MONTY'S SEASON DEBUT: Tonight, Jordan Montgomery will make his D-backs debut after he was signed to a 1-year contract on March 29.

- In 2023, earned All-MLB Second Team honors after he posted career bests in wins (10), quality starts (20), ERA (3.20), innings (188.2) and strikeouts (166).
- In 32 starts between the Rangers and Cardinals last season, went 10-11 with a 3.20 ERA ( 67 ER in 188.2 IP). - Made his first 2 career starts vs. Giants in 2023 while with the Cardinals ( $0-1,2.19$ ERA; 3 ER in 12.1 IP, 13 K ).
