer in 18 of the 27 starts...he has yielded 8 HR since his May 10 season debut, tied for second most in the majors behind CLE Triston McKenzie (9) over that span.

STRIKEOUT ARTIST—Bradley's 168 SO are tied with Tyler Glasnow for third most in a pitcher's first 27 starts after joining the Rays, trailing Charlie Morton (197, 2019) and Drew Smyly (179, 2014-16)...Morton (201) also holds the mark through 27 starts, followed by Smyly (184) and

(201) also holds the hark through 27 starts, followed by Shiyiy (184) and Glasnow (175)...Bradley's 168 SO are the most by a Ray in his first 27 career starts, outpacing Matt Moore (163, 2011-12).

On May 20 vs. BOS, Bradley became the second Ray this season to record 10+ strikeouts, joining Ryan Pepiot (11SO) on April 7 at COL... it marked his second career 10+ strikeout game, joining June 15, 2023 at OAK (11).

FIRST THINGS FIRST—Through his first six starts, Bradley has limited opponents to a .140 (7-for-50) clip with 23 of his 39 SO the first time through the lineup...opposing hitters are 16-for-46 (.348) the second time through and 4-for-22 (.182) the third time.

THE ARSENAL—Opposing hitters are a combined 9-for-65 (.138) with 25 SO against his split-finger, cutter and curveball...they are batting .321 (17-for-53) with 14 SO and 8 XBH (5 HR) against his four-seamer...his opp. average on his cutter has dropped from .312 (29-for-93) in 2023 to .150 (3-for-20) this season.
