TODAY IN YANKEES HISTORY	
May 6, 1930: The Yankees acquire RHP Red Ruffing from the Red Sox in exchange for OF Cedric Durst and \$50,000. Ruffing went 39-96 with Boston but goes 231-124 with New York, posting seasons of 20, 20, 21 and 21 wins on the World Championship clubs from 1936-39.	
May 6, 1922: Carl Mays tosses a two-hit, 2-0 shutout over the Philadelphia Athletics at Shibe Park in a game that takes 1 hour, 11 minutes.	
TOMORROW IN YANKEES HISTORY	
May 7, 2006: In an 8-5 win at Texas, Joe Torre becomes the fourth Yankees manager to amass 1,000 career wins, joining Joe McCarthy (1,460), Casey Stengel (1,149) and Miller Huggins (1,067).	
May 7, 1999: Two Japan-born starting pitchers face each other for the first time in Major League history, as Hideki Irabu (NYY) goes up against Mac Suzuki (SEA). Both pitchers carry a shutout into the fifth inning before the Yankees score three times in the frame en route to a 10-1 victory.	
May 7, 1959: The Yankees play an exhibition game against the Los Angeles Dodgers before 93,103 fans at the L.A. Coliseum. The game is played to honor paralyzed Dodgers catcher Roy Campanella.	
May 7, 1921: Outfielder Bob Meusel hits the first of three career cycles in a 6-5 win at Washington-AL. His three cycles remain the Yankees' franchise record.

AT A GLANCE: The Yankees continue their six-game homestand tonight with the second game of a three-game set vs. San Diego (0-1 thus far)...are 1-3 on the homestand after dropping two-of-three vs. Tampa Bay and their series opener vs. San Diego...after this homestand, will embark on a six-game road trip, featuring three-game series against the A's (Fri.-Sun.) and Mariners (5/12-14).

- Have lost a season-high-tying three straight games since 5/3 (also 3G from 4/6-8).
- Their +51 run differential this season is the second-highest in the AL and the fourth-highest in the Majors.

YESTERDAY'S NEWS: The Yankees fell to the Padres, 4-3, in their series opener on Monday at Yankee Stadium...**LHP Carlos Rodón** (6.2IP, 3H, OR, 1BB, 5K) tossed 6.2 scoreless innings and did not record a decision...**CF Trent Grisham** (1-for-3, 1R, 1HR, 2RBI, 1BB) hit his ninth HR of the season with a go-ahead two-run shot in the third inning...**SS Anthony Volpe** (0-for-3, 1RBI, 1SF) drove in a run with a sac fly in the sixth inning...**RF Aaron Judge** (0-for-3, 1BB) walked in the first inning to extend his on-base streak to 31 games (since 4/2)...**1B Paul Goldschmidt** (2-for-4, 1R, 1SB) recorded the Yankees' only multi-hit game...**RHP Devin Williams** (0.2IP 1H, 3R/ER, 2BB, 2K) allowed 3R/ER in the eighth inning...**RHP Luke Weaver** (0.1IP, 2H, 1R/ER, 1BB) took his first loss of the season, snapping his season-opening 15.0 scoreless inning streak.

FAN-TASTIC: The Yankees have averaged 41,883 fans per home gate this season, their highest average attendance through their first 18 gates of a season since 2010 (44,927).

- Own the highest average home attendance in the American League and the third-highest in the Majors, trailing only Los Angeles-NL (51,364) and San Diego (42,345).

GOOD AS GOLD: INF Paul Goldschmidt recorded the Yankees' only multi-hit game on Monday vs. San Diego... has hit safely in 24 of his last 29 games (since 4/4), batting .372/.410/.487 (42-for-113) with 15R, 7 doubles, 2HR, 15RBI, 8BB, 2SB and 1SF.

- Has hit .452/.500/.613 (14-for-31) with 2 doubles, 1HR, 14RBI, 3BB/1IBB, 1HP and 1SF with RISP this year...with RISP this season, is tied for fourth in the Majors in hits (tied for second in AL), ranks sixth in BA (fourth in AL) and tied for eighth in OBP (tied for third in AL).
- Has reached base safely in 27 of his 35 games this season, batting .353/.400/.481 (47-for-133) with 20R, 8 doubles, 3HR, 17RBI, 10BB/1IBB, 1HP, 1SF and 2SB.
- In 156 career games vs. the Padres, has batted .307/.425/.525 (163-for-531) with 97R, 37 doubles, 2 triples, 25HR, 97RBI, 108BB, 5HP, 6SF and 24SB...has reached base safely in 25 of his last 27 games against San Diego (since 6/30/19), hitting .337/.460/.500 (31-for-92) with 18R, 6 doubles, 3HR, 11RBI, 21BB/4IBB and 1SB over that span.
- Ranks second in the Majors in BA (second in AL) and hits (second in AL), is tied for second in multi-hit games (16, second in AL) and ranks eighth in OBP (fifth in AL).

BRONX BOMBERS: Yankees batters lead the Majors in HR (58), OBP (.344), SLG (.467) and OPS (.811), rank second in runs scored (190, first in AL), runs per game (5.43, first in AL), total bases (552, first in AL) and XBH (123, first in AL), third in BA (.260, first in AL) and times on base (465, second in AL), and fourth in walks (139, second in AL).

- The Yankees' 58HR this year are tied for their most home runs through their first 35 games of a season in franchise history (also 58HR in 2003).

MERRY GRISHMAS: OF Trent Grisham hit his ninth HR of the season with a go-ahead two-run shot in the third inning on Monday vs. San Diego...six of his 9HR this season have given the Yankees the lead...has 5HR in his last 11 games (since 4/19).

- Has 9HR in 29 games this season after hitting 9HR in 76 games in 2024.
- Is hitting .298/.379/.631 (25-for-84) with 17R, 1 double, 9HR, 17RBI, 10BB and 1HP in 29 games this season.
- Is tied for fifth in the Majors in game-winning RBI (five, tied for second in AL), tied for seventh in HR (tied for fourth in AL) and tied for eighth in go-ahead RBI (seven, tied for fourth in AL).

ALL RISE: OF Aaron Judge owns a 31-game on-base streak (since 4/2)...marks the fourth-longest on-base streak of his career, trailing only a 45-game streak from 8/29/22-4/12/23, 37-game streak from 5/2-6/12/24 and 32-game streak from 5/28-6/30/17...is the second-longest active on-base streak in the Majors, trailing only Philadelphia's Kyle Schwarber's 40-game streak since 9/23/24... is batting .415/.504/.686 (49-for-118) with 24R, 7 doubles, 2 triples, 7HR, 22RBI, 19BB/3IBB, 2HP and 3SB over that span.

- Had his career-high-tying 14-game hitting streak snapped on Monday (also 14G from 9/17/17-3/29/18)...was the longest by a Yankee this season and the longest since Anthony Volpe's 21-game streak from 5/7-29/24...hit .474/.524/.825 (27-for-57) with 12R, 4 doubles, 2 triples, 4HR, 11RBI, 6BB/1IBB and 1SB over that span (4/19-5/4).
- Has reached base in 34 of his 35 games this year, batting .414/.503/.759 (55-for-133) with 32R, 9 doubles, 2 triples, 11HR, 33RBI, 22BB/4IBB, 2HP and 3SB.
- Has reached base multiple times in 21 of his last 26 games (since 4/7), 24 of his last 30 games (since 4/3) and 26 of his 35 games this year...his 26 games of reaching base multiple times this season are the most in the AL and tied with the Mets' Pete Alonso for the most in the Majors.

- Has hit .312/.422/.683 (205-for-657) with 141R, 33 doubles, 2 triples, 69HR, 145RBI and 120BB in 182 career Interleague games...since 2017, leads the Majors in HR (68), SLG (.683) and OPS (1.105), ranks second in OBP (.423), and third in BA (.313), RBI (144) and walks (119) in Interleague play...has hit 51HR in his last 110 Interleague games (since 9/11/21).
- Has homered in three of his last six games (since 4/29) and four of his last eight games (since 4/27-G2).
- Has hit 3HR in his last five games vs. the Padres (since 5/28/23).
- Has hit .500/.571/1.200 (15-for-30) with 10R, 1 double, 1 triple, 6HR, 12RBI, 5BB and 1SB in the first inning this year.
- Has recorded multiple hits in five of his last seven games (since 4/28), six of his last nine games (since 4/27-G1) and eight of his last 12 games (since 4/22).
- Over his last 26 games (since 4/7), has hit .448/.535/.708 (43-for-96) with 18R, 6 doubles, 2 triples, 5HR, 16RBI, 17BB/2IBB, 1HP and 1SB.
- Has hit .519/.594/.926 (14-for-27) with 2 doubles, 3HR, 21RBI, 4BB/3IBB and 1HP with RISP this year.

FOR STARTERS: Yankees starting pitchers have posted a 2.86 ERA (103.2IP, 33ER) over their last 20 starts (since 4/14)...over that span, lead the Majors in opponents' BA (.197), opponents' OBP (.279), opponents' OPS (.602) and WHIP (1.13), rank second in opponents' SLG (.323, first in AL) and fourth in ERA (third in AL).

- Have allowed 3ER-or-fewer in 16 of their last 20 starts and 2ER-or-fewer in 14 of those starts.

RODOMINANT: LHP Carlos Rodón tossed 6.2 scoreless innings in a no-decision on Monday vs. San Diego (3H, 1BB, 5K)...over his last four starts (since 4/18), has gone 3-0 with a 0.70 ERA (25.2IP, 2ER) and 29K.

- Has held opponents to a .151 BA (25-for-166) this season...has allowed 4H-or-fewer in each of his seven starts and 3H-or-fewer in five of those starts.

TONIGHT'S STARTING PITCHER: RHP CLARKE SCHMIDT (0-1, 5.52 ERA)

RHP Clarke Schmidt will make his fourth start of the season tonight vs. San Diego...the 29-year-old will start on extended eight days' rest...was scratched from his originally scheduled start on Saturday vs. Tampa Bay...made his third start of the season in Game 2 on 4/27 vs. Toronto, allowing just 1R/ER over 5.0IP without recording a decision (1H, 4BB, 6K, 1HR)...missed the first 17 team games of the season on the 15-day injured list from 3/26 (retroactive to 3/24) to 4/16 with right rotator cuff tendonitis...made two rehab starts with Double-A Somerset, tossing 7.1 scoreless innings (4H, 1BB, 11K, 1BK)...in 16 starts with the Yankees in 2024, went 5-5 with a 2.85 ERA (85.1IP, 71H, 31R/27ER, 30BB, 93K, 8HR)...allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his first 15 starts of the season from 3/31-9/24...**was just the second pitcher in Yankees history to allow 3R-or-fewer in each of his first 15 starts of a season**, joining Ron Guidry (also first 15 starts in 1978)...**allowed 3R-or-fewer in 17 straight starts from 9/25/23-9/24/24, the third-longest such streak in franchise history**, trailing only Russ Ford (20GS from 8/9(G2)/1910-5/27(G2)/1911) and Nestor Cortes (19GS from 8/15/21-6/2(G1)/22)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 37 of his last 42 starts (since 5/19/23)...has pitched over parts of six Major League seasons with the Yankees (2020-25)...was selected by the Yankees in the first round (16th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Carolina.

LAST TIME OUT: Made his third start of the season in Game 2 of Sunday's doubleheader vs. Toronto, allowing just 1R/ER over 5.0IP without recording a decision (1H, 4BB, 6K, 1HR)...allowed his only hit and run on a solo HR to Anthony Santander in the third inning...marked his fewest hits allowed in a start of at least 5.0IP in his career (previous: 3H, seven times).

2025: Is 0-1 with a 5.52 ERA (14.2IP, 12H, 9R/ER, 9BB, 15K, 3HR) in three starts this season...has limited batters to a .214 (12-for-56) opponents' BA.

- Has limited right-handed batters to a .091/.167/.091 (2-for-22) slash line this season.
- Made his season debut on 4/16 vs. Kansas City, allowing 3R/ER over 5.2IP without recording a decision (4H, 2BB, 2K, 0HR)...was returned from rehab and reinstated from the 15-day injured list prior to the game.
- Missed the first 17 team games of the season on the 15-day injured list with right rotator cuff tendonitis...was originally placed on the 15-day injured list on 3/26 (retroactive to 3/24)...made two rehab starts with Double-A Somerset, tossing 7.1 scoreless innings (4H, 1BB, 11K, 1BK)...made his second rehab start on 4/10 vs. Reading, tossing 4.0 scoreless innings without recording a decision (3H, 4K)...in his first rehab start on 4/5 at Hartford, tossed 3.1 scoreless innings without recording a decision (1H, 1BB, 7K, 1BK).

VS. SAN DIEGO/INTERLEAGUE: Made his only career start against San Diego on 5/26/24 at Petco Park, recording the loss despite allowing just 2R/1ER over 5.0IP (3H, 3BB, 6K, 0HR, 1HP).

- Will mark his first Interleague start this season...made three starts vs. National League opponents in 2024, going 0-1 with a 3.29 ERA (13.2IP, 10H, 6R/5ER, 8BB, 13K, 0HR)...allowed one-or-zero earned runs in two of those starts.

ON A ROLL: Over his last 43 outings (42 starts) since 5/19/23, is 13-11 with a 3.70 ERA (219.0IP, 200H, 98R/90ER, 71BB, 209K, 27HR)...has allowed 3R-or-fewer in 37 of those 42 starts.

- Allowed 3R-or-fewer in 17 straight starts from 9/25/23-9/24/24, the third-longest such streak in franchise history**, trailing only Russ Ford (20GS from 8/9(G2)/1910-5/27(G2)/1911) and Nestor Cortes (19GS from 8/15/21-6/2(G1)/22).
- Has recorded at least 6K in 12 of his last 19 starts (since 2024) after recording just 12 such games in 37 starts from 2020-23.
- The Yankees are 24-11 in his last 35 starts (since 6/29/23) and 15-6 in his last 21 starts (since 9/25/23).

2024: In 16 starts with the Yankees, went 5-5 with a 2.85 ERA (85.1IP, 71H, 31R/27ER, 30BB, 93K, 8HR)...allowed 3R-or-fewer in 15 of his 16 starts, including 2R-or-fewer in 10 of those starts and one-or-zero runs in five of those starts.

- Allowed 3R-or-fewer in each of his first 15 starts of the season from 3/31-9/24...**was just the second pitcher in Yankees history to allow 3R-or-fewer in each of his first 15 starts of a season**, joining Ron Guidry (also first 15 starts in 1978)...**allowed 3R-or-fewer in 17 straight starts from 9/25/23-9/24/24, the third-longest such streak in franchise history**, trailing only Russ Ford (20GS from 8/9(G2)/1910-5/27(G2)/1911) and Nestor Cortes (19GS from 8/15/21-6/2(G1)/22).
- The Yankees went 11-5 in his starts...the Yankees won each of his first five starts from 3/31-4/24 and eight of his first nine starts from 3/31-5/16.
- In eight road starts, went 3-3 with a 1.39 ERA (45.1IP, 7ER)...allowed 1ER-or-fewer in each of his final seven road starts from 4/13(G1)-9/19, going 3-3 with a 0.90 ERA (40.0IP, 4ER) over that stretch...**his seven-start streak of 1ER-or-fewer on the road was tied with Al Downing's seven-start streak in 1968 for the longest single-season streak in franchise history** (since ER became an official stat in 1913)...was also tied for the third-longest single-season streak in the Majors in the last 19 years (since 2006), trailing only Dylan Cease's nine-start streak from 5/7-8/11/22 and Kevin Gausman's eight-start streak from 4/1-5/30/21.
- Posted a career-best 17.2 scoreless inning streak from 5/4-21**...was the third-longest scoreless streak by a Yankees pitcher in 2024, trailing only Nestor Cortes' 20.0 scoreless inning streak from 8/13-26 and Luke Weaver's 18.0 scoreless inning streak from 4/20-5/20.
- Recorded his fifth win of the season after tossing a career-high 8.0 scoreless innings on 5/16 at Minnesota (3H, 0BB, 8K, 1HP)...his 8K matched his career high (fifth time, first since 8/20/23 vs. Boston)...threw a career-high 103 pitches.
- Was placed on the 15-day injured list on 5/30 (retroactive to 5/27) with a right lat strain...was transferred to the 60-day injured list on 6/18...missed 86 team games...combined to make three rehab starts with Double-A Somerset (2GS) and Triple-A Scranton/Wilkes-Barre (1GS), posting a 3.18 ERA (11.1IP, 4ER) with 18K...was returned from rehab and reinstated from the injured list on 9/7.
- Made three postseason starts, going 0-1 with a 5.25 ERA (12.0IP, 7ER) and 9K.

CAREER NOTES: Over his first six seasons with the Yankees (2020-25), has gone 19-21 with two saves and a 4.02 ERA (329.1IP, 316H, 167R/147ER, 118BB, 326K, 41HR) in 86 career games (56 starts).

- Made his Major League debut in Game 2 on 9/4/20 at Baltimore after never having pitched professionally above Double-A in his career.
- Did not pitch in 2017 while recovering from “Tommy John” surgery on his right elbow.
- Was drafted by the Yankees in the first round (16th overall) of the 2017 First-Year Player Draft out of the University of South Carolina...in three seasons at South Carolina (2015-17), produced a 15-9 record and 3.21 ERA (229.2IP, 82ER) in 45 games (36 starts).
