ATHLETICS (73-82) vs. PITTSBURGH PIRATES (66-89)

September 21, 2025 - PNC Park - Pittsburgh, PA - 1:35 EDT - Game #156/Home #81
RHP Mitch Spence (3-5, 4.48 ERA) vs. RHP Mike Burrows (2-4, 4.10 ERA)

THE PIRATES: snapped their five-game losing streak (since September 14 at Washington) and seven-game losing streak at PNC Park (since September 5 vs. Milwaukee) with Saturday's 2-0 win vs. the Athletics...Are 43-37 at PNC Park (most home wins in a season since going 44-36 in 2018)...Are 54-63 since Don Kelly made his managerial debut on May 9 vs. Atlanta...Have at least one extra-base hit in 54 straight games (since July 22 vs. Detroit), the second-longest active streak in Major League Baseball (the Athletics, 72 games, rank first) and their longest single-season streak since a 64-game streak from June 1-August 14, 2019...Have played in a Major League-high 58-one run games (24-34), their most in any season since 2014 (60).

UNTIL WE MEET AGAIN: Pittsburgh will conclude the home portion of its 2025 schedule with this afternoon's game vs. the Athletics...The Pirates' 43 wins at PNC Park are tied for their sixth-most in a season since the ballpark opened in 2001 (also 2006 and 2017)...Pittsburgh's 3.47 ERA at PNC Park this season is the fifth-lowest in stadium history...The only seasons in which the team posted a lower ERA at PNC Park were 2013 (2.92), 2015 (3.00), 2012 (3.05) and 2014 (3.17).

HITTIN' THE ROAD: Pittsburgh will close out the season with a six-game road trip to Cincinnati (Tuesday-Thursday) and Atlanta (September 26-28)...The Pirates, who are 4-6 against the Reds this season, have won five of the last seven season series against Cincinnati (since 2018)...Pittsburgh, which took two of three from the Braves from May 9-11 at PNC Park (Don Kelly's first series as manager), has never finished a regular season in Atlanta (Braves moved there in 1966).

SHUT 'EM DOWN: Pittsburgh pitched its Major League-best 18th shutout on Saturday vs. the Athletics...The Pirates' 18 shutouts are their third-most in a season in the Live Ball Era (since 1920), trailing 1992 (20) and 1968 (19)...Pittsburgh has posted 14 of the 18 shutouts at home, its most home shutouts in a season in the Live Ball Era...The 14 home shutouts are the most by any Major League team since San Francisco (also 14) in 2015.

TEAM LEADER: Bryan Reynolds connected for his 16th home run of the season in Saturday's 2-0 win vs. the Athletics, a solo shot off Luis Morales in the third inning...He leads the Pirates in both hits (137) and RBI (73) this season (he has led the team in both categories in every season since 2021)...Reynolds is the only player in Pirates history to lead in both categories in four straight seasons.

RELIABLE ROOKIES: Bubba Chandler and Braxton Ashcraft each had six strikeouts on Saturday vs. the Athletics...They were the ninth pair of Pirates in the Modern Era (since 1901) to each have six strikeouts in a game (they became the first pair to do that while each issuing zero walks), the first since Chad Kuhl (eight) and Richard Rodríguez (six) on May 6, 2018 at Milwaukee.

PREMIER PROSPECT: Bubba Chandler allowed one hit and struck out six batters over 5.0 scoreless innings in Saturday's 2-0 win vs. the Athletics...He became the first Pirate in the Modern Era (since 1901) to make back-to-back starts with two or fewer hits allowed, one or zero runs allowed, zero walks allowed and at least six strikeouts (also did it on September 13 at Washington).

ONE-HIT WONDER: Pirates pitchers combined to strike out 13 batters while allowing just one hit (a second-inning double to Jacob Wilson) in Saturday's 2-0 win vs. the Athletics...It marked just the second time in the Modern Era (since 1901) that they pitched a shutout and allowed one or zero hits while striking out at least 13 batters...The Pirates also did that on May 17, 2023 at Detroit, when they allowed just one hit and had 14 strikeouts in an 8-0 victory.

September 21, 2016: Sean Rodríguez homered for the fourth time in five games, helping Pittsburgh to a 4-1 win at Milwaukee. It was the final game of his 10-game hitting streak, during which he went 15-for-36 with six homers and 15 RBI. Andrew McCutchen also homered in his two-hit performance. Chad Kuhl earned the win, allowing one run and striking out six batters in 6.0 innings.

HOW ACQUIRED: Selected in the 11th round of the 2018 Draft.

AS OF LATE: Burrows allowed three runs on five hits and one walk (he had six strikeouts) over 4.1 innings in his start on September 14 at Washington, having a no-decision in Pittsburgh’s 4-3 loss...Over his last six appearances (four starts), dating back to his start on August 16 at Chicago (NL), he has posted a 2.42 ERA (22.1ip/6er)... His only time allowing more than one run during that span came during his last start.

HOMER HIATUS: Burrows has pitched 24.1 consecutive innings without allowing a home run...The last home run he allowed was a three-run shot to Cincinnati’s Miguel Andujar in the third inning on August 10...He is one of three Major League pitchers since August 16 to pitch at least 20.0 innings and not give up any home runs (22.1ip), along with Kansas City’s Stephen Kolek (27.0ip) and Tampa Bay’s Ryan Pepiot (22.1ip).

WHAT A RELIEF: Burrows has made three appearances in relief this year, coming on June 25 at Milwaukee, August 30 at Boston and September 3 vs. Los Angeles (NL)... He has recorded a 1.23 ERA (7.1ip/1er) and five strikeouts in those three appearances.

ROOKIE RANKS: Since making his season debut on May 22 vs. Milwaukee, Burrows’ 94 strikeouts are the fifth-most among all Major League rookies...The only rookies with more strikeouts during that stretch are Texas’ Jack Leiter (111), the Athletics’ Jacob Lopez (104), New York (AL)’s Will Warren (104) and Kansas City’s Noah Cameron (102).

SKY-HIGH JULY: Burrows had a 3.47 ERA (23.1ip/9er), 25 strikeouts and a .198 batting average against in five July starts...Among Major League rookies with at least 23.0 innings pitched in July, he was tied with Houston’s Brandon Walter for the lowest batting average against, while also ranking tied for second in strikeouts/fourth in ERA.

JUNE BLOOM: Burrows recorded a 2.73 ERA (26.1ip/8er) in six appearances (five starts) during the month of June, tied with Los Angeles (NL)’s Justin Wroblewski for the second-lowest ERA among all Major League rookies with at least 26.0 innings pitched in the month...The only pitcher with a lower ERA was the Athletics’ Jacob Lopez (2.64).

START ME UP: Burrows earned his first win as a starter in the big leagues on June 4 vs. Houston, allowing just five hits and zero walks while striking out six batters over 5.1 scoreless innings of work...He was one of 10 Pittsburgh rookies (11 instances) since at least 1901 to pitch at least 5.1 scoreless innings with six strikeouts and zero walks.

DOWN ON THE FARM: Burrows went 2-1 with a 2.51 ERA (32.1ip/9er) and 41 strikeouts in his eight outings (seven starts) at Triple-A Indianapolis...At the time of his promotion to Pittsburgh on May 21, he ranked second in the International League with a 1.02 ERA, 28 strikeouts and a 0.85 WHIP, as well as third with a .175 batting average against (11-for-63), during the month of May (he had four appearances/three starts).

DEBUT DAY: Burrows made his MLB debut in relief of Paul Skenes last season on September 28 at Yankee Stadium...In that game, he earned the win, allowing two runs (one earned) on two hits (one home run), three walks and two strikeouts in 3.1 innings...He was recalled from Triple-A Indianapolis this year on April 24, but did not pitch before being optioned back to Indy after the team’s April 25 win in Los Angeles.
