TODAY'S TILT...the Mariners continue the 6-game homestand with the last of 3 games against the New York Mets (2-0)...Seattle is coming off a 3-game sweep of the Arizona Diamondbacks on the homestand... following Thursday's off day, Seattle will embark on its first 3-city road trip of the season at Detroit (3 G, June 5-7), at Baltimore (4 G, June 8-11) and at Washington (3 G, June 12-14)...today's game against the Mets will be televised and streamed live on **Mariners TV** with **Aaron Goldsmith** and **Ryon Healy** on the call and **Angie Mentink** serving as field reporter...the game will be broadcast live on **Seattle Sports (710 AM)** with **Rick Rizzs** and **Gary Hill Jr.** on the call.

ODDS AND ENDS...the Mariners won yesterday's game by a 8-3 final over the New York Mets, extending their winning streak to 8 games...Seattle is 23-14 (.622) over their last 37 games (5/22-c), 2nd-best record in the American League over that span behind the Tampa Bay Rays (24-11/.686).

- **First Feels Great** - The Mariners are in first place in the American League West Division, 2.5 games ahead of the second place Texas Rangers (30-31).
- **Dommie Barrels - Dominic Canzone** is batting .333 (10x30) with 3 doubles, 3 home runs, 5 RBI and a 1.108 OPS over his last 10 games (5/20-c).
- **Bizarre Bazarado Note** - Last night **Eduard Bazarado** became the 10th pitcher (done 11x) in Mariners history to record 2 GIDP in less than 2.0 IP, and first since Anthony Misiewicz (5/7/21 at TEX).
- **Sweep Heart** - The Mariners are looking to complete 3 consecutive series sweeps for the first time since they swept 4 straight during the 2022 season: 2 G at SD (July 4-5, 2022), 4 G vs. TOR (July 7-10, 2022), 2 G at WSH (July 13, 2022 DH) and 4 G at TEX (July 14-17, 2022).
- **Series Business** - Seattle has won 3-straight series for the first time this season and now own a 10-9-1 series record in 2026.

#VOTEMARINERS...today Major League Baseball is set to launch Phase 1 of voting for the 2026 All-Star Game on July 14 at Citizens Bank Park in Philadelphia, PA...fans can submit up to 5 ballots per day until the conclusion of Phase 1 at 9:00 am PT on June 25th...Phase 2, which takes the finalists at each position, will run from June 29-July 2 before the All-Star rosters are announced on July 4th at 4:30 pm PT...for more information, visit Mariners.com/Vote.

DO I HEAR NINE?...the Mariners have won a season-best 8 consecutive games (5/25-c), the **longest active winning streak in the big leagues**...with a win tonight, Seattle would have its first 9+ game winning streak since rattling off 10 consecutive victories from Sept. 6-16 last season.

PITCHING DURING THE STREAK...over the last 8 games, the Mariners pitching staff has a 1.92 ERA (16 ER, 75.0 IP), allowing a total of 18 runs which comes out to just over 2 runs allowed per game...Seattle hurlers have recorded 71 strikeouts and 17 walks, holding opponents to a .172 batting average while posting a 0.83 WHIP, 2.04 walks-per-9 innings and 8.52 strikeouts-per-9 innings.

HITTING DURING THE STREAK...over the last 8 games, the Mariners offense is batting .293 (84x287) with 48 runs (6.0 runs per game) with 9 doubles, 1 triple, 21 home runs and 16 walks, posting a .337 on-base percentage, .551 slugging percentage and .887 OPS with 158 total bases across 312 plate appearances...Seattle has recorded 10+ hits in 6 of those 8 contests.

NEW MONTH, SAME JULIO...after leading the AL in HR (10), total bases (69) and extra-base hits (17) in May, **Julio Rodríguez** continued his hot hitting last night, belting his 13th home run of the season...over his last 35 games (4/25-c), J-Rod is batting .275 (41x149) with 10 doubles, 12 home runs, 24 RBI, 3 stolen bases, a .301 OBP and slugging .584 for an .885 OPS...during that span, he ranks T-2nd in MLB in HR and 7th in SLG.

COLT EMERSON IS A BALLPLAYER...**Colt Emerson** went 2-for-4 with a double in last night's game...in 15 career games, Emerson is batting .271 (13x48) with 7 runs, 4 doubles, 1 triple, 3 homers, 8 RBI and 5 walks, getting on base at a .352 clip, slugging .583 with a .935 OPS in 54 plate appearances...the 20-year-old Emerson has a 165 OPS+...the Mariners are 11-4 (.733) when Emerson appears in a game this season.

CAPTAIN CRAWFORD...**J.P. Crawford** walked 3 times in last night's game, matching his season-high (also: 4/12 vs. HOU)...dating back to the 2023 season, J.P. has recorded 47 multi-walk games, ranking 10th in MLB and 1 behind teammate **Cal Raleigh** (48) for the team lead...overall this season, J.P. is getting on base at a .344 clip with 9 home runs and a 109 OPS+ despite sporting a career low .226 BABIP that ranks 9th-lowest among qualified hitters.

LIFE'S A PITCH...the Mariners pitching staff has posted a combined 3.43 ERA (211 ER, 554.1 IP) with an MLB-fewest 157 walks, along with 533 strikeouts...among Major League pitching staffs they rank 2nd in strikeout-to-walk ratio (3.39), 1st in fewest walks-per-9 innings (2.55), 5th in ERA, T-3rd in WHIP (1.18) and 10th in strikeouts...Mariners starting pitching leads MLB with 353.0 innings pitched and ranks 2nd in strikeouts (324) and T-4th in quality starts (27)...the Seattle bullpen ranks 2nd in the Majors in ERA (3.00).

AS YOU MAY KNOW...the Mariners have won 8 consecutive games against the Mets at T-Mobile Park (July 29, 2017-c), are 11-3 all-time against the Mets at T-Mobile Park and are 19-10 (.655) against the Mets all-time, but...**DID YOU KNOW?**...Seattle's .655 winning percentage against the Mets is Seattle's 2nd-best mark against any opponent, trailing only their 21-6 (.778) mark against the Cincinnati Reds?...Seattle has all-time winning percentage of at least .600 against 4 teams: the Reds, Mets, Pirates (17-9/.654) and Diamondbacks (29-19/.604).

ON THIS DATE IN MARINERS HISTORY - JUNE 3

- **1977** - Ruppert Jones hit a dramatic HR to break up Dennis Eckersley's attempt to break Cy Young's 23 consecutive hitless innings record. Jones' HR stopped Eckersley's streak at 22.1 hitless innings and it was the only Mariners hit in the game.
- **2001** - The Mariners won their franchise-record 11th consecutive game. The winning streak would extend to 15 before being snapped on June 9.
- **2009** - Ichiro Suzuki records a hit in a 3-2 win over Baltimore extending his hit-streak to 27 games. This streak stands as a Mariners record for consecutive games with a hit, and was active from May 6th-June 3rd, 2009.
- **2010** - Félix Hernández strikes out 4 batters in the top of the 8th inning. He is just the third pitcher in club history to accomplish the feat.
- **2017** - Nelson Cruz hit his 100th home run as a Mariner and Mike Zunino collected 7 RBI in a 9-2 win over the Rays.
- **2019** - Selected RHP **George Kirby** in the first round of the MLB First Year Player Draft.
- **2022** - **Julio Rodríguez** named AL Rookie of the Month for May.
- **2023** - RHP **Bryan Woo** makes MLB debut at Texas.

ABOUT GEORGE KIRBY...

- The 28-year-old right-hander is making his 13th start of the season and 1st against the Mets...is making the 125th start of his career and his 3rd career start against New York-AL.
• Is in his 5th season with Seattle; selected by the Mariners in the first round (20th overall) of the 2019 MLB First-Year Player Draft; signed by Mariners scout Ty Holub.
• Named to his 1st All-Star team in 2023.
• Named AL Rookie of the Month in August 2022 after posting a 2.15 ERA and 5-0 record.
• Is the highest drafted player out of Elon University.

LAST TIME OUT...on May 29 vs. Arizona, tossed 5.1 innings and allowed 4 runs (4 ER) on 6 hits with 1 walk and 4 strikeouts...threw 87 pitches and 61 strikes.

THIS LAST STRETCH...his 12 consecutive games of 5.0+ innings pitched to start the season marks his 3rd longest streak of such starts over a single season...logged a 14 game streak last season (5/28/25-8/12/25) and a 21 game streak in 2024 (4/15/24-8/7/24)...it is the longest such streak to begin a season in his career...he is 1-of-4 pitchers this season with 5.0+ IP and 3-or-fewer walks in their first 12 starts of the season, along with Emerson Hancock...his 5 starts in May mark the first time he has logged 25+ strikeouts, 6-or-fewer balls, and 39-or-fewer base runners over 29.0+ IP in a 5-game span since June 25 to July 21 of last season...is the third such span since the start of 2025.

HOME TURF...owns a career 1.06 WHIP at home, ranking 11th best in the AL since 2022 (min. 175.0 IP) while his career BB/9 (1.5) ranks 2nd, and K/BB (6.2) in home games ranks 3rd...since 2025 has thrown 5.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer runs allowed in 13-of-19 home games...the Mariners are 9-4 in such games...his 35 career home starts of 6.0+ IP with 2-or-fewer earned runs allowed are tied for 6th most in Mariners history and are T-3rd most in MLB since 2022, 1 game ahead of Luis Castillo (35).

PLENTY OF PUNCHOUTS...has tossed 12+ strikeouts in 3 career games, including a career-high 14 strikeouts twice last season...is 1 of 10 pitchers with 3-or-more games of 12+ strikeouts since 2024.

SO NICE HE DID IT TWICE...is the only pitcher to have multiple starts of 14+ SO and no walks since 2025, having done so twice last season (6/8/25 at LAA & 9/14 vs. LAA)...teammate Emerson Hancock, with his May 2 start vs. Kansas City, is among the 4 pitchers that have logged 1 such game since 2025 along with Kirby, Max Meyer-MIA (4/21/25 vs. CIN) and Reid Detmers (5/24/26 vs. TEX).

GEORGE & WALTER...among pitchers with 50+ starts at home since 2022, he leads MLB in walks-per-nine innings (1.49) and strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.24), ranking just ahead of rotationmate Logan Gilbert in both categories (1.67 BB/9 and 5.96 SO/BB).

WIN #50...earned his 50th career win on May 11 at Houston, becoming the 12th player in franchise history with 50+ wins...his 121 games are tied for the 4th-fewest games to reach 50 wins with the Mariners, alongside: Hisashi Iwakuma and Erik Hanson...behind: Jamie Moyer (100 G), Freddy Garcia (100 G), and Marco Gonzales (118 G).

LENGTH ON THE MOUND...has reached the 6th inning in 11 of his 12 starts this year and has cleared the 7th inning in 3 of those starts...his 74.0 innings pitched this season are 7th most in MLB this season...has pitched 65 games of 6.0+ innings since 2023, including 7 starts this season, ranking T-4th most such in MLB over that span.

QUALITY STUFF...has thrown 6 quality starts this season (last: 5/23 at KC)...has thrown 69 quality starts across his career, T-8th most in MLB since 2022...has thrown a quality start without any walks in 37 career starts (2x this season, last: 5/23 at KC), most in MLB since 2022, ahead of Tarik Skubal-DET (26 G) and Zack Wheeler-PHI (26 G)...has also tossed a quality start with no walks in 20 home games, most in MLB since 2022 and 3rd-most all-time in Mariners history, behind Félix Hernández and Jamie Moyer who each had 22 quality starts with no walks at home.

FURIOUS GEORGE...has thrown 7.0+ innings with 3-or-fewer earned runs allowed in 3 starts this season and in 25 career starts...in addition, Kirby and Bryan Woo (4) are 2 of 11 pitchers in MLB this season to have 3+ games of 7.0+ IP, 3-or-fewer runs, and 1-or-fewer walks allowed...Kirby's 22 such starts since 2023 are T-3rd most in MLB across that span.

CRUISE CONTROL...tossed 8.0 innings on April 7 vs. Texas on the road, his 2nd career complete game (also: 8/12/23 vs. BAL)...is 1 of 7 pitchers with a complete game so far this season...became the first Mariners pitcher to toss 8.0+ IP since Logan Gilbert did so twice in 2024 (last: 9/7/24 at STL)...in addition, Kirby has thrown 8.0+ IP without a walk in 3 career games (last: 4/7 at TEX) and is 1 of 9 pitchers in MLB with 3-or-more such games since 2023, joining teammate Logan Gilbert (3 G, last: 6/16/24 vs. TEX).

EFFECTIVE AND EFFICIENT...currently averages 14.8 pitches per inning this season, tied for the 10th lowest mark in MLB...just trails teammate Bryan Woo (T-8th, 14.7 P/IP)...is averaging 15.6 pitches per inning across his career, tied for the 12th-fewest P/IP among starters since 2022 (min. 500 IP).

KEEPING IT CLOSE...his 52.7% ground-ball percentage this season ranks 3rd-highest in MLB among starters...increased his ground-ball percentage from 44.1% last season (+8.6)...posts a 44.5% ground-ball percentage across his career.

BEST IN ALL THE LAND...among starting pitchers since 2022 (min. 600 IP), he leads the Majors in fewest walks allowed (110), strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.18), walks-per-nine innings (1.4), and walk rate (3.8%).

FOR THE M'S HISTORY BOOKS...leads the Mariners franchise (min. 100 GS) in fewest walks-per-nine innings (1.4) and in strikeout-to-walk ratio (6.18)...ranks 6th in franchise history in career ERA (3.60) and 11th in total strikeouts (680 SO).
