METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets were postponed on Tuesday...On Monday, the team earned a 4-2 win over the Rockies on Monday...The team has won three of their last four games and are 6-6 over their last 12 games...The Mets are seeking their second straight series win and their third on the road this year...The team continues their third trip of the year, a nine-game trip (3-1) against the Angels (2-1), Rockies (1-0) and Diamondbacks (three games).

I'M GOING BACK TO THE START: Tonight, Peralta will face the Rockies for the ninth time in his career, eighth time as a starter...Peralta made his Major League debut at Coors Field on May 13, 2018 and struck out 13 over 5.2 innings while carrying a no-hitter into the sixth inning...On May 2, 2023 at Coors Field, Peralta recorded 10 strikeouts over 6.0 innings of two-run ball...Peralta, Randy Johnson (3), Zac Gallen, Jesús Luzardo and Chris Sale are the only visiting pitchers ever to record multiple double-digit strikeout games at Coors Field...Through his first nine career outings against the Rockies, Peralta is 4-3 with a 3.45 ERA (17 ER/44.1 IP) and 66 strikeouts...His 66 strikeouts are the seventh-most ever by a pitcher through their first nine games against the Rockies...In four career games (3 starts) at Coors Field, Peralta is 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA (3 ER/17.0 IP) and 30 strikeouts.

MY OH MYERS: Tobias Myers is now 0-1 with a 2.05 ERA (5 ER/22.0 IP), four walks and 16 strikeouts in 10 games this year...He has not allowed an earned run over his last four appearances, tossing 9.0 scoreless innings and allowing six hits, three walks and seven strikeouts.

MR. PULCHRITUDINOUS: Carson Benge is batting .303 (10-33) with six runs, two doubles, two homers, five RBI, three walks, a .361 OBP, a .545 SLG and a .907 OPS over his last 11 games...He leads the Mets with three OAA...That is tied for the 17th-most in the majors.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN HIGH: David Peterson, a native of Denver, has appeared in two games at Coors Field...He is 2-0 with a 3.00 ERA (3 ER/9.0 IP), three walks and 11 strikeouts...He has made five appearances against the Rockies in his career and is 4-1 with 2.36 ERA (7 ER/26.2 IP) with seven walks and 26 strikeouts...In three appearances in relief this year, Peterson is 1-0 with a 2.45 ERA (3 ER/11.0 IP), one walk and nine strikeouts...This compares to an 0-4 record with a 8.10 ERA (21 ER/23.1 IP) mark as a starter.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN: The Mets are in the midst of their third road trip of the season...They are 7-10 in 2026...Last season, the Mets went 34-47 on the road...The team has posted a 3.26 ERA on the road, which is third in the majors and second in the National League.

ROX-METS NOTES: The Mets have won six straight at Coors Field...Overall the team is 48-60 at the ballpark.

RETURN OF THE MARK: Mark Vientos is on a four-game hitting streak, batting .313 (5-16) in that span with three runs, two doubles, two homers, seven RBI and a 1.125 OPS...Over his last 10 games, Vientos is batting .294 (10-34) with four runs, two doubles, two homers, eight RBI, four walks, a .368 OBP, a .529 SLG and an .898 OPS...His six multi-homer games are tied with Francisco Alvarez for the second-most on the current team...Francisco Lindor has 11 which is tied for the ninth-most in team history.

I RALEY LIKE YOU: Brooks Raley has appeared in 14 games this year for the Mets...He is 0-1 with a 1.42 ERA (2 ER/12.2 IP), four walks and 16 strikeouts...He has allowed one home run this season...Over his last six games, he has tossed 5.1 scoreless innings, allowing three hits with one walk and seven strikeouts.

DOWN ON THE FARM: In 30 games this year, Nick Morabito is batting .284/.403/.461 with 22 runs, six doubles, four homers, 12 RBI, 11 steals, 17 walks and an .864 OPS...The outfielder was selected in the second round of the 2022 First-Year Player Draft out of Gonzaga College High School in Washington, D.C...He is ranked as the 12th-best prospect in the Mets system according to *MLBPipeline.com*.

WE REMEMBER: The New York Mets announced that the club will wear a memorial "Davey" patch on the sleeve of their home and road uniforms during the 2026 season...Johnson passed away on September 5, 2025 at the age of 82...He finished his Mets career with the most managerial wins in franchise history (595) and the best winning percentage (.588)...In 1986, Johnson guided the team to a franchise-record 108 regular season victories and capped the year off with a dramatic World Championship...From 1984-1990, under his helm, the Mets averaged more than 95 wins.

THIS DAY IN 1986: The Mets earned their fourth straight win and their 15th victory in 16 games as they downed the Astros, 4-0, at Shea Stadium...Doc Gooden tossed a shutout allowing only two hits, two walks and struck out seven...In addition, he tripled in the win, finishing 1-3 with one run and two RBI...This season, the Mets will celebrate the 40th anniversary of the 1986 World Series Champions New York Mets...The Mets will also host a 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration to celebrate the 1986 World Champion Mets on Saturday, August 1 prior to the 4:10 p.m. game against the Miami Marlins...Additional information regarding programming for the 1986 World Series Reunion and Celebration will be available at a later date at [Mets.com/1986](https://mets.com/1986).

PREVIOUSLY ON: Threw a season-high-tying 6.0 innings (also: 4/12 vs. Athletics) and allowed three runs, one earned, in the Mets' 5-4 loss vs. Washington on April 30...Surrendered four hits, recorded six strikeouts and issued a season-high-tying three walks for the fourth time in five starts.

THE GAME OF RISP: So far this season, opposing batters are 3-28 (.107) with runners in scoring position against Peralta...This season, Peralta ranks fifth in the NL and tied for 10th in the majors in opponents' batting average with runners in scoring position (min. 25 batters faced w/RISP)...Since 2021, Peralta has held opposing batters to a .203 (100-492) average with RISP, the best mark in the majors during that span (min. 500 batters faced w/RISP).

VS. COLORADO: Tonight, Peralta will face the Rockies for the ninth time in his career, eighth time as a starter...Through his first nine career outings against the Rockies, Peralta is 4-3 with a 3.45 ERA (17 ER/44.1 IP) and 66 strikeouts...His 66 strikeouts are the seventh-most ever by a pitcher through their first nine games against the Rockies...Peralta faced the Rockies on April 24 at Citi Field and allowed two runs over 5.2 innings with a season-high eight strikeouts...In four career games (3 starts) at Coors Field, Peralta is 2-0 with a 1.59 ERA (3 ER/17.0 IP) and 30 strikeouts...Peralta made his Major League debut at Coors Field on May 13, 2018 and struck out 13 over 5.2 innings while carrying a no-hitter into the sixth inning...On May 2, 2023 at Coors Field, Peralta recorded 10 strikeouts over 6.0 innings of two-run ball...Peralta, Randy Johnson (3), Zac Gallen, Jesús Luzardo and Chris Sale are the only visiting pitchers ever to record multiple double-digit strikeout games at Coors Field.

DAY AND NIGHT: Today, Freddy Peralta will make his second start of the season at night...Peralta's only other night start of the season was on April 24 vs. Colorado...In 129 career night games (94 starts), Peralta is 43-26 with a 3.64 ERA (225 ER/556.2 IP)...In 89 career day games (75 starts), Peralta is 28-19 with a 3.51 ERA (161 ER/412.2 IP)...Peralta and Kyle Bradish are the only pitchers in the majors this season with six daytime starts.

NEW FACE IN A NEW PLACE: On January 21, the Mets acquired Peralta from Milwaukee along with RHP Tobias Myers in exchange for RHP Brandon Sproat and INF Jett Williams...Peralta spent his first eight Big League seasons with Milwaukee and went 70-42 with a 3.59 ERA (371 ER/931.0 IP) and 1153 strikeouts across 211 games (162 starts)...In Brewers franchise history, Peralta ranks third in strikeouts, fifth in ERA, eighth in wins and 10th in starts (min. 500.0 IP)...Peralta made his Major League debut at age 21 on May 13, 2018 vs. Colorado...The right-hander struck out 13 over 5.2 innings and took a no-hitter into the sixth innings...His 13 strikeouts were tied with Cliff Melton (1937) for the fourth-most in Major League history in a season debut...Peralta finished his rookie season at 6-4 with a 4.25 ERA (37 ER/78.1 IP) and 96 strikeouts over 16 games (14 starts)...From 2019-2020, 45 of 54 of his appearances during that span came in relief...In 2021, Peralta was selected to his first career All-Star game after he went 10-5 with a 2.81 ERA (45 ER/144.1 IP) and 195 strikeouts across 28 games (27 starts)...In 2022, Peralta pitched to a 3.58 ERA (31 ER/78.0 IP) over 18 games (17 starts) in an injury-riddled season...Over the past three seasons, Peralta has pitched exclusively as a starter and has gone 40-25 with a 3.40 ERA (195 ER/516.0 IP) and 614 strikeouts over 95 starts...Since 2023, Peralta ranks tied for second in the majors in wins, third in strikeouts and opponents' batting average (.210), fourth in SO/9 IP (10.71) and tied for fifth in starts...A native of Moca, Dominican Republic, Peralta was originally signed as a non-drafted free agent by the Seattle Mariners on April 18, 2013...The right-hander was acquired by Milwaukee in a four-player trade on December 9, 2015.

2025 RECAP: Last season, Peralta went 17-6 with a 2.70 ERA (53 ER/176.2 IP), a 1.08 WHIP, a .193 opponents' batting average and 204 strikeouts across 33 starts...Peralta established career bests in wins, ERA, starts and innings...In the NL, Peralta ranked first in wins, second among qualifiers in opponents' batting average, fourth in ERA, fifth in WHIP, sixth in strikeouts and tied for 11th in innings...The righty earned his second career All-Star selection (also: 2021), finished fifth in the NL Cy Young vote and was an All-MLB Second Team selection...On May 8 at Cleveland, Peralta recorded his 1000th career strikeout...From June 13 - July 19, Peralta earned a win in seven straight starts, the longest such streak in the majors last season...In five August starts, Peralta went 4-0 with a 0.32 ERA (1 ER/28.0 IP) and 32 strikeouts...He earned NL Pitcher of the Month for August, his second career Pitcher of the Month honor (also: August, 2023)...From August 5 - September 10, Peralta tossed 30.0 consecutive scoreless innings, the second-longest scoreless streak in Brewers franchise history behind Teddy Higuera's 32.0-inning scoreless streak in 1987...In each of his five starts from August 12 - September 4, Peralta threw 5.0 or more scoreless innings, the longest such streak in the majors since Zac Gallen's six straight scoreless starts of 5.0 or more innings from August 8 - September 4, 2022...Peralta started three games for Milwaukee in the Postseason and went 1-2 with a 4.70 ERA (8 ER/15.1 IP) and 19 strikeouts...He earned the win in Game 1 of the NLDS vs. Chicago-NL and suffered the loss in Game 4 of the NLDS at Chicago-NL and Game 2 of the NLCS vs. Los Angeles-NL.

OPENING DAY IN THE BIG APPLE PART THREE: On March 26 vs. Pittsburgh, Freddy Peralta made his third career Opening Day start...He allowed four runs over 5.0 innings and struck out seven...Peralta's first career Opening Day start came with Milwaukee on March 29, 2024 at Citi Field...That day, the right-hander threw 6.0 innings of one-run ball and fanned eight Mets batters...The lone hit he surrendered was a solo home run off the bat of Starling Marte in the second inning...Last season, Peralta was named the Brewers' Opening Day starter for the second consecutive season...The Brewers opened their 2025 regular season at Yankee Stadium, where Peralta allowed two runs over 5.0 innings and struck out eight batters...Peralta is the fifth different Mets pitcher to get the Opening Day nod in each of the last five seasons...The last Mets pitcher to start consecutive season openers for the Mets was Jacob deGrom, who started three consecutive Opening Days from 2019-2021.

KEEPIN' IT 200: In each of his last three seasons, Peralta has recorded 200 or more strikeouts...The only other pitcher in the majors to record 200+ strikeouts in each of the last three seasons is Dylan Cease...Additionally, Peralta's three seasons of 200+ strikeouts are tied with Mario

Soto for the third-most by a Dominican-born pitcher...The only Dominican Republic natives with more such seasons are Hall of Famers Pedro Martínez (9) and Juan Marichal (6)...His highest single season strikeout total came in 2023 at 210.

REVERSE, REVERSE: For his career, Peralta has held left-handed batters to a .200 batting average, the fourth-best mark in the majors by a right-handed pitcher since his debut season, 2018 (min. 1500 LHB faced)...In 2021, Peralta held lefties to a .157 batting average (43-274), the third-best mark in a single season by a right-handed pitcher in the Expansion Era (since 1961, min. 300 LHB faced)...Last season, left-handed batters hit .204 (66-323) off of Peralta, the fourth-lowest mark among right-handers in the NL and the 11th-lowest mark in the majors (min. 300 LHB faced).

EXPANDING HIS ARSENAL: In his first two seasons, Peralta threw his four-seam fastball 77.7% of the time as part of a three-pitch repertoire that also featured a curveball and changeup... In 2020, Peralta added a slider to his arsenal and was his second-most thrown pitch from 2021-2024 with his highest usage coming in 2021 at 26.5%...Last season, Peralta only threw his slider 10.2% of the time, his lowest-used pitch...Despite the low usage of his slider, Peralta held opposing batters to a .155 (9-58) average in at-bats ending with the pitch...With the addition of another pitch to arsenal, Peralta's fastball usage has decreased from his first two seasons, however, he has thrown the pitch at least 50% of the time in every season of his career...Peralta has increased his changeup usage from season to season and was his second-most used pitch in 2025 at a career-high 21.2%.
