METSCELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Dodgers, 8-6, last night... New York is a season-high five games over .500...With a win, the Mets would earn their fifth series victory of the season...With another victory, the Mets would secure at least a .500 road trip...The Mets continue their second road trip of the season an 11-day, 10-game trip (4-0) against the Athletics (3-0), Dodgers (1-0) and Giants (four games).

LET'S GO STREAKING!: The Mets have won a season-high five straight games...The Mets are batting .256/.396/.471 in that span, while posting a 3.72 ERA (19 ER/46.0 IP) with 20 walks and 42 strikeouts...The Mets have outscored their opponents 37-19 in that span...The team's longest winning streak in 2022 was seven games, from July 24-August 1...The last time the Mets won five or more games was a six-game winning streak from September 15-20, 2022.

CALIFORNIA DREAMING: Dating back to 2022, the Mets have won five straight games in California...The last time the Mets won five straight games in California was from June 23-July 25, 2017...The last time the Mets won six or more consecutive games in California was May 16-August 16, 1988, when they won eight straight...Courtesy of the Elias Sports Bureau.

PITCHING IN: The Mets rank fifth in the NL with a 4.14 team ERA (69 ER/150.0 IP)...New York is tied for second in the NL with six saves and tied for fifth with 146 punch outs.

BROTHERS IN ARMS: Together, Adam Ottavino and David Robertson have combined to post a 0.59 ERA (1 ER/15.1 IP) with three walks and 17 strikeouts...They have converted six of seven save opportunities.

OTTAMATIC: Adam Ottavino has allowed only one run this season, a solo home run in a loss to Milwaukee on April 5...In eight games this year, Ottavino has posted a 1.29 ERA (1 ER/7.0 IP) with three walks and eight strikeouts...Left-handed hitters are batting .091 (1-11) against him.

DOCTOR ROBERT-SON: David Robertson has appeared in eight games and has yet to allow a run...He allowed only four hits with nine strikeouts...He is holding left-handed hitters to a .143 (2-14) batting average this season...He has converted all four save opportunities he's had this season...Overall, he has recorded 161 saves in his career...That is the seventh-most among active players.

THE SMITH: Drew Smith has 11 strikeouts in 6.1 innings this season...His 14.85 K/per nine among relievers is sixth in the NL (minimum 5.0 innings)...He is 1-0 with a 2.70 ERA (2 ER/6.2 IP) in eight games this year.

HOMER HAPPY: The Mets have homered in each contest of their five game winning streak...The team has hit nine home runs in that span...The Mets hit a total of 10 home runs in the previous 12 games.

INVADER NIM: Brandon Nimmo has safely reached base in nine straight games, owning a .523 OBP in that span...Overall, in 16 games this season, Nimmo is batting .315 with 10 runs, five doubles, eight RBI, 15 walks and a .472 OBP...His .472 OBP ranks fourth in the majors and third in the Senior Circuit...The left-handed hitter has drawn 338 walks in his career, which places him tied for 17th in franchise history with John Milner... Dave Magadan is 16th with 347 free passes...Nimmo has posted a .388 OBP, which is the third-highest in franchise history (min. 2,000 PA)... Only John Olerud (.425) and Dave Magadan (.391) had higher OBP.

I LOVE L.A.: Alonso is a lifetime .382 (21-55) with 12 runs, three doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 17 RBI with a .414 OBP and a .855 SLG in 13 games at Dodger Stadium...All seven of his homers against the Dodgers have come on the road...His .855 SLG at the park is the highest all-time (min. 50 PA)...Brandon Nimmo has hit .375 (18-48) with eight runs, three doubles, two home runs, four RBI, four walks with a .444 OBP and a .563 SLG in 16 career games at Dodger Stadium...Alonso's .382 average and Nimmo's .375 mark rank first and second among active players at the ballpark (min. 25 PA).

DODGERS-METS NOTES: Last year, the Mets claimed their first season series from the Dodgers since 2015.

HOP ON THE TROLLEY: In 31 career games against the Dodgers, Nimmo has slashed .326/.417/.483 with 16 runs, four doubles, two triples, two home runs, seven RBI and nine walks...In 22 games, Alonso has hit .279/.333/.593 with 14 runs, four doubles, a triple, seven home runs, 17 RBI and four walks...Francisco Lindor has slashed .275/.341/.425 with six runs, three doubles, a home run, four RBI and two walks.

CLAYTON KERSHAW: Is 10-0 with a 2.17 ERA (25 earned runs/103.2 innings) in 16 career regular season starts vs. New York...In the 2015 NLDS, Kershaw was 1-1 with a 2.63 ERA (four earned runs/13.2 innings).

POWER STATION: Pete Alonso is tied for the major league lead with eight home runs...He is tied for fourth in the NL with 15 RBI, ranks third in the league with a .677 SLG and sixth with a 1.064 OPS...Alonso is on a six-game hitting streak and has safely hit in 10 of his last 11 games, batting .372 (16-43) with 11 runs, seven home runs, 13 RBI, six walks with a .449 OBP and an .860 SLG.

ROAD WARRIOR: Alonso has hit 88 home runs on the road in his career...That places him tied for sixth place in franchise history with Carlos Beltran...Beltran recorded 88 homers in 434 road games...Next up is Howard Jonson who socked 102 in 580 away games.

THE WALKMAN: The Mets lead the majors with 88 free passes this season...Brandon Nimmo is tied for third in the majors and second in the NL with 15 walks...Jeff McNeil has recorded 11 walks, while Pete Alonso and Francisco Lindor have 10 free passes each this season.

WHEN YOU WISH UPON A STARLING: Starling Marte is tied for fourth in the majors and tied for second in the NL with seven steals...He ranks third among active players with 321 career SB...Only Elvis Andrus (337) and Billy Hamilton (324) have more.

ALL YOUR BASE ARE BELONG TO US: The Mets have stolen 20 bases this season, which is tied for fourth in the majors and is tied for second in the National League...Brandon Nimmo, who is tied for 11th in the NL, has stolen three bases in 16 games this year...Nimmo stole a total of three bases in 151 games last season.

TOMMY BOY: Tommy Pham has safely hit in four of his last six games... He is now batting .273 (9-33) with three runs, a double, two home runs, six RBI, four walks, two steals with a .385 OBP and a .485 SLG...He is one steal away from 100 for his career.

THIS ONE GOES TO 11: In 11 games since April 5, Francisco Lindor is batting .279 (12-43) with 12 runs, five doubles, four home runs, 16 RBI, five walks, two steals with a .380 OBP and a .674 SLG.

D-FENCE: The Mets have committed only two errors in 17 games this season...The team's .997 fielding percentage is the best in the majors... Francisco Lindor has recorded five DRS (defensive runs saved) according to the Fielding Bible...That is tied for the second-most in the majors...Only Milwaukee's Joey Wiemer (6) has more.

MEGILL NEWS & NOTES

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his third victory of the season in as many starts on April 12 at Citi Field...Allowed two runs over 5.0 innings on three hits, three walks and three strikeouts.

BIG DRIP IN THE CITY OF ANGELS: Tonight, Megill makes his first career start in Los Angeles...He was born in Long Beach, California and attended Los Alamitos High School, located 25 miles from Dodger Stadium.

TY-FOUR: Megill is seeking to become the first Mets pitcher since Matt Harvey and Bartolo Colon in 2015 to win their first four starts of the season...Harvey ended up winning his first five starts that season...If Megill earns the win tonight, he will become the 14th pitcher in franchise history to win his first four starts of a season...Frank Viola owns the franchise record for most consecutive starts won to open the season after winning his first seven starts of the 1990 season.

AMAZIN APRIL: In eight April starts since 2022, Megill is 7-0 with a 2.05 ERA (10 ER/44.0 IP) and 40 strikeouts...Megill's seven wins in April since last season are eighth...Among qualifiers in April dating back to 2022, Megill is ninth in ERA, 12th in opponent's batting average (.191) and 15th in WHIP (0.98).

THE FRANCHISE HAS COMPANY: On April 7, the Mets home opener vs. Miami, Megill threw 6.0 scoreless innings and allowed three hits...Megill joined Tom Seaver (April 5, 1983) as the only other pitcher in franchise history to throw 6.0 shutout innings and allow three hits or fewer in a home opener...Courtesy of Elias.

DOIN' THE SPLITS: This season, righties are hitting just .118 (4-34) against Megill, while left-handers have batted .333 (8-24)...For his career, Megill owns a .192 (57-297) opponent's average against right-handed batters, the sixth-best mark among right-handed pitchers since his major league debut on June 23, 2021 (min. 300 RHB faced)...Left-handed batters have a .309 (89-288) average against Megill, the third-highest mark among right-handed pitchers (min. 300 LHB faced).

COMBINED NO-NO: Megill threw the first 5.0 innings of MLB's first no-hitter of the season on April 29 at Citi Field...It was the second no-hitter in team history (also, Johan Santana, June 1, 2012 vs. St. Louis)...The Mets combine no-hitter against the Phillies marked the 17th time a team has thrown a combined no-hitter and the 10th time in the Wild Card Era...Drew Smith (1.1 IP, BB, 4 K), Joely Rodríguez (1.0 IP, 2 BB), Seth Lugo (0.2 IP) and Edwin Díaz (1.0 IP, 3 K) finished the job with 4.0 hitless innings out of the bullpen.

2022 RECAP: Was the Mets Opening Day starter and earned the victory after tossing 5.0 scoreless innings against the Nationals...Did not allow a run over 5.1 innings and earned the victory in his following start against the Phillies on April 12...Started the Mets combined no-hitter against the Phillies on April 29 and threw 5.0 innings with three walks and five strikeouts...Struck out a season-high nine batters in his following start against the Braves on May 4...Was on the 15-Day Injured List with right biceps inflammation from May 12 - June 10...Made two starts in his return from the IL before beginning another stint on the Injured List with a right shoulder strain on June 17...Was transferred to the 60-day IL on June 27 and returned to action on September 19...Made his final six appearances of the season in relief and allowed four earned runs over 6.0 innings in those appearances.

RUNS IN THE FAMILY: His brother, Trevor, is a pitcher in the Minnesota Twins organization...They both made their MLB debut in 2021...According to *Elias*, they are the fourth pair of brothers to make their major league debut in the same season since 2000 (2019, Scott & Tyler Heineman, 2017, Joe & A.J. Jimenez and 2012, Donovan & Jhonatan Solano).

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP MAX SCHERZER (2-1, 4.41)

LAST TIME OUT: Earned his second victory of the season on April 10 vs. San Diego...Allowed one hit, issued three walks and struck out six batters over 5.0 shutout innings.

DOUBLE THE FUN: Scherzer ranks tied for third all-time with 110 double-digit strikeout games in his career, two more than Pedro Martinez...His next 10+ K game will break a tie with Roger Clemens, who also had 110 in his career...He'll then need over 100 more to catch the top two: Nolan Ryan (215) and Randy Johnson (212).
