METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Rockies, 7-6 in walk-off fashion last night... The Mets have won back-to-back games...The Mets will play 15 of their next 21 games at home...The Mets are 64-12 when scoring first this season...New York is 28-8-3 in 39 series this year...The Mets continue an 11-day, 10-game homestand (2-0), the second-longest of the year, against the Rockies (2-0), Dodgers (three games) and Nationals (three games).

TAKE THE TRAIN TO THE GAME!: With anticipated high attendance figures and next week due to the U.S. Open, the Mets are encouraging fans to take mass transit and arrive early to enter the ballpark in order to avoid traffic delays.

BACK TO SCHOOL: Ahead of the Old Timers' Game, the Amazin' Mets Foundation and the Pedro Martinez Foundation partnered on a Back-to-School event at Saint James Park in the Bronx...Together, they distributed over 500 new backpacks and school supplies to students in the Bronx. Mr. and Mrs. Met and members of the Los Mets Employee Resource Group also assisted with the backpack distribution.

BETTER LATE THAN NEVER: New York is tied for sixth in the majors with 54 ninth-inning runs scored this season despite batting in the ninth inning in just 91 of the club's 127 games...There are only two teams that have taken fewer turns at bat in the ninth inning in MLB this season, the Rays (24 runs in 88 ninth innings) and Dodgers (37 runs in 82 chances)...The Mets have staged 26 come-from-behind wins and have won in their final at-bat 15 times...Last night's win was the Mets' 11th of the season when entering the ninth inning either trailing or with the score tied.

"QUIT" ISN'T IN THEIR VOCABULARY: New York walked off on a two-out single by Pete Alonso last night...It was New York's second walk-off win to occur with two outs (also, July 9 vs. Miami)...The Mets have scored an MLB-high 37 runs with two outs in either the ninth or extra innings...The team ranks second in average (.286), OBP (.371), SLG (.519) and OPS (.890) with two outs in the ninth/extra innings, trailing only San Francisco in each category.

WALK IT OFF: The Mets recorded their sixth walk-off victory of the season last night...It was the sixth time in franchise history the Mets recorded a walk-off over the Rockies and their first since September 8, 2014...The Mets recorded 11 walk-off victories in 2021...Pete Alonso's six walk-off RBI are tied for the fifth-most in franchise history...Only Wilmer Flores (10), David Wright (9), Kevin McReynolds (8) and Ed Kranepool (7) have more.

HECK OR HIGHWATER: The Mets are once again a season-high 35 games over .500...Prior to this year, the last time the team was 35 games above .500 was when they were a season-high 35 games over on September 13, 2006...A win tonight would mark the most games over .500 since the final game of the 1988 season (100-60)...New York has won 81 games this season, second-most in the NL and tied for the second-most in the majors...Their .638 winning percentage is tied for second in the majors and is the second-best in the NL...The team has posted a 81-46 record through the team's first 127 games...Only the 1986 (85-42) team posted a better record through the first 127 games of the season.

ROCKY MOUNTAIN WAY: David Peterson is expected to be recalled from Triple-A Syracuse to start today...Peterson, a Denver native, will make his second career start against his hometown club...Despite making a quality start, he took the loss on May 24, 2021 at Citi Field in his lone outing against the Rockies...He allowed three runs on five hits with three walks and three strikeouts in 6.0 innings of work...Tonight will mark his 16th start (20th appearance) of the season...He is 6-3 with a 3.44 ERA (32 earned runs/83.2 innings) with 40 walks and 97 strikeouts.

JUICY J: Jeff McNeil has recorded 39 hits this month, which is the most in the majors...His 39 hits are the most in a calendar month for his career, passing his previous high set in June, 2019...Additionally, his 39 hits in August are tied for ninth in Mets history...John Olerud holds the franchise record with 45 hits in August of 1998...McNeil is second in the majors in batting average with a .411 (39-95) mark in the month of August...In 25 games this month, he is batting .411/.436/.611 with 14 runs, 13 doubles, two triples, 11 RBI and three walks...In 32 games following the All-Star break, McNeil is batting .371 (.46-.124) with 17 runs, 15 doubles, three home runs, 14 RBI, a .397 OBP and a .565 SLG...His .371 batting average is sixth in the majors and third in the NL...He is batting .319 (36-113) batting average against left-handed pitchers this year...That is the fourth-best mark by a lefty this year in the majors.

GIVE ME A BREAK: The Mets are 23-11 in the second-half...The team's 23 wins are the tied for the second-most in the majors, and their .676 winning percentage ranks fourth...The team is batting .274/.345/.441 following the All-Star break...They are third in the majors in OBP and in average and are fourth SLG following the All-Star Game...The Mets are outscoring opponents 164-124 following the break.

ONE AWAY: Edwin Diaz leads the major leagues among relievers with 99 strikeouts...That is 17 strikeouts more than the second place reliever...He has done so in 51.1 innings...He is seeking to become the fastest player to record 100 strikeouts in Mets history...Armando Benitez owns the franchise record, recording his 100th strikeout on August 21, 1999 in 60.0 innings...Courtesy of Elias...Diaz has posted a 0.59 ERA (two earned runs/30.2 innings) with 15 hits, six walks and 61 strikeouts in 30 appearances since the start of June.

ROCKIES-METS NOTES: The Mets won the season series against the Rockies in 2019, 2021 and 2022...The Mets have won five straight and seven of the last eight games against the Rockies in New York.

CITI SLICKERS: New York has won four straight at Citi Field...They have recorded wins in 10 of their last 11 games and 14 of their last 16 at home...Overall, the Mets are 42-19 at home...They are tied for third in the majors and second in the National League with a .689 winning percentage at home...The team's .689 winning percentage is currently the second-highest in team history...Only the 1988 (56-24, .700) had a better winning percentage at home...They are right above the 2000 and 1986 teams (both 55-26, .679)...The Mets have posted a 3.13 ERA with 171 walks and 600 strikeouts at Citi Field...The Mets own the second-best home ERA in the NL.

M-V-PETE: Pete Alonso collected his 25th game-winning RBI of the year, setting a Mets single-season record...It was previously held by Keith Hernandez (1985)...According to STATS LLC, Joe Torre (1971 Cardinals) and Willie Mays (1962 Giants) share the MLB record with 27 game-winning RBI...Alonso has 11 more game-winning RBI than any other player in the majors this year...He has driven in the game-winning run in 11 of the Mets' 22 second-half wins.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso has recorded 137 home runs in his career in 496 career games...Only Ryan Howard (153) and Aaron Judge (138) have hit more home runs through their first 500 career games...He is tied for fifth in MLB history in home runs through a player's first four career seasons...This includes the 60-game COVID-19 shortened 2020 season.

CANHA GET AN AMEN?: Mark Canha went 2-3 with a run, two doubles, three RBI and was hit by a pitch...Over his last 11 games, Canha is batting .412 (14-34) with seven runs, seven doubles, three home runs, 12 RBI, two walks with a .474 OBP and an .883 OPS...He is batting .303/.407/.445 with 19 extra-base hits against right-handed pitching this year.

HOW STRIKING: The Mets have struck out 1,196 batters this season, which places them second in the majors...The team's 1,196 strikeouts are already the 11th-most in a single-season in franchise history...The franchise record is 1,520 set in 2019...Mets pitchers are averaging 9.53 K/9, a rate that if kept up or improved upon would have them eclipse the franchise record before the end of the season...More than one of every four batters to face Mets pitching has struck out this season (25.5 percent), the second-highest rate in the majors...The Mets have struck out 15 or more batters in a game eight times this year, which is the tied for the second-most in the majors...The team has struck out 10 or more in a game 64 times this year, the most in MLB...On the other side of the ball, the Mets have struck out 963 times this season...That is tied for the fourth-fewest times in the majors and the second-fewest times in the Senior Circuit.

ON THE ROX: Starling Marte is a .356 (73-205) career hitter with 47 runs, nine doubles, four triples, seven home runs, 32 RBI, 11 walks with a .414 OBP and a .541 SLG in 51 career games against Colorado...Pete Alonso has hit .352 (19-54) with eight runs, two doubles, five home runs, 11 RBI, two walks with a .386 OBP and a .667 SLG in 14 career games against the Rockies.

TAP THE ROCKIES: Brandon Nimmo, who grew up about 100 miles from Denver, is a .311 (23-74) hitter with 15 runs, four home runs, 12 RBI, 11 walks with a .395 OBP and a .473 SLG in 21 games against his "hometown" team...He has reached base safely in each of his last 15 games against the club, batting .350 (21-60) in that span with 12 runs, four home runs, 11 RBI and seven walks with a .962 OPS.

THE GAME OF RISP: The Mets are batting .273 with runners in scoring position this season...Their .273 average is third in the majors as is their 300 hits, while their 435 RBI with RISP are second...Pete Alonso has hit 13 home runs and 77 RBI with RISP...His 13 home runs with RISP are the most in the majors, while his 77 RBI ranks second in the majors and tops the National League...The single-season franchise record for home runs with RISP is 15 by Todd Hundley in 1996...Four players including Alonso have recorded 13 home runs with RISP - Carlos Beltran (2006), George Foster (1983) and Darryl Strawberry (1987)...The single-season franchise record for RBI with RISP set by David Wright with 91 in 2006.

AND I WOULD PLAY .500 TEAMS: The Mets will face the 54-73 Rockies tonight...22 of their 35 remaining games are against teams who currently have records below .500...The Mets are 44-17 against teams with a record below .500 this year, the fifth-highest winning percentage in MLB vs. sub-.500 opponents.

PETERSON NEWS & NOTES

LAST START: Took the loss on August 20 at Philadelphia in game two of a doubleheader...Tossed the 200th inning of his career in the contest...Allowed three runs on eight hits and two walks with six strikeouts through 4.2 innings...Gave up a career-high-tying eight hits, his most allowed this season.

GOT 'EM: Peterson struck out seven or more batters in six straight starts from June 20-July 17, the longest such streak of his career...He has 62 strikeouts across 43.2 innings since June 20 (10 G/8 GS) for a 12.78 K/9 ratio, a mark that ranks fourth in the majors in that span (min. 30.0 IP)...His 60 strikeouts over his last eight starts are the most by a Mets left-handed starter over an eight-game span since Johan Santana punched out 62 batters in eight starts from April 24-June 2, 2009.

VS. COLORADO: Opposes a fellow Colorado native in Kyle Freeland tonight...Peterson (Regis Jesuit HS) and Freeland (Thomas Jefferson HS) attended high school about 10 miles apart in Denver...Rockies reliever Lucas Gilbreath also attended high school in the Denver area at the same time as Peterson...Peterson will be facing the Rockies for the second time in his career...Took the loss on May 24, 2021 at Citi Field through 6.0 innings of the quality start...He allowed three runs on five hits (two home runs) and three walks with three strikeouts...Is 1-0 with a 2.18 ERA (five earned runs/20.2 innings) in five games (four starts) against National League West opponents this season.

200 KLUB: Struck out the 200th batter of his career on August 6 vs. Atlanta when he punched out Matt Olson swinging in the sixth frame...Is the 10th pitcher in Mets history to reach 200 strikeouts in their first 43 career games...He is the first to accomplish the feat since Steven Matz recorded his 200th strikeout in his 39th career game in 2017.

TO THE LEFT, TO THE LEFT: This season, Peterson has limited lefties to a .188 (13-69) average...Among left-handed hurlers, it is sixth-lowest opponents' average in the National League (min. 60 LHB faced).

ELECTRIC SLIDE: Peterson has held batters to a .175 (20-114) average with his slider this season and 64 of his 97 strikeouts have come on the pitch...His 50.4 slider-strikeout percentage is the eighth-highest in MLB (min. 50 PA).

ON THE FARM: Peterson has made six starts with Triple-A Syracuse this season...He has gone 2-3 and has posted a 4.85 ERA (14 earned runs/26.0 innings) with 10 walks against 34 strikeouts...Gave up just one home run in his first start of the season on April 28.

OH, THE RELIEF: In four outings out of the bullpen this year, Peterson has gone 1-0, posting a 4.50 ERA (four earned runs/8.0 innings)...This compares to a 3.33 ERA (28 earned runs/75.2 innings) while going 5-3 in 15 starts.

I SEE THE LIGHT: Has gone 3-0 with a 1.41 ERA (five earned runs/32 innings) across six starts during the day this season...This compares going 2-3 with a 4.74 ERA (23 earned runs/43.2 innings) in nine starts at night...It's the best day-time ERA among pitchers with at least five such starts in the NL and fourth-best in the majors.

FOUR-HIT WONDER: Has allowed four hits or fewer in 14 of his 19 games this season and 32 of 44 career games (171 career hits)...Among Mets hurlers, only Nolan Ryan (147 hits) allowed less hits in their first 44 major league games (min. 175.0 IP).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER (9-3, 2.33)

LAST TIME OUT: Suffered the loss on August 22 at the Yankees, allowing four runs on seven hits (one home run) and a walk with three strikeouts through 6.2 innings...Was the 100th loss of his career.

LOOKING FOR 200: Scherzer is one away from joining an exclusive club of active pitchers with 200+ victories...Justin Verlander (242) and Zack Greinke (223) are the only active hurlers who have won more than 200 games in their career.

- Lined a walk-off single on August 26 vs. Colorado...Was his second walk-off RBI of the year...He is tied for sixth in Mets history with six career walk-off RBI.
- His 105 RBI this year are tied for 18th in a single season in Mets history...Needs nine RBI to enter the top-10...The Mets record is 124 RBI (done twice).
- Has nine multi-hit games in his last 11 contests vs. the Rockies...Is hitting .409 (18-44) with two doubles, four homers, 10 RBI and seven runs in that span.
- Leads the majors with a Mets-record 25 game-winning RBI this season...Since 1954, only three players have had more in a season: Willie Mays (27, 1962), Joe Torre (27, 1971) and Jim Gentile (26, 1961)...Has 12 go-ahead RBI and 11 game-winning RBI in 34 games since the break...Has 33 go-ahead RBI.
- Tied for fourth in MLB and tied for third in the NL with 31 homers...Tied for the NL lead and tied for second in MLB with 105 RBI...Tied for 16th in the NL with 72 runs.
- Ranks 11th in MLB and seventh in the NL with a .519 SLG...Is 13th in the majors and eighth in the NL with a .869 OPS...Is 18th in the NL in OBP (.350).
- Owens the MLB lead in games with at least four RBI (eight) and is third in games with multiple RBI (27) this season.
- Batting .319 (15-47) with a 1.053 OPS against lefties since June 25...Prior to that date, was hitting .190 (11-58) with a .716 OPS vs. southpaws.
