RECENT REDBIRDS: The St. Louis Cardinals continue a 10-game "home" stand with a split doubleheader against the Atlanta Braves to complete a three-game series. St. Louis began the 'stand with a neutral site game playing as the home team against the San Francisco Giants on June 20 at Rickwood Field. The Cardinals and Giants resumed the series at Busch Stadium with games on Saturday and Sunday as the Cardinals swept the three-game series. The homestand concludes with a four-game series against their division rival the Cincinnati Reds (June 27-30) in their first visit to Busch Stadium in 2024.

FLIGHT PATTERN: The Cardinals enter today in second place in the National League Central, 5.5 games behind first place Milwaukee, and one half game up in the 2nd position in the National League Wild Card race. They have won four straight games, currently the longest active winning streak in the National League, one shy of their season high (May 20-26), and nine of their last 12. Since Mother's Day (May 12), St. Louis owns the best record in the National League at 25-13 (.659) with a +22 run differential. If the season ended today, the Cardinals and Braves would be matched up in the National League Wild Card.

DOUBLE YOUR PLEASURE: The Cardinals are playing their second doubleheader of the 2024 season, previously playing a twinbill vs. Detroit at Comerica Park on April 30, splitting the games. St. Louis still has a split doubleheader coming up against the Chicago Cubs on July 13 at Busch Stadium. The last time the Cardinals played the Braves in a doubleheader was June 20, 2021 at Truist Park. Adam Wainwright struck out 11 in a complete game effort to win Game 1, while Ronald Acuña, Jr., hit his 100th career home run in the nightcap on ESPN Sunday Night Baseball as the only offense in a 1-0 win. The Cardinals haven't hosted the Braves in a doubleheader in 30 years, playing back-to-back twinbills on July 21-22, 1994 at Busch Stadium II.

MY BISCUITS ARE BURNIN': Outfielder Alec Burleson has been crushing it in June ranking among National League leaders in home runs (7, T-4th), runs (18, 7th), hits (26, T-8th), total bases (50, 9th) and AB/HR (12.29, 8th). His 26 hits tied for his most in a single month, set last month with 26 knocks in May. He also set his single month highs in home runs and RBI.

SIXTH SENSE: Cardinals third baseman Nolan Arenado is starting and batting sixth today in the Cardinals lineup. The last time Arenado started a game batting 6th in the order or lower was July 11, 2014 (6th spot) vs. MIN. He has started 132 games batting 6th or lower in the lineup (6th-57, 7th-62, 8th-13) over his MLB career.

WINNING WAYS: Tonight's starting pitcher Kyle Gibson has won his last four decisions, longest streak by a Cardinals pitcher and three shy of his career-high of seven straight winning decisions from Aug. 22, 2017-March 31, 2018. Tobias Myers (MIL) leads all National League active leaders with five straight wins.

OH, DONNY BOY...: Cardinals outfielder Brendan Donovan has an RBI in seven straight games establishing a new career-high. It's the longest streak by a Cardinal this season and 2nd-longest active in MLB behind Shohei Ohtani (LAD, 9). Donovan's RBI in seven straight games is longest by a Cardinal since Nolan Arenado ran off eight straight games May 10-18, 2023.

ATLANTA CONNECTIONS

JoJo Romero made his MLB debut at Atlanta (Aug. 21, 2020)...his first MLB strikeout was **Adam Duvall** (swinging).
Matt Carpenter spent three days with Atlanta this past offseason after being traded by San Diego with **Ray Kerr** and cash in exchange for **Drew Campbell** (Dec. 15, 2023). Released on Dec. 18.
Brian Snitker was born in Decatur, Ill...graduated from Macon (Ill.) High School...managed **Adam Wainwright** on the 2003 Greenville Braves.
Kyle Leahy's uncle, **Thomas Leahy**, pitched in the Braves minor league organization (1991-93).
 Hall of Fame Manager **Joe Torre** played for & managed both the Cardinals (1969-74 & 1990-95) and Braves (1966-68 & 1982-84)...traded to St. Louis from Atlanta for **Orlando Cepeda** (Mar. 17, 1969).

Braves pitching coach **Rick Kranitz** was originally selected by the Cardinals in the 3rd round of the 1977 MLB January Draft, but did not sign.
Austin Riley made his MLB debut vs. the Cardinals (May 19, 2019 at Truist Park)...homered off Michael Wacha that night for his first MLB hit.
Marcell Ozuna played two seasons with St. Louis (2018-19)...originally became a Cardinal via trade with Miami for **Sandy Alcantara**, **Daniel Castano**, **Zac Gallen**, & **Magneuris Sierra** (Dec. 14, 2017)...as compensation for Ozuna signing with Atlanta, St. Louis selected **Alec Burleson** in the 2nd round of the 2020 MLB draft.
Pierce Johnson pitched three seasons (2010-12) at Missouri State University...set the school's single-season record with 119 strikeouts in 2012.

Braves Bench Coach **Walt Weiss** managed **Nolan Arenado** for four seasons in Colorado (2013-16).
Stubby Clapp played the 2003 season for the Richmond Braves (AAA-Braves).
 Bally Sports reporter **Hannah Yates** is a native of nearby Oakville, Mo...graduated from the Univ. of Missouri...previously worked at KFNS and KSDK TV.
 Hall of Fame catcher **Ted Simmons** played his final three seasons with Atlanta (1986-88).
 Cardinals broadcaster **Chip Caray** previously was the play-by-play voice of the Braves for 20 seasons on Bally Sports South and Bally Sports Southeast (2010-22), TBS and Peachtree TV (2005-2009) and on TBS and the Atlanta Braves Radio Network (1991-1992)...his father, **Skip Caray**, was part of Braves broadcasts from 1978-2008.

- Making his 15th start of the season and as a member of the Cardinals (309th career).
- Scratched from his last start at Miami (June 19) upon returning from the Bereavement List (June 16-18) with lower back soreness.
- Also started Game 1 of the Cardinals first doubleheader this season on April 30 at Detroit in the 2-1 win (ND, 7.0 IP, 1 R, 2 BB, 9 K), opposite **Jack Flaherty** (14 K).
- Is 19-21 with a 4.93 ERA in 51 career starts when it's been 6+ days since his last start.
- Threw his second career complete game against the Braves on Aug. 17, 2016, at Turner Field, was the last complete game thrown in the stadium's history.
- Lowered his career ERA (4.49) below 4.50 for the first time since June 17, 2023, with 7.0 scoreless innings at Wrigley Field vs. CHI (6/14) in his last start. Was his first career win against the Cubs and at Wrigley Field.
- Has not suffered a losing decision since April 13 at ARI (11 starts).
- Ranks T-4th among National League pitchers in active win streak with four, trailing only **Hunter Greene** (CIN), **Trevor Williams** (WSH) and **Tobias Myers** (MIL) with five.
- Held his opposition to three runs or fewer over his last five starts dating back to May 22, posting a 2-0 record with 2.28 ERA (28.2 IP) with 30 strikeouts.
- Held his opposition to two earned runs or fewer in 9-of-14 starts, 2nd behind **Sonny Gray** (10) for the most by a Cardinals pitcher.
- Logged 6.0+ innings pitched in each of his first seven starts to begin the season (April 1-May 6), longest by a Cardinal to begin a season since 2017 (**Mike Leake** - 11 & **Michael Wacha** - 7). Streak was snapped in his 5/22 start vs. BAL (4.0 IP).
- Posted career-highs for innings pitched (38.0) and strikeouts (29) in the month of April. Tied his most starts with six (also 2021 w/TEX). The 38.0 innings were the 3rd-most for Gibson in any calendar month, most recently tossing 39.1 with the Twins in 2018.
- St. Louis area resident and University of Missouri Baseball alum signed with the Cardinals as a free agent last November. Is one of three free-agent starters (**Sonny Gray** & **Lance Lynn**) that the Cardinals signed last off-season.
- Pitching for his fifth Major League team: Twins (2013-19), Rangers (2020-21), Phillies (2021-22), Orioles (2023) and Cardinals (2024).

LAST TIME OUT

- Fired 7.0 scoreless innings of two-hit ball for a 3-0 shutout win over the Cubs at Wrigley Field. Was his first career win against the Cubs and at Wrigley Field.

TONIGHT'S GAME

- Makes his fifth start of the season and 27th appearance. Has 22 career starts (57 app.) entering tonight's game.
- Has pitched twice against the Braves, both at Truist Park. Threw a 4.0 inning scoreless start on July 7, 2022, racking up a no decision in a 3-2 win in 11 innings. Pitched four scoreless outs in relief on Sept. 7, 2023.
- His last two starts have been announced the day of the game, making a spot start for and injured Kyle Gibson in his last start at MIA (6/19) getting the call minutes before the game.
- Is 0-1 with a 3.52 ERA in 10 appearances (2 start) covering 15.1 innings at Busch Stadium this season.
- Won his first three career home starts at Busch Stadium vs. MIL (5/28/22), PIT (6/14/22) and MIL (5/17/23); posting a 3-0 record with a 0.00 ERA (15.0 IP, 0 R, 9 H) allowing just three hits in all 5.0-inning scoreless starts. The Cardinals only won one of his next seven home starts after those first three with a 0-4 mark and 6.14 ERA in those seven starts.
- Is a career 4-8 with a 5.95 ERA in 22 career starts and 2-2 with a 3.61 ERA in 35 career relief appearances.
- Has a 3-4 record with a 4.06 ERA in his 10 career starts at Busch Stadium; 0-0, 3.06 ERA in 15 home relief appearances.
- Was credited with his lone win of the season at DET (4/30-Game 1), working scoreless 8th in 2-1 come-from-behind win.

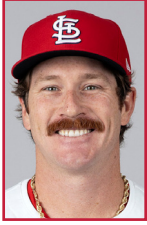
