### FIRST WATCH

In the first inning, the Redlegs lead the Major Leagues in **runs scored** (85), **HR** (30), **RBI** (82), **batting average** (.309), **slugging percentage** (.594) and **on-base percentage** (.374)...have outscored opponents in the first frame, **85-50**, and are **25-8** when leading after the first inning...**5 times** this season scored at **least 4 runs** in the first...**3B Eugenio Suárez** is hitting **.346** in the first frame, leads the Major Leagues with **10 HR** that inning and is tied for the lead with **20 RBI...in 2018**, Reds batters produced **22 HR** and **77 runs** in the first inning.

### GENO & DOGGIE

**Eugenio Suárez** leads the team with **27 HR**, tied for seventh-most in the majors, and joins National Baseball Hall of Famer **Tony Pérez** as the only Reds third basemen ever to produce at **least 25 HR in 3 seasons or more...** Suárez hit **34 HR** last season and **26 HR** in 2017.

### FIRST IMPRESSION

According to @EliasSports, on 7/19 vs StL **C Ryan Lavarway** became the **first player** with **2 HR** in his first game with the Reds, the first player with **more than 3 RBI** in his first game with the Reds and only the **fourth Major League player**, since RBI became a statistic in 1920, to produce in his debut for a team at least **3 hits, 2 HR and 6 RBI** (list below).

**TONIGHT'S GAME:** Is **Game 2** (0-1) of a 3-game series vs **Warren Miller's Rockies** and **Game 2** (0-1) of a 6-game homestand that includes an upcoming 3-game set vs the **Pirates**...the Redlegs are coming off **4-6 stretch vs NL Central Division** rivals (1-2 at Chi, 1-3 vs StL, 2-1 at Mil)...following this homestand will visit Atl's **SunTrust Park** (4g) before returning to **Great American Ball Park** for a 7-day, 6-game homestand vs the **Angels** (2g) and **Cubs** (4g).

**SERIES NOTES:** The Reds and Rockies are meeting for the second time this season...coming out of the All-Star break, the Reds suffered a **2-1 series loss at Coors Field**...that series included a **17-9 win** in which the Reds became the first Major League team in the **modern era** to produce in a game at least **5 triples** and at least **3 HR**...beginning in **2002** and with a minimum of 40 games played, the Reds' **.345 winning percentage at Coors Field** (20-38) is their second-lowest at any current road ballpark in that span (Phi's **Citizens Bank Park**, 18-36, .333)...Cin's **3-1 series win from 5/30-6/2, 2016** is its only series win at Coors since **8/27-8/29, 2012**.

**PIRATES UP NEXT:** The Reds are **45-47** since the bench-clearing incident on **4/7 at Pit** that led to the ejections of **David Bell, Amir Garrett** and **Yasiel Puig**...from **4/4-4/7** the Pirates swept a **4-game series** from the Reds for the first time since **7/11-7/14, 1991 at Riverfront Stadium** and did it in **Pittsburgh** for the first time since **8/22-8/24, 1969 at Forbes Field**...from **3/31-4/5** the Reds were shut out by the Pirates in **3 consecutive games** (5-0, 2-0, 2-0) for the first time since **7/31-8/2, 1931** (5-0 & 1-0 losses at Pit, 3-0 loss at Cin)...last season the Reds lost 8 of their last 9 and 10 of their last 12 games vs the Pirates, including a **7-game losing streak from 7/20-9/28**...was Cin's longest losing skid vs Pit since a **9-game losing streak from 5/1-7/19, 1991**.

**REHABBING:** C/IF **Kyle Farmer** began a rehabilitation assignment on **Thu** for **Class A Dayton vs Great Lakes**, started and without issue **caught 5 innings** of the 6-4 Dragons loss (0-2, 1bb)...after yesterday's off day, tonight is scheduled to **catch 7 innings** for **Class AAA Louisville vs Scranton/Wilkes-Barre**...since **7/18** has been on the **7-day concussion list**...last appeared for the Reds on **7/16 at Wrigley Field**.

**CATCH A BREAK:** The Reds have used **5 catchers** this season, including **Tucker Barnhart, Curt Casali, Kyle Farmer, Juan Graterol** and **Ryan Lavarway**...the **3 catchers** on the club's **Opening Day roster - Barnhart (IL), Casali (IL) & Farmer** (concussion) - simultaneously were unable to play for **8 days (7/18-7/25)** until **Barnhart** came off the injured list prior to last night's game...**Barnhart** last night filled the roster spot vacated by **Graterol**, who went on the **7-day concussion list**...**Graterol** left Wed's game at Mil in the third inning following several foul balls to the face mask...per @EliasSports, the Reds used **6 catchers** in a season just **7 times** in their history, most recently in **1992 (Troy Afenir, Scott Bradley, Joe Oliver, Jeff Reed, Dan Wilson, Rick Wrona)**...also used **6 catchers** in **1963, 1961, 1937, 1925** and **1895**...the **1909 Reds** used a club-record **8 catchers (Tommy Clarke, Tom Downey, Emil Haberer, Mike Konnick, Larry McLean, Si Pautxis, Duck Pearce, Frank Roth)**.

**2-WAY PLAYER:** RHP **Michael Lorenzen** has appeared in 63 of the Reds' 101 games so far this season, including 42 times solely as a **pitcher**, twice as a **pinch hitter/pitcher**, once as a **pitcher/LF/RF** (7/22 at Mil), once as a **pitcher/LF** (6/2 vs Wsh), 3 times as a **CF**, 3 times as a **LF**, 7 times solely as a **pinch runner**, once as a **pinch runner/CF** (3/28 vs Pit, CF), once as a **pinch runner/LF** (5/9 at Oak) and once as a **pinch runner/RF** (5/24 at Chi) and once as a **CF/P** (7/17 at Chi)...**9 times** in his career, including twice this season (4/9 vs Mia, 4/15 at LAD), he entered games as a pinch hitter and remained in that game to pitch...5 times in his career came off the bench to produce a home run, including twice as a reliever and 3 times as a pinch hitter...**Lorenzen** this year became the **first player in Reds history**, whose primary position is pitcher, to appear in **each of the first 6 games of a season (PR/CF, P, PR, P, PR, P)**...is the first Reds player with more than 300 career innings pitched (379.2) to play center field since **Hal Jeffcoat** in **1958**...**Ron Mahay** was the last Major League pitcher with at least 300 innings also to play CF...**Mahay** played in 5g in CF for the Red Sox in 1995 and then pitched his 300th inning in 2006 for the Rangers.

**BLACK & BLUE:** **Derek Dietrich** has been hit by a pitch **22 times**, the most in the Major Leagues and third-most in Reds history (Shin-Soo Choo, 26, 2013 & Jason LaRue, 24, 2004)...was hit **4 times** in a 3-game series at Chi from **7/15-7/17** and was hit by a pitch **6 times** in the 4-game series at Mil from **6/20-6/23**...he is the only player in **modern Major League history** to get **hit by a pitch 6 times** in a series of any length...was hit by a pitch twice in that series opener vs the Brewers, a 7-1 Reds win...in the 11-7 win in Game 2 became the first Reds batter in the modern era to be **hit by a pitch 3 times** in a game, tying the **Major League record** accomplished many times, and the first Reds batter ever to be hit at least twice in consecutive apps...in 15 apps this season vs the Brewers, **Dietrich** has been **hit by a pitch 8 times**...he has been hit by a pitch **115 times in his career**...notes courtesy Elias Sports Bureau.

**150th CELEBRATION:** During the 2019 season the Reds are celebrating the **150th anniversary** of professional baseball, which began with the formation of the **1869 Red Stockings**...this season, the team will wear **15 uniforms** from various periods throughout the team's history...the Reds already wore uniforms from **1902, 1911, 1912, 1919, 1935, 1936, 1939, 1956** and **1961**...**tomorrow vs Col** will wear replica uniforms from **1967**...the Reds are **2-7 wearing throwback uniforms**...as part of the season-long celebration, the **Reds Hall of Fame and Museum** underwent a comprehensive modification, while the **1869 Pavilion** at the southwest corner of the ballpark was dedicated on **May 4**, the **150th anniversary of the Red Stockings'** 45-9 win over the Cincinnati Great Westerns in the first professional baseball game...more than **20 anniversary park benches**, featuring Reds mascots wearing the **15 throwback uniforms**, are on display at locations across **Greater Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky**.

# Tonight's Pitcher - #28 Anthony DeSclafani, RHP

## RED HOTS

**Anthony DeSclafani's** last name is pronounced DEE-sclafani...is approaching **500 career strikeouts** (495, 554.1ip)...tonight is making his **97th career start**...beginning, **6/6**, in his **last 8 starts is 3-2, 3.07**...in Sun's 3-1 loss vs STL recorded a **career-high 11 strikeouts**...has allowed **3 leadoff HR** (Pit's **Adam Frazier**, Chi's **Kyle Schwarber**, Cle's **Francisco Lindor**)...in the 7-5 loss on 6/23 at Mil, became the second Major League pitcher this season to record **9 strikeouts** through his first **3 innings** (Mil's **Corbin Burnes**, 3/31 vs StL) and the only Reds pitcher to do it since at least the 1920s, since such research is available...retired his first 6 batters via strikeout, tying the **franchise record** for strikeouts to begin a game (**Robert Stephenson**, 8/25/17 vs Pit)...that streak was snapped by **Travis Shaw's** HR leading off the third inning...struck out the side in the third inning but in between strikeouts allowed 6 hits and 5 runs, tying his career high for runs allowed in an inning (9/20/15 at Mil, 5th)...missed the entire 2017 season with a **sprained ulnar collateral ligament** in his right elbow and the first 2 months of the 2018 campaign with a left oblique strain suffered in his third spring training appearance...in 40 starts since he returned from those injuries is 12-13, 4.56 (213.1ip, 108er).

**Alex Wood** tomorrow will make his Reds and season debut...has been on the Reds' injured list all season with a **lower back injury**...has been on the 60-day IL since **5/31**...made 1 start for the Reds in spring training, on **2/25 at Sea** (1ip, 2h, 3er, 1bb, 0k, 1hr)...beginning **7/6** made **4 rehab starts** for Class AAA Louisville (3gs) and Class AA Chattanooga (1gs) and combined to go **1-1, 3.18**...in December was acquired from the Dodgers, along with **C/IF Kyle Farmer, OF Matt Kemp, OF Yasiel Puig** and **cash**, for **RHP Homer Bailey, IF Jeter Downs** and **RHP Josiah Gray**.

- On 6/28 was returned from a rehabilitation assignment and was reinstated from the 60-day injured list...had been on the injured list all season with a right groin strain suffered during a spring training game on 3/22 at Mil.
- From 6/17-6/27 made 7 rehab apps for Daytona (3g) and Louisville (4g).

## 4 JOSÉ IGLESIAS, ss

**2nd Half: 14g, 12gs, 12-45 (.267), 2 2b, 1rbi, 2sb**

- Ranks T15th in the National League in hitting with RISP (.325, 25-77), second on the team to Yasiel Puig (13th in NL, .330, 29-88).
- Has hit safely in 9 of his 14 apps in the second half, including three 2-hit games.
- With 90 hits is just 4 behind team leaders Yasiel Puig and Eugenio Suárez...is trying to become the second straight shortstop to lead the team in hits...SS José Peraza last year led the team with 182 hits.
- After Scooter Gennett suffered a right groin injury in spring training became the team's starting SS, with José Peraza moving to 2B.
- On 2/23/19 was signed by the Reds to a minor league contract with an invitation to 2019 Major League spring training camp.
- Was 1 of 2 non-roster invitees to make the Opening Day roster (IF/OF Derek Dietrich).
- Is the Reds' recipient of the 2019 Heart and Hustle Award, given to each team's player who best embodies the passion, values, spirit and traditions of the game.

## 59 RYAN LAVARNWAY, c

**2nd Half: 4g, 3gs, 5-15 (.333), 2 2b, 2hr, 7rbi**

- Last name is pronounced la-VARN-way.
- Has made 3 starts, most recently in Tue's 14-6 win at Mil.
- On 7/9 vs StL had one of the best debuts in franchise history...had 3 hits, a double, 2 HR, 6 RBI and 3 runs scored...became the first player with 2 HR in his first game with the Reds, the first player with more than 3 RBI in his first game with the Reds and only the fourth Major League player, since RBI became a statistic in 1920, to produce in his debut for a team at least 3 hits, 2 HR and 6 RBI.
- On 7/17 was released by the Yankees...on 7/18 was signed by the Reds to a 1-year Major League contract through the 2019 season...was 1 of that day's 7 roster moves.
- Was signed when all 3 catchers on the Reds' Opening Day roster simultaneously were unable to play, including Tucker Barnhart (injured list, right oblique), Curt Casali (injured list, right knee) and Kyle Farmer (concussion list).
- In November was signed by the Yankees to a minor league contract with an invitation to 2019 Major League spring training camp...spent this season with Class AAA Scranton/Wilkes-Barre before he was released on 7/17 (35g, .213, 2 2b, 3hr, 19rbi).
- From 2011-2018, made 146 Major League apps for the Red Sox, Orioles, Braves, Athletics and Pirates...has made 868 minor league apps (2008-2019).

## 9 JOSÉ PERAZA, ss

**2nd Half: 11g, 5gs, 12-33 (.364), 2 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 9rbi**

- In 39 apps beginning 5/31 is hitting .304 (31-102, 6 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 17rbi, 1sb).
- Made 37 starts at 2B (last, Mon at Mil), second-most on the team (Derek Dietrich, 40gs)...made 13 starts at SS (last, Sun vs StL), also second-most on the team (José Iglesias, 88gs).
- Made 10 starts in the outfield, including 8 starts in LF (last, 6/14 vs Tex) and 2 starts in CF (6/9 at Phi, 6/22 at Mil).
- After Eugenio Suárez was ejected by HP umpire Carlos Torres between the first and second innings on 7/19 vs StL, made his first Major League appearance at 3B...made his second appearance at that position on Tue at Mil.
- Because of Scooter Gennett injury, spent most of this season playing primarily 2B and occasionally CF or LF, while José Iglesias has been the starting SS.

## 66 YASIEL PUIG, of

**2nd Half: 14g, 13gs, 16-54 (.296), 5 2b, 2hr, 8rbi**

- Name is pronounced yah-SEE-el PWEEG.
- Leads the team and ranks 13th in the NL in hitting with RISP (.330, 29-88).
- Leads the team and ranks T9th in the National League with 13 stolen bases, 2 shy of his career high (15sb, 2017, 2018).
- Has hit safely in 9 of 14 apps in the second half.
- With 22 HR and 59 RBI through 101 team games is on pace to produce 35 HR and 94 RBI...his single-season career highs for HR and RBI are 28 and 74, both in 2017.
- Beginning 6/15 has 11 HR in last 34 apps...since then, ranks among all Major League leaders in HR (T5th), slugging percentage (6th, .685), batting average (9th, .339) and RBI (14th, 26).

## 15 NICK SENZEL, cf

**2nd Half: 11g, 8gs, 13-36 (.381), 2 2b, 2 3b, 2rbi, 1 sb**

- Last name is pronounced sen-ZELL.
- Wed at Mil, singled to lead off the game but then immediately was replaced by pinch runner Phillip Ervin because of illness.
- Has a 3-game hitting streak (4-10, .400)...hit safely in 7 of his 11 second-half apps.
- Is the only player in franchise history, and 1 of only 21 players in Major League history, to produce 3 HR in his first 4 Major League apps.
- Went hitless on 6/2 vs Wsh, snapping a 9-game hitting streak (14-41, .341, 5 2b, 1hr, 5rbi, .378obp) and a 20-game on-base streak (26-86, .302, 6 2b, 2 3b, 1hr, 8rbi, 4sb, .358obp)...is the longest hitting streak by any Reds batter this season and ties Joey Votto's for the longest on-base streak by a Reds hitter.
- Began the season on Louisville's injured list with a right ankle sprain suffered on 3/25 during a spring training game in Goodyear...came off the IL on 4/23 and in 8 apps for the Bats prior to his 5/3 promotion hit .257 (1 2b, 1hr, 2rbi).

## 7 EUGENIO SUÁREZ, inf

**2nd Half: 14g, 14-47 (.298), 7hr, 13rbi**

- First name is pronounced AY-you-hay-nee-oh.
- Since the All-Star break leads the National League in slugging percentage (.809), is tied with StL's Paul Goldschmidt for the lead in HR (7) and ranks among the NL's second-half leaders in batting average (T16th, .298), RBI (T6th, 13) and extra-base hits (T7th, 9).
- Joins Tony Pérez as the only third basemen in franchise history to hit 25 or more HR in 3 or more seasons...his 10 HR this month are the most by a Reds batter in July since Adam Dunn hit 12 HR in July 2008.
- In the first inning, leads the Major Leagues with 10 HR and is tied for the lead with 20 RBI...also in the first frame ranks 11th in the National League in hitting .346 (27-78).
- Beginning 6/30, homered in 9 of his last 21 apps (11hr, 22rbi).
- Twice this season homered in 3 consecutive plate apps (7/1-7/12, 7/22-7/23).

## 17 JOSH VANMETER, inf/of

**2nd Half: 8g, 4gs, 9-19 (.474), 1 2b, 3hr, 5rbi**

- In his last 7 apps beginning 7/19 is hitting .500 (9-18, 1 2b, 3hr, 5rbi, 1.056slg, .526obp)...homered in each of his last 2 apps.
- On 7/18 was promoted from Louisville as 1 of 7 roster moves...since then has made 8 apps (9-19, .474, 1 2b, 3hr, 5rbi, 1.000slg, .524obp), including 3 starts in LF and 1 start at 3B.
- Is his fourth stint on the Reds' roster...from 5/5-5/16, in his first Major League apps, went 2-for-14 (1rbi) in 8 apps and 2 starts...from 5/21-6/18 made 20 apps, including 5 starts (7-27, .259, 2 2b, 2rbi, .375obp)...from 7/4-7/7 went 1-for-4 with a 2-run double in 2 apps (PH, PH-LF-2B-1B-LF).
- Has made 11 starts for the Reds (8gs in LF, 2gs at 3B, 1gs at DH on 5/8 at Oak), most recently Fri vs Col (LF, 3-4, solo HR).
- His solo HR off RHP Jhoulys Chacin on Wed at Mil traveled 463 feet per Statcast, the longest by a Reds batter this season and the second-longest by any player at Miller Park in 2019 (Travis Shaw, 465 feet, 6/23 vs Cin)...was the longest home run by a visiting player at Miller Park since StL's Marcell Ozuna hit a 479-foot HR on 4/3/18.
- Is a 2019 International League All-Star...in 49 apps for the Bats hit .348 (14 2b, 1 3b, 14hr, 43rbi, 8sb, 1.097ops)...started at 1B (10g), 2B (20g), 3B (10g) and LF (3g).
- In April was the organization's Minor League Player of the Month and the International League's Player of the Month...in April hit .358 and led the IL in games (26), hits (34), runs (24), HR (11), RBI (28), total bases (24), slugging percentage (.758) and OPS (1.204)...his 11 HR and 28 RBI are RiverBats/Bats records for April (since 2000).
- In spring training came over from minor league camp to make 10 apps for Reds (1-13).
- Is a native and resident of Ossian (AH-see-in), Indiana, a town of about 3,400 located near Fort Wayne...graduated from Norwell High School.

## 19 JOEY VOTTO, 1b

**2nd Half: 14g, 13-60 (.217), 4 2b, 1hr, 8rbi**

- For the fifth straight season, was voted by managers, scouts and executives the batter with the best strike zone judgment in the National League.
- Has at least 1 RBI in each of his last 4 apps (5rbi) and in 6 of his last 8 apps (7rbi).
- Last night went 0-for-4, snapping a 4-game hitting streak during which he went 7-for-19 (.368, 1 2b, 1hr, 4rbi, .579slg, .358obp).
- In his last 49 apps beginning 5/24 is hitting .313, raising his season BA from .208 (58-191, 14 2b, 5hr, 22rbi, .368obp).
- From 5/8-6/4 reached base safely in 20 consecutive games, a season-high that ties Nick Senzel's (5/10-6/1) for the longest by a Reds batter this season.
- Beginning 5/8 made his last 59 starts batting second in the order...made 15 starts this season batting leadoff (last, 5/7 at Oak)...entered this year with 1 career start batting leadoff (6/18/08 vs LAD).
- In his career has hit 63 HR on the first pitch.

## 33 JESSE WINKER, of

**2nd Half: 14g, 12-39 (.308), 3 2b, 1 3b, 1hr, 7rbi**

- Since the All-Star break, ranks ninth in the National League and 12th in the Major Leagues in on-base percentage (.426) and 13th in the NL in hitting (.308).
- Hit safely in 6 of his last 8 apps (9-26, .346, 3 2b, 1hr, 4rbi, .577slg, .452obp).
- Hit safely in 8 of his 10 starts and in 9 of his 14 apps in the second half.
- In the 4-3 win on 6/18 vs Hou hit his second career leadoff HR (off Justin Verlander).
- Has 14 HR, a new single-season career high (7hr, 2017 & 2018)...his career high for RBI in a season is 43 (2018).
- Hit his eighth HR, his new career high, in his 28th appearance and 23rd start.
- Has made 75 starts, including a team-high 51 starts in LF (14gs in CF, 9gs in RF).
