**RAYS REPORT**—The Rays continue a 12-game, 14-day road trip against the Angels (2-1), Mariners (0-3), Athletics (1-0, two to play) and Giants (3G) tonight in West Sacramento... have lost five of six and 10 of their last 12 series, including seven of their last eight on the road... have split their last six games (3-3), but have dropped nine of 13, 13 of 18, 19 of 27 and 27 of their last 39 games...are 5-12 so far on a stretch of 19 road games in a 22-game span (July 25-Aug. 17)...started the season 21-26, went an MLB-best 25-9 from May 20-June 26 and are an MLB-worst 12-27 since June 27...are fourth in the AL East for the 32nd consecutive day, 11.5 GB the division-leading Blue Jays and 5.5 GB the third-place Yankees for the AL's third and final Wild Card spot...including off days and the All-Star break, they have spent two days in first, 37 in second, 32 in third, 62 in fourth and four in fifth.

- ✦ The Rays jumped out to a 4-0 lead in the 4th inning and held on for a 7-4 win in last night's series opener...they logged 15 hits, their most since July 23 vs. CWS (15H) and most on the road since July 9 at DET (16H).
- ✦ The 2-5 spots in the Rays lineup went a combined 9-for-18 with 3 2B, 2 HR and 3 RBI, including a multi-hit effort from **OF Everson Pereira** in his Rays debut (2-for-5, 2B). It was the 31st time the Rays have plated seven runs or more, tied with the Red Sox for third most in the AL behind the Tigers (35G) and Yankees (33G)...they reached the mark 28 times all of last season.
- ✦ The Rays homered three times last night and have 13 HR in their last six games since Aug. 5, tied with the Braves and White Sox for second most in the majors behind the Blue Jays (14HR)...they recorded multiple homers and multiple steals for the 12th time this season, tied with the Mets for second most in MLB behind the Mariners (17G).
- ✦ Tampa Bay is 4-14 in its last 18 road games and 6-19 (.240) in its last 25 since June 29, 29th in the majors in that span, ahead of only Colorado (4-13/.235).
- ✦ Since the All-Star break, the Rays have struck out 210 batters, second in MLB behind the Mariners (219SO)...they have 9 SO or more in 14 of 23 games since the break.
- ✦ With a win tonight, the Rays would earn their second series win in their last three sets after dropping four straight from July 25-Aug. 3...they would also earn their first road series win over the Athletics since May 2-4, 2022 and remain undefeated in their last four road series against the A's (2-0-2).

**RECENT TRANSACTIONS**—Prior to tonight's game, the Rays placed **INF Taylor Walls** (left groin strain) on the 10-day IL and recalled **OF Tristan Peters** from Triple-A Durham.

**EXTRA, EXTRA!**—After tallying 3 2B and 3 HR last night, the Rays have collected 6 XBH (or more) in consecutive games for the first time since June 20-21, 2024—they have had one longer streak in franchise history, a three-game run from July 30-Aug. 1, 2019...the Rays have 28 XBH (13 2B, 2 3B, 13HR) in seven games since the current road trip began on Aug. 4, fourth most in the AL behind the Blue Jays (38), Astros (34) and Athletics (30)...they have homered in six straight road games, their longest streak since Aug. 23-28, 2024 (6G), and in 11 of their last 13 games away from home...their last longer streak was 11 straight road games from July 16-Aug. 4, 2023.

✦ Of the Rays last 21 runs, 15 have been scored via 12 HR...23 of their 31 runs allowed on the current road trip have come across on 11 HR by opponents.

**LA MÁXIMA**—**Junior Caminero** has homered five times in his last five games, six times in his last nine games and 10 times in 23 games since the All-Star break, tied for third most in the majors...he is the first Ray with 5 HR in a five-game span since **Isaac Paredes** (5HR) from June 21-28, 2022, and the sixth Ray (13x) with 5 HR in a five-game span on the road (last: **Brandon Lowe**, Sept. 28-Oct. 3, 2021)...Caminero's 33 HR, which rank third in the AL, are already tied for eighth most in a season in franchise history and are the most since **Brandon Lowe** (39HR) and **Mike Zunino** (33HR) in 2021...the 33 HR are the most through the Rays first 120 games of a season in team history, outpacing **Carlos Peña** (31HR) in 2009 and **Jose Canseco** (31HR) in 1999...it ties **ATL Bob Horner** (1979) for the second-most homers by a primary third baseman in an age-21-or-younger season in MLB history (age as of June 30), trailing the Milwaukee Braves **Eddie Mathews** (47HR, 1953)...with his next homer, Caminero would tie Canseco (1999) and **Aubrey Huff** (2003) for the sixth-most long balls in a season club history.

- ✦ Caminero has launched 6 HR or more in each of the last five months (April - 6, May - 7, June - 8, July - 6, Aug. - 6)...he is the second player in club history to record 6 HR or more in five consecutive months within a single season, joining Peña (May-Sept. 2007)...Caminero joined Mathews (1953) as the only players in MLB history to turn the trick in an age-21-or-younger-season (Stats Perform).
- ✦ He is on pace for 44 HR, which would be the second-highest total in Rays history behind Peña (46HR) in 2007...he needs 7 HR in the next 42 games to join **ATL Ronald Acuña Jr.** (41HR, 2019), Mathews (47HR, 1953) and **NY Yankees Mel Ott** (42HR, 1929) as the only players in MLB history to record 40 HR in an age-21-or-younger season.

**DAWG DAYS**—**Brandon Lowe** has 4 HR in his last six games, bringing his season total to 23 HR, most among MLB primary second basemen (min. 50% of games at 2B), ahead of **AZ Ketel Marte** (21HR), and the second most of his career behind 2021 (39HR)...Lowe and Marte are the only second basemen in the majors to record 20 HR or more in each of the last three seasons (2023-25)...Lowe is 13-for-43 (.302) with 1 2B, 4 HR, 7 RBI and a 931 OPS over his last 11 games...he has hit safely in 18 of his last 20 road games, slashing .387/.434/.693 (29-for-745) with 9 XBH and 15 RBI, ranking among MLB's road leaders in that span (since June 11, min. 75PA) in average (3rd), slugging pct. (3rd) and OPS (4th, 1.127).

✦ Rays infielders lead the AL with 75 HR, second most in the majors behind the Diamondbacks (88HR).

**OLD FRIENDS, NEW FOES**—Between **Jeffrey Springs** and **Jacob Lopez** this marks the fifth series in franchise history the Rays have been opposed by multiple starting pitchers who appeared for them last season...the other four instances came earlier this season when Springs and Lopez pitched from July 1-3 in Tampa and three sets in 2022, when **BOS Rich Hill** and **BOS Michael Wacha** started opposite Tampa Bay in three separate series (April 22-24, Aug. 26-28, Sept. 5-7) after pitching for the Rays in 2021...Springs and Lopez were traded to the Athletics in exchange for **RHP Joe Boyle**, **INF Will Simpson**, **RHP Jacob Watters** and a Competitive Balance Round A selection in the 2025 First-Year Player Draft on Dec. 14, 2024.

✦ This marks the sixth time in 11 games and eighth time in 17 games the Rays will be opposed by a left-handed starter...they have won three of their last four games vs. southpaw starters on the heels of a six-game losing streak (June 30-Aug. 1).

**BULLISH ON THE PEN**—Over the last 14 games since July 27, the Rays bullpen leads the majors in WHIP (0.87), opp. on-base pct. (.234) and opp. OPS (.519), is second in strikeout rate (30.3%), and ranks third in ERA (2.11/55.1IP, 13ER), opp. average (.176/34-for-193) and opp. slugging pct. (.285)...Rays relievers have held opponents scoreless in seven of the club's last 11 games...the bullpen's 25.1 pct. strikeout rate on the season is third in MLB behind the Astros (27.7%) and Blue Jays (25.7%) and would be its best since a team-record 25.6 pct. in 2021.

- ✦ **Pete Fairbanks** earned his 20th save last night, his third straight season reaching the mark...he joined **Roberto Hernandez** (1998-2000) as the only players in Rays history to record three 20-save campaigns—both Fairbanks and Hernandez did so in three consecutive seasons.
- ✦ Fairbanks became the ninth AL pitcher this season to reach 20 saves...his 68 saves since 2023 are fourth in the AL behind **CLE Emmanuel Clase** (115SV), **KC Carlos Estévez** (81SV) and **LAA Kenley Jansen** (78SV).

**SPEED (RAY)CERS**—The Rays lead the majors with 151 SB, 21 more than the next closest club (MIL - 130SB)...Tampa Bay (134HR) is the fourth team MLB history to record 150 SB or more and 130 HR or more through its first 120 games of a season, joining the 2024 Reds (168SB, 141HR), 2009 Rays (160SB, 155HR) and 1995 Reds (168SB, 144HR)...the Rays have tallied a stolen base in 17 of 23 games since the All-Star break.

**RAYS AND A'S**—The Rays and Athletics close a six-game season series this week in West Sacramento after Tampa Bay dropped two of three games from July 1-3 at Steinbrenner Field...the Rays need to sweep this series to claim a fourth straight season series win, which would extend the longest streak in franchise history...the Rays are 14-7 in the last 21 meetings between the clubs (May 2, 2022-pres)...their .433 (94-123) all-time winning pct. against the A's is their second lowest vs. any AL opponent, better than only their .430 (204-270) mark vs. the Yankees.

**TONIGHT’S START**—Shane Baz will toe the rubber for his 24th start of the season and 12th on the road...marks his 47th career start and 25th as a visitor...marks his third career start opposite the Athletics...is on a career-high five-game losing streak, seeking his first win since June 26 at KC...was acquired from the Pirates as a player to be named later (Aug. 14, 2018) along with **RHP Tyler Glasnow** and **OF Austin Meadows** for **RHP Chris Archer** on July 31, 2018.

**LAST TIME OUT**—Baz fanned nine batters, but took his first no-decision in his last six starts after departing following four innings of work in a 5-4 win on Aug. 6 at LAA (ND, 4.OIP, 5H, 4ER, 2BB, 9SO, HR)...struck out the side in order on 15 pitches in the opening frame before working a 1-2-3 2nd on 11 pitches...ran into trouble in the 3rd, allowing the first two batters to reach before tallying back-to-back strikeouts...permitted all four of his runs on **Nolan Schanuel**’s RBI-single followed by **Mike Trout**’s three-run, game-tying homer...retired three of four batters in the 9th inning, fanning **Christian Moore** for his 250th career strikeout...allowed the first two batters to reach in the 5th, leading to his departure after 81 pitches...Baz was followed by five scoreless innings of relief from the Rays bullpen, and **Christopher Morel** launched a go-ahead solo homer in the 7th to secure the win.

- ✦ The outing snapped the Rays six-game losing streak in Baz’s outings, marking the club’s first win in one of his starts since June 26 at KC (4-0)...he had taken the loss in each of his previous five starts.
- ✦ Baz has gone 5.0 IP or fewer in a career-high four straight starts.

**SACRAMENTO SHANE**—Baz has made two career starts opposite the Athletics, going 1-0 with a 1.84 ERA (14.2IP, 3ER), a 0.95 WHIP, 15 strikeouts and four walks while holding opponents to a .196/.255/.355 (10-for-51) clip...he reached 7.0 IP in both outings...earlier this season on July 2 at Steinbrenner Field, Baz struck out a careeer-high-tying 11 Athletics hitters in a 4-3 loss...he set a career high with 20 swings-and-misses in the outing, most by a Rays pitcher since **Taj Bradley** (21) on Sept. 5, 2024 vs. MIN.

- ✦ He is 2-2 with a 3.79 ERA (54.2IP, 23ER) across nine career starts against AL West competition, five of which were quality...he has yielded three runs or fewer in eight of the nine starts.

**ON THE ROAD AGAIN**—Baz’s 3.34 ERA (64.2IP, 24ER) on the road is eighth lowest among qualified AL pitchers and his 6.54 ERA (63.1IP, 46ER) is the highest...over his last six outings on the road, he has pitched to a 2.50 ERA (36.OIP, 10ER) and held opponents to a .214 (28-for-131) average with only 2 HR allowed (0.50 HR/9.OIP)...over four starts at Steinbrenner Field during the same timeframe (since June 15), Baz has an 8.86 ERA (21.1IP, 21ER), allowing opposing hitters to bat .303 (27-for-89) with 6 HR (2.53 HR/9/OIP).

**STRIKEOUT STUFF**—Baz has recorded eight strikeouts or more in back-to-back starts for the second time in his career, joining another set of starts earlier this season from June 26–July 1...he has never reached the mark in three consecutive starts—**Ryan Pepiot** (3GS, June 5-16, 2025) is the only Rays pitcher to turn the trick over the last two seasons (2024-25)...Baz has struck out 11.12 batters per 9.0 IP across his last eight starts dating back to June 26, third in the AL/fifth in the majors in that span (min. 40.OIP), trailing DET Tarik Skubal (12.88), SD Dylan Cease (12.86), PHI Zack Wheeler (12.42) and SEA Logan Gilbert (12.14).

- ✦ He has fanned 133 batters in 23 starts this season, surpassing his total from his first 23 career starts entering the year (117SO).

**WELL RESTED**—Baz will be making tonight’s start on five days rest thanks to the Rays Aug. 7 off day...he is 6-4 with a 3.71 ERA (63.OIP, 26ER) over 11 starts following five days of rest compared to 1-3 with a 6.38 ERA (48.OIP, 34ER) across nine starts with four days...this includes a 1.75 ERA (25.2IP, 5ER) over his last four starts on five days rest dating back to May 24.

**HELPING HANDS**—When Baz receives three runs of support or more in his career, he is 13-1 with a 3.30 ERA (128.1IP, 47ER), and the Rays are 20-4 (11-2 in 2025)...in 21 starts with two runs or fewer, he is 2-12 with a 5.13 ERA (119.1IP, 68ER), and Tampa Bay has gone 5-17 (2-8 in 2025).

- ✦ He has received seven total runs of support across his last six outings, good for only 2.08 runs of support per 9.0 IP (6.27 RSA in first 17GS).

**RUNNING OUT OF GAS**—Over the first three innings, Baz has pitched to a 3.65 ERA (69.OIP, 28ER), 1.17 WHIP and .221 (57-for-258) opp. average... he has held opponents scoreless in the opening frame in 20 of his 23 starts this season and 38 of his 46 career starts...Baz went 13 straight starts from April 25–July 1 without a run allowed in the first two frames...from the 4th inning on, he owns a 6.41 ERA (59.OIP, 42ER), 1.54 WHIP and .290 (67-for-231) opp. average...42 of his 70 runs allowed (60.0%) have come from the 4th inning on.

- ✦ Baz is one of three qualified pitchers in the majors who has not allowed a home run in the 1st inning, joining PIT **Paul Skenes** and SF **Logan Webb**.

**10 FOR 10**—Baz struck out a career-high 11 batters on April 14 vs. BOS...paired with his start on April 1 vs. PIT, he became the fifth pitcher since 1901 to record 10 SO or more with no walks in two of his first three starts of a season, joining MIL **Corbin Burnes** and CWS **Lance Lynn** in 2021, WSH **Stephen Strasburg** in 2010 and AZ **Randy Johnson** in 2000 (Stats Perform).

**GOING STREAKING**—Baz threw 6.0 IP or more with two runs or fewer in six consecutive starts from Sept. 17, 2024–April 14, 2025, tying the longest streak in franchise history (6GS, 5x, last: **Shane McClellan**, June 20–July 26, 2022)...he was 4-0 with a 1.89 ERA (38.OIP, 8ER) and 0.74 WHIP during the streak, holding opponents to a .160/.218/.252 (21-for-131) slash line with 46 SO and 7 BB.

TOMORROW’S PROBABLE STARTER: RHP DREW RASMUSSEN [9-5, 2.66]

**LAST START**—Did not factor into the decision of the Rays 3-2, series-opening loss in his home state on Aug. 8 at SEA despite twirling six scoreless frames (6.OIP, 4H, 0R, 4SO)...extended his scoreless inning streak to 15.1 frames.

**vs. ATHLETICS**—In four career appearances/three starts against the Athletics, Rasmussen is 2-0 with a 2.81 ERA (16.OIP, 5ER) and 0.69 WHIP, striking out 16 while holding A’s hitters to a .143/.186/.232 (8-for-56) line...he yielded four runs in 3.0 IP against them on June 30 at Steinbrenner Field.
