Series Play

At present, the Braves' two series losses are the fewest of any team through 67 games since the 2022 New York Yankees matched that mark.

TODAY'S GAME: The Braves and White Sox today continue a three-game weekend series with the second of three games between the clubs this season...This is the only scheduled meeting between the two teams this year.

A Despite leading, 4-0, at the end of the third inning, Atlanta succumbed to a Chicago rally in a walk-off, extra-inning defeat, 6-5...Matt Olson hit a pair of home runs, while Michael Harris II and Ozzie Albies each had three hits in the loss.

A Atlanta has just one series win against Chicago-AL in the last seven seasons, dating to 2020...All-time, the Braves are 4-5-1 in series play against the White Sox.

A Since first facing the White Sox in 2002, the Braves have averaged 1.52 home runs per nine innings, their second-best mark against any single opponent (MIN, 1.75).

A RH Davis Martin has made 56 starts and 63 appearances at the major-league level, but has yet to face the Braves...The 6-foot-2, right-handed native of Abilene, TX, is 8-2 with a 2.61 ERA this season...Martin ranks highly in several MLB stat categories: wins (T3rd, 8), winning percentage (T4th, .800) and ERA (7th, 2.43).

CHRIS SALE: Is set to face both of his former clubs in a three-start span, having beaten the Boston Red Sox on May 28...Sale is 9-3 all-time against Boston and Chicago-AL, with a 2.56 ERA (31 ER/109.0 IP) and 144 strikeouts.

A Last player to earn a win against two of his former clubs in a three-start span was Charlie Morton in 2025 (June 19 at Tampa Bay and July 4 at Atlanta with Baltimore)...Since 1990, two Braves starting pitcher have done so, Charlie Morton (June 15, 2024 vs. TB, June 28, 2024 vs. PIT) and Mike Hampton (April 27, 2005 at NYM, May 8, 2005 vs. HOU).

A Across six starts against the White Sox specifically, Sale is 2-2 with a 2.92 ERA (12 ER/37.0 IP)...In his previous start, on June 27, 2024, Sale suffered the loss in a 1-0 defeat.

A Sale is 2-3 in his last five starts overall, despite pitching to a 2.35 ERA (8 ER/30.2 IP) in that time...In his last turn, he surrendered five hits that carried exit velocities below 84 mph – tied for the most he's given up in the Statcast era (since 2015).

LOSS: The Braves lost last night, 6-5, in extra frames, lowering their record to 2-4 when playing extras...It marked just their second loss this season when maintaining a lead of at least four runs (also May 4 at Seattle)...The team is 26-2 when staked to a four-run lead.

A Michael Harris II and Ozzie Albies each went 3-for-5...The last time Atlanta lost while receiving multiple three-hit efforts was August 18, 2025, also against these Chicago White Sox...Harris II, Matt Olson and Jurickson Profar all did so.

A Matt Olson went deep twice last night, marking the first time the Braves have squandered a multi-home run performance since the aforementioned game against the White Sox...Profar had two home runs in that game.

MATT OLSON: Homered in his first two plate appearances last night, his 18th and 19th home runs of the season...He's tied for fourth in the majors behind Kyle Schwarber (PHI, 23), Yordan Alvarez (HOU, 22) and Munetaka Murakami (CWS, 20).

A The multi-homer effort marked Olson's first since September 19, 2024...He went 237 games without a multi-homer contest, the longest drought of his career...Before that streak, his longest stretch without multiple homers lasted 138 games from 2021-22.

A Olson is currently pacing for 92 extra-base hits (46 doubles, 46 home runs), which would set a new career high and tie the Braves franchise record...Hall of Famer Henry Aaron recorded 92 extra-base hits in 1959.

A In addition to ranking fourth in home runs, the first baseman ranks highly in several other MLB stat categories: extra-base hits (1st, 38), total bases (2nd, 147), doubles (T2nd, 19), RBI (3rd, 50), runs (T3rd, 49) and slugging percentage (4th, .561).

A Olson is tied for first in both fielding run value (5) and outs above average (6) by a first baseman.

SCORING POSITION: The Braves batted .091 (1-for-11) with runners in scoring position last night, their lowest batting average this season when taking at least 10 at-bats with RISP.

A Despite yesterday's performance, Atlanta still leads MLB with a .287 batting average with runners in scoring position...The Braves have left 433 men on-base this season, the fifth-fewest in baseball.

ROSTER MOVES: The Braves today selected RHP James Karinchak to the major league roster and designated RHP Carlos Carrasco for assignment...The club also recalled RHP JR Ritchie to Atlanta and placed RHP Tyler Kinley on the 15-day injured list, backdated to June 8, with right elbow inflammation...Atlanta also placed OF Ronald Acuña Jr. on the 10-day IL with a strained left hamstring and selected INF Rowdy Tellez to the major league roster...To make room on the 40-man roster, the club designated RHP Jhancarlos Lara for assignment.

A Ritchie has made three starts for Triple-A Gwinnett since being optioned on May 18, going 1-1 with a 6.75 ERA (9 ER/12.0 IP)...Five of those earned runs occurred in just 0.1 of an inning at Nashville on May 30.

A Karinchak has made 21 appearances for Gwinnett with a 2.45 ERA (7 ER/25.2 IP), booking 38 strikeouts...His 13.32 strikeouts-per-9.0 innings are the sixth most at the Triple-A level (min. 20 games).

A His first appearance will mark Karinchak's first big-league outing since September 30, 2023 while with Cleveland...He has pitched in 52 minor league games since that date.

A INF Rowdy Tellez has slashed .259/.367/.483 (45-for-174) with a .850 OPS over 49 games for Triple-A Gwinnett this season...Has logged 15 doubles and eight home runs.

Today's Game

Makes his 13th start of the season and the 325th of his career in the second game of a three-game series at Chicago (AL)...Faces the team that drafted him 13th overall in 2010 and with whom he spent the first seven seasons of his career, going 74-50 with a 3.00 ERA in Chicago from 2010-2016 before a December 2016 trade sent him to Boston.

Earned the first five of his seven consecutive All-Star selections as a member of the White Sox (2012-2016)...Still holds the franchise's single-season records for strikeouts (274 in 2015) and strikeouts per walk (6.524 in 2015)...His 274 strikeouts in 2015 surpassed Hall of Famer Ed Walsh's mark that had stood since 1908, and his 17 hit batters in 2016 are also a White Sox single-season high.

Owens a 2-2 record with a 2.92 ERA (12 ER/37.0 IP) and 57 strikeouts in six career starts against the White Sox...Last defeated them on May 3, 2019 with Boston, allowing three hits over 6.0 scoreless innings with 10 strikeouts in a 6-1 win.

Chicago is one of two former clubs for the left-hander, who also pitched seven seasons in Boston (2017-2023) before joining Atlanta in 2024...Beat the Red Sox at Fenway Park on May 28, allowing two runs over 5.0 innings in a 10-2 win.

Pitches for the first time since June 4, when he took the loss against Toronto, allowing three runs on a season-high 10 hits over 5.2 innings with two walks and six strikeouts on 108 pitches in the 7-2 defeat at Truist Park...Atlanta took the series 2-1.

Is 8-4 with a 2.23 ERA (18 ER/72.2 IP), 86 strikeouts and 19 walks across 12 starts this season, with nine quality starts.

Ranks fifth among qualified major league pitchers with a 2.23 ERA, trailing Milwaukee's Jacob deGrom (1.50), Philadelphia's Gerrit Cole (1.54), New York's (AL) Gerrit Cole (1.87) and Cincinnati's Chase Anderson (2.14).

His nine quality starts are tied for the third-most in the majors, behind only Sánchez (11) and teammate Bryce Elder (10).

His eight wins are tied for the second-most among major league starters, behind only Cleveland's Gavin Williams (9).

Has held opponents to a .211 average, the lowest mark among qualified major league left-handers, while his 1.03 WHIP ranks 12th among qualified major league pitchers.

His 36.6% chase rate is the second-highest among qualified major league pitchers, behind only Sánchez (38.3%).

Owens a 2.42 ERA (101 ER/376.0 IP) since joining the Braves in 2024, the third-lowest among major league starters with at least 50 starts over that span, trailing only Pittsburgh's Paul Skenes (2.13) and Detroit's Tarik Skubal (2.34)...Has compiled 476 strikeouts in 62 appearances (61 starts) in an Atlanta uniform.

Owens a 4-2 record with a 3.16 ERA (13 ER/37.0 IP) over six road starts in 2026, compared to 4-2 with a 1.26 ERA (5 ER/35.2 IP) over six home outings.

Won eight of his first 11 starts to open the season (8-3)...Has now done so twice as a Brave, also going 8-1 over his first 11 in 2024, and is the only pitcher to win at least eight of his first 11 games to begin a season multiple times in the Atlanta era (since 1966)...Warren Spahn did so three times for the franchise (1947, 1953 and 1958), all in its Boston and Milwaukee years...Per Stathead.

His 11.12 strikeouts per 9.0 innings (2,665 SO/2,156.2 IP) are the most in MLB history (since 1901) among pitchers with at least 1,500.0 career innings.

Since 1968, three pitchers have maintained a sub-3.00 career ERA while making at least 300 starts: Pedro Martínez (2.93 ERA, 409 starts), Clayton Kershaw (2.53 ERA, 451 starts) and Sale (2.98 ERA, 324 starts).

His 405 career appearances are the third-most among active starting pitchers (min. 60% starts), trailing only Detroit's Justin Verlander (556) and Toronto's Max Scherzer (488)...His 324 career starts rank seventh among active pitchers.

2026

Took the loss June 4 against Toronto, allowing three runs on a season-high 10 hits over 5.2 innings with two walks and six strikeouts on 108 pitches in the 7-2 defeat at Truist Park...Atlanta took the series 2-1.

Recorded his seventh victory May 20 at loanDepot park, allowing one run on four hits over 7.0 innings with no walks and eight strikeouts on 96 pitches in the 9-1 win...Notched his first career win against Miami after entering 0-2 in three prior starts.

Reached 150 career wins April 26 against Philadelphia, becoming the 265th pitcher in MLB history to do so...Allowed one hit over 6.0 scoreless innings with nine strikeouts in the 6-2 victory...Passed Chuck Finley (2,610) for 28th on the all-time strikeout list and seventh among left-handers.

Passed Tom Glavine (2,607) for 29th on the all-time strikeout list April 18 at Philadelphia.

Reached 400 career strikeouts with Atlanta on April 6, the 13th pitcher in franchise history to reach the mark.

Won his seventh career Opening Day start March 27, holding Kansas City to three hits over 6.0 scoreless innings with six strikeouts in the 6-0 win...Became the first Atlanta starter to throw 6.0-or-more innings on Opening Day since Michael Soroka (July 24, 2020).

Career Recap

Awards: NL Cy Young (2024), Rawlings Gold Glove (2024), NL Comeback Player of the Year (2024), AL All-Star (7x, 2012-18), NL All-Star (2024-25), and World Series Champion (2018).

In his 16th major league season, Sale was selected to seven consecutive AL All-Star teams from 2012-2018, was selected to the NL All-Star team in 2024 & 2025, and has eight career Top 10 finishes in Cy Young voting, winning the award with Atlanta in 2024.

In his first year with Atlanta and 14th major league season, Sale was named the National League Cy Young Award winner, a Rawlings Gold Glove Award recipient, a National League All-Star, a First-Team All-MLB Nomination and the National League Comeback Player of the Year, going 18-3 with a 2.38 ERA (47 ER/177.2 IP) and 225 strikeouts.

Led the National League in wins, strikeouts and ERA...Became the first pitcher in Braves franchise history to win the triple crown and first in the National League since Clayton Kershaw with Los Angeles in 2011.
