BACK IN BLACK: The Mets are encouraging fans to wear black tomorrow, July 30 when the Mets host the Cincinnati Reds at 7:10 p.m...The Mets will wear their black Nike jerseys that night and all Friday nights at Citi Field for the remainder of the 2021 regular season...In celebration of the return, the first 12,000 fans in attendance July 30 will receive a Black Francisco Lindor Mets T-Shirt presented by New Balance...Tickets are on sale now at Mets.com/Tickets.

METS HALL OF FAME: LHP Jon Matlack, RHP Ron Darling and infielder Edgardo Alfonzo will be inducted into the Mets Hall of Fame on Saturday, July 31 in an on-field ceremony at Citi Field that begins at 6:45 p.m...The three new additions will bring the total membership of the Mets Hall of Fame to 30...Al Jackson will be posthumously honored with the Mets Hall of Fame Achievement Award for contributions to the organization...This group was scheduled to be celebrated in 2020, but due to the pandemic, the ceremony was moved to this year...Tickets for Saturday are on sale at Mets.com/Tickets.

METSELLANEOUS: The Mets defeated the Braves, 2-1, last night...The team has won seven of its last 11 games...The Mets are looking for their 17th series win of the season and their 11th at home...The Mets continue a 10-day, 11-game homestand (4-3) against the Blue Jays (2-1), Braves (2-2) and Reds (three games)...Following this homestand, the Mets head to Miami for four games and Philadelphia for three.

THIS IS 100! The Mets played their 100th game of the year last night...The team improved to 54-46 on the season...That is their best record through 100 games since they were 57-43 in 2007...The team's best record through 100 games was 68-32 in 1986.

DAY TRIPPER: The Mets are 20-12 in day games this season...The team has won six of their last seven day games and have won 13 of their last 17...The Mets own a 10-5 record in day games at Citi Field this year...The team's .625 winning percentage in day games is fifth in the majors and third in the NL.

TYLOR THE CREATOR: Tylor Megill went 1-0 with a 1.04 ERA (three earned runs/26.0 innings) with seven walks and 27 strikeouts in five starts in July...His 1.04 ERA in July was the fourth lowest ERA by a rookie in any month by a Met...Jon Matlack, who will enter the team's Hall of Fame on Saturday, owns the franchise record with 0.86 ERA in July of 1972...Rick Aguilera is second with a 0.89 ERA in July of 1985.

THE NL EAST: New York is 21-20 against the NL East this season, posting a 3.47 (133 earned runs/344.1 innings) ERA in those games...The Mets are batting .231/.306/.366 in 41 games against the division this season...The Mets are 13-8 against the division at home with a 2.40 ERA (47 earned runs/176.0 innings) with 60 walks and 198 strikeouts.

FELIZ QUINCEAÑERA: Jeff McNeil is on a career-high 15-game hitting streak, batting .382 (21-55) with eight runs, four doubles, two home runs, 13 RBI, five walks and a 1.006 OPS in that span...It surpasses his previous best 11-game hitting streak, which he accomplished from August 16-26, 2018...He has safely reached base in each of his last 16 games, putting up a .443 OBP in that span...He is batting .357 (25-70) with 11 runs, four doubles, two home run, 13 RBI and seven walks with a .923 OPS in 21 games this month.

WHAT A RELIEF: The Mets bullpen has posted a 2.03 ERA (12 earned runs/53.1 innings) with 12 walks and 61 strikeouts over their last 11 games...Overall, the Mets bullpen owns a 3.97 ERA (159 earned runs/360.1 innings) with 149 walks and 400 punchouts...That is 12th in the majors and seventh in the NL.

IT'S GONNA BE MAY: Trevor May has posted a 1.56 ERA (three earned runs/17.1 innings) with 11 walks, seven walks and 23 punchouts in 18 games since June 16...He is 2-0 in that span and has converted both save opportunities...Overall, he is 4-2 with three saves and a 3.23 ERA (14 earned runs/39.0 innings) in 42 games this season...He has struck out 51, while walking 13 giving him a 11.77 strikeout per 9 IP ratio...That is second on the team and 15th in the National League.

THE FAST AND THE DRURY-IOUS: Brandon Drury put the Mets ahead with his third pinch-hit homer of the season last night, a solo shot in the seventh inning...He has a hit in each of his last six at-bats with four extra-base hits in that span...Off the bench this year, he has gone 10-19 (.526) with a 1.813 OPS...As a pinch-hitter, he is batting .467 (7-15) with two doubles, three home runs, six RBI and a 1.700 OPS...His .467 average and 1.700 OPS lead the majors...He is the first Met with at least three pinch-hit homers in a season since Kelly Johnson (four, 2016) and his three pinch-hit HR are tied for the fifth-most in a season in Mets history.

HOME, SWEET HOME: The Mets are in a stretch of 11 home games in 10 days...New York has alternated wins and losses for their last 13 home games...The Mets have lost back-to-back games at home only twice this year (April 27-28 and June 21-22)...The team is 15-2 at home following a home loss this season...The team owns a 32-17 record with a 2.71 ERA (126 earned runs/417.2 innings) with 145 walks and 456 strikeouts at home...The team's 2.71 ERA at home is the best in the majors and their .653 winning percentage is the third-best...This compares to 22-29 with a 4.39 ERA (207 earned runs/424.1 innings) with 146 walks and 453 strikeouts on the road this year.

BRAVES-METS NOTES: The Mets own a 50-66 record against the Braves since Citi Field opened in 2009.

WHEN YOU'RE HERE, YOU'RE FAMILIA: Jeurys Familia is 3-0 with a 2.92 ERA (four earned runs/12.1 innings) with two walks and 19 strikeouts over his last 12 games...He is 5-1 with a 3.27 ERA (12 earned runs/33.0 innings) with 16 walks and 41 strikeouts in 34 games this year...He has held right-handed hitters to a .171 (7-41) batting average with 17 strikeouts...He has not allowed an extra-base hit to a right-handed hitter this year...Opponents are hitting .146 (7-48) against him with RISP.

IN A PINCH: The Mets pinch-hitters are batting .270/.342/.504 with 12 doubles, seven home runs, 33 RBI and 13 walks...Their .270 batting average is the fourth-best in the majors and is the best in the NL...Their .845 pinch-hit OPS is also the best in the NL...The team's seven pinch-hit home runs is tied for the third-most in the majors.

HOMER BOUND: The Mets have homered in 13 of their last 17 games, hitting 30 home runs in that span...The team's 30 home runs since July 9 are the second-most in the majors...Only the Dodgers (30) have hit more...By comparison, the Mets hit 13 home runs in their previous 17 games.

FOR PETE'S SAKE: Pete Alonso is batting .327 (17-52) with eight runs, two doubles, five home runs, 11 RBI, six walks, a .397 OBP and a .654 SLG in 13 games after the All-Star break...He is batting .276/.340/.542 with 24 runs, six doubles, 15 home runs, 37 RBI, 16 walks and an .881 OPS in 53 games since the start of June.

PONY EXPRESS: Alonso has 91 home runs through 308 career games...Despite Alonso's second year in the majors being last year's 60-game season, he currently ranks tied for 15th all-time in home runs through his third career season...He is now tied for the 12th-most home runs through three big league seasons with Jose Abreu, Bob Horner and Ted Williams...Only seven players have hit 100+ homers through their first three major league seasons...Only 14 players in franchise history have hit 100 or more home runs with the Mets...He leads the major leagues in home runs since he entered the league in 2019.

MOVIN' ON UP: Michael Conforto has hit 124 home runs and is now tied with Todd Hundley for eighth on the team's all-time home run list...Lucas Duda is seventh with 125...Pete Alonso is now 20th on the Mets all-time home run list with 91 blasts...Cleon Jones is next with 93 home runs.

FOUR SCORE AND 42 WINS AGO: The Mets are 42-9 when scoring four or more runs this season...The team is 12-37 when scoring three or fewer runs...The Mets are 42-13 when scoring first this season...The team's .764 winning percentage is the second-best record in the major leagues when scoring first this season.

FIRST THINGS FIRST: The Mets have been in first place since Saturday, May 8, a streak of 82 days...This is their longest run atop the East in the last 14 seasons...The 2007 Mets (135 days in a row) were the last iteration of the club to be in first longer than 82 days in a row, per Elias...The team has been in first place for 98 days overall this season, the most of any team in 2021.

JULY! JULY! JULY!: As a team, New York is batting .265/.345/.448 with a .793 OPS in 24 games this month...This is their highest batting average, OBP and SLG in any month this season...The team is second in the majors OBP and OPS, is fifth in batting average and seventh in SLG...The Mets hit .222/.297/.379 in 30 games in June...The team has hit 36 home runs this month, tied for the second-most in the majors and their highest total of any month this year...New York is 13-11 this month.

ACT II: The Mets are batting .272/.349/.474 with 59 runs, 21 doubles and 22 home runs since the break...The team's 22 home runs after the All-Star break are tied for the most in the major leagues, while their .824 OPS is the third-best in MLB and second-best in the NL...The team's .349 OBP is fourth in the majors in that span as is their .272 batting average is second-best...The Mets hit .231/.310/.373 in the first half.

36 DAYS OF NO. 36: There are 30 days until the Mets retire Jerry Koosman's number 36 in a pregame ceremony on August 28...In honor of the event, the team is on a 36-day countdown noting the most memorable moments of his historic career...On this day in 1977, Koosman earned his eighth win of the year as the Mets defeated the Padres, 4-1, at Shea...Kooz allowed one run on two hits, walking two and striking out eight...He lowered his ERA to 3.10 on the season...The Mets were down 1-0 until Felix Millan hit a two RBI single to right field...The team tacked on another run in the inning and one more in the eight to seal the victory...For cool photos and interactive history information on the Mets, please visit the Mets Virtual Vault at metsheritage.com.

WALKER NEWS & NOTES

LAST OUTING: In his last start, Walker faced his former club the Blue Jays...He pitched 4.0 innings and allowed six runs on eight hits...He struck out one batter, walked two and gave up a season-high three homers.

WALKER IN THE PARK: Walker has a 3.43 ERA through 18 starts this season...His 23.3% strikeout percentage, .217 BAA, .636 W-L%, 1.177 WHIP and .634 OPS against are all his best marks in a single-season 18-start span as well...The Mets record of 14-4 in Walker's appearances this season is a career best through 18 games.

BRAVEWALKER: Walker has faced Atlanta four times in his career, twice coming this season...He has a lifetime 1.35 ERA (three earned/20.0 innings) against the club, and in two starts at home he has a 0.82 ERA (one earned runs/11.0 innings)...His last appearance against the Braves, was his lone win against the club and only decision in the four games...He pitched five innings and had eight strikeouts, with only one walk allowed...The Amazins won this contest 13-2.

FAST AND FURIOUS: The four-seam fastball is Walker's most utilized pitch in his arsenal this season...He is throwing the four-seamer about 32% of the time, averaging at 94.3 MPH...Opponents are batting a combined .186, and slugging .333 against Walker's heater...The pitch has produced 48 punchouts over the course of the 2021 season...Walker is generating a 27.6% whiff rate and a 27.0% put away rate on the four seamer.

HIT ME WITH YOUR BEST SHOT: In 13 career starts against the Mets' NL East rivals, Walker has a 3.33 ERA (23 earned runs/69.0 innings)...He has struck out 70 batters and allowed 22 free passes...Five of those starts were quality starts...This season, the Amazin's are 8-1 against NL East opponents when Walker takes the mound.

LEFT HANDS FREE: Walker is holding left handed batters to a .178 BAA (26-146), which ranks ninth in the majors (min. 150 LHB faced) this season...He has only surrendered two homers in those 143 at bats...Over the course of his career Walker owns a .232 (293-1263) BAA against lefties.

CITI SLICKER: Walker has a 4-1 record in nine outings at home this year...The Mets have a record of eight and one in those games...He is eleventh in the National League (min. 40.0 IP) with a 2.68 home ERA (15 earned runs/50.1 innings)...He has a .205 batting average against at home this season, which ranks 10th in the NL.

WALKER THE PURPLE CARPET: Walker made his first career All-Star roster...He appeared in the Midsummer Classic at Coors Field, tossing one inning...He allowed a solo homer to Mike Zunino and struck out one...Walker was chosen as a replacement for teammate Jacob deGrom.

TOMORROW'S STARTER: RHP CARLOS CARRASCO

WELCOME TO THE METS: Carlos Carrasco, a 34 year old from Venezuela was signed by the Mets this offseason...This past season with Cleveland, Carrasco finished the year with a 3-4 record and a 2.91 ERA (22 earned runs/68.0 innings) in 12 games started...He has a lifetime 88-73 record and a 3.77 ERA, with 1,305 strikeouts.
