LAST GAME: The D-backs lost 7-0 vs. Brewers last night.

- **Eduardo Rodriguez** (L; 2 ER in 6.1 IP) tossed his first quality bid.
- Corbin Carroll went for 1-for-4 on the night to extend his current on-base streak.
- **Ryan Thompson** marked his fourth scoreless and hitless performance in 5 total outings this season.

CARROLL'S 14-GAME ON-BASE STREAK: Corbin Carroll has reached base in each of his first 14 games this season (17 H, 6 BB, 3 HBP)...his on-base streak to start the season is the longest by a D-back since Josh Rojas in 2022 (14 G; May 6-20)...the last D-back to do so in 15+games was David Peralta (16 G from 3/29-4/20/2018).

- Dating back to Sept. 23, 2024, Carroll has reached base in 20 straight games, 1 shy of tying his career high of 21 from July 7-Aug. 4, 2024 (T-2nd longest active streak in MLB with N. Arenado/STL).
- Entering today, 4 players in the Majors have reached base in 14+ straight games to start their respective seasons: Corbin Carroll (14 G), Shohei Ohtani/LAD (14 G), Jacob Wilson/ATH (14 G) and Kristian Campbell/BOS (14 G).

CARROLL IN THE LEADOFF: Corbin Carroll ranks among the Majors in the leadoff spot (min. 30 PA) in SLG (1st, .912, ahead of C. Abrams-WSH/.585), OPS (1st, 1.333, ahead of F. Tatis Jr.-SD/1.030), isolated (raw) power [SLG-minus-AVG] (1st, .559, ahead of K. Schwarber-PHI/.343), home run rate (1st, 13.2%, ahead of K. Schwarber-PHI/9.3%) and extra-base hits (1st, 8, ahead of 3 others).

CARROLL WATCH CONTINUES: Over his last 7 games, since April 4, **Corbin Carroll** has 7 extra-base hits (2 doubles, 1 triple, 4 homers)...in the span, is slashing .407 AVG/.484 OBP/1.000 SLG/1.484 OPS...his 7 extra-base hits are the most in MLB in the span while his 1.484 OPS is the second highest in MLB (behind Kyren Paris-LAA/1.500).

• Carroll ranks among MLB leaders in extra-base hits (T-3rd, 10), total bases (T-3rd, 38), SLG (4th, .704), OPS (6th, 1.117) and homers (T-6th, 5).

STARTING PITCHER RHYTHM: D-backs starting arms have tossed 3 consecutive quality bids: **Merrill Kelly** (W) on April 8 vs. Orioles, **Brandon Pfaadt** (W) on April 9 vs. Orioles and **Eduardo Rodriguez** (L) on April 11 vs. Brewers...Arizona's last string of 4+ consecutive quality starts was from June 18-21, 2024 (3 G @ WSH, 1 G @ PHI).

- Geraldo Perdomo has reached base in 13 of his 14 games played this season...is hitting .333/.897 OPS with 2 doubles, 2 homers, 13 RBI, 7 walks and 2 stolen bases.
- Alek Thomas, in 8 starts, is hitting .308 (8-for-26) with 2 doubles, 1 triple and 7 RBI, including 3 multihits...has recorded 1+ RBI in 5 games.
- Pavin Smith, in 8 starts, is hitting .423 (11-for-26)/1.192 OPS with 4 doubles, 1 homer, 4 RBI and 4 walks.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW: Making his home debut as a D-back.

- Is facing his former team for the second time in his career...played for Milwaukee for his first 6 seasons (2018-23), going 45-27 with 2 saves, a 3.26 ERA (257 ER in 709.1 IP), opponent .208 AVG and 870 strikeouts over 167 games (106 starts).
- Helped lead the Brewers to 3 playoff appearances (2023, '21, '18).
- •Went decionless in the win during his lone start vs. Brewers (with Orioles) on April 14, 2024 (3 R-2 ER in 5.0 IP, 6 H, 2 BB, 5 K).
- Through his first 2 starts with Arizona, is limiting runners in scoring position to a .214 AVG (3-for-14) with 2 walks and 5 strikeouts.
- Is holding hitters 3-6 in the lineup to a .118 AVG (2-for-17)/.286 OBP, with 2 walks and 6 strikeouts.

LAST START: Took the loss in his second road start on April 4 @ Nationals (L; 4 ER in 5.0 IP, 7 H, 4 BB, 3 K).

VS. NL CENTRAL: Is 14-13 with a 3.11 ERA (91 ER in 263.2 IP) in 45 career starts

SECOND INNING SUCCESS: Is holding batters to a .167 AVG (1-for-6)/.583 OPS with 1 walk and 2 strikeouts in the second inning.

 In 14 starts dating back to July 25, 2024, has allowed only 2 runs over 14.0 IP in the second.

ENTERING 2025: Is 1 of 3 starting pitchers since 2022 with 3 consecutive seasons of 190.0+ IP, with Aaron Nola/PHI and Logan Webb/SF, ranking third in innings at 590.0, behind Webb (613.0) and Nola (598.0).

- Is 1 of 7 starting pitchers since 2021 with 4 consecutive seasons of 10+ wins, along with K. Gausman/TOR, C. Bassitt/TOR, Z. Wheeler/PHI, F. Valdez/HOU, J. Berríos/TOR and L. Webb/SF.

SIGNATURE CUTTER: In 2024, his 20 Pitching Run Value on his cutter tied for the fourth-best pitch (second-best cutter) in MLB with Hunter Greene/CIN (4-seamer), behind Cade Smith/CLE (28 on 4-seamer), Chris Sale/ATL (24 on slider) and Emmanuel Clase/CLE (23 on cutter).

• Developed his cutter in 2020 with the support of Brewers' pitching coach Chris Hook, but mastered the pitch during the pandemic.

"COVID was kind of a blessing in disguise for him a little bit. It allowed him to kind of master a pitch that I don't think he would have been able to get there without that two months or whatever it was. He was able to master it and have a really good feel. We unlocked a little bit (in spring) and then he went home and unlocked it totally."

POSTSEASON EXPERIENCE: Has made 9 Postseason appearances (3 starts) with the Brewers (2018, '21, '23) and Orioles (2024), going 1-2 with a 2.33 ERA (7 ER in 27.0 IP), 0.85 WHIP, opponent .178 AVG, 7 walks and 25 strikeouts.
