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PITTSBURGH PIRATES (52-49) vs. NEW YORK YANKEES (56-44)

July 22, 2026 - Yankee Stadium - Bronx, NY - 1:05 & 7:05 EDT - Game #102 & #103/Road #51 & #52

RHP Mitch Keller & RHP Bubba Chandler vs. RHP Gerrit Cole & LHP Max Fried

THE PIRATES: have split the first four games of this six-game road trip (their first trip after the All-Star break) to Cleveland (2-1, Saturday-Sunday) and New York-AL (0-1, Monday/Wednesday), including an 8-5 loss in Monday night's series opener at Yankee Stadium...Have hit 130 home runs this season after hitting just 117 home runs all of last season...Have the most hits (923) in all of Major League Baseball (Colorado ranks second with 893 hits)...Have scored the second-most runs (538) in all of Major League Baseball, trailing Washington (559), after scoring just 583 runs all of last season.

THE LONG ROAD AHEAD: Pittsburgh will have the day off on Thursday before starting a stretch of 17 straight days with a game...The Pirates will play three games vs. Chicago-NL (July 24-26), three games vs. Arizona (July 27-29), four games at Cincinnati (July 30-August 2), four games at Milwaukee (August 3-6) and three games vs. New York-NL (August 7-9) before having the day off on August 10...The Pirates' last stretch of 17 straight calendar days with a game came in 2023, when they played vs. Chicago-AL (April 7-9), vs. Houston (April 10-12), at St. Louis (April 13-16), at Colorado (April 17-19) and vs. Cincinnati (April 20-23)...The consecutive upcoming four-game series will mark the first time they play consecutive four-game series since August 3-10, 2023, when they played four games at Milwaukee (August 3-6) and four games vs. Atlanta (August 7-10)...The last time they did that in back-to-back road series came from September 12-18, 2022, when they played four games at Cincinnati (September 12-14) and four games at New York-NL (September 15-18)...The Pirates have not done that in consecutive road series (excluding series with a doubleheader) since May 7-14, 2001, when they played four games at St. Louis (May 7-10) and four at Milwaukee (May 11-14).

DOUBLE TROUBLE: The Pirates will play their third doubleheader in an eight-day span (excluding the All-Star break) today at Yankee Stadium...They also played a doubleheader on July 11 vs. Milwaukee and Saturday at Cleveland...It will mark their first time playing three doubleheaders in an eight-day span (excluding the All-Star break) since 1989, when they played doubleheaders on July 21 vs. Los Angeles, July 23 vs. Los Angeles and July 28 at Philadelphia...Pittsburgh's three doubleheaders are its most in a season since playing six doubleheaders in 2022 (May 4 at Detroit, May 7 at Cincinnati, June 14 at St. Louis, July 7 at Cincinnati, September 7 vs. New York-NL and September 13 at Cincinnati)...Today will mark the Pirates' 12th all-time interleague doubleheader (interleague began in 1997) and second against New York (AL)...Pittsburgh split a doubleheader on May 18, 2014 at Yankee Stadium (current Yankees pitcher Gerrit Cole won a 5-3 decision in Game Two of the day's doubleheader).

THE MAGICIAN: Esmerlyn Valdez connected for his 13th home run in his first 32 Major League games with a two-run home run in the third inning on Monday at New York (AL)...He became the second Major Leaguer (since RBI became an official stat in 1920) to have at least 13 home runs and 34 RBI through his first 32 career games, joining Philadelphia's Rhys Hoskins (2017, 16 HR/34 RBI).

BRING 'EM HOME: Esmerlyn Valdez has at least one RBI in eight straight games (since July 9 vs. Atlanta), making him the first Pirate to do that since Kevin Young (May 1-8, 1999)...The only Pirates (since 1920) to have an RBI in nine straight games were Walter Schmidt (nine, April 16-25, 1921), Cotton Tierney (nine, August 3-12, 1922), Pie Traynor (10, April 28-May 14, 1925), Paul Waner (12, June 2-16, 1927), Traynor (nine, July 13-20 [G2], 1927), Arky Vaughan (nine, September 2 [G2]-11, 1940), Dale Long (nine, May 18-28, 1956), Willie Stargell (10, June 18-27 [G1], 1971), Richie Zisk (10, August 4 [G1]-13, 1974) and Andy Van Slyke (11, June 9-20, 1988)...Valdez also has at least one extra-base hit in eight straight games...He has joined Max Carey (eight, August 7-14, 1924), Kiki Cuyler (eight, June 19-27 [G1], 1925), Waner (14, June 3-19, 1927), Traynor (eight, July 7-August 6, 1929), Long (eight, May 19-28, 1956), Stargell (eight, June 20 [G1]-27 [G1], 1971) and Sid Bream (eight, May 6-14, 1986) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to do that...He has joined Waner (11, June 3-16, 1927), Long (eight, May 19-28, 1956) and Stargell (eight, June 20 [G1]-27 [G1], 1971) as the only Bucs since 1920 w/an extra-base hit & an RBI in eight straight games.

AMERICAN SPIRIT: The Pirates have won five consecutive series against American League opponents for the first time since interleague play began during the 1997 season...Pittsburgh swept a three-game series from May 29-31 vs. Minnesota, won two of three games from June 2-4 at Houston, won two of three games from June 15-17 at the Athletics, won two of three games from June 23-25 vs. Seattle and won two of three games from Saturday-Sunday at Cleveland...The Pirates are also looking to win their fourth straight interleague series away from home (also June 2-4 at Houston, June 15-17 at the Athletics and Saturday-Sunday at Cleveland) for the second time since interleague play began during the 1997 season...They also did that during the 2019 campaign, when they swept a two-game series from April 16-17 at Detroit, swept a two-game series from April 30-May 1 at Texas, won two of three games from June 25-27 at Houston and won two of three games from August 12-14 at Los Angeles.

ON THIS DATE IN PIRATES HISTORY

July 22, 2025: Pittsburgh collected eight doubles, its most in a game in PNC Park history (since 2001), in an 8-5 win vs. Detroit. The eight doubles were the Pirates' most in a game since doubling nine times on August 24, 2002 at Milwaukee and their most in a home game since doubling nine times on August 4, 1998 vs. Colorado at Three Rivers Stadium. Mitch Keller pitched 6.0 innings and earned the win.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the second round of the 2014 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Keller lost a 10-5 decision after allowing three runs over 3.0 innings on July 9 vs. Atlanta...It was his shortest start by innings pitched since tossing 2.0 innings last year on July 28 at San Francisco...His 72 pitches thrown were his fewest since throwing 62 pitches over 5.1 innings last year on September 12 at Washington...Keller is 2-6 with a 7.03 ERA (56.1ip/44er) in his last 11 starts (since May 13 vs. Colorado) after going 4-1 with a 2.87 ERA (47.0ip/15er) in his first eight starts of '26 (March 28-May 7).

AGAINST THE YANKEES: Keller is 0-2 with a 10.24 ERA (9.2ip/11er) and 11 strikeouts in two career starts against New York (AL)...He lost a 16-0 decision after allowing four runs over 6.0 innings on July 6, 2022 at PNC Park...Keller also lost a 9-4 decision after giving up seven runs in 3.2 innings on April 4, 2025 at PNC Park (Pirates' Home Opener).

K IS FOR KELLER: Keller, who has 914 career strikeouts, surpassed Steve Blass (896) for seventh place on the Pirates' all-time strikeouts list after striking out seven batters during his start on June 16 at the Athletics...He surpassed Rick Rhoden (852) during his start on April 19 vs. Tampa Bay and Deacon Phillippe (861) during his start on April 25 at Milwaukee...He also surpassed Dock Ellis (869) for eighth place on May 7 at Arizona.

INTER-ESTING: Keller has gone 3-1 with a 4.19 ERA (34.1ip/16er) and 30 strikeouts in six interleague starts so far this year...The Pirates have won during five of six starts.

QUALITY STUFF: Keller's nine quality starts this season (last on June 28 vs. Cincinnati) are the third-most on the team, behind only Braxton Ashcraft (10) and Paul Skenes (10)...His 75 quality starts since making his Major League debut on May 27 (G2), 2019 at Cincinnati are tied with Yu Darvish for the seventh-most in the National League during that stretch...Keller and Darvish trail Zack Wheeler (129), Logan Webb (113), Sandy Alcantara (105), Aaron Nola (97), Zac Gallen (91) & Merrill Kelly (86) on that list.

SIX PACK: Keller pitched 6.0 innings and allowed two or fewer runs in each of his first three starts this season (March 28 at New York-NL, April 3 vs. Baltimore, April 8 vs. San Diego)...He was the first Pirate to toss at least 6.0 innings while allowing two or fewer runs in each of his first three starts of a season since Joe Musgrove (April 5-16, 2019).

CONSISTENT KELLER: Keller pitched 6.0 scoreless innings during his start on April 8 vs. San Diego, marking his second scoreless start of at least 6.0 innings through his first three starts of the 2026 campaign (also March 28 at New York-NL)...He joined Salomon Torres (2002), Zach Duke (2005), Jeff Karstens (2008), Wandy Rodriguez (2013) and Jameson Taillon (2018) as the only Pirates during the 21st century with two scoreless starts of at least 6.0 innings through their first three games of a season...Keller's 17 starts of at least 6.0 scoreless innings during his career (since 2019) are the 10th-most by any Pirate in the Live Ball Era (since 1920)...Paul Skenes, who has done that on three occasions this season, ranks tied for 12th on the list (15).

DAZZLING DEBUT: Keller scattered three hits without issuing a walk (had three strikeouts) over 6.0 scoreless innings, but had a no-decision in Pittsburgh's 4-2, 11-inning loss on March 28 at New York (NL)...Keller left with the game scoreless after six frames...The Pirates took a short-lived, 1-0 lead into the bottom of the 10th before the Mets tied it...Pittsburgh also added a run in the top of the 11th before New York's Luis Robert Jr. hit a walkoff, three-run home run off Hunter Barco in the bottom half... Keller joined Vance Worley (June 15, 2014 at Miami), Nick Kingham (April 29, 2018 vs. St. Louis) and Joe Musgrove (May 25, 2018 vs. St. Louis) as the only Pirates in the 21st century to toss at least 6.0 scoreless innings without allowing a walk in a season debut.

QUALITY AND QUANTITY: Keller had 17 quality starts in 2025, his third straight season with at least 15 quality starts (he had 18 in 2023 and 15 in 2024)...Prior to Keller, the last Pirate to do that in three straight seasons was Paul Maholm from 2008-10 (A.J. Burnett did it from 2012-13 and in 2015, but he pitched for Philadelphia in 2014)...Keller made his 30th start of 2025 on September 12 at Washington, marking his third consecutive season with at least 30 starts...He joined Maholm (2008-10) and Ian Snell (2006-08) as the only Pirates pitchers in the 21st century to accomplish that.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the third round of the 2021 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Chandler had a no-decision after allowing two runs over 4.2 innings in Pittsburgh’s 3-2 win on July 11 (G2) vs. Milwaukee...He has allowed 11 runs over 15.0 innings in his last three starts (also June 30 at Philadelphia & July 5 at Washington) after posting a 2.82 ERA (22.1ip/7er) across four games (three starts) from June 7-25.

RIGHT ON: Chandler has limited right-handed hitters to a .211 batting average against (35-for-166) and a .616 OPS this season...The only righthanders to take him deep were Chicago (NL)’s Dansby Swanson (April 12) and San Francisco’s Heliot Ramos (May 10).

WHAT A RELIEF: Chandler allowed just one hit and struck out seven batters over 5.1 innings out of the bullpen on June 7 at Atlanta...He became only the second Pirates reliever in the Modern Era (since 1901) to pitch at least 5.0 innings, strike out at least seven batters and allow one or zero hits in an appearance...Chandler joined Bill Swift, who did that over his 7.1 innings out of the bullpen on July 28 (G2), 1935 vs. St. Louis.

GIMME FIVE: Chandler struck out a career-high 11 batters in 5.0 innings on May 22 at Toronto...He joined Erik Bedard (May 3, 2012 at St. Louis) as the only Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to have at least 11 strikeouts in an outing of 5.0 or fewer innings...Chandler also became one of 11 Major Leaguers (since earned runs became an official stat in both leagues in 1913) to have at least 11 strikeouts and zero earned runs in an outing of 5.0 or fewer innings (he was only the fourth rookie to accomplish that).

FINISHING STRONG: Chandler went 2-0 with a 1.08 ERA (16.2ip/2er), 19 strikeouts (zero walks issued), a .123 batting average against (7-for-57) and a 0.42 WHIP over his final three starts of the 2025 season, including 5.2 innings of one-run ball in his final start on September 27 at Atlanta (he is a native of Lawrenceville, GA, located approximately 30 miles from Truist Park)...He became the first Pittsburgh pitcher during the Modern Era (since 1901) to make three consecutive starts with one or zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts...Chandler also joined Milwaukee’s Corbin Burnes (four starts) in 2021, Arizona’s Zac Gallen (three starts) in 2023 and Detroit’s Tarik Skubal (three starts) last season as the only Major League pitchers during the Modern Era to make at least three consecutive starts with four or fewer hits allowed, one/zero runs allowed, zero walks issued and at least six strikeouts.

A BIT OF BOTH: Chandler went 2-1 with a 5.12 ERA (19.1ip/11er) in four starts and 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA (12.0ip/3er) in three relief appearances in 2025...Nine of the 11 runs he allowed as a starting pitcher came during his first career start (Sept. 7 vs. Milwaukee).

RELIABLE ROOKIES: Chandler (starter) and Braxton Ashcraft (reliever) each struck out six batters while issuing zero walks in Pittsburgh’s 2-0 win last season on September 20 vs. the Athletics...They were the first pair of Pirates teammates during the Modern Era (since 1901) to each strike out six batters without issuing a walk in the same game... They were the ninth pair of Pirates since 1901 to both have six strikeouts in a game, the first since Chad Kuhl (eight)/Richard Rodríguez (six) on May 6, 2018 at Milwaukee.

FOUR YOUR INFORMATION: Chandler became one of two Pirates relievers since at least 1900 to pitch at least 4.0 innings in each of his first three outings (last year on August 22 vs. Colorado, August 27 at St. Louis and Sept. 2 vs. Los Angeles-NL), along with Carmen Hill in 1915 (the last Major League pitcher to do that prior to Chandler was Kansas City’s Atlee Hammaker in 1981)...He also became one of three Major League pitchers since 1969 (when saves became official) to earn two wins and a save in his first three games (Minnesota’s Tom Johnson in 1974/Cincinnati’s Hector Carrasco in 1994).
