RAY REPORT—The Rays continue a six-game homestand against the Marlins (2-1) and Orioles (1-0, two to play) tonight at Tropicana Field...are a season-high 16 games above .500...own the best record in the majors for the first time since June 30, 2023 (57-28)...have won six of eight, 13 of 16, 19 of 23, and 26 of their last 34 games...the 19-4 run marks their best 23-game stretch since April 1-25, 2023 (19-4)...since Opening Day, have boosted their postseason odds from 28.9 pct. to 88.7 pct., an MLB-leading 59.3 pct. increase...the Guardians (+47.7%) are the next closest team (FanGraphs)...are off to the third-best start in club history, trailing the 2023 (33-13) and 2010 (32-14) Rays, and have MLB's third-easiest remaining schedule by opponent winning pct. (.473) behind the Athletics (.471) and Rangers (.472)...hold a 3.0-game lead in the AL East, their largest since July 7, 2023 (3.0 GA, 57-34)...have led the division for 10 straight days, their longest reign at the top since a club-record 113-day streak in 2023 (Opening Day-July 19)...have spent 16 days leading the AL East, 25 in second, six in third, four in fourth, and three in fifth...are 10-3 on a stretch of 19 meetings with divisional opponents in a 22-game stretch (May 4-27).

★ The Rays erupted for season highs in runs (16), hits (18), doubles (6), extra-base hits (8), and walks (11st, 7) in last night's 16-6 victory, their eighth straight series-opening win...it marked their most runs since May 31, 2025 at HOU (16), most at home since April 14, 2025 vs. BOS (16), and most at Tropicana Field since April 19, 2014 vs. NY Yankees (16)...it was the fourth time the Rays have scored 16 runs or more at home, also joining Sept. 5, 2007 vs. BAL (17), and the 12th time overall.

★ **Junior Caminero** and **Yandy Diaz** became the first pair of Rays teammates to both record 4 RBI in the same game since they also turned the trick on July 18, 2025 vs. BAL...it was Caminero's seventh contest with 4 RBI or more since the start of last season, tied with five other players for second most in the majors over that span behind DET **Riley Greene** (9)...paired with **Jonny DeLuca** and **Ryan Vilade** (both 3RBI), the Rays tied a club record with four players tallying 3 RBI or more (4x, last: April 11, 2011: **Reid Brignac**, **Johnny Damon**, **Sam Fuld**, **John Jaso**)...Rays 1-5 hitters combined for a team-record 15 RBI, breaking the previous mark of 14 (3x, last: May 31, 2025 at HOU). Diaz (4-for-5) turned in his ninth four-hit game with the Rays, tying **Aubrey Huff** for second most in franchise history behind **Carl Crawford** (29G).

★ **Shane McClellan** earned his club-leading fifth win, one shy of the AL lead, but saw his scoreless inning streak halted at 23.2 IP after **Adley Rutschman**'s two-out RBI-single in the 3rd frame, the fourth-longest streak by a starter in team history...he fanned **Pete Alonso** to end the 3rd for his 500th career strikeout...McClellan reached the mark in his 83rd career game, third fastest in franchise history behind **Tyler Glasnow** (71G) and **Blake Snell** (82G).

★ The Rays are an MLB-best 13-3 during May, tied for their second-best start to any calendar month (4x, last: April 2023) behind a 14-2 run to open July 2013 (Stats Perform)...at their current pace, they would finish the month 22-6, which would tie April 2023 and May 2021 (both 22-6) for their most wins during a calendar month in franchise history.

★ **Griffin Jax** will toe the rubber tonight for his fifth start since joining the rotation on a full-time basis...he has posted a 1.29 ERA (14.0IP, 2ER) across the previous four (April 26-pres.), tied for the eighth-best mark among AL starters over that span (min. 10.0IP).

WHAT'S AT STAKE

★ Claim their eighth straight series win, the third-longest single-season streak in franchise history behind a pair of 10-set streaks from June 24-July 29, 2013 and July 28-Aug. 31, 2008.

★ Earn their ninth straight series win over AL clubs, matching the 2018 D-backs and 2001 Mariners for MLB's best intraleague start since 2000...would also mark their third-longest streak at any point in a season, trailing streaks of 14 (June 24-Aug. 25, 2013) and 10 sets (July 28-Aug. 31, 2008).

★ Earn their first series win over the Orioles at Tropicana Field since Aug. 12-14, 2022 (0-3-1 in last 4). Win five straight series over AL East opponents, tying the second-longest streak in franchise history (3x, last: Sept. 20, 2021-May 15, 2022) behind June 24-Aug. 25, 2013 (8).

★ Win 12 of their first 14 games vs. AL East opponents, the best intradivision start by any AL East team in the divisional era (since 1969)...it would also tie 14 other clubs (last: OAK in 2020) for the third-best start vs. division rivals by any team in that span, trailing the 1982 Braves (13-1) and 1981 Athletics (13-1), per Stats Perform.

★ Improve to 9-1-0 in series play vs. clubs that entered with a sub-.500 record.

★ Improve to 32-15, tying 2010 for the second-best start in club history behind 2023 (34-13).

★ Move to a season-high 17 games over .500.

EARLY AND OFTEN—The Rays have scored five runs or more in four straight and six of their last seven games...on the season, only the Yankees (5.08) are averaging more runs than the Rays (4.85) among AL clubs...they have scored five runs or more an AL-most 25 times through 46 games...fourth in the majors behind the Nationals (28G), Cubs (27G), and Braves (26G), and are on pace to do so 88 times, which would break the franchise record established in 2021 (87G)...the Rays have scored first in a season-high eight straight games and 18 of their last 23 overall (April 22-pres)...the eight-game streak is their longest since Aug. 27-Sept. 4, 2025 (8G), and their last longer streak came from June 14-23, 2024 (9G)...their 22-5 (.815) record when playing the opening run ranks second in the majors to the Rangers (17-3/.850)...the club has scored in the 1st inning in six of its last eight games compared to three of its previous 22 contests (April 15-May 8)...the Rays are 12-3 when scoring in the opening frame, including eight straight wins.

★ Rays hitters have tallied consecutive games with more walks than strikeouts for the second time over the last four seasons (2023-26)...they accomplished the feat earlier this month from May 6-7...their last longer streak was three games from June 17-19, 2011.

★ The Rays lead the AL with 10 triples, including five in their last 10 games...**Chandler Simpson** paces the AL with four three-baggers.

★ **Junior Caminero** has homered in back-to-back games for the fourth time this season (last: April 22-24)...the four streaks of two games or more are tied with **MIN Byron Buxton** and **ATH Shea Langeliers** for second most in the majors behind **NY Yankees Aaron Judge** (5)...Caminero has homered in three straight games three times in his career, all of which came last season (last: Aug. 22-25, 2025)...he has collected multiple RBI in a career-high-tying three straight games (also: Sept. 1-3, 2025)...no Ray has had a longer streak since **Austin Meadows** (4G) from Aug. 16-20, 2021.

★ **Yandy Diaz** is 9-for-21 (.429) with 2 2B, 2 HR, 8 RBI, and a 1.288 OPS over a five-game hitting streak on the heels of a 1-for-17 (.059) skid in his previous four games (May 8-12)...he has 1,440 total bases in his Rays career, four shy of tying **Aubrey Huff** (1,444) for sixth in club history (see table on the right).

TAYLOR MADE—**Taylor Walls** extended his hitting streak to a career-best seven games with a pair of doubles last night, batting .320 (8-for-25) with 3 2B, 2 3B, 8 RBI, and a 1.014 OPS in that span...the 5 XBH since the streak began on May 11 are tied with four other players for the AL lead...entering the streak, he had 6 RBI in his first 28 games this season...Walls is batting .277 (13-for-47) over 16 games in May, which would mark the second-highest average in any month of his career behind April 2023 (.306).

THE ENTERTAINER—**Cedric Mullins** is batting .367 (11-for-30) with 1 HR, 5 RBI, 8 R, and 4 SB over his last nine games, including 8-for-18 (.444) during a season-high five-game hitting streak...the nine-game stretch has raised his average from .131 to .182...Mullins has recorded a 121 OPS+ in May after posting a 16 OPS+ during March/April...OPS+ is a statistic that measures a hitter's offensive production compared to the rest of the majors, accounting for external factors such as ballpark...league average is 100, meaning Mullins'.853 OPS this month is 21 pct. better than the average major league hitter.

★ The Orioles will become the 30th and final major league club Mullins has appeared against...he was selected by Baltimore in the 13th round of the 2015 First-Year Player Draft and spent nearly eight seasons with the club before being dealt to the Mets at last year's July 31 trade deadline...Mullins remains one of four players to record 100 HR and 100 SB (101HR/140SB) in Orioles/St. Louis Browns history, joining **Brady Anderson** (1988-2001), **Paul Blair** (1964-76), and **Ken Williams** (1918-27).

X's AND O's—The Rays and Orioles continue a stretch of six meetings over a 10-day span (May 18-27) this evening...Baltimore won the season series, 7-6, last year, including a 6-5, walk-off win in the season series rubber match on Sept. 25 at BAL...it marked the Rays third straight season series loss (2023-25) on the heels of six straight wins (2017-22)...the Rays are 16-24 (.400) against the Orioles since the streak began in 2023, their second-worst mark vs. any AL opponent in that span, better than only the Rangers (8-12/.333)...they are 1-3-2 in home series vs. Baltimore during that timeframe, with the lone series win coming in their last home meeting from July 18-20, 2025 at Steinbrenner Field.

★ This is **Craig Albermaz's** first series at Tropicana Field as a manager...the Eckerd College product began his coaching career in the Rays system (2015-19) following eight seasons as a Tampa Bay minor league...three members of his staff are former Rays players: first base coach **Jason Bourgeois** (OF, 2013), infield coach **Miguel Cairo** (INF, 1998-2000), and bullpen coach **Hank Conger** (C, 2016).

★ **Yandy Diaz** has reached safely in 14 straight games vs. the Orioles (Sept. 7, 2024-pres.), batting .481/.557/.731 (25-for-52) with 7 XBH, 8 BB, and 7 SO...min. 35 AB, it marks the highest average by any player in the majors vs. a single team in that span...he is 8-for-19 (.421) lifetime vs. **Kyle Bradish**.

★ **Junior Caminero** is batting .396 (21-for-53) with 5 XBH and 13 RBI and 13 games against the Orioles since the start of last season, tallying multiple hits in eight of those contests.

THIS DAY IN RAYS HISTORY—Today marks the eight-year anniversary of the Rays first introducing the "opener" concept on May 19, 2018 at Angel Stadium, when **Sergio Romo** struck out the side in the 1st inning of his 589th MLB appearance and first start...bulk reliever **Ryan Yarbrough** worked the next 6.1 frames and **David Robertson** launched a two-out grand slam in the 2nd inning of a 5-3 win.

TONIGHT'S START—Griffin Jax will toe the rubber tonight for his fifth start and 16th appearance of the year, including his third start and sixth outing at home... marks his fifth straight start after pitching out of the bullpen in each of his first 11 appearances...is the 20th start of his major league career and his ninth at home...acquired from the Twins for **RHP Taj Bradley** on July 31, 2025.

- ✦ Jax has allowed two earned runs or fewer in each of his last seven starts dating back to Oct. 2, 2021 with MIN, the second-longest active streak among Rays arms behind **Nick Martinez** (9G, March 3-pres.).
- ✦ Other than October (3G/1.29 ERA), Jax's 2.94 ERA (64.1IP, 21ER) in May is his lowest across any month.

LAST TIME OUT—Worked a season-high 5.0 shutout innings despite walking a career-high-tying four batters in a 5-3 extra-inning loss on May 13 at TOR (5.0IP, 4H, OR, 4BB, SO)...his 20 batters faced were his most since Sept. 26, 2021 vs. TOR (21BF w/ MIN)...induced a career-high-tying two double play balls, joining Aug. 16, 2021 vs. CLE (with MIN)...marked the third time in his career he's tossed 5.0 innings or more without yielding an extra-base hit, joining July 30, 2021 at STL (with MIN) and Oct. 2, 2021 at KC (with MIN)...utilized his changeup only 8.0 pct. (5-of-66) of the time, down from his 18.8 pct. usage in 2025...used his sweeper at a 45.0 pct. clip against right-handed hitters opposed to a 9.0 pct. rate against lefties.

- ✦ His 66 pitches were his most in a game since he threw 74 in a 4-0 win for the Twins on Oct. 2, 2021 at KC.

O' SAY CAN YOU SEE—Jax is 1-1 with a 1.80 ERA (10.0IP, 2ER) and 12 strikeouts over 10 career appearances (all relief) against Baltimore...his last outing came on Sept. 24, 2025, when he tossed 1.0 scoreless inning on 12 pitches in a 6-2 win at Camden Yards...has only pitched more than 1.0 inning against the Orioles once, working 1.2 innings on May 5, 2022 at Camden Yards with MIN.

- ✦ Jax is 3-6 with a 4.50 ERA (82.0IP, 41ER) in 63 career appearances (five starts) against AL East opponents...however, he has turned in a 1.65 ERA (16.1IP, 3ER), 1.10 WHIP, and .200 (11-for-55) opp. average across 10 outings (two starts) vs. the division since joining the Rays.

STOP, TROP, AND ROLL—Jax has yet to receive a decision at Tropicana Field this year, posting a 2.35 ERA (7.2IP, 2ER) while limiting opposing hitters to a .120/.241/.240 (3-for-29) slash line with a .481 OPS across five appearances (two starts) inside the Trop...has received 2.35 runs of support per 9.0 innings in home outings this season, the lowest mark of his career...Since being acquired by Tampa Bay via trade on July 31, 2025, Jax has pitched to a 4.11 ERA (15.1IP, 7ER) with a 11.74 strikeouts per 9.0 innings across 14 appearances (three starts) at Steinbrenner Field and Tropicana Field.

GET JAX UP AND MOVING—This marks the first time Jax has been a regular starter since his 2021 rookie season with the Twins, when he made his final 14 appearances as a member of the Twins rotation after his first four came in relief...he started two games for the Rays last season, working as an opener for **Ian Seymour** on Sept. 5 vs. CLE before starting a bullpen game on Sept. 10, 2025 at CWS...both starts lasted 1.0 scoreless frame...for his career, he is 3-5 with a 5.49 ERA (80.1IP, 49ER) in 19 starts compared to 21-28 with a 3.70 ERA (294.1IP, 121ER) in 294 relief appearances.

- ✦ Jax spent his first five professional seasons (2016-19, 2021) as a starter...he first transitioned to a full-time relief role in 2022...from 2016-21, 50 of his 55 minor league appearances were starts.

CAPTAIN JAX—Jax is currently a Captain in the U.S. Air Force Reserve, earning the promotion in June 2021, and remains the only Air Force Academy graduate to play in the majors...after his graduation from the Academy in 2017, he made five starts with Class-A Cedar Rapids and Rookie-level Elizabethton during his 60-day leave ahead of his first active duty assignment, departing on July 22 to begin his role as an acquisitions officer working with civilian contractors such as SpaceX and Boeing...the following year, he was accepted into the Air Force World Class Athlete Program, which allows soldiers to train for the upcoming Olympic Games as their active duty job responsibility for a two-year period, allowing him to continue his baseball career while completing his active duty requirement...became eligible for the program when baseball was readmitted for the scheduled 2020 Tokyo Olympics.

- ✦ He completed his active duty requirement and was admitted to the Air Force Reserve in November 2019...was notified of his promotion to Captain on June 5, 2021, the same day he was selected to the Twins major league roster ahead of his MLB debut three days later.

MLB CAREER RECAP—Last season, made a career-high 73 appearances (2 starts), tied for sixth most in the AL, between the Twins (50G) and Rays (23G), going a combined 1-7 with a 4.23 ERA (66.0IP, 31ER)...also set career bests in strikeouts (99) and holds (28)...acquired at the July 31 trade deadline for **RHP Taj Bradley**...of his 99 strikeouts, 97 came as a reliever, fourth most in the AL behind **HOU Bryan Abreu** (105), **CLE Cade Smith** (104), and teammate **Edwin Uceta** (103)...min. 250 BF, ranked second in the majors in chase rate (38.1%) behind **CIN Graham Ashcraft** (38.3%) and was fifth in whiff rate (37.3%)...joined Abreu as the only pitchers in the majors to make 70 appearances or more each season from 2023-25...his 216 appearances in that timeframe ranked third to **SF/NYM Tyler Rogers** (226G) and **Abreu** (220G).

- ✦ In 2024, received the Joseph W. Haynes Award as Twins Pitcher of the Year, as voted on by the Twin Cities chapter of the BBWAA...became the first Minnesota pitcher to record 10 saves and 20 holds in a season.
- ✦ In 2023, made the Twins Opening Day roster for the first time and spent the year in the club's bullpen...tied for ninth in the AL with a team-leading 23 holds...led the majors with a 3.3 pct. barrel rate (min. 250BF).
- ✦ In 2022, transitioned to a relief role for the first time after spending his first six professional seasons (2016-21) as a starter...led the Twins bullpen in innings (72.1), tied for the team lead in holds (18), and ranked second in appearances (65)...began the season with Triple-A St. Paul after spending spring training with the Twins...made one appearance before being recalled April 12 when **Jorge Alcala** was placed on the injured list, remaining with the big-league club through season's end.
- ✦ Made his major league debut in 2021 across four stints with the Twins: June 5-16, June 24-July 7, July 19-20, and July 30-end of season...maintained a regular spot in the rotation during his season-ending stint with the club...named the recipient of the Bob Feller Act of Valor Award, given annually to the major leaguer who best embodies the spirit of the late Hall of Famer, both in terms of commitment to country and love for baseball.
