BIRDLAND BITES: The Orioles continue a season-long 10-game homestand tonight against the Blue Jays, having taken two of three from the Tigers and sweeping a three-game set opposite the Rays...Tonight, the Birds look for a fourth straight win for the first time since a five-game run from September 1-6, 2025.

👉 With last night's win, Baltimore recorded its second series sweep of the year, joining April 6-8 at Chicago-AL and its first sweep of Tampa Bay at Camden Yards since July 31-August 2, 2020 (3 G).

👉 The O's have now won three straight home series for the first time since May-June 2024.

👉 Yesterday, the Orioles plated a season-high five first-inning runs, their most since scoring five in the opening frame on May 17, 2024 vs. Seattle.

👉 **Trey Gibson** earned his first career win (5.2 IP, 6 H, 1 ER, 4 BB, 1 K, WP), while **Gunnar Henderson** tallied his third career multi-homer game (last: 6/21/24 at HOU) and first at Oriole Park.

👉 **Blaze Alexander** recorded a career-high six RBI, matching **Adley Rutschman** (4/24 vs. BOS) for the most by an Oriole this season...The Birds are one of three MLB clubs to have two players record six RBI in a game this season, joining the Dodgers (T. Hernández, Pages) and Reds (Bleday, Stewart).

👉 **Pete Alonso** registered his 1,000th career hit last night with a single in the opening frame...He became the 59th active player to reach the milestone.

START ME UP: Orioles starters have produced a 2.19 ERA (9 ER/37.0 IP) over the last seven games since May 20, the third-lowest mark in the AL during that period behind the Yankees (1.27) and Mariners (2.17), and the sixth-lowest clip in the majors...O's starting pitching produced a 5.20 ERA through the team's first 49 games of the season.

👉 Baltimore pitching has posted a 3.73 ERA at home compared to a 5.86 ERA on the road... It is the largest difference in MLB this season (-2.13, home better) and would be the largest difference in a single season in franchise history (since 1954), per *STATS Perform*.

INSIDE THE MATCHUP: **Pete Alonso** is 19-for-52 (.365) with three doubles, five home runs, and 10 walks against Patrick Corbin...The five home runs are tied for his most against any pitcher along with PHI's Aaron Nola...The 10 free passes are his most against any pitcher, outpacing BOS' Ranger Suarez (8), while the 52 at-bats are second most behind Nola (56).

👉 **Gunnar Henderson** has reached base safely in 17 of his last 20 games against Toronto since May 15, 2024, slashing .257/.368/.419 (19-for-74) with five doubles, two triples, one home run, 19 runs, seven RBI, and 13 walks against 15 strikeouts.

BLAZING THE TRAIL: **Blaze Alexander** is slashing .339/.373/.482 (19-for-56) with three doubles, one triple, one home run, six runs scored, 13 RBI, three walks (1 IBB), and three stolen bases over 22 games in May after slashing .137/.228/.176 (7-for-51) in 21 April games.

👉 His .339 batting average in May ranks sixth in MLB (min. 50 AB) behind TB's Jonathan Aranda (.375), MIA's Otto Lopez (.366), PHI's Brandon Marsh (.354), WSH's Keibert Ruiz (.353), and SF's Luis Arraez (.352).

BASALLO BREAKING OUT: **Samuel Basallo** is slashing .344/.380/.602 (32-for-93) with seven doubles, one triple, five homers, 15 runs scored, 18 RBI, and six walks in 28 games since April 20...Among players with at least 100 plate appearances during that time, he ranks among MLB leaders in batting average (4th), slugging percentage (5th), and OPS (7th, .982).

👉 He's hit safely in 20 of his 26 games since April 22, including a career-high 10 straight from May 5-17...He's also scored a run in 10 of 17 games since May 5.

CAN'T WARD HIM OFF: **Taylor Ward** ranks among MLB leaders in walks (3rd, 48), doubles (T-5th, 15), times on base (4th, 99), and on-base percentage (10th, .394).

👉 According to *STATS Perform*, the last Oriole to finish a season top five in the majors in on-base percentage was Eddie Murray in 1984 (2nd, .410).

👉 Ward has seen 1,107 total pitches this season, second most in the majors behind WSH's James Wood (1,130)...He has seen 396 of those pitches in a 3-2 count, which is tied for second in MLB with LAA's Mike Trout behind CWS' Munetaka Murakami (400).

TWO OUT FOCUS: Over the last six games, during which the O's have gone 5-1, Baltimore pitching has held the opposition to a .203 (14-for-69) mark with two outs...Prior to that stretch, opponents were batting .261...Overall, the Birds' .255 opponent average with two outs is second-highest in the majors ahead of the Angels (.269).

CAMDEN CONFINES: The Birds are 8-2 in their last 10 home games since May 10, averaging 5.3 runs per game...Baltimore opened the season 9-11 at home while posting 4.9 runs per game.

👉 In 30 games at Camden Yards, the Orioles are hitting .249 with a .743 OPS, compared to .222 with a .670 OPS across 26 road games.

👉 **Colton Cowser** is batting .288 (15-for-52) with one double, two home runs, 10 RBI, and an .800 OPS at home, compared to .125 (6-for-48) with one double, one homer, four RBI, and a .416 OPS on the road.

OFF TO THE RACES: Baltimore has stolen 13 bags in 16 games since May 10 after swiping 18 bags across its first 40 games...**Blaze Alexander**, **Gunnar Henderson**, and **Leody Taveras** are tied for the team lead with six steals.

JAYS FLY SOUTH: Baltimore and Toronto open a 13-game season series tonight at Camden Yards...The clubs will meet seven times in the next 11 days, as the Orioles travel to Rogers Centre from June 5-7.

👉 Tonight, the O's look to snap a four-game losing skid against the Jays, their longest skid since a seven-game stretch from September 11 (G1), 2021-June 13, 2022.

👉 Orioles Assistant Pitching Coach **Mitch Plasmeyer's** younger brother, Michael, signed with the Blue Jays as a minor league free agent on December 6, 2025 and is 3-0 with a 1.21 ERA (3 ER/22.1 IP) over 18 appearances (1 GS) for Triple-A Buffalo this season.

QUICK HITS: Bassitt is scheduled to make his ninth start of the season (11th appearance) tonight in the series opener vs. Toronto...Reached 10 years of major-league service time earlier this month...Signed a one-year major league contract with Baltimore on February 13, 2026, to mark his fifth MLB team, following Toronto (2023-25), New York-NL (2022), Oakland (2015-21), and Chicago-AL (2014)...He is one of seven major league pitchers to have made at least 30 starts in each of the past four seasons (2022-25)...Was selected by Chicago-AL in the 16th round (No. 501 overall) of the 2011 First-Year Player Draft.

LAST TIME OUT: Bassitt earned his fourth win of the season on May 22 vs. Detroit after allowing three runs on six hits with four strikeouts across 4.1 innings pitched in relief of opener **Keegan Akin**...Marked his second relief appearance of the season (also 5/10 vs. ATH)...Did not surrender a walk for the first time since July 23, 2025 vs. New York-AL...Threw 58 pitches, 38 strikes.

- Has allowed at least six hits in eight of his 10 games this season, which are tied for the second most in MLB with CIN's Brady Singer behind COL's Michael Lorenzen (9).
- Holds a 2.30 BB/9 (8 BB/31.1 IP) over his last six games since April 22 after recording a 6.19 BB/9 (11 BB/16.0 IP) over his first four games of the season.

GREAT WHITE NORTH: Bassitt has made three career starts opposite Toronto, having gone 0-1 with a 4.26 ERA (9 ER/19.0 IP)...Last faced the Blue Jays on May 5, 2021 as a member of the Athletics and didn't factor into the decision (7.0 IP, 6 H, 2 ER, 0 BB, 7 K)...Spent three seasons with the Blue Jays from 2023-25 and went 37-31 with a 3.89 ERA (234 ER/541.1 IP) over 96 games (95 GS)...Marks his first time facing Toronto since signing a one-year major league contract with Baltimore on February 13, 2026.

- Is 13-17 with a 3.79 ERA (104 ER/246.2 IP) over 43 career games (42 GS) opposite the AL East but is on a three-decision losing streak vs. the division since July 28, 2025, during which he holds a 5.40 ERA (10 ER/16.2 IP).

HOME SWEET HOME: Bassitt's 3.01 ERA (236 ER/706.0 IP) over 121 career home games (113 GS) is the fourth-lowest mark among active MLB pitchers (min. 100 GS at home) behind TEX's Jacob deGrom (2.15), LAD's Blake Snell (2.64), and ATL's Chris Sale (2.95).

WEAK CONTACT: Only six of Bassitt's 162 batted balls (3.7%) have been barreled this season...The 3.7 percent barrel rate is the lowest mark of his career (since tracking began in 2015) and ranks in the 90th percentile of MLB.

- Five of his six barreled balls have come on the road, including two on May 16 at Washington, two on April 22 at Kansas City, and one on April 5 at Pittsburgh.

INSIDE THE NUMBERS: Bassitt holds an 8.6 percent walk rate this season, which is up 1.5 percent from 2025 (7.1%)...His 15.3 percent strikeout rate is also the lowest mark of his career and ranks in the bottom 10 percent of MLB...He owned a 22.6 percent strikeout rate last season, a 7.3 percent increase from this year.

- However, owns a 5.8 percent walk rate and 19.4 percent strikeout rate over his last six games (31.1 IP) since April 22.

SINK OR SWIM: Opponents have gone 31-for-83 (.373) with five doubles and two home runs off his sinker, while whiffing at the offering only 13.0 percent of the time...The .373 opponent average on his sinker is the highest mark in MLB (min. 75 AB ending in pitch) ahead of NYM's David Peterson (.349, 22-for-63).

- Last season, the opposition hit .297 (86-for-290) with 18 doubles, seven home runs, and an 18.7 percent whiff rate on his sinker.

TO THE LEFT: Bassitt has allowed 14 of his 16 extra-base hits (12 2B, 4 HR) this season to lefties, who are slugging .513 against him compared to a .321 mark for right-handed batters...In 2025, he allowed 38 extra-base hits (22 2B, 3 3B, 13 HR) to left-handed batters, more than double his 18 extra-base hits (9 2B, 9 HR) given up to righties.
