Minnesota Twins (52-60) at Detroit Tigers (66-48)

TAKING THE FIFTH: The Detroit Tigers last night picked up a 6-3 win vs. the Minnesota Twins in the series opener of their three-game set, Detroit's fifth win in a row at home and sixth win in its last eight games overall ... after this series ends tomorrow, the Tigers will have Thursday off before hosting the Angels for three games this weekend, the conclusion of 13-of-16 games at home.

- Detroit now boasts its fourth separate five-game winning streak at home this season, matching its season high ... this marks the first time the Tigers have had four separate home winning streaks of five games or more within the same season since 2011 (also four).
- The Tigers have posted a 100-67 (.599) record since the beginning of August 2024, good for the best record in the American League and just half-a-game behind the Dodgers and Brewers (both 100-66) for the best record in all of baseball ... the Tigers are now 4.5 games up on the Astros (95-71), the next-best A.L. club in this past little-more-than-a-calendar year.
- The Tigers have 24 games remaining in August, 21 of them against teams that have a record of below .500 ... the Tigers last night started a stretch during which they play 13-straight games against sub-.500 teams before hosting the Astros for three games from August 18-20.

FOR STARTERS: Tigers starting pitchers have limited foes to a .694 OPS against in their 17 games since the All-Star Break, the fifth-lowest mark by a starting group in the A.L. ... Tigers starters rank fifth in the A.L. with a 3.83 ERA (38 ER/89.1 IP) but lead the A.L. with a 3.11 FIP, well-ahead of the next-closest Mariners (3.71 FIP) and just behind the Reds (3.04 FIP) for best in the majors.

EVERYBODY LOVES CHRIS: Chris Paddack tonight makes his second start for the Tigers as he takes on his former club ... Paddack pitched well but was on the other side of a pair of notable Tigers victories vs. the Twins earlier this season: Jackson Jobe's first major league win on April 12 at Target Field and Tarik Skubal's Sunday Night Baseball win on June 29 at Comerica Park.

- While Paddack brings a 4-9 record and 4.77 ERA in 22 starts this season into tonight, he has allowed three earned runs or less in 16 of his 22 starts and has allowed five earned runs or more in four of his starts ... remove those four tough ones from the equation and Paddack has gone 4-5 with a 3.07 ERA (34 ER/99.2 IP) in his remaining 18 starts this year, allowing two earned runs or less in 13 starts.

NOTHING TO CARP ABOUT HERE: Kerry Carpenter last night crushed his 19th homer of the season and now boasts a .589 slugging percentage vs. right-handed pitching since the start of the 2024 campaign, the third-highest mark in all of baseball behind only Aaron Judge (.688) and Shohei Ohtani (.683) ... minimum 500 plate appearances vs. righthanders.

CENTRALLY LOCATED: Tonight is the second game of an A.L. Central overture that sees the Tigers play 16 of 25 games within their division to close out the month of August ... the Tigers are now 19-9 vs. the A.L. Central this season, the second-best intradivision record in all of baseball behind only the Los Angeles Dodgers, who are 19-7 vs. the N.L. West.

- The Tigers are 100-67 since August 1, 2024, good for a 15.5-game lead on the next best A.L. Central club in that span, the Cleveland Guardians (84-82) ... Detroit's 15.5-game lead in its division since last August 1 is by far the largest in all of baseball and more than double the next-biggest lead held by Houston at +6.5 games in the A.L. West in this span.

CUT THE CHASE: Gleyber Torres boasts just a 17.0 percent chase rate this season, second-lowest in the American League behind only Trent Grisham (16.2 percent) ... Juan Soto leads all of baseball with a 14.9 percent chase rate this year ... Gleyber's chase rate the past few seasons?: 21.1 percent in 2024, 25.5 percent in 2023, 27.5 percent in 2022 and 22.5 percent in 2021.

SPENCER'S GIFTS: Spencer Torkelson has tallied 23 homers and 46 extra-base hits in 108 games this season, tied with Nick Kurtz for the second-most homers by any player in baseball that primarily plays first base this year behind only Pete Alonso (25), while Torkelson has the most extra-base hits among first basemen in the American League, trailing only Pete Alonso (53) for most in the majors.

TELL IT TO THE JUDGE: Riley Greene joins Aaron Judge and Taylor Ward as the only three players in all of baseball to reach 23 doubles, 26 homers and 84 RBI this season ... Greene has those exact totals through 114 team games, which puts him on pace for 33 doubles, 37 homers and 119 RBI in a 162-game season, shattering previous career bests.

THIS DIFFERENCE ISN'T NEGLIGIBLE: The Tigers are tied for the best record in the A.L. on the strength of a +83 overall run differential, trailing only the Yankees (+89) for the best mark in the A.L. ... in the A.L. Central, the Tigers have a +110 edge on the second-place Guardians (-27), are +97 on the third-place Royals (-14) and are +120 on the fourth-place Twins (-37).

AND FINALLY: The Twins and Tigers last night combined for nine runs in a one hour, 58 minute game, the most runs scored in a sub-two hour game this season ... last night was the first MLB game with at least nine runs scored in under two hours since July 16, 2023 when the Royals beat the Rays, 8-4, in 1:54 ... the last time the Tigers were in such a nine-inning game?: August 30, 1975, a 9-2 win vs. the *California* Angels in 1:58 ... thanks to Elias.

- Made a career-best 26 starts in 2019, his first season in the big leagues...went 20-19 with a 4.21 ERA over 61 games (60 starts) in three seasons with the Padres.

- Earned 20 saves with the Nationals this season prior to the trade, sixth-most in the N.L. at the time...went 1-4 with a 4.38 ERA (19 ER/39.0 IP) in 40 relief outings, including 34 games finished for Washington.
- Named to the National League All-Star team last year, a season in which he collected a career-high 38 saves, second-most in the N.L., with a 3.68 ERA (26 ER/36.2 IP) in 65 relief appearances...the 2024 campaign marked his fourth in a row with 65 or more relief outings.
